The idea behind 'Swedish death cleaning' appears to be that having managed our reputation in life, we should contrive to do so in death by ridding ourselves in advance of anything that might tarnish our carefully cultivated image. No life is a completely open book. We all have a need for our own private space. However, we deceive ourselves and others if we think that showing our 'best self' to the world tells anyone about who we truly are.





FOREST HALL SCHOOL



Free professional music tuition is being given to primary and secondary school children in Stansted. Pupils in Reception and Year 1 at Magna Carta Primary Academy and students in Years 7 and 8 at Forest Hall School are receiving the fortnightly tuition. Younger children are starting to learn about rhythm using clapping, while older students are being taught music skills using the piano and woodwind instruments. Music teacher Julia Lysons, who has 20 years' experience of working with Essex Music Hub, said: "This is a great development for our young people. It is the first time Forest Hall School has had extra-curricular music provision for them and it's already having a very positive effect. Children who were keen to learn to play an instrument are now getting that opportunity and we are able to spot students who are showing real promise. It is also giving some students an interest they didn't realise they had. It is great to see the move towards a position where so many of our students now have musical skills. Starting that tuition from reception onwards will continue to have a huge impact in the future."



Students in Years 7 and 8 also study music as part of the curriculum and those in Years 9 to 11 can take music as a GCSE option. As well as the growth in musical ability and confidence, the regular tuition is seeing other benefits across the schools. Mrs Lysons said: "The tuition is helping students with their concentration, especially with more active children who are becoming able to concentrate for longer. It is also helping those who struggle with fine motor skills." It is hoped the sessions will soon include guitar tuition.

PLANNING APPLICATION PROPOSES MORE TRAFFIC IN STANSTED

The Fairfield Partnership has submitted a proposal for 350 new homes on land between Elsenham and Henham. They are clearly hoping to take advantage of the interval before Uttlesford District Council's Local Plan is ready for further consideration. In a previous application, Fairfield proposed that traffic would be encouraged to avoid Stansted in favour of the route via Hall Road, Elsenham, towards Stansted Airport. The new proposal has abandoned that strategy and now acknowledges that drivers will use the route via Grove Hill, Stansted. The Transport Assessment with the application claims that gridlock never occurs on Grove Hill, as dri-vers adopt 'courteous' behaviour and do not proceed if they would cause a blockage, even though strictly they have priority. Undoubtedly this is usually the case - the stretch of road above the lights could not function otherwise. But residents of Elsenham, and no doubt Stansted also, are well aware that serious hold-ups occur from time to time on Grove Hill, and along the whole route through the village. If you think that enough is enough for traffic through Stansted, please email: planning@uttlesford.gov.uk with the reference UTT/17/3573/OP as the subject. You should say that you object to the proposal for 350 houses at Elsenham and indicate why. You can be as brief as you like. It would be particularly helpful if you mentioned any experiences of gridlock, that is, a situation whereby traffic is unable to move in either direction. The deadline is Tuesday 13th February.

494 SQUADRON – SHINY SHOES



Part of the responsibility of being an Air Cadet requires taking care of how we look, and keeping our parade shoes clean and well-polished is a cornerstone of excellent cadet practice. The best way to polish our shoes is to keep it simple, do it regularly and spend time being thorough. All we need is shoe polish, a bowl of water and a cloth. We wrap the cloth around our forefinger, take a small amount of shoe polish onto the cloth and make circular movements on the shoe, usually starting with the toe cap. It can feel rough and so we add a very small bit of water to the end of our cloth (never to the shoe) and keep up with the circular movements until any scratches or imperfections have disappeared. Then we keep adding very thin layers of polish using the circular movement of our finger until we start to get a shiny effect. We keep this going until we can see our reflection in our shoes! A great time to do this is that hour before bedtime when you have switched off all your screens. Pop some music on instead and make a start. It can take up to about three hours to do both shoes properly.

Our January meeting was extremely enjoyable as we had four short presentations by our own members:

The first was **Tony Wellings** who gave a demonstration on sawing. He brought with him a large pit saw and part of a tree trunk, giving us an insight into how planks were cut by sawyers using the saw and a pit. Tony Crosby then gave a talk on the new Uttlesford Local Heritage List and how he has put together a list of certain structures and monuments from the village that he hopes will make it on to the heritage list submitted to the council in November. Tony also gave us a summary of the historic areas, listed buildings and conservation areas in the village. Third was Ralph Phillips who gave a presentation in two parts. Firstly the history around the large black *ledger stone* in St Mary's Church on behalf of Thomas Ray and his wife Dorothy, whose families were substantial land owners, including Thremhall Priory, Stansted Mill, Park Mead, Hartishobury (Hassobury) and others. The second subject was Stansted Park, which included Elms Farm, a large area of land opened exclusively for the public. Ralph spoke to us about the history going back to the De Vere family, the Earl of Oxford, Sir Robert Rochester and Dorothy Josselyn. The fourth and final speaker was our Chairman, Peter Brown, who gave us part history of Stansted Fire Brigade. He explained how in the 17th century, villages were told to provide fire cover for its residents, which usually came in the form of a manual pump. In 1822 Stansted purchased a new pump at a cost of £83, a substantial amount of money back then. In 1894 The Parish took over the running of the station and subsequently bought a new pump and uniform for its firefighters.

Whenever you book a package holiday that involves flights and holidays including a flight plus accommodation or car hire, you must be protected under an ATOL Licence. You should receive an ATOL Certificate from your travel agent when you make payment - keep it safe.

Note: flights booked directly with most airlines are not protected under the ATOL scheme.

Pay by credit or debit card

Paying for your holiday using a credit or debit card is your safest bet. If you are asked to make payments by bank transfer or cash - be very suspicious!

Tip: Before you book your holiday always ask your travel agent what level of protection you would receive.



NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

TRAFFIC AND PARKING - FINDING IMPROVEMENTS?

As part of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, work continues to find ways to increase pedestrian safety, to improve traffic flows and to add more parking spaces.

One initial word of caution. It is unlikely that much can be done to prevent traffic using the local roads although efforts are being made to enforce the weight restriction on Grove Hill.

We would welcome all views on the following issues:

- 1) Cambridge Road reducing footpath width to improve traffic flows and helping to provide more parking spaces.
- 2) Cambridge Road/Chapel Hill junction to consider introducing two small roundabouts to ease turning and crossing.
- 3) Chapel Hill to consider eliminating on-street parking from Woodfield Terrace to the junction with Cambridge Road and to introduce priority signage on the stretch between St John's Road and the Millway entrance.
- 4) Lower Street to consider reducing footpath width to improve traffic flow and to re-engineer the roundabout to prevent traffic acting in a dangerous manner.
- 5) Church Road to seek ways to make traffic calming safer in order to reduce speeds.
- 6) High Lane to assess the best way of introducing traffic calming given the likely increased traffic flows from the Walpole Farm development.
- 7) Increase car parking capacity by evaluating another deck over part of the Lower Street car park and, UDC agreeing finance, to acquire land behind Tesco Express for short-term parking.

Please email your opinions and ideas to parishcouncil@stansted.net or write to the Parish Council at Crafton Green. Response to this consultation will be important in determining what is included in the Plan and whether the Plan is approved. Thank you in advance for your help.

FLOOD MANAGEMENT

In December we had the double whammy of melting snow followed by rain which resulted in some flooding in the vicinity of the Cambridge Road and High Lane junction adjacent to the Bloor Homes development site. Understandably residents and businesses in Lower Street get very concerned about a potential repeat of the flooding experienced a couple of years ago. We have a small group of volunteer Flood Wardens who do sterling work in monitoring the water courses and keeping them free of debris that can block the flow of water and cause flooding. It would be great if a few more people who live in the Lower Street area could get involved and offer some support when there is a flood risk. Should you wish to volunteer as a Flood Warden, please contact the Council Offices.

FLY TIPPING

We get fairly regular reports of Fly Tipping which we forward to the District Council who have an in-house team, who go out and clear up what is often a very unpleasant mess. However nobody involved in dealing with the issue had ever experienced anything on the scale of what happened early in the morning of Tuesday 14 December in Pennington Lane (see below)



Contractors had to be employed to clear waste at a cost of £3,500. There is an ongoing investigation to try and identify the culprits. If they manage to track down the offenders, they can in theory be prosecuted and fined an unlimited amount or imprisoned for up to 5 years. We all very much hope they get what they deserve.

ALLOTMENTS

Both the Walpole Farm and Elms Farm developments will eventually have areas created for allotments, which will be handed over to the Parish Council to manage. We have no definite dates when these will become available, but we are hopeful Elms Farm will be ready by the end of this year. A number of people have already been in contact with us expressing a desire to take on an allotment and their names have been added to a waiting list. If you want to add your name to the waiting list please email parishcouncil@stansted.net or apply in writing to the Parish Council office.

LOST PROPERTY

You may recall the story about the search for a man who left his pay packet in a London pub before Christmas which ended happily after he came forward to claim the money. Thousands of people appealed on social media over the Christmas break to find Mariusz, a Polish construction worker, who left his £600 wages on the floor in the Alexandra pub in Wimbledon, South London, on 21 December. Mariusz claimed the money after he correctly described the envelope and named the amount of money inside. Pub management then double-checked his identity on CCTV.

The pub employee who found the pay packet was widely praised for his honesty and we are reasonably confident that any Stansted resident who found an item of value would want to reunite it with its rightful owner. In the "old days" you could just hand in anything you found to the local police station but with the closure of so many stations this probably isn't practicable. Occasionally people post lost property items on Stansted Matters but not everybody is social media savvy so what else can can you do? Well, you could hand them into the Parish Council Office at Crafton Green. Our environmental rangers also occasionally find items such as keys, wallets and even passports which they bring into our office, and we use our best detective skills to try to identify and locate the rightful owner; but if we can't identify the owner, we will store the item and see if anyone claims it.

TOWN TWINNING

We are in regular contact with our twin town of Rungis and are exploring a range of joint activities. We would very much like to hear from families or individuals who would be interested in exchange visits involving hosting French visitors and spending some time in the home of a French host. VILLAGE EVENTS AND VOLUNTEERS

We are very pleased to be able to report that a successful bid has been made to the National Lottery "Awards For All" fund. This means that we will be able to have the extra attractions that many of you enjoyed at last year's Windmill Bank Holiday Fete.

This is taken from the bid submission: "Through Parish consultation people are telling us that more and more they lead disjointed lifestyles. Many people have busy lives and do not have much time to engage with their neighbours and others in the village like they used to. Local people are saying they are finding that they have less and less time to come together and meet up in our community."

It would be great if we could have a few more community events throughout the year, but for this to happen we need to involve more people in the planning and delivery of the events. Part of our bid was based on the following:

"We have a small group of willing 'older' volunteers who have helped plan different community events over the years but they are not getting any younger (they have said themselves they need to 'hand the baton on'!) and we need to involve younger and new people to ensure community events like this will continue. We want to promote the idea of giving time voluntarily to support community activity in the village and offer people training and support to be able to do so. We have identified a Social Enterprise group who train people in community event planning, including: event management, planning, publicity and budgeting. This will take place from early 2018 and will continue up until the event in the summer."

It doesn't matter how long you have lived in the village, or how old you are, volunteering can be very rewarding and great fun. Including volunteering activities on your CV can be a real attraction to colleges, universities and potential employers. It's also good for "empty nesters" and retired people looking for something worthwhile and meaningful to do with their time. Please give it some serious thought and look out for details of training events which will be published soon.

YOUTH CLUB

The Autumn term was very busy with lots of new Yr 6 young people joining and our established members returning after the summer holidays. For those who are unaware where and when we operate, we are at the rear of the Children's Centre in Lower St and we are open on Tues, Wed and Thurs 6.30-8.30pm and Fri 7.00-9.00pm. The age for membership is school Yr 6 upwards. Our core membership age is 11-14 years, but we do accept older young people up to 16 years. The club is managed by qualified professional youth workers, youth advisors and local volunteers and supported by Stansted Parish and Uttlesford District Councils.

We offer a fun place to meet with their friends in a safe environment. The activities on offer are: football and basketball (both indoors and out), badminton, unihoc, dodgeball, volleyball, table football, table tennis, pool, arts and crafts, TV Room, computers and music. NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Thom Goddard writes

A very happy new year to everyone reading this and I hope 2018 is a great year for you and our beautiful corner of Essex.

The Local Plan

There were just over 6,000 replies to Uttlesford District Council's public consultation on the Local Plan last year and Council officers made a raft of suggestions. The Council has commissioned a number of pieces of work that relate directly to comments from local people on water, highways, sport and heritage. Uttlesford District Council takes the views of residents very seriously. If you missed presenting your opinions in the public consultation you can always contact any of your District Councillors so your views are heard.

Uttlesford District Council has commissioned Garden City Developments Ltd. to carry out a thorough assessment of the delivery options for the new Garden Communities. The report is due this month and is part of the Council looking at every option to minimise disruption to local residents while conforming to UK Government's housing demands.

Castle Maltings Pharmacy

At the end of November over 50 members of the public and a number of District and Parish Councillors gathered to support the application for a pharmacy at Castle Maltings. At present only Boots at the top of Chapel Hill is able to dispense prescriptions in Stansted and Prof Ashok Soni is appealing to the NHS for a second pharmacy alongside the surgery in Castle Maltings. Lower Street Car Park

I am afraid to report there is no change surrounding the Lower Street car park. Your local Councillors continue to receive complaints and we are listening. Cllrs Alan Dean and Geoffrey Sell have been meeting with council officers and Cllr Howard Ryles, the cabinet member responsible for car parks, to press for an action plan leading to improvements.

Local Investment

We are coming to the end of the Council year and in May 2017 each of your District Councillors was given £3,000 for community initiatives AND was able to carry over half of their money from last year. THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY - ALMSHOUSES

www.hundredparishes.org.uk

Almshouses were built to enable the poor, old or disabled who were no longer able to work and pay rent to remain in the community. The first recorded was in the 10th century, founded in York by King Athelstan. The oldest still in existence is at Winchester. They were often a result of a gift from a wealthy benefactor, consisting of a terrace of houses to accommodate a number of residents. The Hundred Parishes has some fine examples – here are just a few.

In Buntingford High Street, the almshouses for the elderly were founded by Bishop Seth Ward in 1684. He was a mathematician and astronomer who was born in Aspenden and educated in Cambridge. He became Bishop of Exeter in 1662 and Salisbury in 1667. The almshouses are now run by a charity.



Radwinter's almshouses were designed by the Arts and Crafts architect William Eden Nesfield in 1887 as part of a collaboration with Rev'd Frederick Bullock following the great Radwinter fire in 1874. His work included other buildings in Radwinter and London.



Lord Richard Rich, Lord Chancellor under Edward VI, founded Felsted School and nearby almshouses in 1565. They were rebuilt in 1878. Rich is buried at Felsted Church which has an elaborate memorial to him. More details of Rich can be found within the People section of the Hundred Parishes website.



In Thaxted this almshouse with a thatched roof was originally built as a priest's house. The building opposite dates from 1714 and incorporates eight tenements. In 1830 it housed sixteen older persons: thirteen widows, a man, a wife and a maid.

PUBLIC MEETING RE STANSTED PHARMACY

The Public Meeting concerning Stansted Pharmacy's NHS prescription dispensing licence application.

A meeting was convened on 23rd November in the Day Centre; it gave the community the opportunity to hear the issues which were included in Professor Soni's application for a licence to dispense NHS prescriptions from his Stansted Pharmacy and to voice their views and needs. About 50 members of our community and surrounding villages attended this meeting. Our Parish Council Chairman, Maureen Caton, chaired the meeting, Ray Woodcock gave an overview of the local issues and Professor Soni (Ash) told us what his plans are once he gets his licence. John Zucker, who is Ash's advisor, shared his thinking of other services the Pharmacy could provide which will support local community needs. The meeting then had a question and answer period.



Ash Soni OBE FFRPS FRPharmS is President of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society; he already has a licence to dispense NHS prescriptions from his Streatham Pharmacy. Ash applied for his Stansted Pharmacy licence in late 2016; it was refused in August 2017. He appealed, submitting many documents and supporting statements, highlighting the need for this additional dispensing pharmacy for our growing community, with the housing developments at Foresthall Park, Walpole Farm, Elms Farm and 14 Cambridge Road. In addition, Bishop's Stortford North will eventually have over 2500 dwellings, and many of its residents are expected to use the facilities in Stansted. Unfortunately, our MP, Kemi Badenoch, could not be present as she had a long-standing commitment with Newport Parish Council. Kemi has met a number of her constituents who raised the pharmacy issue with her. She is now examining why NHS England declined the application. This includes the rules which govern licences; she is also considering if this issue should be raised in Parliament. We await her response.

Appeal hearing

We were pressing for the appeal hearing to be held in public, at which all could participate. Sadly, the NHS Resolution team considered the Appeal in private and did not give any of us the oral opportunity to contribute to their considerations. NHS Resolution informed the 'Consultees' of their decision on 2nd January - the appeal was rejected! This must be considered a major blow to our community, particularly those who would have benefited most from having a dispensing pharmacy at the bottom of Chapel Hill, many of whom are chronically unwell and/or have mobility difficulties. What next? Frankly I don't know, but because our need is real, this decision must be challenged. Please let me know your thoughts.

VISION DRILL

Simple exercise to improve driving, reading and dry eye Vision is the prime sense; an astonishing amount of brain power goes into processing visual information. Even the most sophisticated robot's vision comes nowhere near ours – our eyes are far more complex than mere video cameras. There is much that can be done to improve vision, irrespective of glasses. As always, not every drill suits everybody, so it is wise to test before and after to see if it suits you. First test your balance by standing on one leg, then look at some writing on a wall – it could be a calendar – stare at the smallest letter you can see and notice how clear it is, and then compare the clarity of each eye. Now blink rapidly for a few seconds. Look at the letter again, with both eyes, then with each eye, and see if there is any improvement in sharpness. Now see if your balance has improved. As you blink, make sure that your head stays still and relaxed, so it is just the eyelids doing the work.



The nerve that make the eyelids close also makes our tears, so blinking rapidly can help relieve dry eye - a quicker solution than reaching for the eyedrops. As drivers, the better we see,

the safer we drive. If we want to learn that foreign language, the more comfortably we read, the longer we can spend studying it. Therefore a few seconds spent blinking rapidly, several times a day, can do wonders.

FEBRUARY FACTS AND FABLES

Birthstone: Amethyst symbolizing piety, humility and sincerity. Flower: Primrose

The Romans named it *Februarius* from the word *februa*, which means cleansing or purification, reflecting the rituals that were undertaken before spring. The Anglo Saxons called it *sol monath* or *kale monath* after the cabbage. Having just 28 days each year (except in a Leap Year) February is the only month that can pass without a single full moon, which last happened in 1999. It Is National Bird-Feeding month in the US and here the snowdrop, symbol of hope appears.

Candlemas Day (Christian festival of lights) is on the 2nd of this month; an ancient festival when all the candles to be used in the coming year would be brought to Church and blessed. Candles were very important as they not only gave light but were also thought to give protection against illness and famine. The 4th is World Cancer Day and the 13th is Shrove Tuesday, also known as Mischief or Pancake Day, 40 days before Easter and the last day for fun and food before Lent. A special game of football involving large numbers of people is still played on Shrove Tuesday on the streets of some places in England. It is both St Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday on the 14th and the Chinese New Year (Year of the Dog) on the 16th. Members of the Scout and Guide movements remember their founders, Lord and Lady Robert Baden-Powell on World Thinking Day, the 22nd.



If the dark and dreary days of winter are getting you down, the following Legend of the Snowdrop might help. After being expelled from the Garden of Eden Eve was giving up hope that the cold winter would ever end when an angel appeared and transformed some of the snow-

flakes into snowdrop flowers as proof that winters do eventually give way to the spring. Bring on the Snowdrops!



COMPLEMENTARY MEDICINE FOR PFTS

Many of you may know that I offer complementary therapies such as acupuncture, homeopathy and herbal medicine alongside conventional treatment. I believe in a holistic approach to your pet and try to use whatever therapies are most effective in a safe and appropriate way.

On 3rd November the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS) released a new position statement on Complementary and Alternative Medicines in general and homeopathy in particular. The statement was released without consultation with the veterinary organisations involved with complementary therapies e.g. the British Association of Homeopathic Veterinary Surgeons (BAHVS) and would seem to have serious implications for a vet's ability to be able to prescribe complementary therapies as a first choice. The statement says that vets cannot use medicines such as herbs, homeopathy, supplements etc. if it 'delays' or 'replaces' more conventional treatments. The implications are that animals must have conventional treatment before any other sort of therapy; so for example, if your old dog is getting a bit stiff, you can't put it on a Glucosamine supplement until you have tried drugs first.

The statement also hints that the RCVS may take action against those vets that do use complementary therapies, and when one links this with the Animal Welfare Act, arguably the owners too. Not only has this restricted a vet's clinical freedom but it has effectively taken away an owner's right to make an informed choice about their animal's treatment. This change in statement has been brought about by continued pressure from a small group of vets that are against complementary and alternative medicines and are not representative of the majority of vets in the UK.

There is a growing interest in complementary therapies from animal owners as they seek other options where conventional medicines have failed or produced adverse side effects, or just want to have their animals treated in a more holistic way. There has been a huge public outcry on social media and a petition has been started to get the RCVS to retract the statement and consult with the relevant organisations to produce a new one. There are also support groups on Facebook. If you believe in the freedom to choose complementary therapies for your pet and to allow vets to prescribe them for you please take action now.

NEW YEAR – NEW WINE CHOICES

People often say "I know the wines I like and I stick to what I know". If this is you perhaps I can tempt you to experiment with something new. Let's start with that huge current favourite Prosecco. Unfortunately its popularity has led to reductions in quality and a rise in price, so why not try an alternative? *Cremant*, be it from the Loire, Burgundy (Bourgogne), Alsace or Limoux is a French wine made in the champagne method offering outstanding value and quality. Look out for it in our local supermarkets; Taste the Difference *Cremant de Loire* from Sainsburys at £11 is a good starting point. Getting a bit tired of New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc? Consider instead the *Verdejo grape* from Rueda in

Spain which has a similar fresh acidity with grassy fruity flavours. Waitrose have the *Beronia Rueda* for £8.99 - other supermarkets have similar.

Always go for a soft fruity Merlot? For a change try the Carmenere grape from Chile. This was often mistaken for Merlot when Chilean wines first appeared in our supermarkets and with its smooth silky style one can see why. Tesco Finest Carmenere from Chile at £7.00 with its plum and berry flavours is worth trying. Most supermarkets and wine merchants will have some good versions. Finally if, like me, you like a fruity Pinot Noir from New Zealand then try instead a light fruity red using the *Mencia grape* from Bierzo in Spain. Majestic have a good Pizarras de Otero 2015 Bierzo at £7.50 as part of a mixed case, or try the *Frappato grape* from southern Italy. Adnams (Saffron Walden) have a light juicy version from Sicily, Feudo di Santa Tresa for £8.99, but keep your eyes open for other versions. I do hope that has whetted your appetite to try something new this year.






