

It is hard to believe that we are already over half way through the academic year; the spring term seems to be flying by even quicker than the autumn term. Despite this fast pace there continues to be a plethora of learning taking place throughout the classrooms. In Cherry Class it has been most pleasing that the children are exemplifying a really settled and grown-up attitude, a testament to them considering it is only their second term in school. They have been studying old toys and it has been interesting to listen to the perceptions of the children when comparing them to the modern-day toys they are used to. In Pine Class they are learning about traditional tales and I have also seen some fantastic art work. Their recent display entitled Colour Chaos was particularly eye catching and demonstrated some excellent painting skills. Children attending a primary school out of hours are being given a wealth of new experiences and opportunities. Magna Carta Primary Academy has relaunched its breakfast and after-school club with the appointment of new manager Rebecca Pengelly, who is mum to two Magna Carta pupils. She is giving children opportunities to be creative, to use their imaginations and to learn before and after school at the clubs, now named Lionhearts. She said: "I am creating a welcoming, fun environment focusing on children being creative. I am getting children to use their imaginations and ideas." The club has dress-up costumes for children to roleplay. Lego to develop co-ordination and building, a colouring area and a quiet home corner with blankets and pillows for those wanting an after-school rest. The sessions have an educational element and regular themes, including one week learning about pets and watching Andy's Animal Adventures and another having a teddy bears' picnic where they made their own hats and played party games.



Headteacher Marios Solomonides said: "We have got great parents who do a lot for us. Rebecca is a parent and brings with her lots of customer service experience and people skills from her previous roles. We considered outsourcing the clubs, but this way we are able to link the sessions to our curriculum and they become an extension of the school day. The team running the clubs are a part of our staff training and work to the same systems, so that brings its own security and peace of mind for children and parents as the standards are the same throughout." The breakfast club runs 7.30am-8.45am and the after-school club 3.00pm-6.30pm. Healthy meals are served during both sessions.



HATFIELD FOREST

Spring is approaching and excitement is mounting at Hatfield Forest, where a tawny owl has again been spotted roosting in a veteran tree. The Forest has a number of nest boxes, but this owl seems to prefer the natural habitat. The owl is in a prime place to be able to capitalise on every element which make up a tawny's diet; small mammals, rodents, small birds, frogs, insects, worms and even fish at times. There are also reports of red kites and ravens overflying the Forest, and the possible sighting of a goshawk around the area.



Finding a spot to watch wildlife is a wonderful way to enjoy the Forest. We ask that you please give the creatures space to live, undisturbed by us. Please do take photographs, sketch and paint from a distance, but keep to hard-standing paths and away from waterlogged areas. It is important dogs are kept on leads in the lake and boardwalk areas, around our livestock and wildlife. and under close control in the wider Forest. There are many ways to explore Hatfield Forest. We have events during the spring and summer, including photographic workshops, a Forest bake-off and the opportunity to build a bee hotel. For details see our website or call us. It is not just wildlife that is flourishing now. The Forest is showing signs of new growth, with catkins on hazel trees, sticky buds on the horse chestnuts and dog's mercury carpeting our ancient woodland.

People are often surprised to hear that the rivers are not cleaned of litter as part of weekly rubbish collections, and that maintaining the river is typically down to the work of volunteer groups. The River Stort is an area of diverse wildlife which needs protection; paddlers have sighted otter and water vole for example, as well as kingfishers and cormorants on our travels. We made the commitment to improve the river environment after discovering a dead otter that had become caught in an illegal and abandoned crayfish net. We are on the lookout for dangers to wildlife such as abandoned shopping trolleys and entangled fishing lines in trees. We now run a litter picking paddle over the first weekend of each month, heading out to a different stretch of the river each time. We welcome anyone who can take a couple of hours out to assist in either walking or paddling a stretch of river with a dustbin bag, gloves and grabber.

Over the years we have developed as a Club with a regular group of weekday paddlers alongside our weekend activities. We are a diverse paddling community with a wide age and ability range. We welcome new members looking to try something new, from our midweek pensioners' paddle, to our evening taster sessions for youth groups and trips which can be found on our website.



MY STANSTED An Interview with Jean Winder



How long have you lived here? For 70 years

What brought you to Stansted?

I moved here to work as a Nursing Sister at the Herts and Essex Hospital in Bishop's Stortford.

Why do you enjoy living here?

I get visits from members of my wonderful family who live in the village and I have lovely neighbours who help and look out for me. Stansted is a very friendly community.

*Is there anything you don't like about the village?*Not really. Although it's changed a lot, I'm still quite happy living here.

How does Stansted compare with other places you've lived?



THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

When I am driving, I, like many, have the radio playing. I often change which channel I listen to: sometimes show tunes, sometimes pop music, and currently the channels which provide topical discussions. At the moment a hot topic on most stations is Brexit, but increasingly there has been interest in trying to identify and explain the terminology involved, which is leaving many of us completely baffled!

ATRIAL FIBRILLATION



What is Atrial Fibrillation?

Atrial Fibrillation (AF) is a common abnormal heart rhythm. Your heart's pumping action is controlled by tiny electrical messages produced by a part of the heart called the sinus node. The sinus node is sometimes called your heart's 'natural pacemaker'. Normally, the electrical messages are sent out regularly, with each message telling your heart to contract and pump blood around your body. This is felt as a normal, regular heartbeat, or pulse. Atrial Fibrillation (AF) happens because, as well as the sinus node sending out regular electrical impulses, different places in and around the atria (the upper chambers of the heart) also produce electrical messages, in an uncoordinated way. These multiple, irregular messages make the atria quiver or twitch, which is known as fibrillation: an irregular and fast heartbeat, or pulse.

What are the symptoms of Atrial Fibrillation?

Symptoms can include: palpitation (being aware of your heartbeat), tiredness, shortness of breath and dizziness or feeling faint. An irregular pulse could be a sign that you have an atrial fibrillation. However, some people only have mild symptoms, while other people have no symptoms at all.



When the rate of the electrical algorals is very high, the atria quiver instead of contracting properly. They fail to pump all the blood out of the atria. The blood can pool and may form a clot. If a blood do leaves the atria it can block an artery in the body, causing severe complications, such as attempts.

Can Atrial Fibrillation lead to a stroke?

AF can increase the risk of

a blood clot forming inside the heart. If the clot travels to the brain, it can lead to a stroke. AF increases stroke risk by five times. However, with appropriate treatment the risk of stroke can be substantially reduced with anticoagulant (blood thinning) drugs.

BRAIN TRAINING

Improve your balance and make your walking and running more fluid. To find out if this works for you, stand on one leg, maybe with your eyes shut, and get a good wobble going. Now make a tight fist with one hand and stretch out the fingers of the other hand. If this made you nearly fall over, try it the other way round. The chances are high that one combination improved things whilst the other made things worse. Apart from doing this when practising your balance, it's an extremely good idea to do the same hand combination whilst out walking or running. Just swing your arms as you normally do when proceeding along but keep one hand in a fist and the other stretched out.



Why this works boils down to it having a good effect on the gait cycle. This is how we walk: as the right leg steps forwards, the left arm also comes forwards, whilst the left leg and right arm go backwards. For many reasons and in different ways, this can go a bit wrong. The one fist exercise helps correct this. A typical sign is an unbalanced bottom (oo'er missus); tighten your bottom and prod away at each cheek – it is very common for one cheek to be flabbier than the other. The above drill profoundly helps correct this.

WINES OF SPAIN



If you are planning your summer holiday, why not try some of the indigenous grape varieties before you go, and maybe visit a few wineries whilst you are there? We are so lucky in the UK to have supermarkets with a great range of local indigenous grape varieties, like Spanish wines for example. Many will have tried the white wine and grape Albarino from the Galicia region in northern Spain, but a more unusual variety from the same region now gaining popularity is *Godello*. This grape, which at one time was on the verge of extinction, is more intense with good minerality and crisp acidity. Try Sainsbury's Taste the Difference *Godello*, *Bierzo 2016* at £9.00 or the 'Xastra' Godello, Bierzo at £9.99 from Adnams.

The white *Rueda* wine is made predominantly from the Verdejo grape, a good alternative to Sauvignon Blanc (and indeed is sometimes blended with it) and great with fish dishes. A good value example is Beronia Rueda 2016 at £8.99 from Waitrose with aromas of ripe stone fruits with hints of lime, green apple and tropical fruits on the palate. For the reds Spain has much more to offer than just the Tempranillo grape and Rioja. One worth seeking out is the second most popular red grape in Spain which few have heard of: Bobal, a muscular red wine with a dense core of forest fruit flavours. Majestic have a great value example in Vox Populi Bobal 2014 at £7.32 as part of a mixed six case. Another variety gaining in popularity is the Mencia grape, mainly from the Castilla y Leon region in NW Spain with aromas of strawberry and plum (a bit like Pinot Noir) and an elegant fruity taste. Again, Majestic have a good value version in their Pizarras de Otero, Bierzo 2015 at £7.99 as part of a mixed case, or the 2016 Mencia Selection 'Xastra', Bierzo at £9.99 from Adnams. Happy holiday planning!

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Cllr Maureen Caton writes:

Another year to look back on and look forward too! Elections are looming and there may be changes to the

incumbent Parish and District Councillors that represent us. Peter Jones, (pictured right), who has been a Councillor at both levels, serving the community for 43 years, has decided to retire. His financial expertise, aligned with his common-sense approach to issues, will be sorely missed. John Salmon (left) is also bidding farewell to council life; John has also served on both

tnit.

Councils and retires after 32 years. Thank you both for your years of dedication and commitment to our community.

We hope the Local Plan will be passed and leave us in the position of only accepting another sixty homes in the period to 2033. This, aligned with our **Neighbourhood Development Plan** (NDP), which outlines how we expect any future development, should be assessed in line with policies and principles in the plan. Public consultation on the NDP should take place in late Spring this year. This may well be followed by a call for sites suitable for new almshouses to be built, following the release of funds from the old site on Church Road, ringfenced to be reinvested in Stansted.

Welcome to the **new residents** of Walpole Meadows and Elms Farm; we hope they will be part of, and participate in, our vibrant and caring community.

This year's **Community Achievement Award** winners, who were acknowledged at a celebration event at Uttlesford District Council Offices were Judy Colliver, Alan Corbishley and Marion Pretty. Between them, they illustrate our ability to care in our community.

We held a civil ceremony this year to mark our **twinning with Rungis** in France. We are looking forward to individuals, families and organisations in the village taking the opportunity to exchange visits and social/cultural experiences that will strengthen our bond of "entente cordiale."

The decision on the **expansion of Stansted Airport** was controversially approved by Uttlesford District Council (UDC), with the Parish Council requesting the Minister to review the decision.

Likewise, we are questioning the validity of the 2015/18 **Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment** which states that we only need one dispensing pharmacy in the village; some significant consultees omitted to comment on our needs and this negligence requires a review, significantly in the south ward. The Essex Health and Wellbeing Board are not prepared to visit and hear the views of the community and, therefore, will not issue a reviewed statement of need. We have no alternative than to seek the support of the Minister for Health to achieve this outcome.

Essex County Council's (ECC) Library Strategy Consultation was a complete surprise to the Parish Council. We have been in discussions with the Library Service since 2011, culminating in an agreement that our new hub, The Mount-fitchet Exchange, would be designed around the central resource of a library. To hear that our library was in tier 4, deemed for closure, displayed a lack of transparency and partnership working to say the least. The consultation document is, we believe, flawed; not least it uses statistics taken during the period that the library was based in the mobile vehicle and latterly in a small room in our offices. We are robustly pursuing ECC to honour their commitment and obligation to our community and to review the statistics and the development opportunities from the hub - to place us in Tier 2.



We hope to have a UDC presence providing community information from the hub, CAB services and a base for our joint-funded **Police Community Support Officer** (PCSO) who has been recruited and will hopefully be with us in April.

The increase in our precept this year (£6 per household at Band D) comes as a result of ECC 's current position where they have not signed the lease on the new building, depriving us of an income of £20,000 per annum, although they agreed the Heads of Terms of the lease some years ago.

Should ECC honour their commitment, this money will be used to reinstate the Foresthall Park S106 fund used last year to buy out the legal rights over the Crafton Green land and car park owed by a third party.

The completion of the new **Mountfitchet Exchange**, and the relocation of the Health Service, gives us the opportunity to review the future use of Crafton Green House. We are also discussing with UDC the possible use of the grass area adjacent to the house to create additional car parking spaces.

We are in discussion to set up a **Youth Council** in conjunction with our schools and the Youth Centre, to promote the views of young people being heard and responded to within our democratic systems, and to help prepare our young up-and-coming community champions.

We are in a dialogue with the Environment Agency who are focusing their **Natural Flood Management** programme to the north of Gall End Lane and contact is being made with local landowners to agree further actions on flood alleviation for Lower Street specifically.

Thank you to our staff who have risen to the challenge of a difficult year, and to my fellow councillors who volunteer their services freely in support of our community.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Cllr Peter Jones writes:

Council tax (parish share) will rise by 9.68%. If ECC had signed the library lease (as promised as late as November), council tax would have increased by 2.4% as indicated last year. The Parish Council cannot assume that ECC will commit, so to meet auditor requirements on the level of free reserves, the higher figure has been agreed.

The outturn is lower than anticipated a year ago reflecting the Clinic remaining a contributor for half the year, some short term saving in staff costs and the late recruitment of a PCSO.

An empty Crafton Green House will cost about £20,000 made up of lost clinic income and continuing business rates while the age of lighting stock will lead to higher replacement costs. Even so the outturn was still projected to be lower than indicated last year. If, however, ECC fails to lease space in the new building then, until a new tenant is found, net costs will be £20,000 higher.

Areas of Potential Change

- New building costs if ECC, or another party, signs a lease then parish finances will improve by £20,000. ECC has "actively" encouraged the Parish Council to pursue this project.
- 2 Day Centre changes in the running and management of the Day Centre may produce a useful saving of around £5,000 as well as safeguarding the service.
- 3 Crafton Green House the building cannot be allowed to stand empty. Options under consideration could save the parish around £8,000 or more depending on future use.

Reserve for Foresthall Park

The Parish Council undertook to replace some of the money taken from the Community Fund for the new building. It is hoped that building the reserve will begin in the next year.

ELMS FARM ALLOTMENTS

The allotments at Elms Farm were officially handed over to the Parish Council on Wednesday 16 January. The provision of allotments was part of the planning agreement for the Elms Farm estate so there was no council tax



payers money involved in providing the allotments and any expenditure on the site will be funded from the rental income.

There is a mixture of full plots (25m x 10m) and half plots (12.5m x 10m) and our photograph shows some of our allotmenteers getting to know each other and discussing their plans for their plots. The initial challenge is to clear the plot of "field grass" and turnover the soil ready for planting in the spring.

All the plots at Elms Farm have now been allocated but if you want to be added to the waiting list please see the allotment section on our website or contact the Parish Council Office on 813214. There will also be allotment plots available on the Walpole Farm development once all the construction work has been completed. A waiting list for these has already been established.

NEWS FROM UTTLEFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Sell writes:

Budget

At our meeting on 21 February we will be setting the budget for 2019/20. It is likely that an increase of 2.99% will be recommended. Council taxes are not sufficient to pay for the services that the council provides, so central government has provided an important source of funding. However, this has been going down. In 2016/17 the Council received £7.652 million, made up of Business Rates Retention, New Homes Bonus etc. By 2020/21 this is forecast to reduce to £5.087 million and by 2023/24 to £3.1 million. With these projected reductions the council has two choices - reduce services or diversify through investments. The Council rightly has decided on the latter. In May 2017 the Council acquired a 50% share in Chesterford Research Park, financed through borrowing £37 million. It is expected that the net contribution for 2019/20 to the Council budget through this investment will be circa £1.7 million.

This investment strategy I have supported, although I have concerns about the governance arrangements and I will be tabling a budget amendment. In 2017, the council decided to give £500,000 towards a running track at Carver Barracks. This project has stalled with the Ministry of Defence. My amendment would seek to cancel the project and reallocate the money to a community infrastructure fund.

Local Plan

This has been submitted to the government, and inspectors have been appointed. They will examine the soundness of the plan. The majority of the housing development has been allocated in three new garden communities: North Uttlesford (Great Chesterford) Easton Park (near Dunmow) and west of Braintree (Stebbing). Stansted only receives a small allocation. It is in our interest that the plan succeeds otherwise we may find we will be receiving extra housing.

Stansted Library

Many thanks to all those who have supported the campaign to keep a library in the village. I have met the County Council portfolio holder ClIr Susan Barker on several occasions and left her in no doubt about the strength of feeling. One of the petitions that has been circulating will be handed into the county council by ClIr Mike Mackrory, Leader of the Opposition .

At the district council's last meeting I tabled the following motion which was passed unanimously:

"This Council asks the Cabinet Member for communities and partnerships to work with Essex County Council, parish/town councils, voluntary organisations and residents to explore ways in which the library service in Uttlesford is maintained and enhanced, in light of the county council's major consultation of the proposed future strategy for the county's libraries."

BREXIT AND THE VETERINARY WORLD

I am sure most of you are heartily sick of the 'B' word by now. As I am writing this in February, who knows where we will be in a month's time, but at present it all seems a bit of a mess. The implications of Brexit have been far-reaching and the veterinary world has not escaped. There is a shortage of vets in the UK; in 2016, 43% of new vets had graduated from non-UK vet schools. Vets are employed in general practice, industry, meat hygiene, Government and research. In the meat hygiene sector alone, some estimates suggest 95% of Official Veterinarians (OVs) working in abattoirs graduated overseas. The uncertainty around Brexit has seriously affected recruitment; other areas of concern include the supply of drugs and animal feeds. However, veterinary organisations are working hard to come up with contingency plans, and drug and food companies assure us they have put measures in place to prevent shortages.

Pet Passports

An area of concern is foreign travel and obtaining a pet passport. At present cats, dogs and ferrets need to have a microchip and be vaccinated against rabies; a pet passport can then be issued. In the case of a 'no deal Brexit', these rules will change; a microchip and rabies vaccination are still necessary but then your pet must have a blood sample taken at least 30 days after the rabies vaccination. If the results of the blood test are successful, a passport can be issued but the pet will not be eligible for travel until three months from the date of the successful blood sample. You will also need to take your pet to an OV no more than 10 days before travel to get a health certificate; the whole process could take four months, so our advice is to speak to your vet. GARDENING TIPS FOR MARCH

March can be unpredictable weatherwise, with extremes of temperature in both directions. If we are lucky enough to have a warm period, it is an ideal time for rectifying dead patches and seeding in the lawn; it can even be suitable for major lawn renovations. Should the weather not be so kind, it can still be possible to use turf except in extreme conditions. Generally good quality seed will produce a better result in the long term for establishing a lawn and is considerably cheaper. Make sure your mower blade is both sharp and balanced prior to using it this season. Deadhead daffodils (removing spent flowers) to direct most of the energy the plant generates into the bulb to optimise flowering next year. It is best not to cut down or tie up the foliage, as this reduces the amount of energy that is directed down into the bulb. You can even consider feeding them with a tomato or other high potash fertiliser to improve flowering next year. Whilst discussing bulbs, you can start to plant summer flowering bulbs such as gladioli this month too; in fact, planting some now and some in April will spread the flowering period out in summer. Hardy annuals such as cornflowers and sweet peas can be sown outside now, but do not be tempted to try and sow half hardy annuals outside already as they will

If you have a pond with a filter and pump, check they are in good working order for the summer. If your filter has a UV lamp, ensure you fit a new bulb as they are only effective for one growing season. Doronicum, fritillaries and forsythias are star performers this month; treat yourself to a trip to the nursery to buy some.



Nature Notes

One chilly morning a small flock of finches came into the garden and hunted for seeds among the shrubs. These were mostly bramblings, finches visiting from Scandinavia, mixing with our chaffinches, which are very similar in appearance. Flocks like this usually spend most of their time foraging in the hedgerows in the countryside.



Other winter visitors are a large flock of redwings, members of the thrush family, to be seen in local stubble fields and also pigeons which come to feed on young crops. These pigeons often roost in the trees round our village but never seem to come down and mix with our resident pigeons. Among any large flock of birds, it is inevitable that there will be sick and ailing birds and the sparrowhawks will pick these off. A few weeks ago, a sparrowhawk perched on the fence near our kitchen window and when it took off it swooped low over the lawn and skimmed over the top of the neighbour's fence. If any small bird had happened to be at their bird table at the time it would have been seized and carried off.



Don't give up, give thanks

It's a Christian tradition to deny ourselves something we enjoy in the weeks of Lent between Shrove Tuesday and Easter Sunday. This period of fasting is often reduced to giving up chocolate, cakes or alcohol. Lent is also a time of reflection, and Christian Aid invites us to think about the things that we have, be thankful for them, and share some of that good fortune with others. A booklet entitled *Count* Your Blessings, available online at www.caid.org.uk/lent or from me, invites us to "put our faith into action through daily reflections and challenges." It puts the spotlight on small, remote islands in the Philippines, where the community is pushed to the brink of survival by climate change and precarious livelihoods. On some days it invites us to make a donation to Christian Aid as a way of saying thanks for what we have. Other days an action is recommended, such as only buying sustainably sourced fish, taking a photo and posting on social media, writing down our blessings on sticky notes and putting them where they will often be

So, starting on 6th March, *Ash Wednesday*, you could Count your Blessings and support Christian Aid at the same time. You could give up chocolate as well. Please contact me if you would like a copy of the booklet.

SIXTY FIVE YEARS OF CHURCH MUSIC - IN A CASSOCK

It all started in 1941 when, aged seven, I joined the choir at St Mary's Church and my Uncle Ron, an accomplished organist, paid for me to have piano lessons for a year. My family then acquired a piano and I continued to learn to play

without tuition. A few years later I taught myself to play the organ, and in 1956 I was appointed organist and choirmaster at St Mary's. During those early years, I attended several residential courses at the Royal School of Church Music led by eminent professionals such as Sir David Wilcocks of King's College, Cambridge. By the early '60s I was also choir-



master for St John's Church and organised visits to cathedrals with choirs from St Mary's and St John's, deputising for the resident choirs who were on holiday or touring. I stayed at St Mary's until it closed in 1980. I then formed St Mary's Singers, visiting a total of 27 cathedrals, including St George's Cathedral in Jerusalem where we sang Choral Evensong. We also took part in Joy to the World Concerts at the Royal Albert Hall in aid of children's charities, alongside Cliff Richard and other celebrities. In 1988 I was presented to HRH Princess Royal in recognition of four years of participation at these concerts; a great honour. After leaving St John's, I took over the choir at All Saints Hockerill Church in Bishop's Stortford for five very happy years, before moving to Chatteris due to work commitments, where I still live. There I was persuaded to take over as Director of Music at St Andrew's Church in Sutton (Cambridgeshire), a huge, freezing cold church at the time, with a worn-out pipe organ!

St Mary's exhibition Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th April In 2006, after an incredible 65 years I finally hung up my cassock and although I am no longer running a choir, church music is still my passion. I am actively involved with St Mary's Friends who are staging an exhibition to celebrate the choirs' visits to various cathedrals and venues, offering a unique opportunity for choristers past and present to renew old acquaintances and take a trip down memory lane with me. Numerous photographs will be displayed, and recordings of the choirs will be played during the weekend. The BBC News Team are expected to pay a visit. The choristers' enthusiasm made it possible to achieve the high standards required by cathedrals.



THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY - LAKES AND PONDS

The pond by the village green at Finchingfield pictured here is a much photographed and painted example of the idyllic view of the English countryside, where ducks swim and white clouds are reflected in its calm waters.

The area of the Hundred Parishes has a variety of similar ponds. Those alongside roads were often formed from ancient extraction pits for clay or gravel; others appeared where earth had been extracted for building work. Some are surviving medieval fish ponds or the remnants of moats around isolated old farm houses. Ponds on farms provided water for livestock, but following the reduction in cattle and sheep-rearing many have been filled in.

Fortunately, a number of private gardens have ponds where aquatic plants provide a haven for a wide variety of creatures that depend on such water bodies for their survival. Dipping a net into a pond will reveal snails, assorted larvae of dragonflies, water beetles and midges. Larger ponds may support fish.

Amphibians such as frogs, toads and newts need to lay their eggs within water but will spend much of their adult lives on land, eating a range of garden pests if there is some dense vegetation and a rockery nearby. These creatures have become quite scarce in the wider countryside with the reduction in suitable habitats. During March, the croaking of male frogs hoping to attract a mate is one of the sounds of spring. Local records of adult amphibians and locations of spawn provide valuable

information about their distribution and behaviour. If you are fortunate to see frogs, toads or newts in your local ponds, then please do pass this information to either the Essex Field Club or the Freshwater Habitats Organisation. At our February meeting we were given a most enjoyable talk by Leila Riddell on the Magna Carta Embroidery. Leila has been involved with embroidery most of her life and was responsible for the Bishop's Stortford Mural. In 2013 Leila was approached by Nigel Collingwood and Audrey Rodgers to discuss a Magna Carta project for Stansted. Nigel was a member of the Magna Carta Barons Association. It was decided that this work should be a screen in order to be portable and should be made of the best quality material. The Airport's Community Resources provided grants to help with the cost of the materials and accompanying booklet. The design of the centrepiece was inspired by an ammonite Leila saw in the Saffron Walden Museum. The historical background was provided by the Local History Society. A lot of artwork had to be produced before stitching could commence on the many buildings and historical events which make up the embroidery. The project involved a huge number of volunteers and we were shown a number of slides showing the work in progress.



Leila gave over her home to the huge task of assembling the finished pieces and fitting them into the magnificent wooden frame made for the purpose. This had to be done to a very strict timescale. The final unveiling took place at Forest Hall School. The embroidery was on display at the Mediaeval Fair at Stansted Hall. It has since been to St Mary's Church, Saffron Walden and Chelmsford. It is back at Stansted Hall at present, awaiting its permanent home at the new Stansted Mountfitchet Hub.

Next month's meeting will be held on **Thursday 7th March** 7.45pm at the Day Centre, when Helen Gibson will talk about *The Malt Industry in Hertfordshire*. All welcome.
