Thanks for your welcome

Last Sunday evening a visitor to Farnham Church asked me how long I had been Rector, and when I answered that I had been in post three weeks they expressed a surprise that I found myself sharing. It does seem a long while since we watched all our worldly goods being packed into a removal van in Hornchurch and saw them depart into the distance and then leaped into the car and drove up the MII to await the van's arrival. I have been told that moving and changing one's job are some of the most stressful things it is possible to do, and I have to say that it certainly felt like it! Yet (with the notable exception of British Telecom) we did find that everyone was as helpful as possible and did everything they could to smooth our way.

The induction service, which took place on the evening of 30th July, was a real high point in my ministry and an inspiring beginning to my time as Rector of the United Benefice. My thanks go out to all who were involved in organising the service and the refreshments afterwards; and to all who have done so much to make my family and myself feel so welcome here.

My aim in the immediate future is to get to know as many people in the Benefice as possible by visiting them in their homes. You may already have encountered the clip-board that I have taken with me to the three churches in the Benefice. On it I have indicated times when I will be available and have invited people to put their name, address and telephone number (in case I get lost) next to a time and have then gone on to visit people at the times indicated.

All these visits have been times of joy as I begin the process of 'getting to know you'. I intend to keep the clip-board going for as long as it is needed and I hope that eventually I will be able to visit everyone who is a regular or even occasional worshipper in our churches. If you've not put your name down yet, and if you see the clip-board at the back of the church, do take a look to see if there is a time that might be convenient for me to visit you.

I am looking forward (God willing) to a long ministry here amongst you, as together we seek to discover the will of God for this place and seek to play our part in the plans he has for us. The prophet Jeremiah is often regarded as gloomy and pessimistic but one of my favourite passages from his book gives a very different picture:

"I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord"

Jeremiah 29.11-13

Together we go forward in hope, trusting in the plans God has for us and in His power to fulfil them.

Restorative Justice

Quakers have a long history of involvement in the criminal justice system, some of it from the inside! In the 17th century thousands of Quakers were imprisoned for their beliefs and later this made people like Elizabeth Fry keen to reform the cruel practices that held sway in Newgate prison. We believe in original blessing rather than original sin and tend to think that anti-social acts are an expression of the pain of fragmented lives: both the result and the cause of broken relationships in the family and in the community. Certainly there is a need for restraint of those few who are exhibiting dangerous behaviour but we believe that the kind of restraint used and the help offered during that time must reflect our concern for the spark of the divine inherent in every person. Simply leaving people to rot in prison without any meaningful help is a recipe for disaster.

Bob Johnson, a Quaker psychiatrist, spent five years working with or, as he puts it, cross-examining, 60 violent murderers in Parkhurst prison and managed to help them come to terms with and understand their crimes. He realised that unless you know where evil is coming from you can't undo it; whereas if you do, you assuredly can. For him "Eve and the apple myth scores 100% for misogyny but zero for realism". In other words evil is not inherent in man but is man (or woman) made. During his time at Parkhurst he came to the conclusion that all crime, especially murder, comes from fear and anger, which are healthy when taken as a warning but lethal when mixed with the desire to avenge earlier childhood 'injustices'. Alice Miller's book on Hitler shows where his revengeful evil came from!

Working on the premise that twisted revenge is the root of all evil and that to cure it we need to cure the fear that invariably lurks beneath it, Bob managed to help many violent murderers. Initially many inmates threatened to kill him but he persevered and whilst he was at Parkhurst the atmosphere improved enormously. Few prisoners needed to be restrained or have calming drugs administered. Sadly Michael Howard did not support Bob's work and he had to resign. However, he still believes passionately in restorative justice and has set up a private organisation to help all those who struggle to understand their violent impulses.

Be still for the Presence of the Lord

The first two words of the three verses of the above hymn are 'Be Still'. These days are we ever still with so many distractions of modern life. We are never still, we are always on the move, dashing here for this event, or that meeting, even at home where we should relax, we are not still and quiet. The television is on, or we are at the computer; even the radio provides us with distraction.

Is it possible that in the present age we have lost the art, the knowledge of how to be still, being still in the presence of the Lord? There is a discipline in Christian life, called 'meditation', where one is still and can shut out the distractions of every day life. Meditation is not something new to Christian life, but a deeply rooted Christian tradition. Many of us today have lost touch with this ancient tradition of prayer. Meditation involves bringing the heart, mind and body to a stillness, a calm, a shutting out of the hustle and bustle of everyday life. One of the extraordinary things is that, in spite of all the distractions of modern day life, this silence is perfectly possible for all of us. To obtain the silence and stillness we have to devote time, energy and love.

The mind has been described as a mighty tree filled with monkeys, all swinging from branch to branch and all making an incessant riot of chatter and movement. When we begin to meditate, we recognise this as a wonderfully apt description of the constant whirl going on in our minds. Prayer is not a matter of adding to this confusion by trying to shout it down and covering it with another layer of chatter; the art of meditation is to bring our distracted mind to stillness, silence and attentiveness. Meditation is the prayer of silence, the place where direct contact with Christ occurs, once the constant activity of the mind has been stilled. In meditation one goes beyond words, thoughts and images into the presence of God within. Julian of Norwich says, "God is the still point at my centre". Meditation is making one's own daily pilgrimage to one's own centre.

There are many ways of achieving this stillness of the heart, mind and body. First, find somewhere to sit that will allow you to relax while continuing to stay alert. My suggestion is to listen to a piece of music that you can relax with. As the music plays, gently work at maintaining a sense of yourself

as well as the music. Notice how your emotions, thoughts and body sensations change as you listen. As you find your mind drifting away, you can gently bring your attention back to your body and to the music. Listening to the music in this way, your concentration will gradually deepen, and this experience of deep concentration is both extremely pleasurable and deeply satisfying. In fact, it is through this kind of meditation practice that it is possible to completely transcend the painful sense of dislocation that we often experience between the world and ourselves.

The important aim in Christian meditation is to allow God's mysterious presence within us to become more and more not only a reality but the reality which gives meaning, shape and purpose to everything we do, to everything we are!

UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Development Pressures – Where Will All The Housing Go?

One of the most important decisions that the new Council will have to consider is our response to the East of England Regional Plan. Uttlesford has been set a target by the plan to provide 8000 additional houses in the district by 2021. The Regional Plan assumes that Stansted Airport will have two runways. Although it is a government imposed target, the Council does not have the option of doing nothing.

At the recent Area Panel meeting held in Great Hallingbury the Local Development Framework was discussed at some length. Most Parish Councils have responded with their views. Councillors are already being sent details by developers of locations they have identified as suitable for development. The East of England Plan identifies what it calls key service centres. These are settlements that have a primary school, secondary school, shops, village hall, pub, doctors surgery, frequent bus service and a railway station. However, Elsenham meets all the criteria with the exception of a secondary school.

The Colin Buchanan partnership acting on behalf of Crest Homes has identified a 24.9 hectare site to the west of Elsenham near Alsa Woods. A further site has been identified on land east of Elsenham near the railway station and is being promoted by the Fairfield Partnership. They claim that their master plan will be flexible allowing growth from anywhere between 7-800 homes and 3000+ homes.

What may happen in adjoining parishes should be of interest to Stansted as this will have an effect on us. It is important to stress that the Council has not made any decisions on the location of the additional housing. Options will be put forward to the September meeting of the Environment Committee by our planning department for councillors to consider.

As someone who has lived in the district almost all my life, I wish to retain the character of the area as much as possible. I would not be prepared to support large scale additional housing in the immediate area particularly as the Rochford Nurseries development (700 houses) will shortly commence building.

Ward Walks

Stansted ward councillors recently accompanied UDC Chief Executive Alasdair Bovaird on ward walks. This is always helpful as it gives us an opportunity to point out local issues.

Council Finances

There has been some press coverage on this topic. Neither of the two main parties on the Council can reach agreement. The Chief Executive has issued a press release, which sets out objectively the situation. This is available on the Council website. He makes the point that the Council's balances stand at one million pounds. This should be placed in the context of the Council's net annual expenditure of approximately eight million pounds.

Chairman's Challenge

I would like to take the opportunity of telling you about the challenge I have set for myself in my year as Chairman of the District Council. This summer I have visited fêtes around the district giving away free low energy light bulbs and calculating carbon footprints. I have also started bag painting in schools, encouraging pupils to use cotton rather than plastic bags. The challenge is to reduce the carbon footprint of Uttlesford district!

When people find out how large their carbon footprint is, they are given tips on how they can reduce it. These range from things that can be achieved easily, such as not leaving appliances on stand-by, fitting low energy light bulbs to ones that are more painful, like using the car less and taking fewer flights.

Helping me in this is a sterling group, who don't mind giving up Saturdays to stand in the rain and cajole people into answering a few questions. Before the last UDC Council meeting, they measured the footprints of my fellow councillors. There was no 'name and shame' but I did announce the councillor with the smallest footprint, who appropriately was the Council's champion for (or should that be against!) climate change.

So if anyone would like to know the size of their carbon footprint, I will be happy to take measurements. It is quite painless and straightforward, using the 'Carbon Gym' computer programme designed by the Cambridge Centre for Alternative Technology. Then of course there is the challenge – shrink that footprint.

MOUNTFITCHET GARDEN CLUB

Just over 20 members were fortunate with a lovely balmy evening when they visited Pat Barrett's garden in St John's Road for our August meeting. We spent a leisurely time enjoying refreshments and wandering round Pat's garden. There were many oohs and aahs over the many unusual plants and planting.

The theme of the evening was 'Any Questions' mainly so that members could get advice on any particular problems they had in their own gardens. There were some surprising answers and tips. David Lloynds, our expert on hostas, suggested planting bigger, tougher leafed hostas which seem to fare better against slugs. Another member advised that slug pellets need to be in the garden (or pots) by 14th February because slugs find fresh shoots before we can see them.

Cyril Stoneham offered some very useful tips, including putting two tea bags in the bottom of plant pots to boost nitrogen content. He also found that planting sweet peas between runner beans attracted the bees and so helped pollinate the bean flowers. As regards planting bedding plants, Cyril suggested filling the hole with water, let it drain, then filling the hole again with water before putting in the plants. Judging from Cyril's award winning garden there must be some truth in his methods. Another member said she always puts a banana skin in the ground when planting a new rose. The potassium from the banana strengthens the roots.

A big thank you to Pat for a super meeting. It was a rewarding and very relaxing evening and hopefully we will be able to repeat this next year.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 5th September, 7.30pm for 8.00pm at the Day Centre when Mr and Mrs Greenway will be giving a talk on clematis at Prior's Woods. Visitors very welcome.

October reminder: On Wednesday 3rd October Adam Woolcott will be 'Designing a Show Garden for Chelsea'. More details next month.

IN MEMORIAM

Dawn Elsmore

Dawn was born and brought up in South India in the Nilgiri Hills, a place that she loved. Her father John was in the civil service and it was in India that he met her mother Dorothy. She was very close to her father who was a strong Christian.


Dawn became a teaching assistant in India. She met Des in 1958 in Bombay aboard a ship bound for England when des was returning from New Zealand. They married in June 1959. Back in England, Dawn took shorthand and typing work in Bournemouth and Bromley for several years before Mark was born in 1963. The following year the family spent a year in Sydney, Australia. Until 1971 they lived in Parkstone, Poole, before moving to Stansted where they have lived in the same house ever since.

In the 1970s, Dawn worked as an ancillary assistant at the old Rye Street Hospital in Bishop's Stortford and as a shop assistant at Caton's shop on the Cambridge Road in Stansted which was formerly Green's Stores Buildings. Then in the 1980s she worked for eight years as a dinner lady at St Mary's School.



She was both loved and liked by friends and neighbours who have spoken highly of her, referring to her as a warm, caring, gentle and outgoing lady, always speaking to people, whether neighbours, friends at the shops or church. Dawn was a regular member of St John's Church and a devoted wife and mother who gave herself to caring for Des, particularly as he grew older. She imparted her Christian faith to Mark. She was greatly loved by Des and Mark and will be sorely missed by them as well as by many others.

Dawn's death at the age of 70 and following a stroke, was very sudden. She passed away peacefully, without paralysis, which she would have hated, having been an active person—this is something that both Des and Mark see as a blessing and mercy.



For our August meeting, the summer evening brought out a full house of members and visitors to hear Russell Clark from Uttlesford District Council, our speaker for the evening. Russell arrived a bit late so that we were just beginning to wonder what we would do, when he arrived a bit breathless to tell us that he had to stay home and have the dinner his wife had cooked as she was pregnant and mustn't be upset! He was sure we would all understand! So he had won us over before he even started his very comprehensive presentation on Recycling Management in our District.

Russell is Chair of the Waste Management Team of 80 employees on the Council and is dedicated to improving the understanding of the problem of waste growth both locally and globally. There was 434 million tonnes of waste in the UK last year and 26 million of that from our own homes. The growth of food waste is enormous and seems partly due to the 'buy one get one free' trend, which quite often results in the extra one being thrown away eventually, households being smaller. The supermarkets have now got targets to reduce packaging and it is hoped that increased landfill tax will discourage over-packaging. The good news is that our district has increased its rate of recycling by nearly 20% in the last year.

We were shown how the bins with the recyclable rubbish are sorted at the plant at Braintree; initially some of this is done by hand, which we found surprising. Some of our recyclable stuff is sent to Spain and Scandinavia where it is processed and can be returned here in other guises. A lot of recyclable plastic is made into street furniture - there seemed to be no end to the fascinating facts about rubbish!

The large brown bins, which none of us are ever likely to fill, had originally been going to be used for garden waste as well, but this was found not to be practical and also the size needed to be the same as the others in order to fit on to the lorries. Many members had questions for Russell during the coffee break, which he was delighted to answer.

Our Autumn County Meeting is to be held at the Princes Theatre in Clacton this year and six of our members wish to attend. The principal speaker is Zena Skinner who was one of the first television cooks and she will tell us of those early days.

A trip to see 'Fiddler on the Roof' has been organised for October. These trips offer greatly reduced price tickets and are matinee performances. There is also an opportunity to see the Sadler's Wells production of 'Nutcracker' in December or January - sometimes it's a bit difficult to think that far ahead on a hot summer evening!

Several of our members will be visiting neighbouring Institutes in Manuden, Berden and Elsenham this September and some of their members will be visiting us for our Members' Day meeting on 13th September. We always welcome visitors, so come along too. Members' Day means that non-committee members take the Chair, act as Secretary and arrange a speaker, so giving the committee a chance to sit back!

Following the demise of the local Heal Cancer Relief branch in 2006, the popular Open Gardens scheme was this year taken over by the Garden Club and Stansted Millers. Some 14 gardens were opened and received a steady flow of visitors throughout the afternoon of Sunday 15th July. A brief downpour at 5.00pm terminated some of the visits but most visitors were able to complete their itinerary. One or two cyclists came and demonstrated that this is an excellent way to cover a large number of gardens. Several homes offered welcome refreshments.

PLANNING - a view

It's probably fair to say that no one positively likes the planning system, but overall it is trusted as being fair and transparent. Local people can take part in the decision-making process by making their views known and the reasons for decisions are all open to inspection. The decision makers, whether they are Council officers, elected councillors and even elected Government ministers, are ultimately accountable to the people affected.

This may all change for major infrastructure projects such as airport runways, wind generation farms and nuclear power stations. The Government wants to take these decisions out of the hands of elected representatives and hand them over to what they call an Independent Planning Commission (IPC). The IPC would make decisions based on government guidance in National Policy Statements.

I spoke at a conference in London on this in July. I subsequently received a letter from the organisers saying it was good to have a speaker who was prepared to be critical of the Government. I was not alone. The CPRE, National Trust, Friends of the Earth and others condemn these proposals.

My main argument against what is proposed is the need to maintain trust in the system; that decisions by unaccountable quangos are on the whole treated with suspicion. Ultimately, if people can no longer trust democratic processes, they are more likely to resort to direct action or civil disobedience against proposals. The Government says it wants to engage with local communities while simultaneously proposing to take decisions away from them and their elected representatives. It is simply not enough to pay lip service to the concept of 'being heard'. People have to be convinced that their views have influenced a decision beyond more than the design of the landscaping.

The concept of 'independence' for the proposed commission concerns me. Independent from what? Independent from political accountability? Independent from big business interests? It seems the Government wants to change the planning system for the second time in three years so that big business will get an easier ride.

At a time when the 60th anniversary of Indian and Pakistani independence is much in the news, I thought that the following quotation from the internet Wikipedia was a telling historical parallel: "The India Office provided the bureaucratic and policy ammunition that the Secretaries of State of the late 19th century used to convert the Viceroy and Government of India into little more than the agents of the Government of the United Kingdom." I fear an Independent Planning Commission would, in reality, be the obedient agents of UK Government ministers.

WHERE ARE YOU?

I'm writing this month's contribution in between packing for our family holiday and making beetroot chutney! "Multitasking again" my husband mutters as he walks past. "Show off!" It did get me thinking that the ability to multi-task apart from being handy as a mother is also handy as a vet. Quite often I find that I end up doing or thinking about several things at once.

A good example was the other day while I was removing a grass seed from a dog's paw. Angela, our receptionist, came down to the operating theatre to see if I was free to speak to a client about some poorly chickens; Jackie, our nurse, needed to know what antibiotics to give a cat we had just seen; Angela also had a lab report in her hands that had just been faxed through and seeing I was busy she said "Oh don't worry, I'll add it to your list of messages". This was in addition to the builder knocking plaster off our consulting room wall and a dog in the kennels doing a fair impression of 'The hound of the Baskervilles'! All in a day's work I suppose. We always tell our student nurses that the first thing they need to do is hurry up and grow that third pair of hands. They look at us as if we are a bit mad to begin with, but they soon understand why.

Summer generally is our busiest time of the year and I can always tell when the holidays have started as we get the 'left my pet with the neighbour' syndrome. This usually begins with the appearance of an anxious person, holding a dog/cat/rabbit/iguana (delete as appropriate) at arms length, saying "He's not mine, I'm just looking after him for the neighbour, they're on holiday". This is usually closely fol-

lowed by "I don't know anything about him but he's not eaten for three days." We usually manage to sort things out fairly well (thank goodness for computer records), and the carers generally turn out to be wonderfully responsible and caring people, but I would make a plea to everyone when they are leaving their pet with a kennels or a neighbour, to leave a contact telephone number wherever possible.

Mostly your pet will be fine when you're on holiday, but occasionally the unthinkable will happen and a dog may run in front of a car or a life-threatening condition may be discovered, or an emergency operation may be needed to be carried out and without being able to contact an owner we have to take the responsibility between ourselves and the carer to try and carry out what the owner would want, and what is in the best interests of the animal. Usually this works out fine but I do remember on one occasion doing my best with some quite complex surgery to save a cat's leg after it had been run over only to have the owner return from holiday to say "Oh he was only a farm cat, I would have had him put to sleep."

I suppose you can never get everything 100% right, but it does make it so much more straightforward if we can contact an owner. We quite regularly ring people in France and on one occasion we even spoke to an owner who was on holiday in Australia. Now there's service for you!



Adult Community Learning at the Peter Kirk site is thriving

Readers of the Stansted Observer a few weeks ago may have been led to believe that West Essex Adult Community College is closing. The article was factually inaccurate, and this is far from true! The Peter Kirk School (now part of Adult Community Learning Essex) is not being lost to the community. The former special school has not been out of action since 1998. Since that date it has been used to deliver adult education to the local community and still continues to be used for that purpose. What is being lost to the community is the original village school building which had a clause on it which meant when it was no longer used as a school it reverted to the original owner. Nature Notes

The sparrowhawk has not been seen very often over the garden this summer, possibly because we seem to





have fewer birds around this year. This morning, however, when we had driven 50 yards out of the village a hawk swooped low over the car, coming from behind, and flew just ahead of us for a short distance before rising over the hedge. This has happened several times over the last few years. Pre-

sumably the hawk is hoping that our movement will flush some unwary little bird out of the hedge.

Many of you will have noticed the prolific growth of most of the plants, bushes and trees this summer which has resulted in what promises to be a bumper crop of blackberries, sloes, wild damsons and nuts. The damsons may well all be picked by the time you read this, but there will be plenty of the rest along the local lanes and paths. Perhaps even the beech-nuts will be worth collecting this year.

September is one of the best months for getting out and enjoying the countryside. Paths and tracks are usually firm and clear after the harvest traffic and the contrast of stubble or plough with the green hedgerows gives a new dimension to the landscape. Stansted is also fortunate to be surrounded with numerous interesting country lanes. So, it's all out there. Get to it!

MEMORIES OF LOWER STREET IN WARTIME No III

As mentioned in my first episode, our family business at 41, Lower Street was Turner Bros (Grocers and Pork Butchers). Before the Second World War this was a substantial business with weekly deliveries to customers in Stansted, Henham, Broxted, Elsenham and Ugley. My father was a very good pork butcher. His cooked hams and finest pork sausages gave the business an excellent reputation for quality, and customers came from as far away as Braintree and parts of Cambridgeshire to buy them. To the rear of the premises we had stables, a slaughter house, brine tubs and a smoke-room. The sausage machine was driven by an old gas engine which had a large flywheel, and it also drove (on a belt system) the circular saw in the loft above. We sold firewood in bundles because nearly all supplies from the manufacturers came in wooden boxes. Live pigs were brought from many local farms including Audley End Estate (the home of Lord Braybrooke) to be turned into bacon and hams etc. Lord Braybrooke wouldn't allow his livestock to be sent anywhere else. He always claimed that various other processors often sent him meat that hadn't come from his estate.

At the beginning of the war when petrol was rationed, only one permit for petrol coupons was issued by the Government for the six grocers in Stansted and that was for Greens Stores, Cambridge Road. Consequently Greens were responsible for taking every other trader's deliveries to their customers - you can guess what the result of this was. It meant that the other traders had to struggle to reclaim their customers after the conflict.

I have been asked how much I remember about the highly anticipated invasion by the Nazis. I think those of us children who understood would agree with me that grown ups tried very hard not to let us be terrified. However, it was impossible to hide it from us, when things like the removal of all road signs happened, and I remember reading Official Notices issued by the War Office saying 'IF THE INVADER COMES' what to do. We were told not to run and hide, but to stay where we were. Everyone was to have a bag packed with some medications, iron rations (biscuits, water etc) gasmask, ration books and ID cards. People were hiding food, and where babies were involved, tins of National Dried Milk and Government issue concentrated orange juice.

The morale of the people wasn't helped by broadcasts by the German propaganda. William Joyce (Lord Haw Haw) was constantly telling us on the radio that the German Intelligence knew what was happening in England even at local Women's Institute meetings, and that it was just a matter of days. My mother used to send me up to Mr Johnson at Stansted Water Works Pumping Station to get our accumulator re-charged so that we could always hear the news on the radio. Any strangers in the village were viewed with suspicion, and we were told not to speak to them as they might be spies. After the war, I learnt that many families had hidden poisons in case of invasion, as they considered it better to poison their children than subject them to the Nazi occupation

During the blitz the evacuees arrived. One morning I saw a line of red London buses parked along Lower Street. People, whose only remaining possessions were in a suitcase or a carrier bag, were being directed to various houses where the locals were instructed to find them some accommodation by men with clipboards and official badges. There was an empty cottage belonging to my grandfather, and the Ross family was billeted there. I believe it was Mrs Ross, Ronnie and Vera. In our house we had an elderly couple - Mr and Mrs Magnus and a single woman - Miss Freer. In the Bull yard cottages were Mrs Swan and daughter Jean; the Osborne family, Tony, Rita and Thelma; and the Wise family whose children were Ron, Brian, Douglas and Gwen. I believe some of those unfortunate people still live in Stansted and have brought up their families in the village and if so I hope they feel that we tried to make them feel welcome.

At the end of the War in Europe, 8th May 1945, there were huge celebrations and again when the Japanese surrendered on 12th August 1945. The whole of Lower Street and Station Road had bunting and flags on every house, shop and pub. Two searchlights were positioned at the Working Men's Club and Station Road, and everyone in the village was out singing and dancing all night - dancing with the person nearest to them, young and old together. People had tears of joy in their eyes. I was only 11 years old but it seemed to me that the relief from all that pain and misery brought everyone together and that there was hope for peace in the world. Whenever I am at a funeral service, and those words from The Revelation of St John chapter 21 vs 4 are used, I am reminded of that day of thanksgiving, when people from all over the world rejoiced. If only the human race had learnt to live together in peace! Sadly it seems that our hopes and prayers were in vain.

Inuit leader evidence against Airport Expansion at Stansted Public Inquiry

The leader of Greenland's indigenous human rights organisation the Inuit Circumpolar Council and expert member of United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues, Aqqaluk Lynge, gave evidence on Friday 27th July to the Public Inquiry into the proposed expansion of Stansted Airport. Speaking as a witness for SSE, Mr Lynge highlighted the impacts of climate change which are already being experienced in the Arctic and called for a halt to the airport expansion proposals which would add to the global warming burden that is already affecting the traditional Inuit way of life.

In February 2003, the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) passed a resolution effectively recognising the Arctic as a 'barometer' or 'indicator region' of the globe's environmental health. This resolution called upon Arctic states to significantly increase environmental monitoring arrangements in the Arctic. "The Arctic is no longer isolated from the rest of the world," Mr Lynge told the Inquiry. "What happens in countries such as Britain affects us in the North. Many of the economic and environmental challenges facing the Inuit result from activities well to the south of our homeland and Inuit traditions are being severely tested by the changing Arctic environment. The Inuit people and the Arctic are sometimes overlooked, but in relation to global climate change I suggest you do so at your peril. What is happening now to Inuit will happen soon to you in the south. This is why the UNEP is looking to the Arctic and why you should as well."

Stansted will be the litmus test of the seriousness of the Government's commitment to properly tackling the climate change issue. If Gordon Brown doesn't grasp that nettle then his claims about acting to address global warming will be exposed as mere platitudes. BAA is seeking unlimited passenger use of the airport's single runway, currently capped at 25 million passengers per annum, which could result in the eventual doubling of passenger throughput and an increase in the number of flights from 192,000 (latest 12 months total) to 264,000 annually. Permission for the application was refused by Uttlesford District Council last November and the Public Inquiry is hearing BAA's appeal against that decision, the result of which is expected in the Spring.

Will Self to lead protest walk against Stansted expansion

Author and columnist Will Self will lead a five mile protest walk through Hatfield Forest on Saturday 15th September to highlight the threat to the 1000-year old National Trust property from airport expansion plans which would make Stansted's 'airport in the countryside' bigger than Heathrow today. The five mile Runway Ramble through the ancient woodland is being coordinated by SSE to coincide with the planning application for a second runway, expected in September from airport operator BAA. Hundreds are expected to attend the morning walk, which sets off just after 10.00am. Will Self agreed to take part in the event when he toured Hatfield Forest and other ancient woodland threatened by BAA's plans last December with SSE Campaign Director, Carol Barbone.

Airport expansion would jeopardise the tranquillity of the forest, while there are grave concerns over the impact that such massive expansion would have on its ecosystems as a result of changes in air quality. There are also fears that climate change impacts

would render the woodland vulnerable to extreme weather conditions, which would further compromise its survival.

Hatfield Forest is located at Bush End on the B1256, just off Junction 8 of the M11. Entry is free with a suggested donation to the Stop Stansted Expansion fighting fund. 
