
THE AIR TRAINING CORPS (1096 SON AND D.F.)

The Air Training Corps has two local groups, the main Squadron in Bishop's Stortford and the Detached Flight which meets at Stansted Airport. Both sections enjoyed a full 1995.

Throughout the past year they have both been involved in many activities. At the beginning of the year they took part in both the Cadet Services Falklands Memorial Shield and the Wing Athletics in Basildon, they performed well at both events.

In July they visited R.A.F. Linton on Ouse in Yorkshire. The R.A.F. has its flying school based there with Tucano Turboprop Aircraft. The Cadets spent a week at the camp and experienced life on an R.A.F. station, visiting the different sections which make up an operational station as well as flying, shooting, sports, navigation and night exercises.

East Essex Wing was chosen to provide Cadets for VJ Day at the Buckingham Palace Service and the Tribute and Promise Parade in the Mall. A number of D.F. Cadets attended and achieved some visibility on national television. Also in August, through the airport police, a visit was organised to the underground firing range at Essex Police HQ at Chelmsford. The Cadets visited the armoury of confiscated weapons and also got the chance to see some of the weapons demonstrated and to fire some police issue firearms.













The D.F. sent a team to the Inter Squadron Swimming competition in Chelmsford and won 1 gold, 3 silver and 1 bronze medal in September. Four Cadets went on to represent East Essex Wing in the Inter-Wing competition. They won 4 silver medals and took the wing to 3rd place overall.

In October the East Essex Wing Parade was once again at Carver Barracks and over 700 Cadets took part. Later in the month the second Green Camp took place at Nesscliff training camp in Shropshire. The activities available included hill walking, climbing and abseiling, shooting, missile racing, a confidence course and one of the largest night exercises run by the wing involving over two hundred Cadets.

The D.F. led the parade on Remembrance Sunday in Stansted. A number of Cadets also assisted in a poppy day collection in the New Terminal at Stansted Airport.

The year finished with the Annual Awards held at Enterprise House, Stansted Airport. Over one hundred Cadets and their relatives attended the static displays and presentation. Guests included the Mayor of Bishop's Stortford, Mr Paternoster the Operations Director for Stansted Airport Councillor Melvin Caton from Stansted.

1996 promises to be as busy. Already a number of Cadets from the D.F. and the Main Squadron are preparing for a 4/5 week trip to Zimbabwe in the summer.

The National Childbirth Trust Education for Parenthood

Stansted & District

1996 sees the 40th anniversary of the start of the NCT. Throughout the year there will be various events organised both locally and nationally to celebrate. Watch for details in the press (not just local) and on village noticeboards. Now seems a good opportunity to write a little more about the services we offer in addition to a full social calendar which includes a regular "open house" at the Crafton Green Centre in Stansted to which everyone is welcome.

Usually the first contact made with expectant parents comes via the local midwives. Before the birth we offer a series of antenatal classes open to both members and non-members which are run by a qualified and experienced antenatal teacher. These classes are a good way to meet other parents-to-be in addition to providing invaluable advice and support. It is quite common for friendships made at these classes to continue long after the birth. We also like to provide a postnatal supporter if wanted. This is another parent who is willing to give as much or as little support as is asked for. might accompany instance thev mother/father to a coffee morning and introduce them to other parents or look after older children in the first few hectic weeks.

Once the baby is born, a trained breast-feeding counsellor is available to provide information and support to help mothers overcome any problems they may have with feeding. We also run an informal postnatal support discussion group.

It would be nice to think that after those first few months we all become wonderfully knowledgeable parents! Of course in reality as the children grow the problems and queries just change. With this in mind we have an Experiences Register which covers a wide range of subjects including what to do with a child who bites or who has sleeping problems, etc., etc. Contact can be made via this register on a confidential basis with another parent who has experienced the same or a similar problem.


