




# THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION WOMEN'S SECTION







# STANSTED AND DISTRICT CRIME PREVENTION PANEL



This course of three evenings held in September proved to be a sell out with tickets going to Great Easton, Thaxted, Broxted, Ugley, Birchanger and Bentfield Bury as well as here in Stansted.

The first evening was run by Peter Caulfield, the Braintree Division Crime Prevention Officer and included a video warning about opportunist burglary. Advice was also given on protecting our homes as well as ourselves and there was an opportunity to purchase personal alarms.

The following Tuesday was dedicated to personal safety and self defence with martial arts expert Simon Driver and our own beat officer Steve Pike showing us how. After demonstrating various self protection techniques, we tried it on each other and then on them much to everyone's amusement.

Our final session took place at James Barr's Nissan garage in Bishop's Stortford when we were divided up into four groups and moved round from one "lesson" to another.

Steve Woodward from the traffic police at Newport gave advice on what to do if our cars broke down on the motorway and how best to ensure our own safety both from traffic and other unwanted attentions.

Two mechanics then demonstrated and gave advice on how to change a wheel, jumpstart the engine and keep our vehicles topped up with water, oil and various other liquids to ensure smooth incident free driving.

The fourth part was a quiz asking us to identify eight motor parts and putting a value on them. The winner whose answer was just about spot on was presented with a car care kit.

The general consensus appears to be that the course had been interesting, informative and fun and should help the 40 or so women who came to feel safe and confident, whether at home or out and about.

We also had a display of Cabouchon jewellery which members were able to purchase.


We shall be going out for our Christmas dinner again this year and details will be finalised next month.

### **FORGIVENESS**

Over the last months - because of the 50th anniversary of VJ Day and all the discussions about whether or not the Japanese should be invited to take part in various ceremonies - I have been thinking about forgiveness. I was in the Far East at the end of the Second World War, and saw the prisoners returning from the Japanese prisoner-of-war camps (at least I saw some of those well enough to come ashore). The memory of those haggard, skeletal figures remains with me still; and if I was one of those men or a member of their families I can understand that forgiveness would be very hard. One of the most moving accounts of that time that I know is Laurens van der Post's book "The Night of

the New Moon": he was a prisoner and suffered

unspeakably, and yet was able to write:

'I know only that I came out of prison longing passionately .... that the past would be recognised as the past and instantly buried before it spread another form of putrefaction in the spirit of our time. thought that the only hope for the future lay in an all-embracing attitude of forgiveness of the peoples who had been our enemies. Forgiveness, my prison experience had taught me, was not mere sentimentality; it was as fundamental a law of the human spirit as the law of gravity. If one broke the law of gravity one broke ones neck; if one broke this law of forgiveness one inflicted a mortal wound on one's spirit and became once again a member of the chain-gang of mere cause and effect from which life has laboured so long and painfully to escape.'



If only we all had that God-given power of forgiveness, what a different place the world would be.






