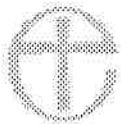

Who is my neighbour?

This column is being written during Christian Aid Week and three weeks before local and national elections. The two events are connected because Christian Aid is about building a better world for people on the planet, and local and national politics are about wanting a better world for ourselves.

However, as we have seen in America, the way we vote doesn't only affect our own world, but it has implications for everyone who breathes the same air that we do, wherever they live in the world.

Whatever we thought of the end of the American Presidential elections, we are cannot but be directly affected by its outcome. President George W Bush announced that he had no intention of honouring the Kyoto Protocol for the reduction of greenhouse gases. This is not simply a decision that affects Americans, it has consequences for us all. It's almost as if he has declared war on humankind.

Nowadays, you don't have to fire cruise missiles to kill civilians on the other side of the world, or to lay landmines to injure children yet unborn. You just have to carry on living as if extravagance and air conditioning are your birthright.

The way we live is probably not going to kill us, but it will kill our grandchildren.

If we care anything for the future, we have to act now. Those who would represent us in government need to know that change is going to hurt, but we have no choice, neither do our political candidates.

Uttlesford District Council is well on the way to rolling out a recycling programme that is at least the equal of anything in the country, we have to be sure that we elect national representatives who will make it easier for local government to continue programmes which aim to save us and our children from choking in our own effluent and reducing the planet to a cinder.

The way we trade already kills the inhabitants of countries which are so crippled by servicing the interest on debt repayments, that they cannot develop the health and agricultural resources to engage in world commerce.

Although Christian Aid Week is past, St John's donates to this charity's causes through the year. Even a few pounds has the power to make a real difference to organisations like Christian Aid which are committed to addressing the causes of world poverty, and are actively working to heal and restore so many who suffer from its effects.

All of the changes in the world have started with local people acting for change. The way we vote in the forthcoming elections June and what we give in Christian Aid Week are two ways in which each of us will have made something possible for somebody else today and everyone tomorrow.

Ever since seventeenth century Quakers were persecuted so savagely for their beliefs, they have held a special concern for prisoners and unfortunates, and all those rejected by society. Our fundamental Quaker belief is that there is good, or God, in everyone makes it impossible for us to believe that anyone is beyond redemption and, in the tradition of Elizabeth Fry and other Quaker prison reformers, we favour restorative rather than retributive justice. Restorative justice (justice without retribution or vengeance) means restoring the balance disturbed by crime and making good the harm caused to those concerned.

Stansted Quakers give warm support to a therapeutic community working in the tradition of restorative justice. It was founded in 1969 and is managed by the Friends' Therapeutic Community Trust, which aims to provide a stable environment where disturbed and vulnerable young men, who have the potential to make trouble for society, can mature emotionally, socially, educationally and physically. Lying, stealing and violence are not merely modes of behaviour but symptoms of deep emotional deprivation and the staff hold determinedly on to the idea that young people whose feelings are "deep-frozen" can be helped to reverse their trauma. All the staff, domestic, administrative and therapeutic, work as a team to give strong and loving support to young men who have never before experienced this and who constantly fear to be hurt, let down or abandoned. All have experienced abuse at the hands of adults and some have begun to commit crimes mirroring their childhood experiences.

Locking up adolescents is costly, ineffective and usually unnecessary, seeking to contain rather than reduce crime. The Community is not a secure unit, but Residents, as the young men are called, hardly ever run away. Control depends on the establishment of valued and trusting relationships with the skilled and well-supported staff. Feelings such as anger and irritation are acceptable and non-abusive ways of expressing them are encouraged. Violence, however, is totally unacceptable any violence is explored within personal and group therapy.

The staff have succeeded in creating a warm family atmosphere and they try to work in a way that helps the Residents regain their self-respect and discover their strengths. Last Christmas I went to their pantomime, a hilarious and well-produced entertainment, and happened to sit next to the social worker of one of the Residents who had arrived a year ago, anxious, hyperactive, truculent and defiant. When she saw the beam of delight on his face as he accepted an Oscar for his performance (they all got Oscars!)

she said "I never would have believed that he could look like that!"

The Community is an inspiring place to visit. Certainly there are difficult incidents but in general there is humour, commitment and purposeful creative activity. New ideas are constantly bubbling to the surface and new projects begun. I hope that eventually we will be able to spend some of the huge sums of money spent on keeping young people in prison on places like the Community, where loving kindness and the belief in forgiveness and redemption hold sway.

Colin and Heather Horner

It is seldom that we can meet a couple both of whose known roots in NW Essex go back to the 17th Century and probably earlier. Colin's family hails from Manuden, having moved there from Thaxted in the 1730's. When he refers to going to "The Street" (Lower Street to us incomers) you know you are with a genuine Essex native. Colin came to Stansted in 1942 and first lived in St John's Road. He attended the Council School on Chapel Hill under Mr Enoch, a headmaster in the old tradition. An apocryphal story is that pupils surreptitiously measured the length of his cane (known as 'the Stocker') at the beginning and end of each term to determine the wear and tear. Colin then went to Newport Grammar School before obtaining jobs with Lauritzen Boiler Treatment and the Lee Valley Water Co. Having married Heather in 1957 they moved to Hatfield. In 1961 he went as a mature student to Hockerill College and afterwards taught at Stewards Comprehensive in Harlow and Helena Romanes in Dunmow, specialising in biology and environmental sciences. They returned to Stansted in 1967 and from 1975 to 1999 Colin was employed with Herts County Council in educational administration.

Heather's mother was a member of the Hutley family whose records go back to 1691. Heather was born in Bambers Green and came to Stansted in 1950. She went to St Mary's Primary School followed by the Secondary School on Chapel Hill. She became competent in shorthand and typing and went on to work at Rowneybury, Nockolds Solicitors in Bishop's Stortford and Skyways before moving to Hatfield where she worked at de Havillands. The next few years were given to raising their three children Ysanne, Calvin and Kieran. In 1975 she took up what was to be her profession from that time to this, that of Beauty Therapist. Heather maintains that her skills in craft and manual dexterity are her principle asset, a view which would be endorsed by her many clients over more than 20 years. Both Colin and Heather have a rich fund of anecdotes from the past half century, with a lively sense of humour to go with them.

Colin's great relaxation was cricket. He joined the Stansted club, as scorer, in 1946 and opened the innings for the first XI from 1950. His best season brought him 867 runs. He became a M.C.C. Youth Cricket Coach in 1955 and is delighted to know that many of his boys went on to shine in the game. He was coach when Stansted won the prestigious Myles Routledge Cup in 1972.

Away from Stansted the name Horner is synonymous with roses. As so often happens, the beginnings were unremarkable. He was intrigued by his grandfather breeding canaries with goldfinches. The purchase of a book on roses at Poole's shop in the village gave him on one page the basic practical guidelines on breeding. In the mid-sixties he began

breeding and growing-on the seedlings then, as now, in his lean-to greenhouse and allotment. He became captivated by the qualities to be looked for and developed a skill in selection which is part experience and part intuition. He learned the need for patience for it takes up to 10 years for a new variety to reach commercial production. For many years he has raised between 2 and 3 thousand seedlings each year. Colin joined the Royal National Rose Society in 1969 and had his first rose selected for trial in 1971. The first award winner was raised in 1976 and the first coveted Trial Ground Certificate in 1982 with the variety 'Champagne Cocktail'. Since then he has won the Torridge Award for Amateur Breeders seven times. Many of Colin's 70 registered names are now distributed world wide, the principal countries being the UK, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand with some 30 currently in commerce. Heather has been a willing partner in rose breeding as it often fell to her to emasculate the female parent flowers when Colin was at work. She has some varieties to her credit, including the award winning 'Marjorie May'. Other Horner roses to have achieved acclaim include 'Celebration 2000', 'Golden Future', 'Isabel Derby' and in 1996 'Starry Eyed' which won a Gold Medal. Colin was elected to the R.N.R.S. Council in 1991 and was Chairman of the International Trials Committee from 1994-1998. He became Deputy President for 1997-1999 and then gained the rose world's highest honour in 1999 when he was elected President, an office he holds until this summer. Colin and Heather have travelled widely on behalf of the R.N.R.S., including the USA, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand. It is the Link's pleasure to mark Colin's Presidency in these columns and to offer our congratulations on achieving such a well-earned distinction.

Back in Stansted Colin is one of that all-too-small band of drivers who provide transport for the Huw Johnson Club, of which Kieran was once a member. Heather also helps with beauty demonstrations for the members. The early years under Mr Enoch have obviously done Colin no harm as he and Heather bring two well-rounded personalities into Stansted and beyond and we are privileged to have them in our midst.

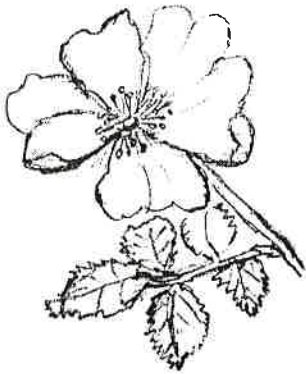
Capturing The Scent Of A Rose

This month marks the transition from spring to summer. Crops in the fields are developing fast. Where oil seed rape has been sown the plants are now in bloom, the flowers collectively creating a continuous sheet of golden yellow in the surrounding fields of Stansted village.

This is the time when wild roses come into bloom with arching sprays of the dog rose (*Rosa Canina*) rambling through the hedge bearing five petalled fragrant flowers varying in colour from deep pink to white sprays, followed by red hips in autumn.

The dog rose does have a scent of its own which you can capture by an ages-old and simple method.

Pick the flowers at the peak of opening in the morning but when dry of dew, remove the petals and lay them on white paper (not newspaper). Spread the petals thinly, never more than one layer deep otherwise they will begin to turn brown and rot; turn them every day for a week or two, until they are quite dry. Most leaves and flowers can be dried this way and put in jars as pot pourri as a reminder of summer for winter evenings.

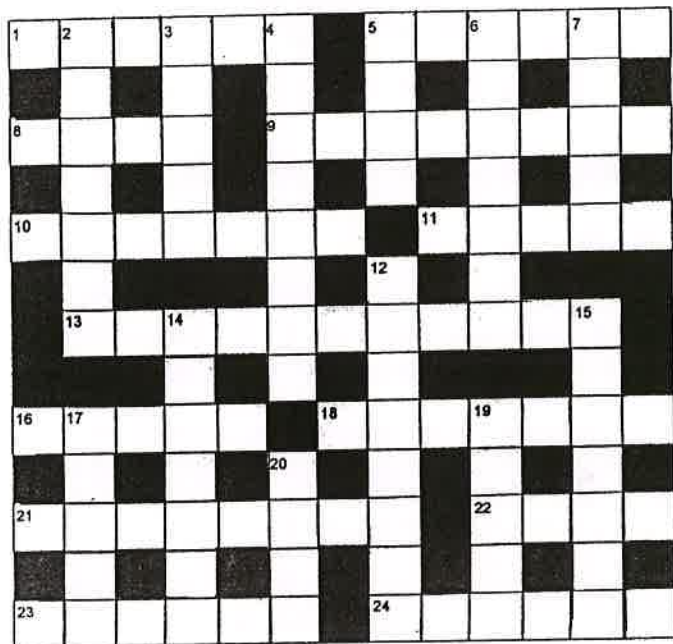

Recipe of the Month

Rhubarb Cream

- 1 teaspoon vegetable oil
- 1 lb / 450 gm cooked rhubarb
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 3 oz / 75 gm sugar
- 10 fl oz / ½ pint double cream
- 4 eggs, separated
- ½ oz / 15 gm gelatine

- (a) grease 2 pint / 1 litre mould with the oil
- (b) place cooked rhubarb in large mixing bowl
- (c) stir in lemon juice and sugar
- (d) add more sugar if needed
- (e) beat cream and egg yolks in medium sized heatproof mixing bowl
- (f) place bowl over a pan of hot water
- (g) cook mixture until thickened
- (h) remove pan from heat
- (i) beat custard into the rhubarb
- (j) dissolve gelatine in 4 tablespoons hot water
- (k) beat into mixture and leave to cool
- (l) fold in egg whites
- (m) pour into prepared mould
- (n) refrigerate for 4 hours

WHAT'S IN A NAME NO. 8

Occasional Series

Blythwood Gardens. Originally Wood House stood here adjoining Silver Street. When James Blyth (later the first Baron Blyth of Stansted Mountfitchet) purchased the estate it became known as Blythwood. The house was burnt down in 1926 and a new one built further back from the main road in 1928. The second Lord Blyth gave the windmill to the village.

White Bear. A coaching Inn of this name stood on the site of the house now known as Little Fosters, which was the East Lodge for Hargrave House. This inn was at one time owned by Daniel Gilbey, grandfather of Sir Walter Gilbey. Sir Walter's father was born there.

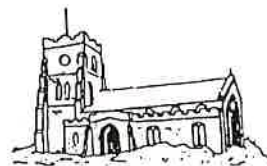

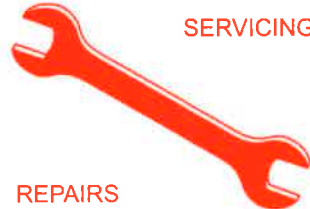
