AUBREY BUXTON NATURE RESERVE THE MAN BEHIND THE NAME

Most local dog owners and walkers will know all about the delights of the beautiful 23-acre nature reserve off Alsa Street, but may not know anything about the man the reserve is named after. Aubrey Buxton - or Major Aubrey Leland Oakes Buxton, Baron Buxton of Alsa KCVO MC to give him his full title - was born on 15th July 1918 to an East Anglian family.



Educated at Ampleforth College in Yorkshire, he graduated from Trinity College Cambridge, served in the Royal Artillery in WWII and was decorated with the Military Cross. In 1946 he married Mary, daughter of Sir Henry Birkin, the 1930s motor racing hero. After the war, Aubrey Buxton farmed the Norman House estate in Stansted; in 1958 he became a founder director of Anglia Television. It was through his TV connections that the Stansted Carnival, once a popular annual village event, had the likes of Miss Anglia 1967 and Kenneth Horne, a famous celebrity back in the day, to lead the carnival procession and open proceedings. A leading naturalist, Aubrey was best known for creating Survival a nature documentary series that ran for four decades. He went on to become chief executive and later chairman of Anglia Television, served on numerous conservation bodies and was one of the co-founders of the World Wildlife Fund. He was Extra Equerry to Prince Philip in 1964, High Sheriff of Essex in 1972, and Deputy Lieutenant of Essex from 1975 to 1985. He was created a life peer in 1978 and appointed KCVO in 1996.

The Buxtons left Norman House and Stansted in 1976 having kindly donated the nature reserve, originally the pleasure park of the estate, to the Essex Wildlife Trust who still look after it. It is looking really good at this time of year so if you have never been, then visit now. You will be glad you did.

Further legal challenge against Airport Planning Approval

Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) has confirmed that it will commence legal proceedings challenging the decision by the Communities Secretary, James Brokenshire, not to intervene in the decision by Uttlesford District Council (UDC) to approve the expansion of Stansted Airport to 43 million pas-

sengers per annum ('mppa'). His reason was that "the application does not involve issues of more than local importance". SSE considers this conclusion to be factually incorrect. Stansted will soon overtake Manchester as the UK's third busiest airport. Meanwhile, Stansted has fewer local employees than 15 years ago despite the airport's growth. Over 84% of its employees are not Uttlesford residents. The noise, air pollution, health and road traffic impacts of Stansted are felt far beyond the borders of Uttlesford, and the 3.7 million equivalent tonnes of carbon dioxide attributable to Stansted Airport this year will have significant adverse impacts nationally and internationally.

SSE's legal proceedings will take the form of an application to the High Court for a Judicial Review (JR) of the decision of the Communities Secretary not to 'call in' the Stansted Airport planning application. SSE already has an outstanding JR application against the Transport Secretary, Chris Grayling, over his decision to allow the airport planning application to be determined locally by UDC. This case was originally scheduled for a two-day High Court hearing in February but has been 'stayed' by the Judge to await the decision of the Communities Secretary, referred to above. SSE solicitors have written to UDC pointing out that it would be inappropriate for UDC to issue any decision in relation to the airport planning application whilst these legal challenges are pending. SSE Chairman Peter Sanders commented: "High Court proceedings are not cheap and so we do not take such actions lightly but only after careful thought and professional advice. SSE's primary objective is to safeguard the community and environment from unfettered and unsustainable airport expansion."

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Fields across the Hundred Parishes are turning yellow as the oil-seed rape flowers; farmers will be hoping for a bountiful harvest. Fortunately for them, research by the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology found a positive but unexpected increase in key bee species responsible for pollinating flowering crops such as this. Between 1980 and 2013, the scientists had measured the presence of 353 wild bee and hoverfly species across the country. Overall, they noted that one-third of species had declined, one tenth increased, while evidence for the status of other species was inconclusive. Pollinating insects are vital for adequate seed production in crop plants as well as other species including rarer native plants which often support more specialist insects.

The UK hosts about 20,000 species of insects, many of which get eaten by other creatures. We enjoy seeing brightly coloured butterflies or dragonflies, but species like skylarks, swifts, blue tits, hedgehogs, shrews, bats and many fish require a cornucopia of moths, flies and beetles in order to survive. Assorted flies, beetles and wasps are also predators or decomposers helping to control pests and recycle dead material. The statistics in the 2016 State of Nature Report show an alarming decline in the abundance of many insect species. The causes of this decline are complex, but intensification of farming, loss of wildflower meadows, hedgerow removal and changes in climate play a part. Widespread use of herbicides and pesticides is also implicated. Herbicides have reduced the variety of wildflowers; with limited foraging opportunities many insects have become scarce or extinct. The impact of pesticides on all insect populations has far reaching consequences and is now subject to intense scrutiny to find answers. Planting suitable flowers in our own gardens benefits insects and other forms of wildlife, especially if we garden organically.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

UPDATE ON THE REQUEST FOR A DISPENSING PHARMACY IN THE LOWER STREET AREA

Just to remind all readers what has happened, what we have been doing and what comes next. In 2018 we wrote and sent a number of detailed reports to Essex Health and Wellbeing Board and Essex Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment Team (PNA). The PNA refused our request for a dispensing pharmacy in the Lower Street area, stating it was satisfied that there are adequate dispensing services in the area, and choices within a 20 minute drive. In January 2019 our team comprising Maureen Caton, Ruth Clifford (from the Parish Council), myself and our advisor, wrote to the Essex Primary Care, Pharmacy and Clinical Governance Lead, to once again highlight important key issues. We received a reply from the Essex County Council Director of Wellbeing, Public Health and Communities (Dr Mike Gogarty), again refusing to reconsider our need!

After very careful re-examination of our pharmaceutical needs we wrote to our MP, Kemi Badenoch, detailing the issues and asking for her help. Kemi wrote to Dr Gogarty supporting our need, and requesting a meeting in Stansted with our team and members of the community. The following dates have been suggested for the meeting: Tuesday 14th or 21st May; Thursday 16th or 23rd May. This will be the first time we have had the opportunity to explain our issues. We have proposed that the meeting starts with a 'walkabout' at around 6.00pm followed by an open meeting at 7.30pm. The venue has yet to be decided but it will be in the centre of the village. BRAIN TRAINING - CHEWING FOOD

Did you know that the process of eating helps to stimulate the brain stem? Here are five benefits of chewing your food well:

- Smelling, tasting and chewing food primes the digestive process, signalling the release of the various digestive enzymes. If prone to 'musical' outlets after eating, slow it all down and enjoy the process more. Enzymes increase digestive power and decrease flatulence
- The smaller the particles of food, the more chance we have of extracting the nutrients. Our digestive system should break food down to enter the body at a molecular level. Give it help by lightening its load
- Savouring our food makes it much more satisfying, leading to the need to eat less, which may be a good thing. Mindless wolfing decreases appreciation, which can stimulate cravings

- Really chewing food relaxes us. This also aids digestion.
 Put simply, there are two parts to the nervous system:
 the fight or flight (sympathetics) and the rest and digest
 (parasympathetics). To digest food well, we need to be
 in rest and digest mode. Chewing food activates the
 parasympathetics, diverting blood from the limbs and
 into the guts
- Lastly, and much less well known, is that the act of eating is a big stimulation of the brain stem, particularly the parasympathetic sections. Pretty much all parts are stimulated when we eat: smell, sight, sound, saliva, the muscles of the face, jaw, tongue and swallowing. And the more we chew and savour our food, the bigger the result. A healthy brain is utterly dependent upon a healthy brain stem.

If you are an inveterate wolfer start small. Each meal, slowly increase the number of chews per mouthful to 15, and then on to 30. Good luck!

They then divided into smaller groups for individual hands-on practice using manikins.



If someone has a cardiac arrest and stops breathing, chest compressions (and rescue breaths, if you can) may keep them alive until a defibrillator and professional help arrives. The participants felt it had been an interesting and useful evening. They were encouraged to tell others at home what they had learned because the more people who are willing to have a go, the better chance a casualty has of survival.



AIR POLLUTION AND TRAFFIC PROBLEMS ON GROVE HILL

The air pollution has been measured on Grove Hill by Uttlesford District Council; the average level between March and October 2018 was found to be **47.43 micro grams** per cubic metre of air. This exceeds the World Health Organisation limit of **40 micro grams/m³**. [*This information is provisional and has yet to be calibrated.*] Air pollution is a real hazard for people's health. Any increase in the number of vehicles using Grove Hill will exacerbate the pollution levels and health hazard.

There are currently two further planning applications in Elsenham, reference UTT/19/0462/FUL and UTT/19/0437/OP. The first is for 130 and the second for 44 dwellings. If approved, they will increase traffic by approximately 1.5 vehicles per household, many of which will travel along Grove Hill into Lower Street. You can object to these applications by emailing planning@uttlesford.gov.uk; include the UTT references above and state that you object to the development. The building of these homes will significantly increase the numbers of large lorries in excess of 7.5 tonnes which regularly travel up and down Grove Hill, many in breach of the weight restriction. This is ignored by 99% of HGV drivers, and the authorities to date have done nothing!



One of these oversized vehicles crashed into our house, which is why Grove Hill was closed in April while repairs were carried out. The coppicing season has come to an end at Birchanger Wood. Volunteers have laboured hard over the winter to cut back trees to allow light onto the woodland floor, boosting the flora and helping to support biodiversity. In line with a management plan devised by conservation experts and overseen by our warden Pat Forrest, Birchanger Wood Trust is pursuing this time-honoured method of woodland management with sales of firewood from coppicing helping to sustain our work. We look forward to another summer watching our woodland benefit from continued management and developing a legacy for future generations.

It is early summer and the grassland of Hatfield Forest is carpeted with gold, as our spectacular display of buttercups comes into bloom. At the last count there were an estimated 300 million flowers! Roaming among the buttercups, you will see our herds of Red Poll cattle. Red Poll are known for their gentle nature, and are well suited to grazing historic wood pasture like ours. This year we have around 200 cattle on the main plain and Takeley Hill, including this year's calves. Cattle are a crucial part of conservation work at Hatfield Forest. Their grazing prevents areas growing into young woodland, keeping a balance of habitats. Now that the cattle have returned it is particularly important to consider them when walking your dog. We want visitors to enjoy themselves but when you are near the cattle, please keep your dog on a lead. Walk around them in a wide circle, rather than through the herd, which could separate mothers from their calves.



May is a perfect time for families to enjoy the natural world together. During our *Magical Woodland Elves and Fairies* events, enter a secret world to explore the forest, looking for hidden fairy doors. For those wanting to discover the wider forest, our geocaches are now ready to be found by adventurous treasure hunters; scavenger hunt sheets are available from the kiosk and hub, to help you identify our birds, butterflies, plants and fungi. 

Some of us will remember the magical visual transformation of H E Bates' 1958 novella *The Darling Buds of May* to the TV series starring David Jason as 'Pop' Larkin, 1991-1993. Bates' title was taken from Shakespeare's Sonnet 18, "Shall I compare thee to a Summers Day" and I was particularly awestruck by the visual manifestation of the blossom-laden trees and the Queen Anne lace hedgerows in the verdant portrayal of the Kent countryside in the TV shows.

I think Bates used the pregnant landscape and the 'Happy go lucky' carefree characters to represent the rebirth of a new happiness and hope in a country diminished by the bleak austerity of war and rationing. NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

THE MOUNTFITCHET EXCHANGE

At the time of writing (early April) there is a huge feeling of frustration that we are not able to give residents a date when the building will be operational.

The outstanding issue we have is that we are waiting for Openreach to install the fibre optic cables for the internet connection in The Exchange. We cannot accept handover of the building until this is complete. Unfortunately, the site was not registered by our contractors with BT at the appropriate time to schedule the work in line with the project completion. We are obviously addressing the issue with contractors.

As soon as we have a date from Openreach, the Library Service will install their computers and set up the rest of their operation and we can at long last open the building.



The picture above shows the area where the library will operate from. There will be a Parish Council officer behind the reception desk to deal with any issues residents have.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

What is the vision for the Neighbourhood Plan?

The Stansted Mountfitchet Neighbourhood Plan is being compiled by local residents and the Parish Council. It establishes a vision for the evolution and long-term sustainability of Stansted Mountfitchet Parish and village. The plan sets out a vision for the future of the parish and planning policies, which will be used to determine planning applications locally.

The Vision for Stansted Mountfitchet Parish described in the Neighbourhood Plan is as follows:

To conserve the strong historic character and rural setting of the Parish by ensuring that development is sustainable, protects valued landscape features, maintains and enhances Stansted Mountfitchet village, strengthens a sense of community, and enhances the well-being and quality of life of existing and future residents. To ensure that the Parish remains a healthy environment, friendly and a great place to live.

What are we trying to achieve?

We have identified various Key Issues for the future of the Parish which include:

- the development of the London Stansted Cambridge Corridor (LSCC)
- development at Stansted Airport
- congestion in and around the local road network
- strategic rail improvements
- strategic growth proposals in the emerging Uttlesford Local Plan
- flood prevention measures
- management of footpaths within the Parish
- the need for more community facilities and public open space.

Our draft Neighbourhood Plan aims to address these Key Issues, whilst recognising that some of them are national/regional infrastructure issues which are sometimes beyond the influence of our Neighbourhood Plan. We have, however, included them because our proximity to Stansted Airport, and the LSCC, will doubtless have implications for our vision for the parish and its development.

Where are we up to now?

We are close to finalising a draft Neighbourhood Plan, which will then go out to public consultation within the parish.

What will happen next?

We hope to complete the draft Neighbourhood Plan, hold the first public consultation during the next few months, and then submit the Neighbourhood Plan to Uttlesford District Council later this year.

There will then be a further round of public consultation before the Plan is submitted to the Independent Examiner and we hope that the final referendum on the Plan will take place in 2020.

- Referendum. If more than 50% of residents support the plan, it is adopted and published. If less than 50% of residents support the plan it can be reviewed and any changes made then go back to the consultation stage.

ALLOTMENTS

Many thanks to the Whelby Dental Practice who supported us during Healthy Body, Happy Me week. This year it focused on oral health. Did you know that 25% of children have experienced tooth decay before the age of five? Over the period of three mornings, groups of children visited the dental practice where Anna the hygienist plus a dental nurse showed them how to brush and look after their teeth correctly. Everyone was given the opportunity to sit in the dentist's chair, go up and down and practise opening their mouths wide to show their teeth. MAGNA CARTA PRIMARY

Developing kind and respectful young people is top of the agenda at a primary school. Magna Carta Primary Academy marked Stephen Lawrence Day on 22nd April with a range of activities to highlight racism and bullying. The day also saw the school's first anti-bullying ambassadors appointed in Year 2; a tradition which will continue every year on the same day. The work is all part of the school's ongoing mission to stamp out discrimination in all forms and to ensure young people grow up appreciating and celebrating their differences. Headteacher Marios Solomonides said: "It is all very well teaching English, maths, science and history, but if you are not a kind and respectful person, it means nothing. Without this work, everything else is meaningless. Our school rules are to be safe, be kind and work hard. They are in order and 'work hard' comes last as we have to be safe and we have to be kind; they are the most important traits we can teach children. Stephen Lawrence was a similar age to me and I remember being really shocked at his murder. Now, it is not quite as shocking when we hear of another murder and that is the sad reality of life. We have got a duty to show our children that enough is enough with regards to young people being killed and that message has to start with respect."



The school is also working with its diverse families to share lessons in Argentinian, Italian and Spanish cooking, flamenco dancing and the Jewish and Polish cultures. The Headteacher said: "This is all a part of the same thing. It is about showing our children that we embrace and celebrate each other's differences and similarities."

Nature Notes

A sinister visitor to Stansted

On a walk along the River Stort in Stansted (opposite the sewage works in Lime Kiln Lane) a couple of years ago, I noticed a bird perched on top of a hawthorn bush that looked at first like a small magpie. I stopped and watched and listened to it for a while, thinking something wasn't quite right. With a bit of patience, I managed to get a little closer to watch this bird that looked, sounded and acted like a magpie, but clearly was not a magpie. Referring to my bird guides a little later, I realised that I had seen a Great Grey Shrike. They are 22–26cm in length with a stocky body and a long tail; they are rare winter visitors with only 20-30 birds gracing our shores each year.



The first part of its Latin name, Lanius meaning 'butcher' could not be more apt, because, after chasing down a small bird or dropping on voles, lizards, or even a stoat, the shrike beats its victim to death with its inch-long beak. Shrikes can lure their prey by mimicking their calls and then pouncing like a sparrowhawk. However, the shrike's feet are too weak to hold its food while it is being ripped apart, so it finds a secure anchorage, such as a blackthorn or a handy barbedwire fence, to assist with the dismembering process. Surplus food may also be impaled for storage. These 'larders' are typically around a metre above ground and can be found anywhere within the bird's territory. So, if you are out for a walk and you see impaled robins, voles and even fish on barbed wire or hanging in a hawthorn bush, keep an eye out for this very rare bird.

The Royal Gunpowder Mills

Richard Thomas delivered a presentation on the *Gunpowder Mills* at Waltham Abbey, to a well-attended meeting. He spoke about the science and source of gunpowder going back to at least 300 AD China, and the first written record in England in 1044. He informed us of the dangerous manufacturing process; it was first used at the battle of Crecy 1346. Gunpowder developed over the centuries with the introduction of nitro glycerine, guncotton and cordite. The Government acquired the site in 1774 and it became the Royal Gunpowder Mills with up to 4000 staff, half of them women.



The Mills has a long and fascinating history. It played an essential part in military history, national defence and in the development of civil industries such as mining and quarrying. It is a story of a family-run business, which prospered and grew to become Crown property and a major local employer of workers in the Lea Valley and beyond, where people risked their lives to earn a crust. The Mills is designated a Scheduled Monument, the highest protection that can be given to a historic site. Its landscape is shaped by 300 years of making explosives and propellants. Sealed off from the outside world, it features many listed buildings, waterways and dry canals, and an alder tree plantation which supplied the wood to make charcoal, one of the three ingredients of gunpowder. The alder plantation is now part of a nature reserve - a site of special scientific interest which attracts a diverse range of animals and plants. If you would like to visit, tickets may be purchased on the day. Check their website for prices and opening hours.

WINES FOR SPRING

It has taken a while for spring to arrive, but now with us in May, we can consider fresher wines to suit sunnier days and lighter meals ahead. Love it or hate it, Sauvignon Blanc has a great fresh taste to go perfectly with new season asparagus. Its zingy crisp taste makes it a great wine for spring. One that did well in the 2018 Air New Zealand Wine Awards was the Brancott Estate *Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc*

2018, widely available at most supermarkets from £8.00 to £9.70; it is intensely fruity with lovely tropical flavours. Also search out the 2018 *Blind River Awatere Valley SB* from Majestic, £9.99 as part of a mixed case. A little oak ageing gives this more complexity but still with intense flavours and tropical aromas. Keep an eye out for a couple of cracking good value rosé wines from Aldi. *Cotes de Thau, Cap L'Agde* 2018 at £4.99 (half the price of a Provence rosé) is fresh tasting with nectarine aromas; the 2018 Exquisite Collection *Touraine Rosé* from the Loire at £5.99 is wonderfully juicy with hints of raspberry.

The Cabernet Franc grape is also from the Loire and it produces some lighter reds from Chinon, Bourgeuil and Saumur (Champigny). If you have not tried one before then the Les Nivieres 2016 Saumur from Waitrose is a good place to start with some good berry fruit and enough acidity and tannin to pair with food. At 12.5% it is not super heavyweight so all the better for spring and summer drinking. Young Pinot Noir reds from Marlborough in New Zealand, Chile or California are also good at this time of year. A great example is the Villa Maria Cellar Selection Pinot Noir 2016 from Waitrose at £15.99; not cheap but has good aromas of cherries, juicy red fruits on the palate and smooth tannins. Lovely easy drinking!





GARDENS AND CATS

One of my favourite Just So stories was *The Cat That Walked by Himself.* As a child I loved the fact that although Woman outwitted several of the animals, Cat outsmarted her. Maybe I identified with the rebellious streak or the fact that Cat couldn't be tamed. The longer quote in the story is: "I am the cat that walks by himself and all places are alike to me." I was reminded of this the other day, standing opposite a rather irate lady in the consulting room who had just uttered the classic line, "Well, what are you going to do about it?" The 'it' in question was her lovingly tended vegetable patch used by the neighbourhood cats as their toilet. Cats are clean animals but don't distinguish between their owner's or neighbour's property; they just 'go' where conditions seem ideal and to a cat, digging over the vegetable patch or flowerbeds means "I've just finished cleaning the bathroom, you can use it now."

Well, what can you do about it? Frustratingly little, as all the advertised solutions are ineffective; whether it's fake animals with glowing eyes, or spraying ammonia, mothballs or lion poo around your garden, cats stroll past them with haughty disdain. Physical barriers are best: cover your vegetable beds with netting, so the cat cannot reach the soil; grow ground cover plants in your flower borders with some prickly shrubs like Berberis, or get a dog! Of course, one of the most obvious things, often overlooked, is don't encourage cats into your garden in the first place. If you think it's sweet to feed your neighbour's cat, don't be surprised if the cat starts spending more time in your house or garden; you have basically told it "Pull up a chair, I'll put the kettle on. The toilet? Yes, it's that third flowerbed on the left." Happy gardening!

HELP TO CLAIM UNIVERSAL CREDIT

Uttlesford Citizens Advice has launched a new service called 'Help to Claim' for those who need help to apply for Universal Credit, the new benefit which combines six benefits into one, including Jobseekers Allowance and Working Tax Credits. People will be able to get support from the charity as they submit their Universal Credit application until they get their first full payment. Help will be tailored to indi-

viduals and is available face-to-face in Saffron Walden and Great Dunmow (call 01799 618840 for an appointment), by calling a national helpline number, 0800 144 8 444, and online, through webchat and advice content at www.citizensadvice.org.uk.

Kate Robson, Chief Officer of Uttlesford Citizens Advice, said: "We know that many people really struggle to complete the application for Universal Credit, especially if they do not have easy access to a computer. Our new 'Help to Claim' service will support people locally, whether they simply need help to get online using our public access computers, verify their identity or gather the right evidence; our aim is to make sure their applications are processed and they get the benefit as quickly as possible. If you are already claiming JSA, ESA or Working Tax Credits there is no need to apply for Universal Credit until asked to do so by DWP (Department of Work and Pensions). For the majority of people, it is better to stay on existing benefits, where possible. If you are unsure, speak to one of our trained advisers. If you are worried about having enough money to live on while waiting for your first Universal Credit payment, we can also help with applications for advance payments, check your entitlement to other benefits and offer budgeting and debt advice, if needed."

Teenagers have been warned of the dangers of being recruited by drug-dealing gangs

Year 10 and 11 students and teachers worked with theatre company *Alter-Ego* to learn about the reality of *County Lines*. The trend sees gangs deliberately targeting vulnerable young people and coercing them into dealing or running drugs for them. They exploit children and young people into selling drugs, often using dedicated mobile phone 'lines' to supply drugs to others from across different counties. Gang members groom young people into doing this work by threatening and tricking them into trafficking for them. A



45-minute production on the topic highlighted the hidden dangers of *County Lines* and gave students the opportunity to ask questions. Teachers were told the signs to look out for in a young person caught up in *County Lines*, including being secretive about who they are talking to or where they are going; unexplained absence from school; unexplained additional possessions; disruptive or aggressive behaviour and using sexual, drug or violence-related language.

Erin O'Dell, assistant head, personal development, behaviour and welfare, said: "The production focused on highlighting the concerns of this prevalent topic. It hopes to educate students, so they are aware of the possible dangers of such involvement and be mindful of the topic in order to protect themselves if approached."
