

Peace on Earth, Goodwill to all Men

In late September I was in Saffron Walden helping to celebrate the Tercentenary of Friends' School. The school was founded by a Quaker, John Bellars, in 1702. It was to be "A college of Industry of all useful TRADES and Husbandry, with profits for the RICH, a Plentiful Living for the POOR and a Good Education for YOUTH..."

Friends' School started in Clerkenwell, London, as a combined workhouse and school. It was not the first Quaker School, but is the only one in England to have survived for 300 years without a break. The initial premises in Clerkenwell were unsuitable to continue as a combined school and workhouse so the school moved a short distance to Islington in 1786. As London grew and houses and factories surrounded the school another move was contemplated and in 1825 the 75 boys and 75 girls moved to Croydon, which was then only a small town. However, Croydon grew and the health of the children began to suffer so a search began for a new site. Saffron Walden was chosen, mainly because of a gift of land from a local Quaker and banker, one George Stacey Gibson, who also donated to many other establishments in Saffron Walden. The school on it's present site opened in 1879 as separate boys and girls schools, however, in 1910 the schools combined and co-education began. This must have been one of the first co-educational boarding schools in the country.

Part of the celebrations was a procession from the school down through Saffron Walden, then on to the Castle Museum and to the green areas surrounding the Castle. Here a pageant was organised as well as a giant Bar-B-Q to feed the large number of people, who had processed to the Castle. The procession had all the current pupils and staff dressed in Quaker costume, with the youngest Junior School pupils in the oldest costume right through to the current Sixth form in present day school uniform. It created quite a spectacle with the school children carrying banners depicting some Ouaker concerns through the ages. The main theme of the banners was that of Pacifism and Peace-making. On that same Saturday there was an

Anti-war march through the streets of London alerting people to the threatened war in Iraq. It was good to think that Saffron Walden was having its own Pacifist and Peaceful march through it's streets.

Now with Christmas approaching I would like to wish you all a Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year.

The Enemy Within

Many of us who haven't lived in Stansted for years, have been on a steep learning curve this autumn. I'm talking about the Government's proposals for the development of Stansted Airport.

Some of what I have learned has been heartening. It has been good to be able to spend time with veterans in the business of resisting airport development, hearing stories of past campaigns. I have not yet been able to understand why the following generation of Stansted residents has been slower to move into coherent political action. For many, life is already spun out too thin. The church is not the only voluntary organisation to hear the plea, 'we feel we should get involved but, we haven't got enough time', so too with the Stop Stansted Expansion Campaign, I regularly hear the complaint that there is no time.

A more insidious view is the one which says that the Government's proposals are a done deal; it was all decided years ago. I know these plans have been kicking around Whitehall for decades, but that doesn't mean to say that they are good, right or just. The more people think like this, the more likely is the expansion going to happen.

The second most common view I have heard is that, if life around here becomes intolerable, then we'll simply move somewhere else.

What troubles me about all these responses is the underlying assumption that living in a

community is provisional. We'll stay as long as it suits us, then go somewhere else.

This is ironic when you consider how many of us move out here to raise children, and belong to a place with a sense of community. I don't know where we think the sense of community comes from, but if Stansted is made up of people who want to join a community that someone else has made, and be able to opt in, or out, then very quickly those on the periphery outnumber those who have been here a long time. Before we know it, everyone is here provisionally, and then we start complaining about lack of common life, lack of community, and a feeling that no-one would notice if one if us suddenly disappeared.

I have buried enough people in my life to know that, at the end of our days, we can be measured in terms of what we have given to those around us, and the stories that can be told about us, if we stay in one place long enough for people to know who we are, know our good and bad sides, and still be able to celebrate us when we are gone.

We can't live without belonging to someplace, and to some people. This is why we have to make the effort to ensure that we have a decent future here, and admit the possibility that we may belong here.







Much discussion is taking place over the future of Stansted Airport. However, at our meeting on 7th November, Mr Richard Hauls, a Senior Archaeologist of Essex County Council, told us something of what has happened there over the past 15 thousand years. Traces of early hunters, enclosures from the Bronze and Iron Ages, Roman settlements and Medieval remains have all been discovered, although no evidence of the Saxons. One theory is that we are today living in villages which have grown from the earlier Saxon settlements.

Prior to any building at the airport the archaeologists have, for nearly 20 years, examined the ground for previous uses of the land. BAA retains a firm of specialist archaeological contractors to work with the County's experts and many interesting (and occasionally valuable) discoveries have been made. Many of the finds are in the safe-keeping of Saffron Walden Museum.

Next month we return to more modern times when Mrs Olive Bunting will be speaking on "the Stansted Post Office". This will be at 8pm on 5th December at the Day Centre - see you then.

REMINISCENCES

Mr, Edward Laird of Water Lane has numerous recollections and friends from Stansted's past. He has written to remind older residents of the redoubtable Mr I G Mitchell, who was headmaster of the Boys section of the British School in Chapel Hill from 1925 to 1943. He keeps in touch with his son Robin, an old Newportian, who although now retired, writes and publishes on Maori issues in New Zealand, as well as raising Clematis hybrids, some of which have been exported to this country. He also recalls a cousin of the Mitchell's, Mr Torey, one time self taught organist at St. John's Church, who had a family grocery business in what is now a Chinese Takeaway on the west side of Station Road.

Another historical chronicle has been brought to our notice by Susan Bone, nee Robinson, which records the adventures of a relation, Thomas Jordan, in the mid-XIX century. He too ended his days in the Antipodes. The Local History Society has the opportunity to analyse his life, which was spent between milling and being a sailor.

Stansted Airport Update

Many thanks to all those readers who voted in the referendum. It was a fantastic result. In total, 69% of ballot papers were returned with a massive 89% supporting the Council in its opposition to more runways. The referendum results will be handed into 10 Downing Street and the Department of Transport on Tuesday 19 November.

The Council's Airport Advisory Panel, of which Alan Dean and I are members, has been meeting weekly in preparing a response to the SERAS consultation document.

At the last full council meeting all councillors signed a pledge card which committed them to campaign for no more runways at Stansted. The card details six reasons for the council's opposition. It would mean:

- A monster airport twice the size of Heathrow;
- Bulldozing the countryside. Thousands of acres would be lost:
- Concrete from London to Cambridge. If expansion went ahead it is estimated that a town twice the size of Chelmsford would need to be built in the countryside;
- Unacceptable noise pollution;
- Overheating the local economy. The monster airport will further overheat the local economy at the expense of other regions;
- More aircraft cramming into increasingly congested airspace. Airspace over London and the South East is already the most congested in the UK. Adding thousands more flights to this crowded area will increase the risk of accidents, the need for stacking of aircraft and levels of pollution.

The future of council housing in Uttlesford

Uttlesford is the largest landlord in the district and owns approximately 3,200 dwellings of which some 250 are in Stansted. The question of whether Uttlesford should continue to be a landlord was discussed at our last fullcouncil meeting. The Conservative/Independent Administration believes that the housing stock should be transferred to a housing association. With proposed changes to capital receipts from right to buy sales they feel that the Council will no longer be able to afford to maintain the stock. Opposition members however feel that such a move was premature and needed greater examination. Our tenants are happy with the Council as their landlord and have repeatedly expressed their opposition to a transfer. Housing Association rents also tend to be higher than a Council's. The Administration's proposal to start the process of transfer was defeated by 18 votes to 16. Liberal Democrat and Labour councillors together with one Independent opposed the motion.

My position remains clear. As stated in The Link October 2000, I would only support a stock transfer if it could be shown to be in the interest of tenants.

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

Readers will by now be well aware of the actions in hand to resist the development of the airport and very probably will have given their vote for or against.

Presently and in support of this, the County Council is actively involved in exploring the arguments which can be advanced to persuade the Secretary of State that the airport should not be enlarged. Already the subject has been debated in Committee and will be debated again at the end of this month, after the reports of the experts retained by the County in conjunction with Hertfordshire have been received. Finally, the County Council itself will debate the matter again on 10th December prior to the County's report and opinion being submitted to the Secretary of State. Readers cannot claim after this anything other than the subject has been carefully and comprehensively discussed and reviewed, and that the matter has been fully explored. At this time it would be wrong to outline details of the likely lines of the opinion, and what will be recommended to the Secretary of State, but again readers must remember that the subject is a matter for decision under planning and environment law. Therefore, and for this reason, the result of the deliberations must be based on these principles and to say merely that it should not happen is not good enough.

Readers can be assured that the defence will be as soundly based as possible in order that the Secretary of State is persuaded that no future development should take place.
