THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

Some will have seen *The Greatest Showman* recently: a musical film set in the past, with contemporary music and a timeless message. Although it may not be the main character's original intention, he ends up showing the sceptical and prejudiced crowds that every person has a place, value, purpose and potential. From the start the 'greatest showman' (based on circus entrepreneur PT Barnum) strives to be a rich, successful businessman; someone well-connected to royalty and celebrity, but ultimately he discovers that his true purpose and personal fulfilment is found in being a 'family' man. Near the start of the film he takes pleasure in caring for his own family, but by the end of the film he realises he can provide a 'family' that helps lots of other people too.

Jesus, in his time, was criticised for spending time with people who were loners, disreputable or simply dif-

ferent. In an era long before Barnum, he too faced crowds who were sceptical and prejudiced towards others. Yet Jesus welcomed everyone and often spoke to those ignored or despised by the general crowd. Our church is called Family Church; not because we only welcome families, but because we want to be inclusive of everyone and promote a 'family' environment where anyone can feel accepted and welcomed. A verse from the Bible says that God "sets the lonely in families". Whether or not you have family of your own nearby, God's global family waits to welcome you. Just as God values each human being, and wants to welcome them into his family, so he encourages each of us to recognise the value and potential of others too. Perhaps this month you, too, can extend a 'family' welcome to someone feeling alone.





The new headteacher of Magna Carta Primary Academy is building a rich future for his pupils. Marios Solomonides arrived as headteacher on 16th April, having previously been head at fellow Burnt Mill Academy Trust (BMAT) school Freshwaters Primary Academy in Harlow. He has spent the last 18 months researching and creating a bespoke curriculum for the Trust's Harlow schools. He will use that experience to put together a knowledge-rich curriculum for the children of Magna Carta to ensure they are ready for life beyond school. As well as ensuring lessons are suited to the children's needs, Marios is also looking to expand their interaction with the community, with a focus on charity and

business. He said: "I am keen to make links with other local primary schools, so we can hold joint events and our staff can moderate together and share CPD sessions. We already work with our fellow primary schools within BMAT in Harlow, but the communities are very different and so it makes sense to build links with our local schools. We are starting from scratch with the curriculum here as Magna Carta is a new school. That is very exciting. As part of that, I have joined the Stansted Business Forum to begin building links with local professionals who can help to inspire our children to strive for various careers. It will help children to see there is a purpose to what they are learning. Of course, we want our curriculum to be aspirational; however, another focus for us will be the personal, social and moral development of our pupils. By working with the community and charities, the children will feel they are contributing, but it will also give the community opportunities to come in and be a part of us".

On day one, Marios introduced three new rules: be safe, be kind and work hard, and the curriculum will be used to teach children in these areas. Marios will be joined in June by Deputy Headteacher Teresa Avey, He said of his new school: "The children at Magna Carta are lovely and the



parents are very interested in their learning and are keen to get involved. That's exactly how we would want things to be."



At the first meeting of the new season, members welcomed back Brian Carline who spoke about one of his favourite flowers, *Pelargoniums*. He explained that although pelargoniums are often called geraniums; this is not correct, as the true geraniums are hardy herbaceous plants often referred to as cranesbills. Although, to confuse matters further, both generally belong to the family *Geraniaceae*. Linnaeus originally included both species in one genus, but they were later separated by L'Heritier in 1789. Using plants grown in Brian's garden in West Hanningfield, members were told about this large, diverse group of mostly evergreen and tender plants used as bedding, house plants or in pots and, as they are drought tolerant, they are ideal for hanging baskets.

Members were able to appreciate the diversity of this genus as examples of Zonal, Ivy-leaved, Scented, Regal, and Angel pelargoniums were shown. One tip, which may be useful at this time of year when hanging baskets are being assembled, is not to combine pelargoniums and fuchsias together as one thrives on drought conditions but fuchsias prefer the soil to be kept damp. Members were then given a demonstration on how to take cuttings and how to make a good potting medium by adding sharp sand and perlite and some slow release plant feed to a basic compost; this helps rooting and gives the cuttings a good start. Watering cuttings from below was recommended.

Fun & Flair with Flowers

Over 130 people attended the flower arranging display at The Forest Hall School on 25th April. Gill McGregor, a National Association of *Flower Arranger* Societies (NAFAS) National Teacher has demonstrated flower arranging to audiences around the UK.



Gill showed the audience six outstanding displays using a variety of flowers in stunning colours. Her skills in weaving and plaiting grasses to unusual shapes amazed the audience.



Whilst demonstrating, she explained various techniques of building up a balanced arrangement and how to use colour combinations to emphasise the shape and size; examples of her work are shown in the photographs.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

PLANNING APPLICATION FOR STANSTED AIRPORT EXPANSION

The Parish Council has made a detailed submission on the planning application for the airport to increase the number of passengers to 43mppa. The full response can be found on either the Parish Council website (www.stansted.net) or on the Uttlesford District Council (UDC) website (www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/3193/Planning-applications).

The Parish Council argues that UDC should consider carefully whether this application should be determined locally given the anticipated impact regionally and nationally. However, if UDC proceeds with local determination, it should treat carefully the way in which this application has been constructed to give the appearance that the proposed increase is only a small incremental step while providing the necessary infrastructure to permit the airport, after a "small" second bite of the cherry, to handle fifty million passengers per annum which may be compared with the throughput of 25.6 mppa in 2017.

The key arguments in favour of rejecting the application as submitted are listed covering sections for National Significant Infrastructure Project, Prematurity of Application, Methodology for Environmental Impact Assessment, Road/Rail Infrastructure, Air Noise, Air Quality, Housing, Socio Economic Effects and Land Compensation.

If the application is approved, UDC must insist in the conditions that the interest of local residents in the district and surrounding areas, most critically in terms of noise, air pollution and additional traffic on inadequate local roads be protected with the necessary funding being provided by Stansted Airport which is the main beneficiary.

Stansted Airport has plenty of scope to grow within the permission already granted - the number of passengers can rise by 35% from 25.9m in 2017 to 35m. (See also comments from Cllr Geoffrey Sell on page 23.)

HIGHWAYS

There was a good response to the suggestions listed in the February Link and all have helped move the ideas forward. It is not too late for many more of you to let us know your thoughts on roads, parking and public transport in and around the village. We are well aware of the problems; the real challenge is coming up with workable solutions.

A couple of comments on earlier responses.

Church Road - The Council is pushing ECC Highways to ensure that there is a full width footpath as far as Forest Hall School. Changes to the unpopular traffic calming scheme have been put forward but the use of speed bumps or cushions has been rejected.

Chapel Hill - Some respondents misunderstood the possible changes to parking on the hill. The stretch in front of the houses opposite the Memorial Gardens will remain and in due time will be covered by a residents' parking scheme. The proposal was to remove parking from Woodfield Terrace uphill to Cambridge Road as all the houses in this stretch have off-street parking. This would improve the flow of traffic but the downside would be the risk of higher speeds.

Pedestrian Crossings - The new crossing on Cambridge Road and the one towards the top of Chapel Hill are not always easy for motorist to see. Ways to improve visibility and safety are being considered. The proposed pedestrian crossing in Lower Street should proceed once a funding issue is resolved.

We would like to thank everybody who has responded. We do read comments on social media but we really need people to contact us directly so that we can more accurately gauge public opinion.

TWINNING

A delegation from the Parish Council and the Business Forum will be representing the village at the twinning ceremony of our two communities in Rungis on 9th June. In Stansted we will be holding our civil ceremony in St John's Church at 12 noon on 6th July . Representatives of all our local organisations have been cordially invited to attend the ceremony, along with any parishioners who would like to attend. The group from France will be attending the Business Forum Breakfast meeting being held at Linden House earlier that morning and then will be spending time before the ceremony at Forest Hall School, meeting the pupils and staff.

This is a great opportunity for future further cultural and business exchanges and we are delighted to twin with a town in France that has so many similar characteristics to Stansted Mountfitchet.

We are asking local organisations to start thinking about possible exchanges and communication channels that could be opened up. Business opportunities are being taken forward through the Business Forum, and joint information exchanges have started to take shape already with shared social media and website opportunities. Our local schools are also co-ordinating links and preparation for contact with the French schools is progressing through Skype. The French delegation will also be attending Music in the Park held at Bentfield School and we hope to have representatives of all our schools at the ceremony.

CAR PARKS

Crafton Green

There is now a pedestrian route from the Crafton Green car park which makes access to the Cambridge Road shops much more convenient. The car park does tend to get used very heavily during weekdays but there are usually spaces available in the evening (and it's free after 5.00pm as well as on Sundays and Bank Holidays). If you are going for a meal or takeaway please consider using the car park rather than adding to the congestion in Cambridge Road.

Lower Street

Not everybody seems to appreciate that there are two separate organisations that manage parking spaces in the Lower Street Car Park. The spaces on your left as you drive in, which are immediately adjacent to the Castle are owned by Mountfitchet Castle who employ a

management company to enforce the parking regulations for their spaces. The rest of the car park is managed by Uttlesford District Council who use the North Essex Parking Partnership to enforce regulations. Both



areas have their own ticket machines so you need to make sure you are buy-

ing a ticket from the appropriate machine. The picture above shows a Castle ticket station. Charges apply at **all** times.

This picture shows one of the UDC ticket stations. There is no charge after 5 pm or on Sundays and



bank holidays. There are some UDC spaces designated for 20 minute parking near the entrance. These are meant to be a drop off point for patients going to the surgery who have mobility issues and would struggle to make it from the

area designated for GP patient parking. There is no charge for these spaces. We are told that there there will be some changes to this area in the near future. The waiting time is to be reduced to 15 minutes and new signs will be erected so hopefully this will reduce the amount of confusion people feel when they arrive in the car park.

HEALTH AND WELL BEING

Every resident in Essex is urged to carry out 30 minutes of physical activity every day in June - in a campaign launched by Active Essex to help raise funds for a new charity foundation which provides life-changing support through sport and physical activity. People across Essex can choose to carry out any type of physical activity in the 30:30 challenge, such as walking to school or exploring their local area by bike. The challenge can either be completed in one 30 minute burst or by three 10 minute bouts of activity throughout the day. The challenge can also be varied with different activities tried over the 30 day period. To kick off your month of activities why not join in the "Activity for All" session at the Romeera Leisure Centre on Friday 1st June at 6.30pm? This will be a very flexible session with activities for all levels of fitness and it's free. You need to wear suitable clothing and footwear but there is no need to invest in any expensive designer gym wear.

If you need an activity for Saturday 16th June you could join Cllr Daphne Wallace-Jarvis who is leading a walk. There will be a thirty minute circuit with the possibility of an extension for those with time and energy to spare. Please meet outside the entrance to the Doctors' surgery in Lower Street for a 10.00am start.

FORESTHALL PARK OPEN SPACES

The Parish Council have recently taken over responsibility for maintaining the public open spaces on the Foresthall Park Estate. This covers all the planting and grassed areas around the estate apart from the roadside verges which continue to be the responsibility of Essex Highways. After a competitive tendering process it was decided to award the contract to the the companies that already do the grassing cutting and gardening in the rest of the village.

STANSTED IN BLOOM

Entries for Stansted in Bloom are starting to trickle in. We are hoping that lots of you will have taken advantage of some favourable weather over the Bank Holiday weekends to get your gardens in good shape. Details of the different categories can be found in the April Link or on the Parish Council website There are lots of really attractive gardens around the village so if you have put a lot of effort into getting your garden looking at its best, why not enter into the spirit of Stansted in Bloom and submit an entry form? There is no entrance fee so what have you got to lose?

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

The NhW Observer leaflet is on hold at present. Alan Johnson, who sadly died just before last Christmas, managed most of the information that went into the leaflet, and ensured it was printed and circulated to a very large area in Uttlesford. Graham Jackson stepped in to carry on Alan's valuable work, but unfortunately he himself has health issues, and at the moment is unable to continue. We very much hope that the leaflet will continue as soon as possible, and we will keep you informed. In the meantime we trust that all our NhW helpers and coordinators will stay with us, and will continue to help when we are back on track again.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Geoffrey Sell writes

Stansted Airport Planning Application

The application to lift the existing cap on passenger movements of 35 m passengers per annum to full use of the runway 43 mppa is due to be determined by the Planning Committee on 18 July. Clearly there are economic benefits for having a successful airport in our midst. It is the biggest employer by far in the district. It also provides the opportunity of travel through low cost airlines to many parts of Europe. However, there are also social costs of having an airport in our backyard which are spelt out in some of the representations made. A Burton End resident commented: "Night time noise has kept me awake. We are routinely woken at 4 in the morning and often then struggle to return to sleep. Frequently there is a strong smell of kerosene around our house. This is especially true on Sundays when I believe they routinely test the aircraft engines. I believe this to be a significant health risk".

Another resident highlighted the potential effect on our already congested roads: "Access to Lower Street is only possible by way of one of the four steep hills each of which has a section which is restricted to single file traffic. There is already unacceptable congestion at times in this location due to the volume of traffic which will only get worse as result of the existing planning permission for 35 mppa. Add the traffic resulting from permission for a further 8 mppa then the area around Lower Street is likely to become more or less permanently gridlocked."

Yes Stansted Airport is an important driver of economic growth but that should not be the only consideration. This application is premature; it is difficult to visualise what conditions will be like when movement is at the cap let alone beyond.

Cricket

As a keen follower I have been pleased to financially help both cricket clubs in the village through the ward councillors' new homes bonus scheme. I was invited to meet with officers of Stansted Hall and Elsenham Cricket Club. Their Elsenham pavilion burnt down in 2016 and they wish to replace it. Almost all the junior matches (some of the players come from Stansted) are played there. I have been working with the club to explore funding opportunities and put them in touch with the relevant officers at UDC. My view is that the council should make a financial contribution. Last year the council gave £500,000 towards a running track at Carver Barracks. This project has stalled with the Ministry of Defence. It would be nice to think some of this money could be used to support existing provision.

Derek Honour

I was very sorry to learn of Derek's death. He played a big part in the life of the village. Link editor, Tree Warden, Chairman of Stansted Millers - all positions he held at one time. Derek was Chairman of Stansted Liberals when I first became politically active. Thank you Derek for all you did for Stansted.

UDC Chairmanship

I have enjoyed my year as Chairman and hope I have played a small part in putting Stansted and Uttlesford on the map. Many thanks to the Rector Paul Wilkin and Rev Roy Fowler of Stansted Free Church for their part in hosting a very successful civic service.

Risk of frost should be a memory in our area, and with the soil warming up rapidly in the long days, if you have not already done so, it is an ideal time for planting summer bedding and other floriferous annuals. When in the nursery, garden centre or supermarkets looking for plants, look for good quality specimens. Plants that look excessively dry may have been that way too long to survive, so are best avoided. Shun individuals that have obvious signs of disease on them, eq black spots, rusty looking pustules, etc; these are only likely to get worse and will not be very productive. For larger plants in pots, do not be afraid to slip the pot off and have a look at the root system, if it is a tightly matted tangled mass that you cannot see any soil through, then this is a sign of being pot bound (held in the same size pot for too long), and this also does not give a plant a healthy start in life. Ideally the roots in the pot should be a good mixture of some roots going around the pot with lots of friable compost and growing room.

Once you have selected your favourite choices from amongst the myriad of species available, then ideally get them home quickly and into their growing position as quickly as possible. Almost all bedding plants will benefit from soaking first before planting as well as a good watering once planted. The watering not only provides moisture to the plant, but also helps to consolidate excessively large air pockets in the soil. For plants being put in baskets or con-

tainers, incorporate a slow release fertiliser, as it has been proven by both the RHS and *Which?* that it really does prolong the flowering period.

My Stansted swallows (two) arrived on 4th April and are probably wondering why they came over so early. It must be a real nightmare for them trying to find sufficient insects to eat. They are definitely not sitting on a nest yet. Let's hope that we get a bit more 'full-on' summer shortly. Following my call last month for photographs of our Birchanger Wood, this month I have a number of images from which to choose, supplied by our volunteer woodland worker Peter Sherlock. I hope you enjoy them as I do.



GROWING UP IN STANSTED Part 1 – The War Years

Born in 1934, I lived above my family's grocer shop, Turner Bros at 41 Lower Street. My brother arrived two years later and two sisters followed after the war. I started my education at the Council School on Chapel Hill (now converted to housing) in 1940. I heard on our crackling old radio the Prime Minister, Mr Chamberlain, announcing that we were at war with Germany and my father had to join the army. I still remember the smell of the gas mask and the sound of the air raid siren sending us up to the primitive shelter dug out between the school field and the Memorial Gardens. It was pitch dark in the shelter and we sat on an old tarpaulin while one of the teachers read to us by torchlight or candle.

I remember seeing German aircraft coming over Stansted in large numbers and Takeley being bombed in an attempt to stop the American soldiers building the long runway at



Burton End. Stansted was also bombed; one hit the Recreation Ground, a second landed in Mr Spalding's house on the edge of the Rec, a third landed near the railway line at Stoney Common and a fourth landed in Burton End close to the American Camp. I was in the cheese cellar in Lower Street with my granddad, mother and my brother Paul; we were all very scared! When one of the bombs was dropped in daylight Mr Morton said, "That'll fetch the flies off the chemist's wall." He always had a great sense of humour. An unmanned flying bomb landed in Burton End, and all the

stained glass from the Lancaster Chapel window in St Mary's Church ended up on the stone floor in small pieces. We used to watch films of the battles in Europe in the Central Hall on Chapel Hill (now The Old Courthouse).

When I was about seven or eight years old my mother would take us for long walks on Sunday afternoons. Sometimes we would walk to Hazel End to visit Aunt Em who always gave my brother and me a piece of seed cake, which was so dry the seeds would stick in our throats. Neither of us liked it but being wartime I don't suppose it was easy to get the ingredients, so we couldn't be seen to waste it. I thought about putting it down the toilet at the bottom of the garden but there was no flush and Aunt Em would see what I'd done, so I would often throw my cake in the hedge, hoping the birds would eat it.

During the war I remember going out in Lower Street when red double-decker buses were parked and lots of the elderly and many young children (evacuees) were being allocated places to stay in the village by men with clipboards and ration books. We had a married couple, a mother and four children plus a land girl billeted in our home. The school became overcrowded; I was at a desk built for two that had to sit three; consequently teaching standards dropped. Not one boy in my age group passed the 11 plus, but with a bit of extra tuition paid for by my parents I managed to pass the 13 plus and gained a place at Harlow College as a 'late developer'.

At the end of the war in Europe the whole village gathered in Lower Street, which was decorated with flags and bunting, as was Station Road. Music played non-stop and everyone danced all night under the searchlight placed at the entrance of what is now the car park. We young boys were allowed to get on the searchlight and move it around. The same celebrations went on when the war with Japan ended. I will never forget the poor servicemen home from Japan looking like skeletons; eyes sunk in their sockets and finding it difficult to walk. It made me cry and glad the war was over.



Poll victory for Local Residents over Airport Computer Manchester Airports Group (MAG) has no cause to celebrate over its claim that some 650 emails have been sent to Uttlesford District Council supporting its plans to expand Stansted Airport. This would entail an annual passenger throughput of 43 million which is 66% above the 25.9 million passengers handled last year.

Unsurprisingly MAG's spin doctors do not bother to point out that 615 of the supportive responses were almost identical computer-generated emails, prompted by a letter from Stansted Chief Executive Ken O'Toole to all his employees and airport-based businesses urging them to "voice their support" for MAG's expansion proposals for Stansted, saying: "It is quick and easy to register your support for the application and will take two minutes. All you need to do is log onto www.ourstansted.com and complete the registration form. This will then send a letter automatically to the Council outlining why you support the plans for the airport".

Even though it was said to take just two minutes to send an automatic, computer-generated email to Uttlesford District Council supporting the airport's expansion plans, only five per cent of those employed at the airport took the trouble to respond. Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) Deputy Chairman Brian Ross said: "Despite MAG's attempts, local people have outscored the airport's computer 'voting' system with more than 700 objections to MAG's plans, all individually written. Aircraft noise, especially at night, is the biggest concern, followed by road traffic, with many respondents saying that local roads already can't cope. Those objecting to the planning application come from far and wide, although mostly from those parts of Essex and Herts most affected by the impacts of the airport. Some 50 local parish and town councils are amongst those opposing the airport's expansion plans.

To add insult to MAG's injury, its attempt to flood Uttlesford District Council with standard emails supporting its expansion plans may have spectacularly backfired because the computerised system which generated the standard emails failed to include the sender's postal address, a requirement which the Council has always insisted upon. As a result, it is understood these automatic emails are to be treated as a petition, which will carry minimal weight. On 30th April SSE sent Uttlesford District Council its own response to the MAG planning application. SSE's 175-page response setting out the detailed grounds for refusing the application is the result of two months' work by an expert SSE team and is now available on the SSE website.

The night started with the end of term AGM, when any issues were raised, finances discussed and all members of the Committee were voted in for another year. Roger Barrett gave us an insight into next year's programme and it looks like a good year ahead.

Elphin Watkin, an ex-engineer and member of the Essex Historic Buildings Group and one of Dunmow Malting Trustees, gave a presentation on the history of malt houses in Essex. Historically the region was known as a Malting County going back several thousand years. Elphin explained how malt is created by germinating barley grain in water to encourage the grain to sprout, then drying the barley to halt the progress when the sprouting begins. He explained the 16th century basket-grown process right through to the huge Malt houses of Mistley and Witham.



When demand for ale from London reached its peak in the 18th century, Essex went into full production, with maltings being erected everywhere. There were 20 alone in Saffron Walden, and Bishop's Stortford was covered with them, especially along the Stort River. In 1697 the Government realised the tax potential of ale and brought in a malt tax and by 1880 it was raising £6 million a year: approximately 11% of all tax raised, which of course helped with the wars at that time. Elphin suggested paying a visit to the Dunmow Maltings, pictured above. As the term has now finished. I will be placing a piece in The Link detailing next term's programme which starts in September. Until then, enjoy the summer and we hope to see a few new faces when the new term starts.

IS IT TIME FOR ROSÉ WINES?

The pleasure of rosé wines is often overlooked, but for me a crisp cool rosé is the perfect alfresco wine to enjoy as the weather gets warmer and can be a far better food wine than most might realise. A rosé from Aldi is getting a lot of good press, so seek out a bottle of their Exquisite Collection *Touraine Rosé* from the Loire; it is a bargain at £5.99 with its refreshing apple and cherry aromas and citrus flavours. Last year it was their Exquisite Collection *Côtes de Provence* which was voted the best rosé under £8 by the International Wine Challenge, so that's an alternative for £6.69 with aromas of strawberry and white fruits.

New World rosé tends to be packed with a little more fruit and a good example is the South African Porcupine Ridge Rosé from Waitrose at £7.99, bursting with strawberry and raspberry fruit. Alternatively, there is the *Ned* Rosé from New Zealand, a blend of Pinot Noir and Pinot Gris from Majestic at £9.99, as part of a six mixed case; this has pure berry fruit characters with crisp acidity and citrus flavours. If it's a serious food friendly rosé you need then those from the Côte de Provence in southern France are dry and full bodied. Two are from a blend of Grenache and Syrah; one is Mirabeau Pure from Waitrose at £13.99 which is bone dry but has flavours of berry fruits and a hint of rhubarb; the other is its sister Mirabeau Etoile from Sainsbury's at £15 with aromas of peach and apricot with citrus flavours. If those are a little more than you want to pay then the SO Organic Rosé, Vin de France from nearby in the Languedoc, is available in Sainsbury's at £6.50 from the same grapes with strawberry, juicy watermelon and a redcurrant tang; it is good value, if a little more delicate. Get those garden seats out, sit back and enjoy.

SUMMER ROSES AND STONES

The summer solstice on 21st June is the longest day of the year and traditionally associated with Stonehenge, the prehistoric monument in Wiltshire which is two miles (three km) west of Amesbury. Stonehenge, a ring of standing stones, each around 13 feet (4.0 m) high, seven feet (2.1 m) wide and weighing around 25 tons, is believed to have been constructed in several stages; the first monument being an early henge monument built about 5,000 years ago. The unique stone circle was erected in the late Neolithic period about 2500 BC. None of the huge stones are local ones and would have been transported over several miles, which was quite some feat. In the early Bronze Age, burial mounds were also built nearby.

Because Stonehenge was constructed by a culture which left no written records, many aspects such as how it was built and what it was used for, remain subject to debate. A number of myths surround the stones. The Druids are thought to have used the sun and stones at Stonehenge as a calendar, because at the summer solstice the sun shines directly on the famous Heel stone at sunrise; although the excavated remains of culled animal bones suggest that people may have gathered at the site in the winter rather than the summer. Nowadays people still go to Stonehenge to watch the sun rise at the summer solstice; it is a very important moment of the year for modern day Druids.

Midsummer Day (24th June) is associated with witches, magic, fairies and dancing. On Midsummer's Eve bonfires were lit in praise of the sun; as the days were getting shorter it was thought the sun was getting weaker and the fires would help strengthen it. Roses picked on this day

were said to keep fresh until Christmas; rose petals scattered at midnight on Midsummer's Eve by young girls whilst reciting a special mantra were supposed to ensure their true love would visit the follow-

ing day. Wonder if it ever worked?

BRAIN TRAINING

Improving your balance improves short term memory and stops you tripping over things

Research published in March 2017 found that improving your balance, wobbling about on one leg, also improves short term memory and spatial awareness because these three parts of the brain are linked. The balance training was intense: balance training circuits twice a week for 12 weeks.

If your balance was not very good, I'm sure it was not an entirely pleasant experience, even if shot with humour. However, all participants improved in all three goals of better balance, better memory and better spatial awareness. This means it really is worth practising your balance with great regularity (why water the plants standing on two legs when one will do?). Then not only will



you be less likely to fall over, your car parking skills will get better and you will be able to remember where you parked the wretched thing!

I specialise precisely in improving such things as balance. As an easy example to try: stand on one leg, shut your eyes if necessary and get a good flail going on. Now poke your tongue into one cheek and, if that makes things worse, try poking it into the other cheek. For many this really helps stability, but not for all. Brains are too complicated for a one size fits all solution. To read the research, type, Balance training improves memory and spatial awareness' into a search engine.



HOW TO RESEARCH YOUR FAMILY HISTORY (PART 2)

At the end of the last article I suggested you download a blank Ancestor Chart - how many of your ancestors have you been able to fill in, I wonder?

Next step: talk to your relatives

If you have left it really late to start researching your family tree you might be the oldest in your family. But if not, now's the time to talk to older relatives who can provide you with snippets of information which will point you in the right direction. For example, they might know where your ancestors lived, or the surname of the man who married your grandmother's sister.

This sort of Information might not seem obviously relevant, but believe me, it will be at some point! And it is not just older relatives who can provide useful information; when I began I discovered that my younger sister had information which she had collected from our late aunt 20 years before.

Tip: people were not always known by the name on their birth certificate; some were known by their middle name, and some by a derivative of the forename, such as Nell or Nellie (instead of Ellen), Polly (instead of Mary), or abbreviations such as Mike or Fred. This is the birth certificate of Peter Calver's mother.



Dig out the family memorabilia

In most families there is an envelope, tin or box full of things which might be needed one day. Or which nobody could bring themselves to throw away and a good thing too, because they are likely to prove invaluable to you! Certificates, wills, insurance policies, even postcards and letters can provide useful clues. Write down any significant names, dates, or addresses you come across. I run the LostCousins website. You can see a sneak preview from the next article and download a free Ancestor Chart from my website.

ANIMAL BEHAVIOURAL ISSUES

"Princess just won't come downstairs anymore and she used to have a beautiful coat; now look at her". On my consulting table sat a sorry example of the Persian cat breed whose thick shiny coat had been reduced to a thin wispy covering and a bedraggled excuse for a tail. Princess looked at me with a haughty 'don't say anything, I'm still a princess inside' look, so I tried to get to the bottom of the problem. It turned out her owner was a kind-hearted lady with a love of animals and her garden had become the community hub for wildlife. She fed hedgehogs, foxes, squirrels and birds; then the local stray cat population cottoned on and now her time was spent producing meals on a near industrial scale for all her animal visitors!

It didn't take long for Scarface and Claws, the two local tomcats, to push it a bit further and start coming through the cat flap and pinching Princess's gourmet food and sleeping on her bed. No wonder poor Princess had retreated to the top of the wardrobe and spent her days anxiously over-

grooming! It did take quite a bit of time to convince Princess's owner that although she loved her animal visitors, cats are quite solitary creatures with a strong sense of territory and to have it invaded by so many on a daily basis was actually causing Princess a lot of stress. I know this is an extreme case, but we do see animals on a daily basis with a variety of behavioural issues, from cats and dogs to aggressive rabbits! However, help is at hand; the first step is to bring your pet in for a veterinary check to ensure there's no physical problem and then we can talk through behavioural issues. Cat, our lovely Stansted nurse, is a mine of information about rabbits and other small furries; Jackie our deputy head nurse has completed extra training in cat behavioural problems and our vets can advise about dog behaviour. We also have links with local trainers and animal behaviourists. So mental health is important, even for animals and we are here to help!

Nature Notes

Wild Marjoram Origanum vulgare

The Latin name for marjoram is Origanum which is taken from the Greek words 'oros' meaning mountain, and 'ganos' meaning joy, therefore it is known as 'Joy of the Mountains'. Some years ago, whilst visiting Farnham churchyard, I found a pretty purple plant in the profusion of beautiful wild flowers. It turned out to be wild marjoram, also known as a 'bee plant'. To find marjoram growing on a grave is significant. In the olden days powdered marjoram was sprinkled in the winding sheet used at burials. Later, if marjoram was found growing on the grave, it gave a sign to the bereaved that their loved one was happy in the afterlife.



Our ancestors benefited from this useful plant. It would be used as a strewing herb; a scourer for wood, to clean and prevent woodworm; to make the washing water sweet and used in potpourri. As a dye it would make woollen cloth light purple. What bliss to have no cleaning agents under the sink in plastic containers!

Marjoram has many healing uses too. For the elderly, it has anti-ageing properties; it helps with degenerative arthritis, osteoarthritis and rheumatism. Herbalists use marjoram for bronchitis, asthma, coughs and also indigestion and dyspepsia. Externally it can be used as a fomentation for painful swellings and rheumatism. *So, less in the bathroom cabinet too!* This useful plant is also used in aromatherapy. In the 1990s it was trialled in Lewisham Hospital on patients suffering from high blood pressure. Patients experienced a lower level of BP which lasted for quite a few days after the treatment. Marjoram is indeed a joyful plant especially in Greek and Roman times when garlands of the flowers were worn on the heads of newly married couples.



THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Within its towns, villages and countryside, the Hundred Parishes has an exceptional number of ancient buildings. More than 6,000 are listed, meaning that they have been formally identified as an important part of our national heritage so that they can be protected by law. They appear

on the National Heritage List for England; 6,000 listings represents more than 10% of all buildings within the Hundred Parishes, whilst nationally only about 2% are listed. Furthermore, half of our listed buildings date from the year 1700 AD or earlier. This exceptional depth of heritage is a key feature of the Hundred Parishes. Over 100 buildings within the Hundred Parishes have the highest category of listing, Grade I, and of these more than half are parish churches, constructed and reconstructed over the last thousand years.

By way of explanation, of all listed buildings in England, less than 3% have been classified as Grade I, while 92% fall into the Grade II category and about 5% into the intermediate Grade II* (two star) category. Listings can relate to all manner of buildings, whilst there are separate listings of 'registered parks and gardens' and 'scheduled monuments'. Local listed buildings include garden walls, gravestones, war memorials, telephone boxes, milestones and other features of historic interest. Details of all listed buildings can easily be found on www.britishlistedbuildings.co.uk. All listings, including parks and gardens and scheduled monuments, can be found on www.historicengland.org.uk, which is the official website; however the site is not easy to navigate. The fact that a building is listed gives it some degree of protection so that it should survive to delight future generations. Owners of listed buildings are generally conscious that they are just today's custodian within a long line of custodians.


