#### STANSTED FRIENDS MEETING HOUSE

You will have noticed that the Friends Meeting House at the top of Chapel Hill has been transformed. This was out of necessity as the building that occupied the site had passed both its "display until" and its "use by" dates some years ago. It could have been repaired and patched up but we felt that we would be faced with similar repairs in the near future and a more radical solution was needed before another winter came.

We have attempted to keep much of the old Meeting House. In fact we have had built a brick "skin" around it and changed the leaking flat roof for a more practical pitched roof. There have been some changes internally. We hope you like the result and that you will have the opportunity to come and see for yourself what has been achieved. We still have to furnish loans that enabled us to do this work and no doubt there will be many attempts to raise money to that end. In order to save money most of the decoration will be done by ourselves and to date this is going well, the more so because there are so few members of our meeting.

You will notice I have not used the work "Quaker" yet. We rarely refer to ourselves as Quakers but as "Friends" belonging to the "Society of Friends". The word "Meeting" also needs some explanation. A meeting is a place as in "Stansted Meeting". Then it is the collective noun for the worshippers at a certain place as in "Saffron Walden Meeting has decided to hold Vigils for Peace". It is also applied to the occasion at which the group meets for worship, it is then short for "meeting for worship". Friends (Quakers) say "I am going to meeting this morning" as other Christians would say "I am going to Church".

Most of you will know that Friends do not have a Creed and that they have no set form of worship. We do however have a book called "Christian Faith and Practice in the Experience of the Society of Friends". It gives help and guidance on many matters both spiritual and practical quoting from the writings of Friends. One of these quotes reads thus:-

"We should like to see a greater unity between the religious service of our meetings and the social service of Friends, each being complementary to the other, since they are rooted in the same life and spirit; and to see this expressed in meeting houses which act as centres for varied activities of the surrounding neighbourhood ..."

This was written in 1944 and we hope that the "New" Meeting House will act as a centre for the surrounding neighbourhood and community.


Co-ordinator Anne Ruskin said this week:

#### FOOTPATHS IN STANSTED

In 1989 the British Airports Authority and Essex C.C. agreed diversions of footpaths on BAA land. It appears that the issue of the diversion order was delayed until some new paths were brought up to standard. We understand that this has now happened and the order has been issued. The paths in Stansted which are affected are nos. 28 and 29 running between the motorway and Forest Hall Road and described in the August issue of the Link. We believe that these paths have now been replaced by the bridleway which runs along the eastern side of the motorway from Burton End to Duck End Bridge in Birchanger. At the time of writing no notification has been received by the Parish Council and the finger posts waymarking the paths still stand in Forest Hall Road. The paths do, of course, appear on the Ordnance Survey maps and due to the time lapses between major revisions it could well be 15 years before revised maps are available.

We shall be organising another walk on Sunday 21st November starting at 10.30 a.m. from Crafton Green. The distance will be about 6 miles and everyone is welcome.
