





My Stansted swallows are now sitting on their second batch of eggs; their first fledglings are whizzing around far and wide, coming back in the evening to roost. We have been experiencing a super heat-wave in the latter part of June into July and this will affect the weaker and shallow-rooted trees as they have less access to water than the deeper-rooted primary trees in the wood. Below are some notes I made when walking during one of the hotter days, when there was also a strong wind blowing.



'HANDS UNITED IN PEACE' STANSTED MOUNTFITCHET WITH RUNGIS

We were privileged to attend the Twinning Ceremony between Stansted Mountfitchet and Rungis, which took place on Friday 6th July in St John's Church. Monsieur le Maire, Raymond Charresson, spoke first, saying how proud he is to be part of this significant event. He mentioned the similarities between the two communities: amongst them the importance placed on economic, social, educational and cultural issues.



Maureen Caton then spoke about how she hopes the friend-ship will grow. Important possibilities for the future include language exchanges, as well as the prospect of employment. She referred to the fact that one of the signatories of the Magna Carta was Richard de Montfichet. Our local MP, Kemi Badenoch, talked about the history shared between the two towns; Stansted was founded in the late 11th century, and Rungis only 38 years later. She discussed the value of town twinning; this is something we can feel optimistic about during these rather difficult political times. The ceremony was greatly enhanced with lovely singing by the St John's Choir, featuring songs with very apt words for the occasion, including 'Hands United in Peace' by Rothernberg and 'Look at the World' by John Rutter.

Rungis is a town in Val-de-Marne, one of the southern suburbs of Paris. It also has a community magazine, called *le journal de Rungis.* If you go to the website *www.rungis.fr* you will find a picture of the June cover, which shares similarities with the cover of this issue! BANK HOLIDAY MILL-DAY

In 1871, the 33 saints' days and religious festivals previously observed as holidays by the Bank of England were reduced to just four: 1st May (May Day), 1st November (All Saints' Day), Good Friday and Christmas Day. As the first legislation relating to bank holidays was introduced in the same year by the Liberal politician and banker Sir John Lubbock, the holidays were sometimes referred to as *St Lubbock's Day*.

Here in Stansted the August Bank Holiday Monday (27th) is special; not only because it's the last bank holiday before Christmas but because it's also when the annual Windmill Fête takes place. Built in 1787 along with a malthouse and villa, the windmill would have looked guite different to how it does now. Originally constructed on staging supported by a timber round house, it has been constantly altered and improved as successive millers have struggled to make a living. The mill closed as a working mill in 1910 and in 1935 its then owner, the second Lord Blyth, conveyed the mill 'for the benefit of the inhabitants of Stansted' and the Parish Council were appointed as Trustees. The mill had become damp with mildew, rot and woodworm while standing empty, so when the Stansted Scout Troop started to use it as their Headquarters in 1942 they had to clean it and sort out the woodworm. They continued to base their activities at the windmill until 1963, keeping it aired and weatherproof: helping to prevent the structure from deteriorating beyond repair.

Scheduled as an ancient monument in 1952, the Trustees together with the Stansted Millers carry out the ongoing repairs and maintenance needed to preserve the windmill. This requires a great deal of money and the Bank Holiday Fête is the mill's main fundraiser of the year and a very enjoyable event. The sun always shines (well nearly always) on the day and there's normally something at the fête for all the family. If you've never been inside the windmill or to the fête, I can highly recommend both. See you on 27th August 1.00pm-5.00pm.



NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

HIGHWAYS ISSUES

Calling All Cyclists

As part of the Neighbourhood Plan, the Parish Council is looking at ways to encourage cycling, whether for commuting, for leisure, or for any other reason. If you are a cyclist, or would like to take up cycling, we would like you to help us improve your experience.

- Can you suggest where cycle routes would be feasible?
- Are there any ways of making cycling safer in the centre of the village?
- Are there places you would like to see cycle racks?

We are looking for active cyclists to meet with us to pull together ideas. If we can come up with sound, practical and realistic ideas, then this will improve the chances of winning support and gaining funding.

Calling All Pedestrians

Most residents will walk within the village to a greater or lesser extent. The Parish Council is keen to encourage people to walk more, which will benefit their health and reduce car usage, which will help lower emissions.

Please contact us if there are any safety issues that deter you from walking, and let us have your ideas for improvements that would make walking easier, more pleasant and, most importantly, safer.

Do You Use a Mobility Aid?

If you do please let the Parish Council know if you have any difficulties getting around the village. It is all too easy for us not to recognise the problems, so do not hesitate to let us know if there are any obstacles that make it difficult to get around. Please use the contact details on page 24 to let us have your views.

Grove Hill

There have been regular incidents of HGV vehicles that have attempted to drive up Grove Hill but have failed to get through because they are too big so had to reverse back. In addition, there have been concerns about lorries that can squeeze through but are above the weight limit set by Essex Highways.

If you observe any vehicle that is causing a problem, please record the registration number and, if possible, the name of the company, and report it to the Parish Council. The company will then be contacted and asked to comply with the Traffic Regulation Order.

On top of this, the increased traffic flow from the Elsenham direction is causing lengthy delays at peak times, causing frustration to residents. The phasing of the lights is to be changed in order to improve traffic flow at the request of Elsenham Parish Council. We have requested a weight limit for lorries coming down the hill but this could take some time.

BENTFIELD PLAY AREA

We have now secured funding for a basketball ring with hard-standing at the Bentfield Green play area. Consultation on this took place some time ago. From the responses received, supporters of the project far outnumbered residents who had reservations.

The funding comes from an external agency and is specifically for this project so there is no cost to Stansted residents.

DIARY DATES

The annual **Skatepark Jam** will take place on Sunday 2 September. There will be events for all ages and abilities. The event attracts top skaters from around the area and spectators are very welcome to witness some impressive 'tricks'.

The Jam will be immediately followed by **Music in the Skatepark** which will feature live performances from local bands and runs for two hours starting at 6.00 pm. It's all free so please pay a visit at some time in the afternoon.

As part of the run up to the World War I Centenary Remembrance Day we have arranged for Saffron Screen to stage a Pop Up cinema showing of **Journey's End** on Friday 9 November. Look out for times and ticket details in the next edition of The Link.

CRAFTON GREEN PROJECT

We promised to keep you abreast of developments as the construction work progresses. This is how the site looked at the end of June. The ground work is more or



less complete and materials are arriving on site ready for work on the main structure of the building to start.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Alan Dean writes

A five-hour full council meeting on June 19th was a record event. Maybe the significance of the meeting - to agree a draft Local Plan for the final lap of its 12-year gestation period - justified debate until four minutes to midnight. Another view would conclude there was a lot of time-wasting. The district now has an agreed draft plan that contains three new garden communities located north-east of Great Chesterford, south of Little Easton and east of Stebbing. The principles behind garden towns and villages can be read at www.tcpa.org.uk. For Stansted the plan includes future housing land at the top of High Lane, across the road from the current Walpole Meadows development.

Stansted's four district councillors voted for the plan to proceed to the final stage of consultation, which has been running since June and ends on August 13th. In the autumn the plan will be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for examination at a public inquiry. Given a fair wind, the Local Plan will finally be adopted after next May's local elections.

So why, you may ask, did it take five hours to agree to a public consultation? There were 20-odd public speakers who wanted to object to the new settlements near to where they live. Then there was a delaying amendment from Elsenham, Newport and Saffron Walden councillors to put off a decision for further investigations. Yes, more delay after 12 years! Many reasons were put forward by the public why their locality was unsuitable, even by the few who recognised that there is a national and local housing crisis.

I spoke about some stark facts: that the average cost of a home in Uttlesford is 11.7 times the average income

of people working in this district. Today couples need a joint income of £74,241 to purchase an average priced 2-bedroom property in Uttlesford at £305,700. Our villages are turning into ghettos for well-healed people. Our children and grandchildren are being denied their own decent homes because demand has been outstripping supply for years. This is part of a nation-wide housing crisis. I stressed the point that there is a housing shortage crisis, and no case at all for saying it doesn't exist and shouldn't be solved on some people's own doorsteps; that we must all face the facts and think of younger generations and others less fortunate.

I am chairing an all-party working group identifying requirements that will help define the Local Plan's demand for "40% affordable housing". We know that so-called affordable rents at 70% of full market-level rents still means that many people are left with too little money for the other needs of life besides a roof and bed. Community Land Trusts are one option. The trusts acquire land at low or zero cost, so the prices (including rents) can be set at levels well below open market levels. A report on that work is expected in September. The outcome will feed into the detailed Garden Community negotiations over coming months as the Local Plan is defined in greater detail.

The policy on Stansted Airport (SP11) has been strengthened at my request. It now commits the Council to resisting any relaxation of the controls on night flights. A statement about developments being in accordance with the latest throughput permission has been reinserted. Other improvements address public transport access for non-aviation users, especially uses by local people. Statements on climate changing emissions by aircraft are more explicit. Protections needed for the amenity of local residents and the environment have been bolstered. In particular, the airport owner is required to take responsibility for reducing the effect of aircraft on the area by demanding fleet modernisation by airlines.

The Local Plan was approved by 23 votes to 13. Those voting against were from Elsenham, Newport and Saffron Walden as well as three councillors from the garden settlement wards. If the opponents had been successful, under central government rules, sites for over 2,000 more homes would almost certainly have had to have been added to the Local Plan, the council would have lost local control of the planning process and there would have been several years more of uncontrolled development in places like Elsenham and Stansted. Landowners and developers would have been allowed to fill the vacuum through the Planning appeal process. Thankfully, that fate has been avoided.

TWINNING CELEBRATIONS

It's official - we are now twinned with Rungis, France!

In June, a delegation visited Rungis to join their celebrations and to sign the Charter, and a return visit to Stansted in July completed the formalities. For detailed reports and more photographs see pages 17 and 29.



STANSTED MOUNTFITCHET EVENING WI



What a pleasure to attend our June meeting on such a lovely summer's evening. We have a new President, Anne Watson. This was her first meeting and all went well! Anne is a familiar face at our top table as she has been our minutes secretary for the past 12 months. We wish her well.

The meeting started with the singing of 'Jerusalem' and then we were introduced to our new Committee and the roles they will be carrying out on our behalf. Other business followed before we welcomed our speaker, Steve Lester, who had come to tell us about *The Titanic, from Launch to* Loss. Having piped himself aboard using a deck officer's whistle, he then explained that he considers himself a 'Titanorak', and his knowledge proved to be considerable. There were to be three White Star ships in their class, the Olympic, the Titanic and the Britannic and they would rival any Cunard ship afloat. The keel of the Titanic was laid down in 1910 and her maiden voyage commenced on 10th April 1912. A series of events had a domino effect on the maiden voyage, resulting in the Titanic being in the wrong area of the Atlantic at the wrong time of year, hence the problem icebergs and the fatal collision. White Star never claimed that their ships were unsinkable; this rumour started after the Olympic was holed and, with water-tight doors closed, managed to make it to port. Also, Steve told us that the order "woman and children first" did not actually preclude men from getting in the lifeboats after the women, so many boats were launched below capacity. When the wreckage was discovered in 1985 it was seen that the keel of the ship was still intact. Had it broken, the stern section would have stayed afloat much longer and more lives would have been saved. Following this tragedy, many changes were made to maritime legislation including the number of lifeboats that

GARDENING TIPS FOR AUGUST

With June into July being very hot and dry, many plants died due to drought. If you are looking to replace lost specimens, wait if you can for better conditions in September. If you have a plant ready now, look to give it a good start in life, immerse it fully in a bucket of water (even drought resistant plants such as lamb's ears, etc). The compost that most nurseries use is typically peat or coir based, really dries out easily and resists re-wetting. Even plants whose root ball feels damp on the outside are often still dry and hydrophobic on the inner part of the root ball. A 20-minute immersion is enough to moisten the compost thoroughly. Next pour half a watering can of water into the hole to be planted, to ensure there is moisture below to encourage the roots to spread downwards. Place the plant in the hole and firm it in well. Mulch around the top with a suitable moisture retentive material and give the soil at the base of the plant another soaking with the watering can without the rose on; do this even if the soil is already wet. It is a useful way of removing excessive air pockets and consolidating the soil around the rootball. Finally ensure that the plant and any other young plants you have put in this season are given regular thorough soakings throughout their first year. Avoid using a hose with the spray end on it, a better option is to fill a watering can and apply directly to the required point. If you do have to use a hose, take the spray end off and use the normal hose opening, or use a device that simulates a tap flow that can be directed at the base of the plant.

At least, unlike last year, we have not yet had to cancel any group visits due to rain or wind. We have had visitors from a whole range of groups including Uttlesford Wild Flower Group, Garden Clubs, WIs and U3As as well as visitors from the USA wishing to see where their relatives were stationed in the second world war.



TO MUMBAI BY BIKE FOR MAGIC BUS

Courageous Stansted residents Joe Andrews and Verity Ellis are about to set off on an extraordinary travel adventure in aid of charity and they could do with your support.



Verity explains: "Joe is a Maths teacher at Felsted School, and I am an Intellectual Property solicitor working in London. We are about to embark on a cycle adventure fundraising for Magic Bus, the education and gender equality charity. Leaving in the middle of August, we are cycling from the UK through 15 countries and covering at least 4,000 miles in order to get to Mumbai in January 2019 to see the charity in action. We will make our way through Western Europe, over the Alps and along the Dalmatian coast through Istanbul, but after Turkey things are likely to get a little trickier. 2018 WINE AWARDS

The season of wine awards is upon us, with little circular stickers appearing on supermarket bottles indicating that a bottle has been given an award. The largest two groups giving such awards in the UK are the *Decanter World Wine Awards* and the *International Wine Competition*. The former is connected to the Decanter wine magazine and the latter was originally also a magazine but now just connected to the annual awards. With so many categories and awards, the secret is to get the top award-winning wines before they become well known. The categories seem to expand every year with more levels above the normal gold, silver, bronze



and commended such as 'platinum' and 'trophy' and even individual awards for countries or grapes. These somewhat 'water down' the achievements in the lower categories. So ideally just look for those with a silver or above.

So here are a few top picks from the 'Gold' category from both sets of awards. Be careful on the vintages as previous vintages may still be on the shelves and have won lesser categories last year. Waitrose has a couple to look out for including their own new white and blue label Austrian Gruner Veltiner 2017 at £7.99, a lovely fresh white wine with stone fruit flavours and a peppery hint. Also look for the 2017 Reserva Malbec and Cabernet Franc mix by Santa Julia from Argentina at £9.99 full of dark red fruit and spices. Sainsburys has a gold medal winning Chenin Blanc from South Africa. This version is the 2017 Stellenrust Chenin Blanc at £7 from Stellenbosch with zesty pineapple and pear notes. Finally wait for the new vintages of a couple of high class wines: at Marks and Spencer the 2017 Italian white Ascheri Langhe Arneis at around £13.50 with its full tropical fruit flavours and from Majestic a smooth voluptuous red, the 2015 Vinalba Gran Reservado Malbec at £15 as part of a six-bottle mixed case. Happy hunting.

BRAIN TRAINING

Letter Ball - improves vision, hand/eye co-ordination and stiff shoulders

- 1. Using a marker pen, write five to six letters on a tennis ball, spreading them out evenly.
- 2. Play catch with one or more people.
- 3. As you catch the ball watch it into your hands and call out the letter you see.
- 4. If you can, throw the ball without spinning it so it is easier to see the letter approach.
- Start catching with both hands, then move to one handed catching. The ultimate is to patch one eye and catch the ball, which is much harder since you lose depth perception and suddenly become a ball fumbler.
- 6. Be careful to watch the ball all the way into the hands; it is very common to predict where the ball will be rather than really look at it.
- 7. If you have no partner, you can just throw the ball up and catch, throw it from hand to hand, against a wall or bounce it on the floor.
- 8. If catching really is difficult, you can use either a balloon or even a hacky sack.

Tracking the ball exercises the eyes, particularly their ability to change focus from far to near. It also encourages us to really move our arms about to catch. If we have sore or stiff arms/shoulders we focus on the pain and



learn to fear movement; one of the best cures is to have an external reason for movement, like reaching out to catch a ball. We think about ball catching, not painful shoulders, helping us to unlearn fearful movement.




