#### Spaceship Earth

Just over 70 years ago, a Dutch sculptor was asked to create a monument to represent the newly formed United Nations in New York. His design was a hollow iron circle on a stand with a small pumpkin shaped object attached to it. When asked to explain the title of his work *Spaceship Earth*, he said that following the devastation of World War II it was necessary for the human race to reconsider their relationships. His image showed earth as a ship passing through space. If the crew did not act as a team and share their talents the ship would implode. The United Nations would be the vehicle to enable this necessary co-operation.

Just over 2000 years ago in the *Our Father*, Jesus shared a vision of His Father's will being "done on earth as it is in heaven". That vision was to bring about recognition that we are all brothers and sisters in the Family of God *Our Father*, whose wish is to replicate the love and peace of His heavenly realm. Football Is Back! Our new season is now under way with the FA Cup tie away to fellow Essex Senior League team Redbridge on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> August being the highlight of the month. 



#### **IN MEMORIAM**

#### PHYLLIS BINNS HARRISON

27th June 1919-22nd May 2017

The daughter of Rev'd George and Ada Reith, Phyllis' first home was at the manse in Clunie, Perthshire, followed by Dumfries where she started school. At an early age, she learnt her Latin Roots which she said stood her in good stead for the rest of her life. Her father died in 1929, so Phyllis and her brother Ivor were sent south to Christ's Hospital schools. She did very well academically, particularly languages, and at sports, becoming head girl. Phyllis won a place at Oxford to read Latin and French but because there were no bursaries available she could not afford to take up the place. However, the family moved to Bloomsbury where Phyllis won an exhibition to Westfield College to study French and German. As a linguist she was snapped up by the Intelligence Service when she graduated, working in the Censorship Office (a branch of MI6) where her boss had links to Bletchley Park. Like many of her generation she did not disclose much of what she did, but we know she looked for codes in prisoners' letters and read the correspondence of Rudolf Hess who parachuted into Scotland to try and negotiate a peace treaty with Churchill. However, Phyllis was very anti-war so registered as a conscientious objector and left the Censorship to work in a youth club in the East End. By this time she had met her husband Bruce who worked with her brother.

After the war she went abroad with the American Quaker Relief Service and worked with displaced persons in the south of France, escorting some of them over the border into Spain under the eye of armed guards! Then she spent six months in Vienna, when on one occasion she and her friend jumped out of a train window to evade the Russians. This period in her life had a huge impact on her and she witnessed a lot of hardship. In 1948 she married Bruce at Crown Court Church of Scotland in Drury Lane, Covent Garden, when she was given away by her uncle - Lord Reith, the first Director General of the BBC. Married life started out in Palmers Green, where son Roger and daughter Claire were born; son Andy came along after the move to Enfield in the early 50s. Phyllis was renowned for her hospitality and her ability to get on with so many different sorts of people; visitors came from all over Europe and America from all walks of life. Bruce and Phyllis ran the youth club at Trinity Methodist Church in Wood Green, making many friends. As well as being a very talented poet, she acted in the Trinity Players and brought the house down with her antics. In Enfield, Phyllis ran a Brownie pack, and a Ranger unit. She volunteered with what was then known as the Enfield Society for Mentally Handicapped Children and invited children to tea to give parents a much needed break.

In 1972 they moved to Ugley Green where they became stalwarts of Stansted Methodist Church, supporting Churches Together in Stansted, including the exchange trips to Chevetogne in Belgium. Phyllis edited The Link magazine for about ten years. She loved life in Ugley Green, starting an evening fellowship that still exists, and joining the Ugley WI, where she was president at one time. She volunteered at Elmhurst Old People's Home and the Citizens' Advice Bureau. In all these spheres she has enriched everyone with

her poems and clever sketches which brought great amusement. Phyllis loved the outdoors and she was never happier than walking the hills in her beloved Scotland and the lanes and fields of Essex and Hertfordshire. Her walking partner was Bruce until his untimely death 25 years ago. She knew



all the footpaths around here. As her health declined in recent years, walking became more of a trial but she always looked at life with courage and good humour retaining as she would put it a 'sense of proportion' about

things. Above all she loved her family and was especially proud of her grandchildren's achievements and the more recent arrival of three great granddaughters. The last few months have been particularly difficult but we are thankful that she remained active for so long. Well done good and faithful servant.

### Z-HEALTH: BRAIN BODY COMMUNICATION - IMPROVE THAT AND EVERYTHING IMPROVES

In recent issues of The Link, you may have noticed there have been some unusual balance exercises which are part of a new system called Z-Health. This improves communication between brain and body by exploring all the inputs into the brain, how the various parts of the brain interpret those inputs. Since the brain is basically a lump of grey jelly in a bony box, it relies on information from our eyes, ears and the body, so it can direct us to our next task. Problems arise when the quality of that information is poor; for example poor balance, stiff joints, declining vision. If we stand on one leg, shut the eyes and then nearly fall over, this is a good example of how the brain is getting confusing signals from the eyes and the inner ears. Eyes shut usually results in a major wobble to one side, which shows the inner ears are not pairing well to keep us upright. Whilst you may think your balance is fine with your eyes open, what will happen when in poor light? Walking along a slightly uneven pavement in broad daylight should present no problems; but what happens in freezing fog? As we age, the brain/body communication degrades and the brain gets less certain about the outside world and slows us down by creating pain and illness and, eventually, decrepitude. Clean up the various inputs to the brain and so on, and pain levels drop, we stand up straighter and move more freely. That is what Z-Health aims to do.



#### A FLEDGING SUCCESS STORY

For the previous three springs, I have had blue tits nesting in the box in my garden. I have seen the parents going in and out and heard the chicks 'chattering' away, but I have always missed them fledge. So, as a Christmas present, I was given a simple nesting box camera (which relays live pictures direct to my TV), which I duly installed. Then I waited. I observed blue tits in the garden, but they were not showing any interest in the box, or so I thought. Then on 10th May, I heard the distinctive sound of baby birds coming from the box! The next 15 days were wonderful. I learned to recognise the parents' call to the chicks before bringing in food – so the chicks were ready with their mouths open. I watched and learned to distinguish between the parent birds, the male coming in, feeding the first mouth available and the female who would feed systematically then do some housekeeping. I recognised a parent's alarm call and saw the chicks' reaction, flattening themselves down in the base of the box in complete silence. At night, the female would brood the chicks but as they developed sufficient feathers, she just joined them for the night.



Towards the end of the fortnight, room in the box was at a premium. At first, I had counted eight chicks, but on fledging it turned out to be 10! By 24th May, feeding had become frantic, the adults in and out of the box non-stop to keep up with demand. The chicks now completely filled the box, had virtually lost their gapes, looking much like their parents and a lot of 'wing flapping' was going on. I decided that if I were Mum and the following day was nice, I would get the chicks out of the nest first thing to give them the whole day to settle down in their new environment. So I got up at 6.30am and sat glued to my TV as I watched the wonderful and courageous process of fledging. It took many occasions of gripping the side of the hole and peering out before, in turn, they all went, except one. It stayed in the box, bewildered it seemed. The parents came in three times to feed it, then, at last, it plucked up the courage and made it out. I went into the garden and watched for half an hour as the chicks flew from tree to tree relishing their new-found freedom and calling to each other but, within two hours, they had gone. I felt so privileged and at the same time, bereft.

## GARDENING TIPS FOR THE HOLIDAY SEASON

When you go on holiday do ask friends or neighbours to help keep your pots, containers and growbags moist. If not, they will almost certainly die during your absence. If you have a water butt in the garden, ensure the water is covered to discourage biting insects from multiplying and becoming a nuisance to you and your family. Many flowering perennials benefit from being dead-headed (removing faded flowers). This is a hormonal response as the plant detects that it has lost its potential seeds and generates more flowers to replace the lost seeds. Plants that particularly benefit are the likes of coreopsis, heleniums, pelargoniums (zonal geraniums). If you like to fertilise your lawn, then during August switch to a high phosphorous containing fertiliser and natural fertilisers. Both are better for the long-term good of the soil than artificial fertilisers, as they contain less salts, which can kill other beneficial micro-organisms. August is a splendid month for taking cuttings of your favourite plants. Pelargoniums, fuchsias and other tender perennials are the ones to target. Cut off a strong nonflowering shoot about 10cm long. Remove all but two leaves and stipules; trim the cutting immediately below a joint (node). Use fresh rooting hormone. Place the cuttings at the edge of a peat free compost filled pot, mixed with a free draining material such as grit, perlite or vermiculite. Water



the cuttings in, and store out of direct sunlight; north facing window sills are great places. They will root in around a month if kept just damp.

#### **POLICING ISSUES**

#### FURTHER UPDATE ON THE 7/7A BUS ROUTE

We have definitely secured the 7/7a bus until 2020. However there are some minor changes to the timetable from 28th August, as you will see from the new timetables printed on page 31 of this edition of the Link. You will find these changes at the end of the timetable: the schooldays only bus 7a leaves the Bishop's Stortford Interchange at 1600 instead of 1550, and the next 7a leaves at 1825 instead of 1815. In the other direction, the 1705 bus from the Airport now leaves ten minutes later at 1715. There does not seem to be any change to the times of the 301 or the 510 at the moment.

Although the damage to the bus shelters on Forest Hall, plus the lack of timetables on other bus shelters in the village, eg Cambridge Road and Clarence Road, have been reported several times over many months, it does not seem that any work has been undertaken as yet, either in repairing bus shelters or replacing timetables! However we will keep on trying!!

Just a reminder - keep using the 7/7a if you wish to keep the facility beyond 2020!!

#### **NEWS FROM THE DISTRICT**

Cllr Geoffrey Sell writes:

#### **Local Plan**

The Local Plan continues its tortuous process. Full Council on 11 July will decide whether or not to recommend the draft plan for public consultation. Councillors will have mixed feelings. There is an acknowledgement that there is a need for more housing. On the other hand, more housing will take more of our green fields and create additional pressures on our infrastructure.

The draft Plan includes proposals for three new settlements at North Uttlesford (Great Chesterford), Easton Park (Nr Great Dunmow) and west of Braintree (Stebbing). These three settlements will accommodate the majority of the 5,900 new homes required to meet the district's growth needs up to 2033.

Stansted Mountfitchet is listed as a Key Village. This means that is has facilities such as day to day shopping, GP services, primary education, public houses, nearby towns and London Stansted Airport. Stansted has 62 dwellings allocated under the draft Plan. There is an acknowledgement that we have already taken a lot of housing. Planning permission already exists for 215 houses, primarily Elms Farm (53 houses) and Walpole Farm (147 houses). The bulk of the allocated 62 new dwellings would be at land east of Cambridge Road and west of High Lane. This is the triangle of land adjacent to St Theresa's Church. The scale of the development would be 40 dwellings.

#### **Highways**

I am a member of Uttlesford's Highways Panel which consists of the four County Council members for Uttlesford and five district councillors. There are a number of schemes affecting Stansted which are due to be completed in 2017/18.

- a) Church Road-traffic calming: installation of additional traffic calming from Church Road junction with Bury Lodge Lane (bridge) in a westerly direction to the point of the first build-out installed in the previous scheme
- b) Cambridge Road crossing: new zebra crossing on Cambridge Road
- c) Foresthall Road speed limit: convert current section of derestricted to 40 mph
- d) Grove Hill signal improvements: improve signals at junction of Grove Hill and Lower Street. Consider installation of more visual weight restriction signs.

## INFORMATION FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

## AUGUST FESTIVALS, FAIRS AND FÊTES

Birthstone: Agate Flower: Gladiolus

Known as Augustus by the Romans in honour of Emperor Augustus Caesar, the Anglo-Saxon name for August was Weod monath (weed month) due to the rapid growth of weeds and plants. August is traditionally holiday time and many music festivals are held all over the UK including the Royal National Eisteddfod; this originated in medieval times as a gathering of bards and minstrels across Wales vying for the prized chair at the noble's table. This festival of Welsh arts and culture takes place in the first week of August. Lammas Day is on 1st (also Picnic Day in Northern Territory, Australia). Lammas comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Hlafmaesse (Loaf Mass) and marked the beginning of the harvest. Farmers made loaves of bread from the new wheat crop to be used as the Communion bread during a special mass at their local churches; a celebration predating our Christian Harvest Festival held at the end of the season. The Lammas Fair was a time for foretelling marriages; two young people who agreed to a 'trial marriage' for the 11 days of the fair, could part after that if they didn't get on. An interesting concept!

Edinburgh International Festival, from 4th to 28th of this month, is a celebration of the performing arts with live concerts, plays, ballets, operas and other shows. Together with the Edinburgh Fringe featuring its famed 'alternative' entertainment, the Edinburgh Festival celebrates its 70th anniversary this year. The Glorious Twelfth is traditionally the start of the shooting season for red grouse in the UK, postponed to 13th August if 12th is a Sunday. International Lefthanders Day is on 13th and the Late Summer Bank Holiday in England, Northern Ireland and Wales this year is on Monday 28th as is the annual **Notting** Hill Carnival – and here in Stansted the Windmill Fête takes

> place; an event not to be missed. August comes to an end on Thursday 31st marked this year by National Burger Day here in the UK; yummy. Enjoy all this month has to offer.

### STANSTED MISSES OUT ON TOP 50 **PLACEMENT**

A panel on The Sunday Times has been researching the 50 best places to live in rural Britain - taking into account hard data on house prices, schools, crime rates and transport links. They also considered other factors, such as the local pub and parking penalties. Only one Essex village made it onto the list: Dedham in Constable Country. Although we are not a picturesque village, there are many positive things about living in Stansted. It is a very friendly place; people usually make eye contact, smile and say good morning. #### DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

In 1281 a City of London Regulation prohibited pigs from wandering the streets and 16 years later banned their sties from the street? In 1283, they prohibited tallow-melting in the streets as well as the scouring of furs. In 1311 the flaying of dead horses was also banned. A City of London Regulation in 1297 required every man to keep the front of his tenement clean, and in 1309 prohibited the casting of filth from his houses into the streets and lanes. At the start of the 18th century the country's population probably numbered around five and a half million. 'In the towns, houses, including cellars, were desperately overcrowded; there were no sanitary systems, and streets were unpaved and filthy. In the early part of the century only about one child in four born in London survived". "A statute of 1284 required underwood and wood banks to be removed from within 200 feet either side of the King's highway'. Oliver Rackham, author of 'The Last Forest', had this to say on an anti-highwayman's trench in Takeley Forest: "Another pointer to this early Act is the existence of a strip of open land between the northern coppices and Takeley Street (through which the railway was later to pass). Such narrow clearings called Trenches, were customarily made alongside main roads to give travellers a sense of security from highwaymen lurking in the bushes".



There are Karseys (see picture above) still surviving in Stansted although probably serving as garden sheds. You may think that the above largely applies to London and not Stansted. Then cast your eye to the ground when next approaching the station. There you will notice a raised cobbled way crossing Water Lane apparently into a blank wall which, before the Station Master's office was built. used to be the station's main entrance. This is from the days when horses with coaches or carts were standing long hours at the station forecourt awaiting the trains. At least the liquid filth generated ran off the pathway. Then there is the ancient woodland, known as Woodfields to the south of Chapel Hill. In 1703 the Society of Friends purchased six by four poles of Conygree Wood for a Meeting House. How did the wood get that name? Many people suggest it's to do with rabbits, but Nuttall's Dictionary 1902 gives a secondary explanation, and that is 'Cony-catcher' a thief, or a cheat.



#### There are no August **Sunday Walks**.

I appear to be a one-person-accident-zone! Quite a problem when you are a walker, so apologies to all for my absence on many of the walks this year. This month, I have decided to respond to some general enquiries about public footpaths, bridleways, and other tracks. These are termed Public Rights of Way (PROWs) and are identified on the appropriate local Ordnance Survey (OS) Map. In addition the Definitive PROW maps have to be kept and maintained by the relevant Local Highways Authority, and many authorities have an Interactive map of PROWs on their websites. Each Highways Authority is responsible for ensuring the maintenance of PROWS in their area. The actual land under a PROW is usually privately owned by a farmer, private individual, company, or charity, but not normally by the Highways Authority. Footways and pavements alongside roads, are usually owned by the Local Highway Authority, except where the road concerned has not been adopted. If reporting an issue in respect of a public footpath to your local Highway Authority, you will probably be asked for a reference number in order to identify it. These numbers are not shown on OS maps, because each parish has its own set of numbers for the paths within its boundaries, each usually commencing with number 1. This can make life interesting when walking along a continuous public footpath which crosses Parish boundaries; for example, Public Footpath No 27 within Stansted Parish, becomes Footpath No .5 when you cross into Birchanger Parish. Fortunately these numbers can be obtained on the Highway Authority Interactive Maps.

In addition to Public Rights of Way, there are Concessionary Paths. The concession can be removed at any time and some of these paths are not shown on OS maps. Also, there are paths where members of the public have walked for years, but these have no status and are not Public Rights of Way and therefore not identified on any maps. You could be requested not to walk along them by the land-owner.



Without an OS map, general direction guidance is provided by *finger* posts and way-markers, sometimes a post or a coloured disc, or combination of both. Yellow designates a public footpath; blue refers to a public bridleway (which incidentally should be the width of a cart); red is usually a track open to all users (including 4x4s); white usually defines Special Paths such as Millennium Walk, Acorn Way etc. Oh what a tangled path we tread.

Find it approximately opposite house number 124, Heath Row, postcode: CM23 5DG. If you go by car, **please** park courteously along Heath Row. Buses 509 and 309 also run along Heath Row, roughly every half hour.

#### Alternative entrances are:

From Woodfields or Northolt Avenue off Heath Row - no real parking available; or from the top of Parsonage Lane, going towards the Dunmow Road, just before Birchwood School. There is also a hidden entrance off the Dunmow Road, just after the roundabout with Parsonage Lane going in the direction of the Airport. There is no parking, but a number of buses from Bishop's Stortford do stop there. Finally, there is a narrow track from the far right-hand side of *Wickes* and *Pets at Home*, on the Stansted Road, Bishop's Stortford. There is no parking, and the stores can clamp visitors not using the stores. Enjoy summer.

#### Lower back pain

The Chief Medical Officer report of 2005 stated that around 80% of people experience lower back pain in their lives and that approximately 150 million working days are lost each year because of this. It is estimated nationally that around 20%-30% of GP appointments are taken up with patients presenting with lower back pain. This has led to schemes being put in place across the country to improve the service for such presentations. In July, the surgery started a pilot project with local chiropractors and physiotherapists (musculoskeletal, or MSK practitioners) to try and improve the quality of care for this very common presentation, by offering patients presenting with lower back pain a telephone assessment. The patient will be called by the MSK practitioner and assessed using a nationally accepted screening tool to determine the best course of action. This may include simple advice on self-management, physical examination, or referral into the NHS physiotherapy service for example. Due to the scale of the likely demand, the number of appointments being offered per day with the MSK practitioner are limited to ensure we can iron out any teething problems with the system. Whilst the service model is unique locally, it is based on a model used elsewhere in the NHS and helps improve access and improve quality. Patients who prefer to see one of the GP's or primary care practitioners will of course still be able to do so.

#### Other news

Whilst Dr Humphrey formally left as a partner at the end of March, she has continued to work for one day a week assisting with the ever-increasing list size at the practice. She will be greatly missed by patients and staff and we wish her and her family the very best for their new life in Yorkshire. The practice also has a new practice manager in Teresa Buglass, formerley deputy practice manager at Thaxted surgery, who has already started and will be full-time from 1st September.

## LOOK AFTER YOUR CHILD'S TEETH

Four out of five toddlers were not taken to the dentist last year despite NHS treatment being free for children.

Recent figures revealed by the Faculty of Dental Surgery, shows that the vast majority of parents are not taking their young children for regular dental check-ups. It comes amid soaring numbers of children needing to have bad teeth extracted in hospital. Official guidance recommends children should start having regular check-ups as soon as the first teeth appear. Dental check-ups are as much about getting children comfortable in a dental environment as it is about checking teeth. Simply getting a child to open their mouth for a dentist to look at their teeth is useful practice.

First impressions are vital if we want children to have a long-term positive impression of dentistry. If a first dental visit results in a stressful, traumatic experience, this could have a serious lifelong effect on a child's willingness to engage in the dental process. Many oral health problems are easily preventable. A dentist will look at the health of the teeth and gums, and also screen for oral cancer. Some basic prevention advice includes:

- Brushing children's teeth as soon as they erupt; brushing before bed and at least one other time daily using a fluoride toothpaste
- Having regard for the strength of fluoride toothpaste, and after brushing, spit out the excess toothpaste and do not rinse
- Eating a healthy, balanced diet and reducing the amount of sugar consumed will help prevent dental cavities

#### LIVING WITH AN ELDERLY DOG

## Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) announce public consultation on proposals for service changes

People in West Essex are being asked for their views on proposals designed to make best use of the money available to the local NHS, while helping as many people as possible to live healthier, longer lives and avoid preventable illnesses. These proposals are being put forward by West Essex Clinical Commissioning Group (WECCG) and come as the CCG faces a number of challenges. The number of people who need health service support is increasing and many people are living longer, often with complex conditions. A limited budget, care that is expensive and national and local shortages of NHS staff mean that we have to make sure that doctors', nurses' and other specialists' time is used wisely. These proposals are about:

- Reducing or stopping the availability of NHS-funded IVF (in vitro fertilisation) and specialist fertility services
- 2. Limiting the routine prescription of medicines and products that can be bought (from a pharmacy) without prescription for short-term conditions and minor ailments.

Dr Christine Moss, Clinical Director of West Essex CCG said, "We are not acting in isolation; the proposals we are seeking views on are also being put forward in Hertfordshire. While we accept our proposals around changes to IVF and specialist fertility treatments have the potential to make a significant difference to some patients' lives, we have to be realistic about what we can afford. Our proposed changes to limiting the routine prescription of medicines will, over time, save money; they are also aimed at freeing up more GP appointment time by encouraging patients to use the expertise of community pharmacists, who can advise on minor illnesses. We will be holding public events; speaking to people across West Essex; attending community and local health and social care meetings; taking opinion online and communicating with people via social media." Details of all these events will be advertised on the website. Consultation documents have been produced which give more detailed information on each of the proposals, why we are considering them, and a survey asking you what you think. This month I am writing about heather honey, which is the British equivalent of New Zealand manuka honey, only much better. I am sceptical about manuka honey, as it was invented by New Zealand in the 1980s to get a premium price for their honey. It is supposed to be honey which comes exclusively from the tea tree, but I have been to New Zealand and never seen acres of tea trees with bee hives in the middle of them. However, I do know that beekeepers in Britain take their hives onto the heather moors where the bees can collect nothing but heather pollen and nectar. Heather honey has its own unique flavour, due to its higher protein content, about 3% compared to 0.5% in normal honey. It is also a jelly, not a liquid (technically it is 'thixotropic'; it becomes liquid when agitated but then returns to a jelly). It also has a higher water content than the normal of 20%, so can ferment in the longer term. To collect heather honey, beekeepers will take their hives to a remote spot on the moor at the beginning of August until mid-September, and place them at the base of a hill, where the bees will bring honey down, rather than up to the hives. This also gives them shelter from the weather. Extraction is difficult because of the gelatinous nature of the product, and the equipment has to be agitated to change the honey to a liquid, or a honey press can be used instead of a rotary extractor. To get over this, it is common for beekeepers to sell heather honey on the comb, which some consumers like. For these reasons, heather honey does attract a premium price, which is well deserved; and manuka honey, does that deserve a price premium? I think you know my answer to that.

Meadowsweet Spiraea ulmaria Filipendula ulmaria This sacred herb of the Druids gave its name to the most famous drug in history. Meadowsweet has been used by the ancients, valued as a strewing herb, and medicinally, it could ease pain, bring down fevers and soothe the stomach.



The plant's most interesting active ingredient is salicylic acid. In 1830 apothecary Johann Pagenstecher used meadowsweet to treat toothache and rheumatism. He developed it into a powerful remedy and published the results in a Swiss journal. This led to alkaloid specialist Karl Lowig experimenting with the tincture, and thinking he had found a new substance, he named it spirsaure after the meadowsweet. It was realised later that he had discovered salicylic acid, more often associated with the willow. It took a further 60 years to synthesise this useful chemical. In the spring of 1899 three scientists working for Bayer, finally produced the elusive pill. Eichengrun, Dresser and Hofmann managed to synthesise the salicylic acid. They agreed to use the old Latin name for the meadowsweet, spirea, thus the A-SPIR-IN was born. This drug could bring down fevers and relieve pain, just as the plant had done. This was the first wonder drug of all time. The man who truly discovered the aspirin was Arthur Edward Eichengrun, a talented scientist with many discoveries to his name. In 1941 he visited the Hall of Honour in the Deutsche Museum and saw displayed the white crystals of aspirin, lauding the success of Hofmann and Dresser, not him! Tragically, being Jewish had precluded him from getting the credit he so rightly deserved.
