

UTTLESFORD BRANCH

Support and a listening ear have helped people cope with anxiety and depressive problems in the Stansted district. And they are to be found at a drop-in centre in Chapel Hill which opened last year.

Co-ordinator of the centre, Anne Ruskin, said this week: "We offer tea, coffee and a chat with people who have any type of mental health problem. However, we have found that the majority of the people who come along have anxiety or depressive type problems and a few are coping with withdrawing from tranquilliser dependency."

The drop-in centre is run by the Uttlesford branch of MIND, the largest mental health charity in the country and is the third to be set up by the local group.

Friendships have grown within the group as people have found they have a listening ear from other volunteers and support from members who have had similar experiences.

"The difficult part is coming along for the first time which is why the welcome is among the most important aspects of the centre." said Mrs. Ruskin. "Each person is greeted by name, offered tea or coffee and encouraged to sit and talk with a volunteer. Barriers come down and people feel free to talk about their feelings."

There is no stigma or fear of rejection in the group and many of the volunteers are former mental health sufferers so there is great empathy. However, some people do not want to be involved in a group or maybe cannot get out due to an illness such as agoraphobia wo we also offer a befriending service. Volunteers visit people on a one-to-one basis for about an hour a week, usually in their own homes where they will chat over coffee or share hobbies and interests. The volunteers have been on a 10 week training course and references are taken up before they go ahead with befriending.

MIND aims to complement the medical service and offers the listening time doctors have not got to spare. Many people take the support of friends and relatives for granted but some have no-one to share their problems with in times of need.

The centre is held at the Friends Meeting House, Chapel Hill, Stansted, on Tuesdays from 2-4 p.m. Other drop-in centres are held in Saffron Walden and Dunmow.

STICKY SLICES

125g / 4oz margarine 50g / 2oz soft brown sugar 75g / 3oz dates, finely chopped 25g / 1 oz desiccated coconut 75g / 3oz Rice Crispies 125g / 4oz chocolate,

broken into small pieces Grease and line a swiss roll tin (28x18cm / 11x7 inches). Put the margarine, sugar and dates into a saucepan and heat gently until soft. Take the pan off the heat.

Stir in the Rice Crispies and coconut, mix well. Turn the mixture into the tin and press down evenly.

Melt the chocolate (in a bowl over hot water or in a microwave). Spread the melted chocolate over the mixture and leave to set. When cold, turn out and cut into 24 slices.


