

#### **FOREST HALL SCHOOL**



The Dyslexia Support Unit (DSU) at the school works with students with low literacy to teach them the skills and strategies to achieve in life. An educational psychologist, Dr Andy Keay, is helping GCSE students with dyslexia to prepare for their exams. Students are able to share their emotional, physical and cognitive concerns, pick up tips on how to revise effectively, tackle past exam papers and practise answers. They are taught relaxation techniques and given resources to help, such as mind maps and flash cards. Sue Flood, Head of Unit, said: "The curriculum support groups are really helpful for students, especially those in Year 9 who have not sat any GCSEs yet. They are something we can refer back to and remind students of the techniques they have been taught. This is not about students being told what to do, it is a discussion. It is an opportunity for students to discuss how they are revising and for Dr Keay to explain a format and a plan for how to approach revision." Students are advised to revise little and often, taking regular breaks, rather than devoting an entire day to their books. Students from all across Essex attend lessons in the DSU with three specialist teachers who focus on multi-sensory teaching, while boosting confidence and self-esteem. Hannah Jones, head of school, said: "The exceptional work in the DSU is world class. Students are not just supported academically, they are supported with their social, cultural and moral development. Our specialist teachers work above and beyond to ensure these students have better life chances and future opportunities."

# MAGNA CARTA PRIMARY ACADEMY

Children who lack confidence to contribute in class are benefiting from a unique new form of sign language. The academy has developed its own system to enable all pupils

to give feedback during lessons. With less confident pupils reluctant to put their hands up in the traditional way, teachers at the primary school decided to find a way to encourage all children to get involved. Instead of putting their hands up, pupils are now signing to comment in different ways about a particular subject.



Headteacher Marios Solomonides said: "There is lots of research out there

about children putting their hands up, saying it allows some children to dominate and others to feel as though they do not matter. We are not banning children from putting up their hands, of course. This is simply about ensuring everyone has a voice. It is an opportunity for pupils to feedback to each other and to their teachers. We trialled different ways and decided on what worked best to create our own feedback policy. This has been developed with the children and they have really taken to it. It is working so well in keeping the flow of a lesson and keeping everyone on track." The new system, which will also be used in assembly to gather views from lots of people at once, is already used in Year 2 and is being introduced into Year 1 and Reception.

- When buying fruits and vegetables, do not use supermarket plastic bags; instead buy them loose or fill your own reusable bag
- Do not litter but dispose of everything in the correct bin (maybe even pick up litter if you see it)
- Use bar forms of beauty products such as soap
- For cleaning products, use cleaning pods and use these to fill your old bottles, you can find these on Amazon (made by Ocean Saver) and Splosh
- When buying cheese, meat and fish from the counters in a supermarket, take your own container and ask the shop staff to put the product in it for you
- Take a reusable drinks bottle with you.

# UGLEY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Paddington Bear, Rupert, Sooty and Winnie the Pooh, accompanied by their friend Carol James, were the entertainers at our April meeting. In the space of 45 minutes, Carol introduced us to her friends and told us of their fascinating history. Teddy bears as we know them today were created in 1902; before this they were anatomical representations of bears in the wild. She explained that in British sign language the sign for 'Love' and 'Teddy Bear' are the same. She gave a brief and fascinating history of the Steiff bears and showed us a recent acquisition from their

museum shop. She reminded us of some well-known British teddy manufacturers including Dean and Green who started making teddy bears during WWI. Chad Valley is another well-known name and a sample teddy from this factory



was proudly displayed. Merrythought is another well-known name; the only surviving British manufacturer of teddies, they have been in business since 1906. Paddington is the latest bear to appear on film and Carol told us that TV presenter Jeremy Clarkson was the first to own a Paddington Bear from darkest Peru. She ended her talk by giving us some amazing auction sales figures. A female teddy made in 1905 sold for £110,000 and a Louis Vuitton bear complete with luggage sold for £2.1. million! This is now in a Korean museum. At the end of her talk Carol judged our teddy bear competition for which there were a great number of entries in all shapes and sizes but with one thing in common: all much loved!

Our June meeting to be held on **Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> June** in Ugley Village Hall at 2.15pm will feature the memories of Phyllis Harrison. No stranger to the residents of Ugley and Stansted, it promises to be a very interesting afternoon. Why not come along!





### Mountfitchet Garden Club



Self-sufficiency throughout the year was the subject of the Club's first meeting of the season. After a long search, our speaker, Maike Windhorst, found a house with a three-acre garden which would allow her to garden organically with the aim of becoming self-sufficient.

After studying the various methods of crop rotation, her first attempt, using raised beds, was unsuccessful. After being undisturbed for many years the slugs and snails thoroughly enjoyed the banquet that was being grown for them; the framework of the raised beds gave them plenty of hiding holes! The vegetable patch was converted to rows using a four-crop rotation plan. Rather than taking vegetables back to the kitchen to clean up or taking spent greenery to a compost bin, this waste is put straight into the area of the path ready to be covered and new crops planted into this enriched soil at the next rotation. To ensure the land was always being used, quick crops such as lettuces, onions, radishes, etc. were introduced. A selection of vegetables picked from her garden that day was brought along to show members the variety of crops that can be grown. She sells her vegetables and fruit and homemade apple juice at the weekly Farmers' Market in Danbury. A piece of advice was given: always start with a small area and then slowly increase the growing plot. Keep the unproductive areas under grass, the clippings of which can be put into the path compost areas. Constant mowing will kill or weaken most weeds making it easier to bring under production eventually.



#### **MY STANSTED**

An Interview with Richard (Dick) Pollard



How long have you lived here?

Most of my life, apart from 2% years National Service, and the first six years of my married life when Sue and I lived in Newport.

#### What brought you to Stansted?

I was born in Bishop's Stortford hospital but grew up in Stansted. My parents lived in a house about halfway down Chapel Hill and I attended St Mary's Junior School before passing my 11 plus and going to Newport Grammar School.

#### Why do you enjoy living here?

It is a nice place to be, a lovely community. Although it has grown, I have always enjoyed village life. I would not want to live anywhere else.

Is there anything you don't like about the village? I am concerned about the increased traffic resulting from the recent housing developments. The infrastructure is struggling to cope.

How does Stansted compare with other places you've lived? I was part of the last group of young men to do National Service, which I enjoyed, and spent some time as a driver in Cyprus. I remember Cyprus as being much sunnier and warmer than here. It also seemed a bit more exciting than Stansted, but then I expect that was mostly due to it being my first experience abroad and away from home. During the time we lived in Newport it was a small village, and we particularly remember how helpful the doctors and nurses were with our children. It was convenient having the surgery just around the corner from us. The new surgery in Stansted is super, but a bit further away for me than when it was in St John's Road.

#### What was your profession?

My first job was in the village at The London and Stansted Furnishing Company, a large store on the Cambridge Road. The building was demolished and has recently been replaced by houses (Kingswood Close). The company also had a showroom near the Hockerill crossroads in Bishop's Stortford where I became manager. I went on to be a Sales Representative for a London company dealing in textiles,

and travelled widely across the UK. My last job was working part-time as a driver at a local car dealership.

How do you spend your leisure time?

For many happy years I ran a Cub Scouts pack here in Stansted and was also an active member of the Congregational Church (now Free Church), singing in the choir in my younger days. My favourite sport was cricket and I was the regular wicket keeper for the Stansted XI for several years. In those days it was a dangerous fielding position without the head and body protectors used today. I was also involved in the Stansted Carnival and the Stansted Fun Run in its early days, and was one of the Directors of The Link. Sadly, ill health has meant that I now spend most of my time at home reading and watching the television.

What is the most memorable thing that has happened during your time in Stansted?

Dressing up as a Court Jester and making all the announcements at the Stansted Carnival and other village events for many years. I thoroughly enjoyed it at the time, especially when being compère of the Carnival Queen competition!

#### THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

As a community we are in a season of fresh starts, some happening now and others anticipated. 

Unfortunately, we all have times when the going gets tough and we do not know where to turn. We may have financial worries, concerns about an elderly relative or marital breakdown. Finding the right help is all important. Uttlesford Citizens' Advice Bureau (CAB) has long been dealing with the myriad problems its clients face and recognised that there was a real need to amalgamate all the services within the local community which people could access in times of trouble. In 2015, with the backing of Essex County Council and the West Essex Clinical Commissioning Group, Uttlesford CAB and Uttlesford Council for Voluntary Services launched a pioneering new service, Frontline, which brings together more than 130 organisations in the area which provide help, support and advice when people most need it. Frontline has an easy-to-use website which gives users the opportunity to browse through a library of all the services on offer, or to hone down their search to provide information specific to their problem and where they live. It is also available as an app for mobile devices. Information is listed under: Advice, Family, Older People, Mental Health, Transport, Disability, Addiction, Well Being. Frontline is a growing resource with more and more services signing up. Each offers a printable fact sheet with full details of the organisation, contact details, opening hours and information about how it works and who is eligible. Many offer a call-back facility. People without internet access can access Frontline by calling Healthwatch Essex weekdays 9.00am-5.00pm on 0300 500 1895 (calls charged at local rate).



#### **BRAIN TRAINING - DEALING WITH STRESS**

Long term stress is very bad for our health. However, short term stress is actually good for us; it is a learning opportunity. The main problem is finding good ways to lower stress levels once the event is over.



Here are four stress-busting ideas:

- 1. Take a determined walk up Chapel Hill aiming to get thoroughly puffed out. Stress prepares us for action and taking any physical action is the best stress buster.
- Contract your muscles: most simply, squeeze your fists tight, grip your feet and teeth, tense up your leg, arms and abs and hold your breath. Then calmly let it all go. Look up slightly; lift your shoulders up into your ears: the top of the shoulder blades move towards each other, and the bottom of the shoulder blades widen. Then calmly let it all go.
- 3. Stress makes us hold our breath, so having a long hum or gargle will help us breathe it all away; do this for at least two minutes to encourage that breath to get moving properly again. Or breathe in and out of a hole-less bag, sealing it around the mouth and nose; this reverses over-breathing.
- 4. Mindfulness is an increasingly popular way of learning how to avoid getting stressed in the first place. If interested, but fear terminal boredom sitting on your bottom for hours on end doing absolutely nothing, a good app to try is *Headspace*. You try it for free and your meditation session can be as short as three minutes. This tiny length of time can be surprisingly effective. Insight Timer is good too with billions of guided meditations, a cool timer and it is free!

#### PARISH COUNCIL- "CHANGING OF THE GUARD"

The Chairman paid tribute to all those retiring, and expressed "grateful thanks to everybody for your commitment and hard work". All 15 councillors were present for the final meeting of the old council.



The first meeting of the new council was the Annual Meeting held on Wednesday 8 May. Maureen Caton was elected as Chairman with Fran Richards as her Deputy. Details of all the committee appointments can be found on our website.

We reported in the last Link that 13 Parish Councillors had been nominated for the 15 seats on the Council which left two vacancies to be filled by co-option. Four residents put their names forward to be co-opted so one of the first jobs the new council had was to hold a ballot of members to decide who to co-opt. The process we are required to go through for this involves a complicated single transferable vote ballot, which could have resulted in a number of rounds of voting. In the end the way the votes were cast meant that this was not necessary and Matthew Jessup and Tom Van de Bilt secured a majority of votes on the first round of voting and were duly elected.

# A PERSONAL REFLECTION BY PETER JONES - 40 YEARS ON THE PARISH COUNCIL - WAS IT WORTH IT?

When I was first elected in 1976, the Parish Council shared two small rooms with the library which, at that time, was located in Lower Street; the Crafton Green complex was purchased in the 1980s - critics said the move was unnecessary and expensive!

The Mountfitchet Exchange represents another major step, once again bringing the Parish Council and Li-

brary together. This new build, I believe, provides a central point for community interaction but of course not everyone agrees.

Meetings in my early years often lasted to 11 pm (new councillors do not take fright as this has changed!). Sometimes, the then Council adjourned to take some refreshment in The Queen's Head before resuming. Whether decisions should have been taken before or after the break is a moot question! After supporting yellow lines on Lower Street, the Council was, for a short time, banned from The Queen's.

I have served with many councillors of all political persuasions but generally, after elections, the parish has come first - party affiliations forgotten - long may this continue. Although not all hopes were realised or actions successful, my experience has always been worthwhile.

Whatever the efforts of councillors, the Council would be ineffective without the constant focal point, the Clerk. I have served with six Clerks (Rosemary, Marty, Shelia, Janet and Owen for those with long memories), five during the the sixteen years from 1976 and one, the current incumbent, Ruth Clifford, for the past twenty seven years. Their efforts have often extended well beyond their contractual commitments.



Whilst big projects excite - The Mountfitchet Exchange, the Leisure Centre, the Health Centre, the skatepark, re-equipped play areas and new allotments - just as important are the more mundane services which improve our daily lives: street cleaning, street lighting, flower troughs and hanging baskets, the Youth Centre and Windmill, as well as lobbying on worrying planning applications.

More and more responsibilities are falling on Parish Councils, a trend that is likely to continue. Demand upon councillors and staff are much greater than in my early years. Decisions will have to be made on the wants of residents against their willingness to pay for them.

Stansted is a good place to live but there is plenty of scope for improvements. A dedicated and thoughtful Parish Council is much needed but so are the ideas, the support, the knowledge and the talents of residents. Patience is essential given our limited powers but success is achievable with well researched ideas and sustained pressure.

It has been a privilege to serve as a parish councillor but to commit so much time, for so long, would not have been possible without the support and advice of my late wife, Kaye. So my thanks go to all of you and to her.

#### TWINNING ASSOCIATION NEWS

Our Quiz Night took place on Saturday 13th April. This was the second community event organised by the Twinning Association this year and it was another great success raising over £600! The Day Centre was packed with around 60 people of all ages competing in the quiz. There were 10 rounds, including one about Stansted and one about France. Special thanks to the Quizmasters David, Cliff and Sophie, and congratulations to Anna Watkins, winner of the Pot of Gold.

#### **CLOTHES AND SHOES RECYCLING**

Until recently there was a clothing recycling bank outside the Fire Station on Chapel Hill. This had to be removed because of access issues.

We had a request from the charity Scope to place a clothing bank in Stansted and we have agreed it will go into the Crafton Green car park, hopefully in the near future.



The Textile Banks help to raise awareness and provide a much needed source of income towards ongoing projects which help to make this country a place where disabled people have the same opportunities as everyone else.

At the same time, they help to reduce landfill and increase the availability of textile recycling facilities for the local residents. The bank will be monitored for collections and will normally be emptied once a week, more regularly if it fills up very quickly. If there were to be a rush of donations, there is a contact telephone number on the bank and the collection team will be straight on to it.

#### THE MOUNTFITCHET EXCHANGE

As we write the issues we reported in the last edition of The Link have regrettably not been resolved. We are still waiting for a date for Openreach to install the fibre optic cables for the internet connection in the Exchange. We cannot accept handover of the building until this is complete. Unfortunately, the site was not registered by our contractors for the work to be completed with BT at the appropriate time to schedule the work in line with the project completion. We are addressing the issue with contractors. As soon as we have a date from Openreach, the Library Service will install their computers and set up the rest of their operation and we can at long last open the building.

#### NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Dean writes:

Friday May 3<sup>rd</sup> at The Lord Butler Leisure Centre in Saffron Walden was dramatic. No squash was being played, yet there was some squashing. The swimming pool was closed, yet a tsunami swept the premises and beyond. It was the day for counting votes from the local elections of the day before.

The big winners were the Residents for Uttlesford Party. Their number of councillors rose from 10 to 26. The Lib Dems got a boost from 4 to 7. Independents came back with two councillors.

The big shock was the collapse of Conservative district councillors from 24 to 4, the same low number that the Lib Dems had been at until the day before. Labour gained none.

The council welcomes Melvin Caton and Ayub Khan to represent Stansted South and Birchanger. Geoffrey Sell and I continue to represent Stansted North.

There can be no doubt that the collapse of the Conservative vote followed a national trend, influenced by the unstable state of affairs at Westminster.

Yet there were local factors that almost certainly contributed to what was the highest percentage Conservative loss of seats and control in England. No doubt there will be other theories, but controversy over the emerging Local Plan and public dissatisfaction with a draft obligations agreement with Stansted Airport were significant causes of residents' dissatisfaction.

As I write this account on May 6<sup>th</sup>, I can't say much about the future. Residents for Uttlesford have more than enough councillors to form the next Administration. The Liberal Democrats will be the Opposition. I am, nevertheless, confident that there will be various forms of cross-party working. There was under the outgoing Conservative administration.

I will be concerned if the Local Plan is thrown off-track by uncertainty caused by attempts to stall or rewrite it. That could bring yet more unplanned development.

I hope that the airport cooperates in a review of their planning agreement and does not rush for an appeal that would be costly in time and expense - to their neighbouring residents in Uttlesford District as well as to the airport.

### Nature Notes

When walking in the countryside one very often sees or finds something interesting. The other day I came across a small animal's skull which I was able to identify as belonging to a badger. Now, badgers are tough creatures which are only likely to come to a premature end by being run over or dispatched in various other ways by humans. This skull was not near a road so the badger was unlikely to have been run over. It was found by an area where badgers regularly forage for food and where they liked to play on old logs and steep banks. # FLEAS, TICKS, AND OTHER CRAWLY THINGS

A vet's year has a predictable path with regard to the ailments treated: gastroenteritis from overindulgence at Christmas, chocolate poisoning at Easter and the arrival of fleas in spring. Every self-respecting dog or cat has fleas at some point in their lives; it does not mean your pet is unclean, it just means its blood tastes nice. They are a nuisance as they make your pet bite and scratch and can cause skin infections and allergies. They can transmit tapeworms and can cause anaemia; scarily, an adult flea can lay 50 eggs a day and up to 1500 eggs in about three weeks. It is hard to see fleas as they are tiny and very quick; you might see black specks of flea poo. One good way of checking for them is by doing the wet paper test. Get a piece of wet white kitchen roll and rub the pet's coat over it. If little black specks appear which slowly turn red, these are flea dirts. Products from a vet are usually much more effective than those available at supermarkets, pet stores or pharmacies. Flea collars, shampoos and sprays are outdated. Most modern flea products are either 'spot -on' products which you put on the back of your pet's neck, or palatable tablets.

The golden rules are:

- 1. Get your flea control preparations from a vet.
- 2. Treat all the animals in the house on the same day.
- 3. Follow the manufacturer's instructions and repeat the treatment at the correct intervals.
- 4. Treat the environment as well as the animals (but remember washing pet bedding doesn't kill fleas, it just makes clean fleas).
- 5. Don't panic!





# ORGANIC, BIODYNAMIC AND NATURAL WINES WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

Many people seek these wines out for environmental reasons and others because they believe that sulphites and chemicals in wine give them headaches. What happens in the vineyard and then in the winery defines how they are classified. **Organic** vines (like organic vegetables) are grown without artificial fertilisers, weed killers, fungicides or pesticides. Sulphur dioxide or copper may also be used. They can use certain natural additives including sulphites, although the level can differ depending on certification rules. Try

Sainsburys SO Organic Prosecco £10, fresh and fruity with a floral nose, soft peach and apricot flavours, or Aldi's Toro Loco, Organico, Utiel-Requena, Spain 2016 £5.00, with juicy red berry fruit, sweet spices and smooth finish. Biodynamic wines have a lot in common but go a stage further in the vineyard almost to a spiritual level, following philosophies developed in the 1920s for soil preparation, such as the use of manure and how the grapes are managed and picked (for example, following lunar cycles). These again can contain sulphites. Try Waitrose Ch Maris Vieilles Vignes 2017 Minervois £11. Dark fruit flavours with a hint of spice, from old vines.

Both organic and biodynamic wines can also be vegetarian or vegan if they do not use animal-derived products in the winery such as egg whites or Isinglass for fining. **Natural wines** have no certification rules at present but these should be made without the use of chemical fertilisers or pesticides in the vineyards and little filtration of yeast, enzymes or sulphur used in the winery. However, there is a higher risk of bacterial infection or oxidisation. Whilst some are wonderful and fresh, others can be unstable, cloudy and have some secondary fermentation (a slight fizz to the wine). These are generally only available from specialist merchants.

Early summer at Hatfield Forest - a time when nature flourishes, as young birds and animals tentatively head towards independence. This is the perfect time to visit and enjoy the Forest in all its glory. Have you met our flock of sheep - our woolly conservators? Livestock have long grazed at Hatfield Forest and today our flock continues this tradition, helping clear scrub and restore wood pasture. We have 24 sheep, all hardy and rare breeds. They can graze wetter land than cattle, such as the marsh at the top end of the lake and Old Woman's Weaver. Sheep are easily stressed, so please ensure dogs are kept on leads and out of fenced off areas. We have our own sheepdog, a Welsh collie called Selena, who has worked at the Forest since early 2018. A donation from the Chelmsford Supporters' Group enabled us to buy her. She works with shepherd Ian Pease and can often be seen travelling through the Forest in the back of his pick-up truck.

#### **Sheer Incompetence from Start to Finish**

Uttlesford District Council (UDC) conceded that it could not grant final approval to the current Stansted Airport planning application before the recent local elections. At the end of an Extraordinary Council Meeting at UDC's Saffron Walden offices on 25<sup>th</sup> April a procedural motion, put forward by Residents for Uttlesford (R4U) councillors, supported by Liberal Democrats and two of the 20 Conservative councillors present, foiled the current administration's attempt to

approve the planning application before the recent local elections.

SSE Chairman Peter Sanders commented: "It is beyond comprehension why our own local council wanted to rush through approval of this planning application by accepting a totally inadequate package of local safeguards and community benefits which did not meet the minimum requirements set down by the Council's own Planning Committee. This planning application has been incompetently handled from start to finish. It was always far too complex to be dealt with locally. It should have been passed to the Secretary of State for national consideration at the very outset." Ahead of the meeting SSE had provided all UDC councillors with detailed briefing notes explaining the legal deficiencies in the proposed Section 106 Agreement and demonstrating that many of the proposals put forward by Stansted Airport, which the former UDC administration were prepared to accept, were grossly inferior to comparable arrangements at other major UK airports. Meanwhile, SSE continues to press ahead its High Court proceedings with the aim of forcing either the Transport Secretary or the Communities Secretary (or both) to take direct charge of the current Stansted Airport planning application. A date for the Judicial Review is expected to have been announced on 23<sup>rd</sup> May.
