

A 'NEW' LINK

This is the last issue of the 'Link' format with which you are familiar. The 'Link' which will come out in November may seem different at first glance but, as you will soon realise, essentially it will be the 'Link' that you have known.

The changes are:

- It will have coloured covers with three pages of full-colour advertising
- It will contain Parish Council and other local authority items in the centre pages
- You will receive it at no cost
- It will be delivered under contract to every house and business in Stansted plus the Rochford development as it moves towards completion
- It will contain a contents index and some new features
- The 11th of the month is the date for last receipt of copy rather than the variable dates that have applied in the past. Because of more demanding printing and distribution timings, we have a tighter production schedule and must therefore make the 11th of the month the date after which no copy can be accepted. So no more late copy please it just won't go in that month!

The 'Link' will still contain reports, news and a village events page as at present. The Editor, Advertising Co-ordinators and Distribution Secretary will continue to be available, so please let them know how you feel about the changes, as we are always pleased to hear from you.

The most significant point, and the principal reason why the change has been made, is that the 'Link' will not only go to every home but will include within one magazine all the Stansted news and information which is fed to the Editor. For readers outside Stansted, the 'Link' will continue to be available, largely by the same means that it is received now, but a charge of £5 annually or 50p per copy will be made.

For the first year we are grateful for a grant from the Parish Council to help us through the transition. It is, however, our firm intention to become self-financing as soon as possible. The 'Link' remains an independent publication produced by local volunteers. Although it includes local authority copy it is not an 'officially' produced publication.

Finally, an appeal for your understanding. Our distributors will need to familiarise themselves with their new area and there may be a few cases where in the early days houses may be missed. Normally distribution will take place between the 25th and 27th of the previous month, so if you have not received your copy by the last day of the month, please give Janet Townsend a ring on 812593 or email distribution@stanstedlink.org.uk.

Praise God for the harvest

Late September and early October seems to be the time when the churches celebrate harvest festivals. It's a time to stop and recognise that we depend on the earth to feed us, on the labour of others to supply our food and on the provision of the Creator whose work underlies everything. Certainly the theme of harvest will dominate the next few weeks for me as I attend thanksgivings in schools and in churches; and several well provisioned harvest suppers!

In the Bible the theme of harvest is often used as a metaphor for our human existence. In the Book of Revelation there is a wonderfully cartoon-like description of the beginning of God's judgement of the earth as an angel sitting on a cloud reaps the earth with a sickle – a reminder to us that this world is not as permanent as we sometimes assume it is. Certainly for each one of us there comes a point when the harvest of our lives is gathered in. Jesus told a story about a man who gathers vast amounts of goods into his barns only to hear God say to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And these things you have prepared, whose will they be?" Harvest calls on us to stop and reflect on where our lives, the life of our community, and the life of our planet are going.

It's a reflection we desperately need nowadays. As I see the busyness of life around

us I'm sometimes reminded of the story of the person who sees a horse and rider dashing down the road at an alarming rate. "Where are you going to at such a speed?" the bystander calls out to the rider. "Ask the horse", shouts back the rider, "I'm just trying to stay on!" In the twenty-first century, life can be a bit like that for everyone at one time or another.

Harvest, then, is a time for looking back and looking forward. Looking back in thankfulness for the good things we received from God and through the labour of others, and pausing to look forward and consider the harvest that we are growing in our lives; the people we are becoming and the legacy we will leave behind us.

And finally, of course, harvest calls us to action. It's no use sitting reflecting if our reflection does not lead to action. Whether it's choosing the 'Fair Trade' option, turning off the tap to save water, or not leaving the TV powered up on the 'standby' setting – or whether it is something vastly more costly and life changing than any of those things – there are things that we can all do to make the world a better place. We just need to think about it, and harvest can be a good time to do that.



UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

For the second month running the hot topic is planning. Last month I wrote about central Government plans to change the system for dealing with major projects such as airport runways. This month the issue is much closer to home and concerns an important decision about future housing in Uttlesford.

The Council has been consulting on what is known as the Local Development Framework; a plan for the future of Uttlesford that will take us into the 2020s. Plans have to be made for the allocation of 4,200 homes on top of some 5,000 that are already planned or built. It is reasonable to expect that some of these will eventually be planned in or around Stansted and over recent months questionnaires have been completed by residents and others about how the homes should be distributed across the district. Should they be evenly spread across all towns and villages? Just in the towns and larger villages? Concentrated mainly in Dunmow, Saffron Walden and Stansted? Or would a completely new settlement be the right way to go? What is not an option is to do nothing.

To make the right decision first requires principles or criteria to be established against which any particular option can be evaluated. It is fair to say that such criteria have not yet been drawn up so none has yet been explained to the public.

It was a major surprise to many of us when our District Council officers produced a report in September, which bypassed the stage of agreeing criteria and jumped straight to the next stage of recommending options with specific housing number and locations. Members were asked to choose their preferred option from three proposals. The first would place 470 homes to the north of Stansted Mountfitchet village. The second and third would place 30 homes in Stansted, north of St Theresa's Church. Our officers dismissed the idea of a new settlement.

But the real bombshell came only just before the committee meeting, when the Conservative administration announced a proposal for a new town of 3,000 homes on land at Elsenham east of the railway line and growing towards Henham as their preferred option. They voted this through. No papers were tabled about this plan. There was no technical justification beyond vague ideas that it would bring about new facilities like a secondary school, shops, etc. The proposal is not backed by our professional planning officers.

The following day it was discovered that the promoter of this scheme would make no road improvements in and out of Elsenham, which would put significant congestion onto Grove Hill and the centre of Stansted as well as places like Ugley Green. But the potential developer has also said that he would take advantage of new roads that BAA proposes to put into the Elsenham area were a second runway given permission. He has also said that a quarter of the resident workers of the new town would work at the airport provided the jobs from a second runway were created. Needless to say, this has caused enormous consternation.

An extraordinary meeting of the Council's South-West Area Panel has been demanded at Elsenham Primary School on either 26th or 28th September with the aim of providing some explanation to the public. Meanwhile, the decision has been 'called-in' by several councillors. This means that the decision has effectively been put into suspense until it is investigated by the Council's Scrutiny Committee on 3rd October at 7.30pm. The Scrutiny Committee could vote to take no action or ask the Council to think again. As I write this in the middle of September, I cannot say what is likely to happen. What I am sure about is that a big mistake has been made that has serious long-term implications for all of us. I would urge anyone who has an interest in the future of this area to try to get to the Scrutiny Committee meeting or to make your views known by other means.

Mountfitchet Green

The Council is working with the Parish Council to deliver a multi-use games area aimed at the 10-19 age group. This would complement the nearby existing equipped play area for ages 4-8. A bid has gone into the National Lottery. If successful, this will deliver a much needed leisure facility for this part of the village.

Short Stay Managed Accommodation

Following discussions with residents the Council is proceeding with the redevelopment of the old garage site in Manor Road. A formal planning application will be shortly made to the Council, followed by a bid for funds to the Housing Corporation. This will reduce the need to use expensive bed and breakfast accommodation and should be built within the next two years. The accommodation will house an office as a point of contact.

Tenant Forum

If you are a UDC tenant have you considered putting your name forward for the forum? The forum represents tenants' views and is regularly consulted by the Council. It has representation on the Community Committee which is responsible for housing matters. For several years there has been no tenant representation from Stansted I should very much like this to change. If you want to influence council housing policy please contact the tenant participation officer on 01799 510571.

Community Achievement Awards Scheme

This scheme was launched in 1996 to mark the significant voluntary work carried out by people across Uttlesford. If you know of someone who you feel worthy of an award please contact the Parish Council for details. The closing date is 12th October.

Local Development Framework

The proposed 3,000 housing development in Elsenham, if it is approved, represents a significant threat to the quality of life to Stansted residents. I believe it would have a significant adverse affect on Stansted. Already at peak times our roads are severely congested; can they withstand even more traffic? I hope residents, once the consultation period begins, make their views heard.



He was pushed by his tall athletic son, who was a track runner, and while crossing a three-lane highway with Jim, thought he had better get a move on to miss a bus that was coming towards them at speed, and ran with Jim in the chair. His leg, which was plastered up to the thigh, stuck out before him. Unfortunately they hit a kerb and Jim shot out of the chair like a jet propelled missile and landed on the sidewalk. Linda, still in the middle reservation, collapsed with laughter. She told this tale with her usual flourishes of dramatics and had us in gales of laughter. However, Jim was OK. When Jim retired they came back to live in England. She made the joke he had a medical condition that could only be cured in England - with a pint of Greene King bitter! As she says, when things go wrong they make a good story.

Our speaker for our next meeting on 11th October is Ilse Pedler, who is giving us *A Veterinary Talk* in St John's Hall at 7.45pm - all are welcome. The competition will be *An Animal Ornament*. 

Nature Notes

Hedges forming field boundaries are particularly beautiful in the autumn months with both leaves and berries displaying a wide range of colours. Blackthorn and hawthorn, both members of the rose family, are common shrubs in local hedges. Blackthorn produces dark bluish-black sloe berries which are very astringent (but provides an excellent flavour in sloe gin). Hawthorn (also known as whitethorn or May tree) has deep red edible fruits, the haws, which this year are especially plentiful. The amount of berries may be affected by weather during the previous summer when the flower buds are being formed.

The leaves of the blackthorn turn lemon yellow, contrasting with the orange gold colour of the field maple. This is our only native maple. It tends to grow on the more chalky soil which is found to the north and west of Stansted. The dogwood shrub also prefers calcareous soil. It is quite inconspicuous in spring but its leaves turn a deep red in early autumn. Its inedible berries are black. Dogwood was originally 'dagwood' – its hard wood was used for butchers' skewers or 'dags'.

spindle contains gutta-percha. It grows in Lime Kiln Lane where the chalk outcrops.

It is surprising how many members of the rose family (rosaceae), apart from blackthorn and hawthorn, are found in hedges: wild plums, cherries, apples, blackberries ... The true crab apple is rare but 'wildings' are quite common. These grow from discarded pips which can produce any variety but still with traces of their ancient ancestors. Blackberries abound in almost any hedge. Over 400 micro species have been recognised in Britain, with subtle variations in flavour, texture, size and time of fruiting. The related dewberry, which is usually very sweet, is more prostrate and has a bloom on its fruits.

Boundary hedges are now known to be several hundred years older than previously thought. Many hedges still grow on the same spot as those of a thousand years ago. In the 1970s Max Hooper formulated the following equation of dating a hedge: the number of tree and shrub species in a 30 yard stretch of hedge equals the age of the hedge in centuries. This rule will obviously have exceptions but it is an interesting exercise to try out next time you walk along a well established hedge.



MOUNTFITCHET GARDEN CLUB

A large group of members and visitors welcomed Mr and Mrs Greenway of Priorswood Clematis, near Ware, to our September meeting who came to enlighten us on growing clematis. Mr and Mrs Greenway have successfully run a clematis nursery for many years exhibiting annually at Tatton, Malvern and Chelsea. Their nursery has over 400 varieties of clematis from all over the world including Russia and America. They brought many colourful and showing varieties and their slide show offered other tempting varieties.

Mr Greenway emphasised the importance of correct planting. Clematis are deep rooted plants and need a deep hole (about 2 ft). Incorporate a lot of manure in the whole and heel in firmly. Mound well rotted manure around the clematis and water well. Clematis are very thirsty plants. The best time for planting clematis is October to March. If a clematis is to be grown in a pot, choose a deep pot and put crocks in the bottom. Line the inside of the pot with firstly tin foil (shiny facing inside) then an inner layer of newspaper and use multi-purpose compost. Water the clematis well and keep out of direct sunlight. As regards pruning, if you are unsure, the safest bet is to cut back after flowering. A thoroughly enjoyable evening. Mr Greenway had a very keen sense of humour. He answered many questions interspersed with witty anecdotes. Do visit the clematis nursery. You will be warmly welcomed.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 3rd October, 7.30pm for 8.00pm when a local man from Bishop's Stortford, Mr Adam Woolcott, will be giving a talk on 'Designing a Show Garden for Chelsea'. He is a gold medal winner! Visitors are most welcome.

Pesterford Bridge 2005 - 2007



How it was



The ostensible reason for the protracted bridge works is the development of some 700 houses on the Rochford Nursery site. Work should have started in November 05 with a declared completion date of November 06 but the programme suffered severe slippage.

The Forest Hall Road junction would not have been capable of taking the greatly increased traffic load that will be generated. Moreover it is a planning condition that house building could not proceed in advance of the junction improvement. We now seem to have reached that stage.





The extended construction time has been one of great frustration to road users who suffered a 24 hour single line roadway for several months on end. A swear box at the junction could almost have paid for the scheme!

A superficial look does not indicate much difference – just more barrier rails and a slightly wider roadway. However, as with all bridge and tunnel works, much has been done that remains unseen. The photograph of Stansted Brook where it passes beneath the road and railway gives some idea of this. Perhaps time (and familiarity) will soften the scene.

Now for the real test. We wait to see how the junction will work when the houses arrive!



Report on July Lunch

In July, Daniel Robinson & Sons and Weston Business Centres together sponsored the Lunch at the Stansted Centre in Takeley for the benefit of St Clare Hospice of Hastingwood. St Clare provides specialist palliative care services for the population of its bailiwick, the area bounded to the North by Saffron Walden; to the East by Great Dunmow; to the South by Loughton and Buckhurst Hill; and to the West by Bishop's Stortford.

Some 50 members and around a dozen guests heard Richard Cowie, St Clare's Chief Executive, and Melanie Nightingale, St Clare's Director of Fundraising, outline the nature of St Clare's excellent palliative care services which help many suffering from cancer or a number of other terminal illnesses, to live their lives to the fullest possible extent without undue suffering and pain. They also described the extent to which St Clare cares for, and provides bereavement counselling to the families of its patients over the months preceding death, and the months following bereavement.

All these services are provided free of charge by a professional team of clinical and support staff including fundraising, shop and administrative staff, and over 500 volunteers who give their time in a wide range of activities from clinical support to gardening. STOP STANSTED EXPANSION

Support the British Economy - Stop Stansted Expansion

On 10th September, SSE launched a new phase in its campaign aimed at raising awareness of the adverse impact upon the UK economy of the inexorable growth in cheap leisure flights. SSE's new campaign signboards feature the Union Flag alongside the SSE campaign logo with the message 'SUPPORT THE BRITISH ECONOMY – STOP STANSTED EXPANSION'.

Figures published by the Office of National Statistics in August show that the UK tourism deficit continues to grow rapidly. During the first six months of this year, UK residents took 34.3 million overseas trips - almost double the number of trips to the UK by foreign visitors (17.5 million). The difference in expenditure was even more marked. UK residents spent £17.7 billion abroad during the first six months of 2007 compared to £7.9 billion spent by foreign visitors to the UK. The dramatic deterioration in the UK trade balance on inward and outward tourism over the past ten years coincides with the boom in cheap leisure flights, and SSE has provided extensive evidence to the current Stansted Airport Public Inquiry to demonstrate that BAA's proposed expansion of Stansted Airport would give rise to an even bigger UK trade deficit and cause further damage to the UK and East of England tourism industry.

BAA is seeking permission to handle an additional 10 million passengers a year at Stansted Airport (more than either Luton or Birmingham Airports currently handle) but admits that just 290,000 of the extra passengers would be business passengers (145,000 round trips) and that the additional capacity would primarily cater for more and more UK residents on cheap leisure breaks overseas.

The purpose of this new phase in our campaign is to raise awareness of the adverse economic consequences of expanding Stansted Airport and to encourage a wider debate so as to challenge the longstanding myth that airport expansion is always good for the economy. Approving further expansion of Stansted Airport would undoubtedly serve the interests of its Spanish-owners and its main customer, Irish-owned Ryanair but this would entirely be at the expense of the UK economy and of the many thousands of taxpaying local residents around the airport who would suffer the consequences.


