THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

My granddaughter attends St Mary's Catholic School in Bishops Stortford. The School is divided into five houses, all named after saints, and pupils are encouraged to find out about their particular saint and learn from their example. Sophie's House Saint is Maximillian Kolbe. He was a Polish Franciscan priest who was arrested in 1941 and eventually taken to Auschwitz following his outspoken criticism of the Nazi regime. Remarkably, he volunteered to take the place of a married prisoner in the death cells following the escape of three prisoners. He was the last to die, encouraging the other nine condemned prisoners to the end. He was 47. The man whose place he took was 41 and was able to live with his wife and children for a further 53 years as a result of Fr Kolbe's act of extreme generosity. He died on 13th March 1995 and his name was Franciszek Gajowniczek, a Polish Jew.

Fr Kolbe's story mirrors the loving action of Jesus, offering His life so that others might live; and reflects the unselfish, unconditional love of God expressed in Jesus's words, "No greater love has any man than he who lays down his life for his friends". The man saved by Fr Kolbe and his family were invited by Pope John Paul II to the canonisation, the conferring of sainthood, on Maximillian Kolbe on 10th October 1982. Whilst pupils at St Mary's hopefully will never have to make such extreme physical sacrifices, they are inspired to give up their lives in the service of others by Fr Kolbe's example.

The scheme really does cover everything: how we use and store medicines, our health and safety policies, what equipment and facilities we have, how we look after our patients and communicate with clients, and how clean our premises are, to name but a few. Hospital status is the highest level a general practice like ours can attain and shows that the level of care and facilities are higher than average. We could not have reached this standard without the ongoing hard work and dedication of all our team, not only the vets and nurses but also the receptionists, consult helpers and cleaners. 

"Gardens are getting smaller – so why not go up?? Why waste the space on the fences and walls? Why have 'empty' areas where just grass or an empty patio is located?" These were the questions our May speaker, Paul Harrison asked before explaining the advantages of vertiginous gardening; for example in an average 12 metre by 8 metre garden with 2 metre fences, a gardener could increase the growing area by approximately 80%! By incorporating internal garden structures (arches, columns, pergolas, obelisks and trellis dividers) into your design, even more growing area can be achieved. Experiment with companion planting - for example a climbing rose with one or more clematis plants will ensure the season of interest is lengthened. Planters and pots can be utilised throughout the year as hot-spots and focal points; and by under-planting with bulbs for winter/spring interest, then allowing the climbers' growth to mask the dying leaves as they cover the climbing framework, the garden outlook can change over the months. A slide-show emphasised how gardens had/had not put these ideas into practice. A handout listing the plants featured plus contact details for the nurseries that supply the more unusual plants, was given to members.

GARDENING TIPS FOR JUNE

Mulch, mulch, mulch; if you haven't already done so, cover the bare soil in your beds and pots with a 7-8cm layer of a good quality mulch, examples include well-rotted farmyard manure, homemade compost, composted bark, strulch (straw) or cocoa shells (if you have dogs do not use cocoa shells). As the weather becomes hotter (hopefully), it is the only time of year to contemplate pruning any trees in the deciduous cherry family. Prune sparingly when dry and warm/hot, as this significantly reduces the risk of silver leaf disease which is nearly always fatal. Cuts on cherries do not heal well at the best of times, but when they are in active growth, the calluses have the best chance of healing over without allowing cankers and other diseases to enter.

Some variegated plants (coloured edges to leaves) can revert to being entirely green; eunonymus and eleagnus are common examples that revert. Prune out reverted shoots completely back to a point where it comes from a branch that is still variegated; this will help to keep your shrub in its variegated form. Aggressive weeds like bindweed and ground elder will be romping away this month, stop them in their tracks by wiping the weeds with a weed wipe containing glyphosate, avoid spraying in amongst your other desirable plants as any spray drift can be fatal. Weed wipes work even quicker when rubbed on the underside or both sides of a leaf. If we have a prolonged dry spell, raise the cutting height on lawnmowers to around 40mm; it will help to reduce stress on all the little grass plants and keep it greener during the dry spell. If the lawn goes brown in a dry spell, don't panic, it will become green again once rain arrives.



AGM and 'Stansted between the Wars'

At our AGM, all Committee members were re-elected. Thanks were given to all who attend throughout the year and to those who contribute to the success of our Society. After the AGM, Peter Saunders gave a very interesting presentation on Stansted between the wars, which covered a wide ranging number of topics including the famous families and estates, but I will feedback on just one - Stansted Hall and its inhabitants.



The First World War had a terrible impact on the village; according to the memorial 54 men lost their lives. The Fuller-Maitlands at Stansted Hall, having already lost their youngest son in an elephant accident, lost their eldest son in Aisne, and their surviving son Richard was injured on the Somme and had to return home and take no further action. The Estate was put up for sale by auction in April 1921. A notice stated An important freehold sporting, residential and agricultural property of about 5,400 acres, known as the Stansted Hall estate with six handsome reception rooms, thirty bed and dressing rooms, three bathrooms and offices. Stabling and garage accommodation together with 30 good arable farms, three nurseries, several residential and small holdings, numerous cottages and 200 acres of woodland. The auction did not take place, and in 1922 Fuller-Maitland entered into a contract for sale of the estate to Albert Ball, a remarkable man who had begun life as a plumber and made a fortune as an estate agent. Albert possibly saw Stansted Hall as a guick profit, as he sold off the farms to the tenant farmers and Stansted Hall and its parkland to Arthur Findlay.



Findlay was around 40 when he moved in; he worked for a firm of ship owners, ship brokers and insurance brokers, and became a leading stockbroker and a freeman of the City of Glasgow. More importantly for Stansted, he was an active spiritualist who wrote several books on spiritualism. In 1964 he gave the hall to the Spiritualists National Union, and so began the college that exists today. I would personally

recommend a visit to their open events where Public Spiritualist Services are held every Sunday and Wednesday at 7.30pm; there is no charge and all are welcome to attend.

BEEKEEPING

The queen will start laying around 2500 eggs per day from early spring onwards. This can lead to overcrowding in the hive, which causes the queen to send out signals that she will be leaving the colony to start a new one elsewhere. To enable her to do this, the existing colony needs a new queen. The colony has three days after the queen lays an egg to decide whether to develop an ordinary worker egg into a queen. To develop a queen they start feeding royal jelly to the chosen eggs (usually about three or four), and in a couple of weeks new queens will emerge. This is then the signal for the old queen to fly off with thousands of flying bees (a swarm) to find a new home. The new gueens then fight amongst themselves until one survives. It is the only time a queen stings, to eliminate her rivals. The existing colony continues with a new queen, and the old queen starts a new colony elsewhere. Swarms can be intimidating, but the bees gorge themselves with honey beforehand as they do not know when they will eat again, so they are not aggressive. If you do see a swarm, enjoy a wonder of nature, then go to our web site www.stortfordbees.org.uk/swarms and call one of our swarm officers who will come and collect the swarm free of charge. He will then give it to one of our bee keepers to nurture into a new colony. You will be participating in another way to help sustain the bee population.



DOUBLE CHOCOLATE COOKIES



Ingredients

375g plain flour
1 tsp baking powder
175g butter
220g brown sugar
vanilla essence
2 eggs
100g dessicated coconut
200g melted white chocolate
100g white chocolate chips
100g dark chocolate chips

Method

- 1. In a mixer, cream butter and sugar together until fluffy Add the eggs and vanilla and mix together. With the mixer spinning slowly, add flour, melted white chocolate, baking powder, dessicated coconut and chocolate chips
- 2. When everything is mixed into a soft dough, set it to one side. With a dessert spoon, scoop out portions of dough and mould them into balls in your hands. Flatten balls with your hands and place onto a baking tray lined with parchment paper, 1 inch/2½cm away from each other
- 3. Bake at 175°C for 8-12 minutes. Bring them out of the oven and allow to cool. It is good to undercook them slightly, so when they have cooled down, your cookies are deliciously chewy.

Buzzards are out over Birchanger Wood and also two kites. These are really large birds. The buzzard has a wingspan of



120–150cm (48–60"). We see them high above, making spiral flights, often over the Ugley Brook valley and Alsa Wood, and landing to catch small rodents. However, they appear to return towards Birchanger, rather than our northerly woods.

June, and all our woodland deciduous trees will now be in full leaf. In the wood we do not have the rich, flowering trees like cherry, as the Wood comprises ancient woodland; but there are the smaller growing hawthorn and blackthorn, which earlier produced lots of pretty white blossoms. The hazel and hornbeams, our other low-growing trees, produce only yellow-greenish catkins, whilst the larger ash, oak, sycamore, sweet chestnut and silver birch present only the most insignificant greenish flowers. Whatever - the birds love our Wood. They are best seen foraging on the woodland floor and we can hear them singing. I can recognise the songs of the great tit, greenfinch, blackbird, green woodpecker, robin, swallow and buzzard. The easiest birds to see are the wood pigeon, collared dove, blue-tit, blackbird, the hammering of the great spotted woodpecker, and the squawks of the jay and magpie; there are about 100 species of bird in Birchanger Wood according to the RSPB!

Back to earth, and to advise that the Trust is now selling fire-wood suitable for next year's use. It can usually be collected on Saturdays 9.00am-10.00am and 2.00pm-3.00pm at the Compound off Heath Row (the vehicular entrance is opposite house no 124 Heath Row).



NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

ROAD RESURFACING

The good news is that the following locations have been included in the Essex Highways schedule of resurfacing work this spring:

- Pines Hill/Silver Street
- Church Road
- Foresthall Road

Crafton Green should have been resurfaced by the time you read this as well, which is important because it was very hazardous to residents with mobility issues accessing the Day Centre.

The bad news is that there are still many roads in Stansted where the road surface is less than satisfactory and which have potholes, which many residents consider potentially dangerous. According to the Essex County Council website, a pothole is a hole in the road that is deeper than 50mm and wider than 75mm in any horizontal direction. When a pothole is reported, an inspection will be carried out to determine whether it should be classed as urgent or will be put into a planned programme of works to ensure they are repaired as efficiently as possible. The assessment will take into account many issues including the location of the pothole in the road and the type of vehicle that uses the road such as cars, motorbikes or pedal bikes.

An assessed pothole will have either orange or purple paint by it, which represents the length of time it will take to repair it. Depending on the level of priority, orange paint indicates repairs will be undertaken anything between two hours and 28 days, but purple paint means a non-specified timescale. Essex has been given £1.5m from the central government 'PotHole Action Fund', which it is estimated funds 28,302 pot hole repairs. Hopefully some of this will be spent in Stansted.

A complicating factor in Stansted is the number of unadopted roads we have, which are not the responsibility of the local council and it is down to the residents and businesses to maintain these roads. Stoney Common Road is a good example of an unadopted road which has a number of issues and where the Parish Council is keen to see action, but getting all interested parties on board is a difficult and protracted business. Whilst progress is slow, we are optimistic that improvements will be made before too long.

LONG SERVICE

Councillor Peter Jones recently clocked up his fortieth year as a member of the Parish Council. Peter has done two stints as Parish Council Chairman (1981-84 and 1991-96) and has chaired the Finance and General



Purposes Committee for very many years. Parish Chairman, Maureen Caton, congratulated Peter on his 40 years service, his twice being Chairman and his diligent chairmanship of the Finance Committee, as well as his representation at planning enquiries including the proposed second

runway at the airport. She also thanked him for the support and sharing of his experience with her during her chairmanship.

Anne Court started work in the Parish Council office back in April 1986. Parish Chairman, Maureen Caton, said "Anne has been a conscientious, loyal and valued



member of staff, working for Stansted residents for 30 years as our Administration Assistant. She knows the make up of the village well, although she does not live in Stansted herself. Her cheery disposition puts parishioners at ease along with the reassurance that their issue will be addressed."

The Parish Council would like to record its appreciation of Derek Honour's contribution to the upkeep of the windmill. On our behalf, Councillor John O'Brien made a presentation to Derek at the celebration party held in Derek's honour at the windmill and praised the outstanding contribution he and his wife, Peggy, have made over many years.

SPEED WATCH

It is widely acknowledged that speed is one of the main factors in fatal road accidents.

- In 2013, 3,064 people were killed or seriously injured in crashes where speed was a factor.
- The risk of death is approximately four times higher when a pedestrian is hit at 40mph than at 30mph
- Fatal accidents are four times as likely on rural "A" roads as urban "A" roads.

Driving at higher speeds also mean that drivers have less time to identify and react to what is happening around them, prolonging the time it takes for the vehicle to stop, and raising the risk of a crash occurring.

Adam Pipe is the casualty reduction manager at Essex Police. He has said: "It's disappointing to see that some drivers continue to drive irresponsibly on the roads of Essex. Residents continue to tell us that speeding is a concern in their communities but we are still seeing a number of people putting themselves and others in danger by driving at excess speed". The Police have limited resources to prevent speeding and catch offenders so they are very supportive of Speed Watch teams such as the one we have in Stansted.

Many people are unclear about the status and powers of the Speed Watch team, so to clarify:

- Community Speed Watch is a partnership between the Community, the Police and Local Authorities
- A Speed Watch group consists of local residents who are willing to volunteer a small amount of time each week to monitor traffic speeds using the appropriate equipment
- Persistent offenders identified by the Speed Watch volunteers will receive up to two warning letters and, on a third occasion, offenders can expect further action by the Police.

Kevin Clinton, head of road safety at the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA), said: "Community Speed Watch schemes can be a useful way of monitoring speeds and encouraging drivers to stay within limits."

We owe a debt of gratitude to the members of the Stansted Speed Watch who are prepared to spend a few hours each week doing their bit for the community. Why do they do it? Mainly because they are genuinely concerned about safety and, although some of the comments and gestures they get from motorist can be quite unpleasant, there is a feel good factor in doing your bit for the community. It is also a good opportunity to meet people and catch up on the latest village gossip! The feedback we get from the monitoring sessions is often quite alarming with up to 25 incidents of drivers breaking the speed limits in a two-hour session and speeds of over 50 mph being recorded.

A skatepark "jam" is planned for September which is a great opportunity to come and see some impressive tricks from our youngsters.

SPRING POND WORKING GROUP

A big thank you to Superman and the other super heroes who turned out to give the village pond its Spring make over.



Our twice yearly working groups are resulting in significant improvements in the appearance and ecological health of the pond. There are currently moorhens in residence which is nice but no evidence of frogs or fish life.

RESTRUCTURING OF POLICING IN ESSEX

Many of you will be aware that Essex Police took a decision last year to drastically cut back the number of PCSO's serving the county. As a result, we will no longer see a flash of hi-vis yellow on a bicycle touring the village streets.

PCSO Stuart Stranger, who has effectively been our 'village bobby' since Neil "Jack" Russell's retirement, made his final drop-in call to the Parish Council Office on Thursday 5 May. Stuart will be staying with Essex Police as a Custody Officer in Basildon and we wish him well for the future.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Geoffrey Sell writes:

Planning once again dominates matters at Uttlesford. The local plan continues its tortuous process. The call for sites has yielded up a number of potential sites for development in Stansted, most of which fortunately have been deemed unsuitable by officers. However, two additional sites have been submitted. The first is for a development of 8.4 ha at Bentfield Green and would provide between 81-135 houses. This proposal is for a development which moves it away from the Conservation Area and the traffic "would use Rainsford Road". Officers consider the site is "suitable for this smaller scaled development subject to the capacity of the road network." I am not aware that the road network has increased capacity and therefore I will be opposing development on this site.

The second site is land to the west of Pennington Lane. The site area is 15 ha and would potentially provide between 338-563 houses. Officers admit that development here would result in loss of open agricultural land, spilling down steeply sloping land beyond the clearly defined northern edge of the community. Such development would be visually prominent for the most part. Whilst development on this site would not contribute to sustainable patterns of development, officers state that "development of the site is achievable subject to highway improvements to access the site." Again I would oppose any development on this site.

The projected timetable for the local plan is:

 Nov-Dec 2016 Official 'Pre-submission' consultation will be held. This is an opportunity for members of the public and other stakeholders to respond to the consultation

- March 2017 Submission of Local Plan to the Planning Inspectorate for public examination
- Aug-Sept 2017 Dec 2017 Start of the hearing sessions for public examination
- Dec 2017 Adoption of Local Plan at Full Council







The BSDFA was formed in 1957 by a small public-spirited group of people following an attempt by the (then) Braughing Rural District Council to close a footpath in the Twyford Bury area, which had been unused for some time owing to obstructions instigated by the landowner.

The footpath closure attempt caused some 'considerable indignation' and so a public meeting was called resulting in the Bishop's Stortford and District Footpath Association being set up. The minimum subscription was 2/6d (12½p) or

1/- (5p) for those under 21. Today, family subscription is £4. The Bishop's Stortford Museum at the Rhodes Centre will be displaying documents from these early years at an exhibition in March 2017 in celebration of our 60th Anniversary. Nature Notes

The warm spring days have arrived late this year and in our and neighbouring gardens the nesting birds have had a hard time. It is now approaching mid-May and although nest building commenced over two months ago I had not seen any young birds until today when a small flock of starlings landed on the lawn with a young starling amongst them. Actually I had seen young birds, but not live ones – the crows or magpies dragged two nearly fully fledged young pigeons from their nest and left their remains on the lawn. The pigeons' heads were missing which is not unusual because the brain is quite nutritious and predators will carry them off. Other birds' nests were either ravaged or the eggs and young succumbed to the frosts.



This spring seems to have suited wild flowers such as primroses, oxlips, peggles and bluebells which are a joy to behold on a country walk, but not everything is so nice. Above is a photo of one of the giant hogweed plants growing near a bridleway in a bit of Durrell's Wood. Dormant seeds from these plants seem to have been disturbed and spread by winter floods and under damp conditions they will grow three metres tall. The sap from these plants can cause severe blistering if it makes contact with the skin and the effect can be long-lasting, so if you come across them on your walks, take care. Trees and shrubs seem to be happy with masses of blossom on the blackthorn, may, crab apple and horse chestnut to name a few. On a sadder note. the ash trees are now coming into leaf and it is probable that this summer we shall see signs of the ash dieback disease which threatens to decimate the ash population over the coming years. Most of us will remember how the Dutch elm disease changed our landscape and in spite of masses of elm saplings growing in the hedgerows over recent decades, so far none have acquired immunity from the disease and reached maturity. We hear that some strains of the ash tree are resistant to ash dieback so it is not all bad news and we live in hope.

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

Within St Mary's Church there is a fine memorial plaque, sculptured by Edward Gaffin of Regent Street, London, for William Harcourt Torriano, (1748-1828) of Colchester. It is described by Pevsner as, "a mourning female figure leaning over an altar".



Torriano was, 'Upwards of Forty Five Years in the Civil Service on the Madras Establishment of the Honble East India Company', a senior Adventurer Merchant. When he travelled his plans were reported in the newspapers. In 1792 he built a large chapel outside of Fort Vellore at his own expense to be used by the English and Indian congregations. In 1806 the first rebellion of Sepoys against British rule (the Vellore Mutiny) erupted; by late morning they had killed 15 officers and 100 men of the Madras Army then ransacked their houses. By noon the mutiny had been put down. Six mutineers were blown away from guns, five shot by firing squad, eight hanged and five transported.

The church became dilapidated. In his will William Torriano left £1,000 (£85,000-£100,000 in today's value) to the British and Foreign Bible Society for the purpose of printing and distributing bibles and testaments in the oriental languages. William's eldest son, Josias was born in Nellore, Madras, 1788. He entered the Madras Infantry as a cadet 1804,

Lieutenant 1805, and Captain 1818. Came to Britain 1819, and entered St Catherine's College, Cambridge. Resigned his commission 1820. BA 1824, MA 1830, ordained into the Church 1823. Vicar of Stansted Mountfitchet 1828-1851.

The Vicarage, now renamed Manor House, had two acres of glebe and tithes commuted in 1840, the Rectorial £315.15s and Vicarial for £306 (basically large and small tithes). Josias Torriano then retired into obscurity. His wife Louise died in Richmond in 1874; she is buried in Brompton Cemetery. Their daughter Lydia, born in India, married Charles Hanson in 1856 at St George's Hanover Square, but they divorced 1861. She was reported to have been an alcoholic with sexual fantasies. When she died in 1883 her name was recorded as Louisa Hanson Torriano. Josias died in Kensington early in 1877, but was not buried until June 1880. His daughter Lydia had his body embalmed and she kept him in a glass topped coffin in her bathroom for three years! She occupies the same vault as her father in Southampton Old Cemetery.

Pottery brings together the three elements – earth, fire and water. The earliest vessels were found in China and would have been used for water carrying. The oldest piece of ceramic dates from 25,000 BC and was found in Poland. It was not until 1709 that porcelain was made in the West. It was fascinating to watch Helen produce a lovely jug whilst she was talking to us. It rose up like magic in front of us, as she assured us that anyone can do it! In order to show us the thickness of the clay and what it looked like inside, she then cut it in half! Well of course you just scoop it all up and make another one – just like that! She brought some samples along with her and I now have a lovely jug to remember her by.

Our Craft Group gathered on 30th April in the Day Centre. Some of us learnt to do paper-folding using old paperback books; there is help for those wanting to crochet and help with embroidery and card-making, as well as making earrings from beads, so lots going on and tea and biscuits included for £2.50. Everyone is welcome to come along you do not have to be a WI member; we have booked the Day Centre for the last Friday of each month 2.30pm-4.30pm.

In June Ian Currie will talk on the *History of Weather Fore-casting* – should be fascinating. Just now the sun is shining and it seems like summer is here! Join us on Thursday 9th June at 7.45pm in the Day Centre.
