When I arrived at Stansted in January 1989 I was also appointed Priest-in-Charge of Farnham and, since Easter 1994, I have also had the pastoral care of the Parish of Birchanger.

This temporary arrangement is obviously unsatisfactory and the time has come to make it permanent. It is therefore proposed that the 'United Benefice of Stansted Mountfitchet with Birchanger and Farnham' be created. This will not affect the independence of the three parishes. Each will continue to elect its own Churchwardens and P.C.C. and each will have its own pattern of service.

This measure will make little or no difference in the day-to-day life of the parishes. However, there are two clear advantages:

Firstly, when the time comes to appoint my successor, all three Parishes will be represented in the process. The Patronage will be exercised jointly by the Bishop (Patron of Stansted Mountfitchet) together with New College, Oxford (Patron of Birchanger) and the Patron of Farnham. Each of the three parishes will appoint two representatives (normally the Churchwardens) to consult together with the Patrons in the appointment process.

Secondly, this measure ensures that the temporary links between Stansted, Farnham and Birchanger are made permanent. I understand that no parish wishes to lose its resident Vicar or Rector and equally every priest's ideal is one parish, one priest. We are, however, well enough aware of the financial and manpower problems facing the Church and must therefore seek the best arrangement in each group of parishes.

I believe that, in the circumstances, this is the best way forward for these parishes. The Church Commissioners are currently considering the proposals. If there are no objections, then they will be laid before the Queen at a meeting of the Privy Council and take effect on the first day of the following month.

I hope that the Bishop of Colchester will come to inaugurate the new United Benefice as soon as possible after this and will advertise the date in due course.

#### Lazer Group Weekend at Asheldham Youth Church (Sept 6th - 8th)

On the lake are numerous canoes and two bottomless dinghies. In the water and on the bank are some very soggy, dirty Lazer group members. Initiative games showed us that by working together we were able to achieve what it was impossible to achieve working alone, and that by listening to each other's points of view we were able to come to workable solutions to problems. (Is there a message for today's "church" here?).

Moreover, during our short time together we explored the nature of trusting in God and the nature of our relationship with Him which is built upon that trust. In worship we thanked God that such a relationship is for all of us, whoever we are, wherever we are.

The evening ended with a "do-it-yourself" variety show which included singing, dancing, drama, jokes, storytelling and dance.

We returned home on the Sunday evening but our journey in faith together continues. The importance of fellowship together and of mutual support for each other as people and as Christians was made clear to us during our weekend at Asheldham. However, it is a relevant message for all who share in the Christian journey of faith.

It was a good and memorable weekend.


#### STANSTED PERSPECTIVE

October saw the imposition of yet another tax and a consequent potential increase in future Council Taxes. I refer, of course, to the Landfill Tax by which all mixed rubbish carted to large holes in the ground will henceforth be charged at £7 per tonne. The initial cries of anguish at the additional charge on the local "ratepayer" (and skip hirer), together with the prophecies of even more indiscriminate fly-tipping continue to reverberate in our ears, doubtless to be repeated when the next Council Tax is announced.

Before we berate our political masters perhaps we should look more critically at the consumer society we have all unwittingly created. A simple starting point is that 40 years ago the old Rural District Council had a fortnightly collection service which for the most part we found to be adequate. Now households have one or more laden bins emptied weekly, in addition to which many of us regularly visit that popular social venue the Council Skip, that cup which constantly runneth over. Moreover, so many items from nappies to electrical appliances are over-packaged and of a throw-away rather than wear-out nature.

What should we do? Clearly everyone should segregate their rubbish and put bottles and cans into the bins at Crafton Green. Paper should be left by the front gate for collection by our present day Pharaoh. In some countries segregation of refuse is mandatory and it would be difficult to argue against it here. As one of the lesser known contributions (on recycled paper of course) from the recent National Poetry Week put it:

Tins and bottles, paper, card, Sorting them is not too hard, Get the habit, don't be lax, Save resources, reduce tax.


"Maybe I'll get better as I grow bigger," she said.

### **Shalom Group**

Reports and announcements of Shalom events frequently appear in 'Link', so it may be that you have wondered what this group really is.

In September 1995, the Shalom Group in Stansted celebrated the tenth anniversary of its founding. This group of Christians from all denominations has been meeting together on a fortnightly basis in the homes of its members for prayer and praise, to discuss issues, for bible studies and to listen to guest speakers. As well as inviting speakers from other Christian denominations, there have also been contacts with other faiths. There have been several interfaith meetings between the Shalom Group and the Jewish Community of Harlow and we are now affiliated to the Council of Christians and Jews (Harlow Branch). We were extremely fortunate to have Dr Akbar Ahmed, a foremost scholar on Islam, to speak to our group two years ago and last year we hosted Dr Ken Cracknell from Cambridge. There was a visit to the Hindu Temple at Neasden in June this year.

For some years now, the Shalom Group has had a relationship with the Black Church of Cherubim and Seraphim, when alternate visits for worship together have taken place. This has now been constitutionally adopted by CTS.

A few years ago many of the Shalom Group were very fortunate to visit the Holy Land and whilst our group leader was a Catholic Priest, two other ministers from the Methodist and Baptist Churches also took part in this very special pilgrimage. Every year, the Group holds an annual retreat which usually takes place at Hengrave Hall. Next year the Retreat will be led by Fr Gerard Hughes SJ who is a leading writer and spiritual leader. We are also linked to the Corrymeela Reconcilation Centre in Northern Ireland, being registered Friends of Corrymeela, and ecumenically organise a St Patrick's Night Dance every year to raise funds for this cause. A few years ago, members of the Group visited Belfast and Ballycastle to see for themselves the work of the Community. The Group also assist at the Whitechapel

Mission for the Homeless every sixth Sunday of the year, helping in the kitchens and shower rooms. We are also members of the Stansted Fun Run Committee which began in response to the Live Aid Appeal in 1985 and has taken place annually since then, the proceeds being divided between a local, national and international charity. This event is now linked into the Stansted Festival Weekend.

Three years ago Shalom group members, inspired by the example of the Rev'd Neal at Horncastle, set up 'Regular Aid for the Poor' (RAP). This is a structured arrangement whereby contributors - who could be anyone - donate a sum of money to three well-known charities - at present Oxfam, Save the Children and the Red Cross. These organisations have shown that they provide continuing aid for the deprived as well as being able to respond to specific crises. The system operates on a monthly basis by envelope or banker's order. Upwards of £2,000 has been raised annually and the latest indications are that membership is holding up well. A renewal is being planned shortly to which it is hoped that 'Link' readers will respond. The overall responsibility for RAP has recently passed to Churches Together in Stansted.

Perhaps I should point out that whatever Shalom is, it is <u>not</u> another church or sect. Almost all its members are active week by week in their mainstream churches.

I hope that this resumé gives readers a better idea of Shalom, which is a Hebrew word that embraces sharing and fellowship. Membership is open to all, so if you feel that this is something that expresses your feeling for the outgoing aspects of life, please come and join us. Meeting dates and venues regularly appear in 'Link'.


The new term is well underway and our new football game was very well received. It took us a little while to get it together but once all the screws were in place everyone wanted to join in the fun.
