FOREST HALL SCHOOL



SINGLE-USE PLASTIC CAMPAIGN

Local business Wastepack has been working with Forest Hall School (FHS) to raise awareness of the issues surrounding single-use plastic. The school signed up to the Plastic Clever School campaign which was developed by child-led charity Kids Against Plastic. The charity, sponsored by Wastepack, was set up by Nottingham sisters Amy and Ella Meek (age 15 and 13) due to the negative effect single-use plastic is having on the environment. As founders, they encourage schools and businesses nationwide to be Plastic Clever by reducing the use of the big four plastic polluters (single-use cups and lids, straws, bottles and plastic bags) as well as items such as plastic cutlery. With the Education Secretary challenging schools to eliminate single-use plastic by 2022, it could not be a better time for FHS to be working towards Plastic Clever goals. Following a plastic pollution assembly, including a personalised video from Amy and Ella, Wastepack provided all students with their own reusable bottle to help achieve their Plastic Clever goals. The school has also installed additional water fountains and provided fruit squash in the canteen to encourage both staff and students to use their bottles.



The project has resulted in a significant reduction in the number of single-use bottles sold at the school. Before the introduction of the reusable bottles the school's canteen sold approximately 240 single-use plastic water bottles a day, that is 1200 a week. Now they sell approximately 120 single-use plastic bottles a day, including all other soft drinks such as juices. Although there is still some way to go to reach the Education Secretary's 2022 challenge to eliminate single-use plastic entirely, this is a substantial improvement. The students should be proud that they are helping to avoid the use of approximately 2400 single-use plastic bottles a month!

The school Eco Club has teamed up with the Woodland Trust to plant 160 trees. This latest initiative by the Club, which also set up a bug hotel in the school's garden, is growing vegetables and building flower beds out of recycled bottles stuffed with plastic. The school also took part in Earth Hour Day when Year 7 worked in the garden to dig a pathway and make a vegetable patch; Year 8 planted trees and Year 9 picked up litter and launched a campaign raising awareness of discarded plastics in the ocean after watching a documentary and carrying out a survey.



Sarah Power, careers and enrichment lead, said: "Students involved in the activity were surprised at their fellow students' littering. It was a really great day for students to get engaged in the world around them and to contribute to their community. We hope to do more with the garden by launching a gardening club this term." Daniel Ricketts, co-leader of Eco Club, said: "We are doing really well at becoming a greener school. Seeing our students put such tremendous effort into the project is amazing. In a world where things can be so instant and short lived, the work in the garden is teaching students about building for a sustainable future and developing teamwork skills which will last them a lifetime."





GETTING HELP WITH DEMENTIA THROUGH UTTLESFORD FRONTLINE

Alzheimer's Society research shows that many people worry about 'saying the wrong' thing to people living with dementia. Despite almost all of us knowing someone affected, two thirds of people living with dementia report feeling isolated and lonely. That is why the primary aim of Dementia Action Week in May was to encourage everyone to take action, by starting a conversation with someone we know who is living with dementia. It could be a relative, a friend or a neighbour, but whoever it is, it is definitely time to start talking; even a chat about the weather could make a difference. Getting out and about is also beneficial, whether to a dementia café, special cinema screenings, a pub lunch or taking part in an exercise programme. But if you are involved with someone living with dementia, just how can you track down what help is available in the community? Who can provide the right advice and information? And, importantly, who can you trust?

Help is at hand, thankfully, through our website which was developed by Uttlesford Citizens Advice. 

Blood Flow to the Brain

A vital thing to maintain or improve thinking and memory is to have good blood flow to the brain. People who keep this going throughout life have more resilience to damage to the brain from either trauma, stroke or heart disease, and they recover more quickly or fully. Most research points to car-diovascular exercise being the best and that equates to getting puffed out regularly. There is evidence that strength training is also good for brain function. Therefore, storming up Chapel Hill or Church Road several times a week will help maintain the grey matter nicely. But what if you cannot do that, or you would like to go more quickly? You could try a breathing drill; that would increase blood flow even in the most compromised person.



A simple drill is pursed lip breathing. Good breathing mechanics matter, so first stand or sit in front of a mirror, place one hand on your stomach and the other on your upper chest; now take a big breath in. The stomach slightly swells. The chest moves forwards a bit. The shoulders rise a tiny bit at the very end of a large in-breath. Practise until you get those shoulders to stop getting prematurely excited and you feel your entire ribcage expanding nicely. Then breathe in through your nose for two seconds then slowly out through pursed lips (or a straw) for four-eight seconds. Build up to 30-40 breaths, twice a day. Ideally, keep the hands in place to maintain good breathing mechanics.



THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY - PARGETING www.hundredparishes.org.uk

The buildings of the Hundred Parishes display a range of traditional construction methods and materials, some dating back many centuries. A notable feature, rarely found outside East Anglia, is pargeting. Pargeting is decorative render applied to the face of a building, either incised, where a pattern has been cut or pressed into plasterwork, or raised, where an image has been attached to the wall. Either type may have been crafted by hand in situ or created first using a mould or template. The incised forms were basic and not expensive, unlike the elaborate raised forms. There are several fine and varied examples across the Hundred Parishes and I have just mentioned just a few specimens.

Perhaps best known are the 17th-century raised images on the former Sun Inn in Saffron Walden. They depict two giant figures (whose identity is a matter of debate) and also various birds and plants - even a little dog.



Also dating from the 1600s is the raised decoration on The Crown House, Newport where legend (albeit without evidence) suggests that King Charles II may have visited his mistress, Nell Gwynn.





The art of creating and conserving pargeting is now pursued by only a few craftsmen. An example of imaginative modern design (above left) can be seen in Newport, opposite the village store, and also in Radwinter on a relatively new house called Bourne Side (above right). Radwinter also has pargeting on its almshouses and parish hall which were built in 1874 after a village fire.



A fine example of incised patterns can be seen in Braughing, where panels of different patterns cover the face of The Old Forge.



In Linton High Street, Chandlers has a mixture of small, ancient raised panels and extensive, more modern incised patterns.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

THE ART OF COMMUNICATION!

As most of you are aware, the Parish Council is the first tier of local government, providing some local services (gardening, grass-cutting etc) and liaising with other councils and public bodies on your behalf. However, there are many routes by which our information could be communicated and we are canvassing opinion on how best to do this.

To this end, we have launched a Survey Monkey which we would ask you to complete and spread the word asking your friends and family to do the same. We really want to reach as many people, of all age-groups, as we can. You can find the survey by typing the following link into your browser, tiny.cc/Stansted, on our website www.stansted.net or on the various village social media pages, or by requesting a hard copy from the Council Offices.

THE MOUNTFITCHET EXCHANGE

Frustratingly there has been little progress since we last reported to you in the June Link. At that time we explained that "We are still waiting for a date for Openreach to install the fibre optic cables for the internet connection in the Exchange." Regrettably, little has changed as Openreach have failed to meet two dates that they gave us for the work to be started.



For many reasons, we cannot accept handover of the building until this is complete.

Both the Parish Council and the library service have moving-in plans ready and waiting to implement as soon as we have a date from Openreach

PLAY AREAS

The Parish Council have play areas at Bentfield Green, The Rec, Mountfitchet Green and on Foresthall Park which they are responsible for. Ensuring that these play areas are in good order and as safe as possible is a high priority.

The vast majority of our play equipment is fairly modern and in good order, due to the weekly inspections of our handyman who is qualified to inspect and maintain

the equipment. We also employ RoSPA to carry out annual inspections of our play areas and advise us of any action we should be taking to ensure our play areas are fit for purpose. There were no high risk issues, but the report identified a few medium risk classifications which we are taking action on.



One of the concerns we had to address following the RoSPA inspection concerned replacing some of the timber work and a safety guard on the Zip Wire on The Rec. These have now been done. The other main issue we have to address is shrinkage of some of the safety matting which has left gaps which are a potential trip hazard. Our picture shows contractors undertaking this work early in the morning to avoid the heat (and children!!) later in the day.

It is important that we are all vigilant in keeping our play areas safe, so if you spot anything of concern to you in any of our play areas, please report it to us.

WASTE REDUCTION

Essex County Council is running a reuse campaign where we are encouraging residents to donate their



unwanted items - as opposed to throwing them away - in a bid to reduce unnecessary waste. They would like residents in Uttlesford to consider the use of Freegle, which is a great site that enables local people to get rid of their unwanted items – and help someone else out in return. HANGING BASKETS

There are over 80 hanging baskets in place. They are now starting to look at their best and we hope villagers appreciate their impact on the street scenes they encounter when they are out and about in the village.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Melvin Caton writes:

Difficult decisions made

The new administration at Uttlesford District Council were forced to make difficult decisions quickly following the change of control at the local elections in May. Firstly, the Planning Inspectors responsible for the Examination in Public of the proposed Local Plan (submitted by the previous council), asked the new

controlling group whether they supported the Plan or alternatively wished to withdraw it. Thankfully, the Residents for Uttlesford (R4U) administration agreed to let the draft plan go forward for inspection. To have withdrawn it at this late stage would have opened Uttlesford up to even more speculative planning applications over a longer period.

The first stage of the Local Plan hearings started on 2nd July and discussed legal and procedural matters, the assessed need for housing and employment land in Uttlesford, the proposed spatial strategy, infrastructure, Stansted Airport and the new garden communities. Following that, if the Inspectors are satisfied that the plan is legally compliant and sound, the discussion will move on to the development management policies and allocations of sites.

Secondly, at a special full council meeting on 28th June, Uttlesford agreed, with only one dissenting vote, to refer details of Stansted Airport's draft S106 planning agreement (arising from the decision to approve expansion to 43 million passengers per year last November), back to the new Planning Committee for greater scrutiny and some improvement. In reviewing the situation the committee and council will need to minimise the risk that local taxpayers are landed with an enormous bill for costs if Manchester Airport Group decides to take legal action.

Finally, a Working Group of councillors will shortly start reviewing how the council's decision-making structure operates. Currently, Uttlesford has a Cabinet system where only a few people are involved in making key discussions. The Working Group will see if there are other models that involve all councillors in decision making and in greater depth. The aim is that any new structure would come into operation at the start of the new council year in May 2020.

ST CLARE HOSPICE

Hospice extends support for carers.

We have extended support to families and relatives of local people who receive the hospice's care by launching a new Carers' Group service. Led by the hospice's Day Therapy team, the new Carers' Group initiative provides information, skills and support to carers through the experience of caring for a loved one with a life-limiting illness. "There are many challenges to be faced when caring for a family member, friend or relative," says Jane Iskander, Occupational Therapist and Day Therapy Manager at the hospice. "Things like fatigue, stress and anxiety are common, as well as pressure on personal relationships and uncertainty around navigating the public care system. That is why we've initiated this new Carers' Group so that carers have access to professional, specialist advice, guidance and coping strategies to help them look after someone close to them."



The group follow a tailor-made six-week programme, scheduled to run four times a year, with a focus on skill-based learning, as well as group discussion and professional and peer support. Sessions cover the practicalities of caring for a person living with a life-limiting illness, sharing recognised techniques and skills that carers can use themselves. The group launched on Friday 28th June and is open, by referral, to carers, families and relatives of those who receive care from the hospice. The Right Decision: Legally, Procedurally and Democratically

Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) has welcomed the decision by Uttlesford District Council (UDC) on Friday 28th June to refer the 2018 Stansted Airport planning application back to the Planning Committee for further consideration. SSE Chairman, Peter Sanders commented: "There is a compelling case for referring this airport planning application back to the Committee in view of all the outstanding issues. Congratulations to UDC for making entirely the right decision." Cllr Paul Fairhurst proposed referring the application back and Cllr Anthony Gerard seconded the proposal; both represented the Residents for Uttlesford (R4U) party which took control of the Council in May. R4U Leader John Lodge and Cllr Alan Dean, Liberal Democrat leader, also supported the proposal which received overwhelming crossparty support; 31 councillors voted in favour, one against and one abstention.

There was loud applause from the packed public gallery when the result of the vote was announced. Many of those present had signed the residents' petition calling for the airport planning application to be referred back to the Planning Committee. The petition had gathered almost 1,700 signatures in 17 days: the biggest petition in the history of the Council. Peter Sanders added: "It was a truly uplifting day for local democracy but only a first step. The Planning Committee will make its decision based purely on the facts, not emotion or popular opinion. SSE's task now is to provide all the relevant evidence and analysis to the Planning Committee so that it can make the right decision. We will take nothing for granted. This is a large complex planning application and it should have been dealt with nationally rather than by our local council. The many new members on the Planning Committee will obviously need time to familiarise themselves with an application which comprises some 2,400 documents with 13,000 pages. This cannot be rushed".

HOT WEATHER AND ANIMALS

I was saddened to see in the paper that the fire service had to rescue a dog that had been locked in a car in Waitrose car park. It seems almost inconceivable, after several national publicity campaigns, that people still do not realise how quickly dogs die in hot cars. It literally can take just 20 minutes for a dog to die; opening a window makes little difference. The Dogs Trust has a very clear website with excellent advice and it is really worth taking a look: www.dogstrust.org.uk/help-advice/advice-forowners/summer-weather-advice.

- Take your dog for a walk early in the morning or later in the evening
- Make sure it has access to shade and water all day
- Do the seven second test. Hold your hand on tarmac for seven seconds; if it is too hot for you, it will be too hot for your dog to walk on
- Plan your holiday; check that places are dog friendly so you know when you go out for the day you can take your dog with you.

Symptoms of heatstroke are excessive panting or drooling, becoming drowsy or unco-ordinated, vomiting and collapse. If you suspect heatstroke, move your dog to a cool place and call the vet. Body temperature needs to be lowered as soon as possible but it needs to be done slowly or the dog will go into shock. Pour small amounts of room temperature (not cold) water onto the dog's body. You could place the dog in the breeze of a fan or use wet towels; be sure to re-apply water regularly to the towels and do not keep the dog constantly covered as this can heat them up instead of cooling them down. Allow the dog to drink small amounts of room temperature water. Rabbit and guinea pig runs may start off in the shade but could be in full sun by the afternoon. Farm animals need access to shade in the summer and plenty of water. See our Facebook page for lots of useful tips for keeping your pets cool in the summer and we also have cool mats and coats for sale which are really useful for taking on holidays.



SUPERMARKET WINES



Following on from last month I continue to look at what our local supermarkets have to offer. With Aldi stores in Bishop's Stortford and Saffron Walden we do not have to travel far to pick up some very good value wines. Let us start with a white that is getting very good reviews and a regular in our household. It is the Albanta Albarino 2018 from Northern Spain and really is great value at £7.99. It has that bright acidity with orchard fruits and a bit of creaminess from extended lees ageing, with a slightly salty tang typical of the grape and region. It would go really well with crustaceans, scallops or prawns on the barbeque. They also do a couple of really good rosé wines. I have already recommended their Exquisite Collection Touraine Rosé from the Loire which at £5.99 is a must try, but their 2018 Exquisite Collection Côtes de Provence Rosé at £6.99 is also a bargain. Bone dry, crisp with a little Syrah to pep up the usual Grenache and Cinsault mix. As for the reds if you have not tried their absolute bargain, the 2017 Animus red from Portugal, I urge you to give it a go. Warm, ripe red fruit with a touch of spice at the ridiculous price of £5.99. If you are a fan of New World Pinot Noir then their 2017 Plow and Press Monterey County Pinot Noir at £7.99 is worth seeking out. It is given a bit more body by a touch of Syrah, Cinsault and Grenache.

Finally, I could not sign off without saying how pleased I was to hear that Majestic Wines has been saved from being swallowed up and spat out by Naked wines. So please support your local Majestic in Bishops Stortford; we almost lost it. Support local I say - enjoy.

July Meeting

Our evening visit this year was to the Gibberd Garden near Harlow. Members were told about the life of Sir Frederick Gibberd and his wish that the house and garden should be open to the public. A long-standing family feud nearly prevented this, and the property was put up for sale. However, with public donations and loans, the garden was saved. The Gibberd Garden Trust was formed and, with a team of volunteers, now looks after it. The listed Grade II, sevenacre garden is sited on a small valley which slopes downhill to the Pincey Brook (which rises near Elsenham) and which forms one of the boundaries. The garden is a mixture of intimate spaces with pools and seats enclosed by shrubs, brookside walks, glades and lawns which give wide vistas with many mature trees. There are over 80 modern sculptures, pots and architectural pieces positioned throughout the garden. As the designer of Harlow New Town, Gibberd purchased the property in 1957. It was in the countryside, on the edge of the Harlow-Sheering border; one wonders what he would think as the new Gilden Park Estate creeps ever closer to Marsh Lane, the other boundary of his garden!

LOCAL NURSE RECEIVES THE PRESTIGIOUS QUEEN'S NURSE AWARD

My role is incredibly rewarding and challenging". MARRIAGE TAX ALLOWANCE

Are you married or in a civil partnership? If so, you may be entitled to a £1,150 tax break called the marriage tax allowance, which lets you transfer £1,250 of your personal allowance to your husband, wife or civil partner if these specific circumstances apply:

- You must be married or in a civil partnership (just living together doesn't count)
- One of you needs to be a non-taxpayer, which usually means earning less than the £12,500 personal allowance between 6th April 2019 and 5th April 2020
- The other partner needs to be a basic 20% rate taxpayer (higher or additional-rate taxpayers aren't eligible for this allowance). This means you would normally need to earn less than £50,000
- You both were born on or after 6th April 1935.

So, in a nutshell, one of you must be a non-taxpayer and one must be a basic-rate taxpayer. The marriage tax allowance for the tax year 2019-20 is up to £250. However, you can backdate your claim by up to four years, which means that if you claim now and backdate, you could get up to £1,150.

If your claim is successful, HMRC will give your partner their extra allowance by changing their tax code, which can take up to two months, or when they send their Self-Assessment tax return; any changes to your personal allowances will be backdated to the start of the tax year (6th April). Your tax code will also change if you are employed or get a pension. Your new code will reflect your new personal allowance and will end with 'N'. If your new personal allowance is lower than your income after you have made a claim, you might have to pay some income tax. However, you might still benefit as a couple. Your personal allowance will transfer automatically to your partner every year until one of you cancels marriage allowance or your circumstances change; for example because of divorce or death. If your circumstances change you can cancel marriage allowance online. You will be asked to prove your identity using the information HMRC holds about you. If you stop transferring the allowance to your partner, it will run until the end of the tax year (5th April).

You can apply for Marriage Allowance online at www.gov.uk/apply-marriage-allowance. The person with the lowest income should make the claim. More information about marriage tax allowance and income tax in general can be found at www.gov.uk or call the HMRC helpline on 0300 200 3300 (it helps to have your national insurance number with you when you call). Advisers at Uttlesford Citizens Advice can help check your eligibility and offer advice on benefits and tax allowances as well as housing, debt, relationship and employment issues.
