Most of you will have seen that the scaffolding is finally up! Whilst it is only the first part of the project, we can rest a little easier knowing that the tower will not end up across Lower Street. The committee are in negotiations to borrow the relevant funds but are still looking for any donations, or sponsorship from local companies. The cost of the scaffolding was around £12,000 and the repair bill for the tower will be upwards of £85,000 so we still have a long way to go!

We have explored a number of avenues to obtain funding but are in an awkward position. The building is not listed so we have not been able to apply for any relevant grants. An application to the Heritage Lottery Fund was also withdrawn as we are not a limited company, community interest company or similar, so we did not meet their criteria. This is something that we will explore moving forward and we may look to change to a more recognised structure.

The financial future of the social club is looking a lot more secure than in recent years, and we are on target to make a healthy profit. Unfortunately, most of the profit will have been used to repay historic unpaid debts so this will not help with the tower repairs. We are very aware that once the repairs are complete, we will need a programme of regular inspections and maintenance in place to ensure that the building does not fall into a state of disrepair in the future.

So, if you are able to help, please dig deep and let us keep the social club standing for future generations.

Despite all the building work we still have our usual excellent weekend entertainment:

Saturday 5th October *Trojan Horses*, Saturday 12th October *Jack*, Saturday 26th October *Gladragz*, and Sunday 27th October *Karaoke*. Come and join us!

MAGNA CARTA PRIMARY OFSTED REPORT

Inspectors visited Magna Carta Primary Academy in July and gave a grade of Outstanding to areas of:

- Effectiveness of leadership and management
- Personal development, behaviour and welfare
- Early years provision

The school welcomed its first pupils in 2016 and moved into a brand-new building in September 2018 with pupils in Reception, Year 1 and 2. After its first Ofsted inspection, the school was highly praised in the report.

Inspectors said: "Children get off to a flying start in the early years. The quality of teaching and learning is excellent. Year on year, children make exceptional progress from their starting points. They are extremely well prepared for Year 1. Pupils behave exceedingly well. They work hard and interact with each other and adults in a highly positive manner. There is a palpable harmony around the school. Leaders' support for pupils to take care of themselves and to be kind to others is a strength of the school. Pupils' kindness and respect for others stands out. Leaders, including those responsible for governance, have very high aspirations for what pupils can achieve. They set demanding standards for staff and pupils and provide strong support for them in working towards these."



Headteacher Marios Solomonides said: "I am pleased the inspector saw that our pupils get off to a flying start. This is testament to the hard work of the entire school community, including pupils, parents, volunteers, as well as staff. This is truly a terrific place for children to come to school." The school scored good for quality of teaching, learning and assessment and outcomes for pupils. The overall Ofsted grading was good.

FOREST HALL SCHOOL GCSE RESULTS

Students and staff celebrated as the GCSE results were released. Eighty 80 percent of students achieved at least grade 4 (a pass) in English, compared to 74 percent last year. All students at the school achieved a strong pass in the separate sciences and 60 percent of students achieved the top grades of 8 and 9 in textiles. In maths, 57 percent of the cohort achieved the national standard of grade 4 or higher.

Kayleigh Trainor, assistant head responsible for achievement

and outcomes, said: "As a school, we are immensely proud of our students and what they have achieved in their GCSEs. They worked incredibly hard throughout Year 11, attending study clubs and Saturday schools; their exceptional attitude towards their learning has helped them to secure a wonderful set of results. I wish all of our students the very best of luck in



their post-16 journey." Success also went to students entered early for GCSE examinations in Years 9 and 10. Students complete up to two option GCSEs in these years.



Dr Leeman's Walk-in Dermatology Sessions

Fundraising

Following the successful fundraising campaign by our Patient Participation Group for the purchase of our new Ankle Brachial Pressure Index, we now want to raise funds for a new neonatal and paediatric Pulse Oximeter. The devices used in Primary Care are not as accurate as the ones used in hospitals, and a more accurate device will mean better care for our young patients. With the cough/cold/flu season around the corner, a new device will ensure our clinical team can offer the best clinical care. These devices are not cheap, and we are grateful to the Patient Participation Group for their help in fundraising for this.

Our annual Flu-a-thons will be held on **Saturday 5th and Saturday 19th October** 8.00am-noon. No need to book an appointment, just walk in. Remember that the flu jab does not just offer protection to you, but to vulnerable children and adults around you. Please consider carefully before declining the vaccination. STANSTED PHARMACY UPDATE

Update on a licensed dispensing pharmacy in Lower Street A number of actions and significant changes have occurred since I last wrote about this issue, and the campaign for a licensed dispensing pharmacy in the Lower Street area continues. Since March 2017, 500 residents have signed my petition supporting the need for a pharmacy to be close to the Surgery but retaining a pharmacy in Cambridge Road; however, our request has not yet been approved. Our Parish Council fully supports this campaign and chaired a public meeting to discuss it. Detailed supporting documents were sent to Essex County Council (ECC) Health and Wellbeing (H and W) team and our MP. We invited ECC to visit the area and meet residents at another public meeting; they have not yet agreed. Kemi Badenoch MP invited us to Parliament to meet ECC H and W representatives in June; she has tried hard to find a way forward. NHS England is trying to find ways of reducing the demands on GPs and spreading their work load. Primary Care Networking is being introduced. People with common conditions are being encouraged to visit their local pharmacist. The Climate Change issue is gaining momentum yet ECC Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment report states that if there is an alternative dispensing pharmacy within a 20 minutes' drive, then that gives you choice and satisfies their criteria. Pharmacies will be busier, giving GPs more time to treat patients with serious conditions; viz "No prescription required - referral to local pharmacy" at the surgery reception desk. The ECC H and W team should reconsider its decision that Stansted is adequately served. We will not allow this issue to go away. Please email your thinking to me.

This summer we took a break from our usual activities but managed to fit in a trip to the Houses of Parliament. Meeting us in Westminster Hall, MP Mark Prisk told us that this historic building, built in 1097 by William II, Rufus, son of William the Conqueror, is the oldest on the parliamentary estate. It is astonishing not just for its sheer size and its magnificent roof but also for the central role it has played in British history. Our guide conducted us through the main halls and chambers of the iconic Westminster Palace designed by Augustus Welby Pugin and completed in 1860. Before completion, Pugin sadly died in Bedlam, his insanity apparently brought on by the stress of work on the Palace.



We started in St Stephen's Hall which stands on the site of the Royal Chapel of St Stephen's, where the House of Commons sat until it was destroyed in the fire of 1834; then to the Central Lobby, a crossroads at the heart of the Palace, the spot where corridors from the Commons and the Lords meet. From there we entered the Commons Chamber with its green benches, where the great affairs of state are discussed by the 650 Members of Parliament. The Speaker's chair and the Dispatch Boxes dominate the area. Across the Central Lobby is the plush red world of the Lords, dominated by the Royal Throne, used when the Queen addresses the assembled Houses. Before leaving, our guide reminded us that this was the place where Guy Fawkes and King Charles I were found guilty of treason, and where, from half way up the staircase to St Stephen's Porch, Nelson Mandela, President Obama and our Queen have addressed both Houses of Parliament.

Uttlesford Community Travel (UCT) is a charity which provides transport options for the district's elderly, disabled and rurally isolated; recently the demand for its services has increased dramatically. The charity supplies cars and minibuses to take residents wherever they want to go, including to medical appointments. A fleet of six specially-adapted minibuses, all of which are wheelchair accessible, are used for its Book-A-Ride service. Drivers are fully trained and checked through the Disclosure and Barring Service.

Passengers pay a £10 annual joining fee; for their journeys it costs £3.40 for the first two miles and £1.02 for subsequent miles. Groups like clubs and schools can join Book-A-Ride for outings. Individual journeys can be taken only Monday to Friday, but buses for groups are available for evenings and weekends. Drivers can be supplied, or groups can use their own driver, who would need to be trained by us. The annual joining fee for a group is £20 and the price for journeys is then worked out on an individual basis per group.

UCT's Hospital Car Service helps people who have difficulty in getting to hospital appointments by finding drivers who live nearby, and who use their own car to take them. The drivers are all volunteers, so the passengers have to pay only the HMRC mileage rate of 45p per mile to get them there. Funding is crucial to enable these services to operate; we rely on financial support from Essex County Council, Uttlesford District Council, the NHS West Essex Clinical Commissioning Group and Saffron Walden Town Council.

UCT is looking for more volunteers to help meet the growing demand for its services; we need hospital car drivers to transport members to medical appointments and minibus drivers to help out with the Book-A-Ride service. No previous experience is required as full training will be given.






THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

Jesus once said to the crowds: "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand." He knew what he was talking about. His own land was deeply divided by politics and religion. About a generation after his death and resurrection, his land exploded in violent revolution against the occupying Roman army. The failure of that revolution was more because of the arguing of the different factions within it than the power of its opponents.

We are living in a divided land too. The referendum of 2016 has left our land more deeply divided than it has been for many years. Whatever happens to our relationship with the European Union we will have a difficult task to rebuild our national unity. Modern forms of communication make it easy for us to only listen to people who agree with us. Argument has become more about shouting down anyone who disagrees with us rather than refuting carefully made arguments. When people care deeply about something but have different opinions, conflict is inevitable. Conflict is not a failure but simply a fact of life; however, conflict can be handled badly or well. We are not handling it very well in our country at the moment but we can do better. Perhaps the most important thing is to separate the person from the issue. We need to respect one another and listen to each other. If we do so we will find, in our common humanity, more to unite us than divide us.

Farewell to Shalom!

Thirty five years ago, Rev'd Harold Fisher (then Stansted Methodist Church minister) organised a course entitled The Fully Alive Experience. A large number of people from all the Stansted churches attended, and afterwards, many wanted to continue meeting on a regular basis. Thus in 1985 Shalom was born! We met every two weeks in people's homes; a termly programme was devised, with a mixture of homegrown and outside speakers and church ministers, Bible study, and prayer and praise. We became prayer partners with the Corrymeela Community in Northern Ireland, a centre for reconciliation during the troubles raging at that time. A small group from Shalom visited there in 1990 and returned with their Prayer for Unity in Christ which we have said together at the end of every Shalom meeting since then.

In conjunction with Churches Together in Stansted, church twinning was set up with Chevetogne in Belgium, and regular visits were made. Rev'd Tony Bundock, then St John's curate, helped to forge links with the Church of the Cherubim and Seraphim in Birmingham. The annual residential retreat was always eagerly awaited; venues included Pleshey, Hengrave Hall and Hemingford Grey, and each denomination took turns to invite a leader of their choice. The retreats were a great way to get to know others in a spiritual way, denominational differences put aside.



Many of the original group have moved away or died and a few have joined. The remaining members, shown above at our final meeting, are retired and have many other church and non-church pulls on their time, so we have reluctantly decided to cease meeting. We see each other regularly and the fellowship we have built up over the years will continue.

At the start of every Shalom meeting we have always said the following prayer written by Harold Fisher:

Father, in Shalom is fullness of life, Our healing and wholeness Give us your peace, that we may be at peace: With ourselves, with each other, with the world around us, and with you. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



A DAY OUT - STANSTEAD, SUFFOLK



About an hour's drive away lies the pretty village of Stanstead. Despite being much smaller than Stansted (and having the extra 'a' in its name) our Suffolk namesake is similar in many ways. Houses line both sides of the long main road called Lower Street and a lane leading off this road winds uphill (not quite as steeply as Chapel Hill) past open fields and the Village Community Centre to Stanstead Hall, the church, village green and Upper Street.


The purpose-built Community Centre also houses the Social Club, which was advertising a village BBQ on the following Saturday. Behind the centre is a small but well equipped children's play area with something suitable for all age groups. Unfortunately the high hedges, gates and CCTV cameras prevented me from getting a close-up view of Stanstead Hall but from what I could see it looked a very grand building similar to Hargrave House, with Dutch style gables and ornate chimneys. St James' Church is a very attractive building and like St Mary's in Stansted, just a stone's throw away from the Hall. On the tiny village green stands the painted wooden Village Sign mounted on a brick and flint plinth; somewhat weather beaten and faded but quite striking.

Wandering around Stanstead I came across roads such as Windmill Close and Windmill Place so assume there used to be a windmill there once but could find no other evidence of its existence. I didn't come across any shops, pubs or other amenities, apart from the Community Centre, a mobile library parked by the village green and a bus stop or two. There's no railway station or airport, but it's quiet and peaceful, lots of colourful cottage gardens (a plethora of beautiful hollyhocks) and a lovely rural feel to the place (much like Stansted used to be centuries ago, before the arrival of the railway and airport perhaps?) Stopping at nearby Long Melford for lunch made it a very pleasant and relaxing day out.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN CONSULTATION

The Stansted Mountfitchet Neighbourhood Development Plan is reaching the point of consultation with the local community to get your views on the various themes and objectives we have developed within the Plan.

These themes are:

- Housing, Development and Design
- Community Facilities, Health and Wellbeing
- Natural Environment, Green Infrastructure and Landscape Character
- Transport
- Flood Management
- Historic Environment
- Local Economy

We intend the public consultation to take place over six weeks from 1 November until 13 December with the hope that we can by then use the new Mountfitchet Exchange as the main consultation venue. Consultation events will include exhibition displays, opportunities to ask members of the Neighbourhood Plan team about the Plan and opportunities for the local community to comment on the Plan.

We will provide further details about specific consultation events taking place in November and December in the November issue of The Link, but for now we just want to highlight the proposed dates for the consultation and the themes we have been working on. We are also keen to promote engagement with the Plan consultation through a photo competition, which is described below.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN PHOTO COMPETITION

We would like to let you know about a photographic competition the Neighbourhood Development Plan Strategy Group is holding. We are looking for photos of "My favourite view/scene in Stansted" – it can be anything from a landscape view to a picture of a building, a piece of play equipment etc

Entries should be emailed to us at parishcouncil@stansted.net to arrive no later than 13th December. The winning photo will appear somewhere in the Neighbourhood Development Plan document. Together with the photo we need the photographer's name, age, and a short sentence telling us what the photo is of and where it is (if it is not obvious).

POLICE MATTERS

Our photo shows PC Steve Sharma being briefed about issues by Parish Clerk, Ruth Clifford. PC Sharma has been given responsibility for Stansted, so we hope to see a police presence around the village on a more regular basis.



The PCSO whom the Parish Council are part-funding should just about have finished her initial training by the time you read this, so hopefully we will be seeing her around the village in the near future.

PARKING MATTERS

Parking is always near the top of the list of things residents get frustrated about. Residents in Meadowcroft reported airport parkers on the airport hotline on a regular basis and, as a result, the airport have put signage in place to discourage anybody thinking of parking up and heading for the airport!

Stansted Airport Limited operates a Freephone number for reporting suspected on-street airport-related car parking. The number is: 0800 731 2385. If you feel your road would benefit from similar signage you need to be prepared to report every incident of fly parking to the hotline and be very persistent.

Meadowcroft still has problems with commuters parking to avoid charges near the station. They argue that if you wouldn't want somebody parking outside your house for twelve hour stretches on a regular basis, then you shouldn't inflict it on somebody else, which doesn't seem unreasonable.



BOUNDARY HEDGE IN COOPER'S ALLEY – BENTFIELD GARDENS OPEN SPACE

Many of you will have noticed that a section of the hawthorn hedge on the northern boundary of the open space has been removed. This was not a decision that the Council took lightly, but we were informed that the roots of the hedge were in very close proximity to a house in Cawkell Close. The discovery was made during groundworks for an extension, but we were advised by a Building Inspector at Uttlesford District Council that, if left in situ, the hedge would cause severe damage to the existing house, particularly if we had another dry summer. Discussions will be held with the property owner in the Spring to agree replacement planting of an appropriate nature to soften the impact of the brick wall.

The Parish Council does not like removing hedges or trees, but in this instance we were left with very little choice. This will not set a precedent for the future, and we will not give permission for removal of any of our trees or hedges because they are a nuisance to property owners, or drop leaves or branches into their gardens!

TWINNING NEWS

The Twinning Association is working with our U3A group to explore ways that they could link with residents in a similar age group in Rungis. Rungis does not have an organisation that is directly comparable with the U3A (which makes it a little more challenging to find links) but there are possibilities that could be explored to establish a relationship that could lead to exchange visits involving a range of cultural activities.

Look out for details of future social and fundraising events. A wine tasting evening and quiz are being planned for the Autumn and Winter 2019.

Hosting

Official visits between Stansted and Rungis are every two years, i.e. we go one year and they come the following year. However, unofficial visits can be made at any time and hosts will be found at either end whenever anyone wants to exchange! Both towns have a database of hosts that can be called upon.

Please consider adding your name to our list of hosts and/or acting as an escort. Contact the Parish Council office for more details.

SKATEPARK JAM

Sean Thompson writes

The fifth annual Stansted Skatepark Jam was a resounding success. The weather held out and the wind was minimal. We had around 75 people ride/skate throughout the day with at least 100 spectators also attending. We had an amazing age range of participants from children under 10 right up to men in their 40s. Some people travelled from as far as Kent and Northamptonshire to take part.



Everyone taking part had a massive smile on their faces, and the evening after the Jam I received numerous messages from participants and parents telling me how much fun they had, how they were already looking forward to next year's event and thanking everyone involved for putting it on.

I would like to say a big thank you to the brands that helped us out by donating prizes for participants; but the biggest thanks go to local businesses Yeoman's Cafe and Mix Wine Bar who once again made a generous contribution to help cover our running costs and allow the event to take place. Without their generosity and support, the event would be almost impossible to run to the standard we set ourselves.

FORESTHALL OPEN SPACES

There are a number of enclosed seating areas on the estate where the wooden fencing is in a poor state of repair. As the fencing seems to serve no useful purpose, the Parish Council propose that, rather than spend money repairing them, the fences will be removed. This will make grass cutting easier and improve the general appearance of the area. If you have any objections to this proposal please contact the Parish Council.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllrs Dean and Khan Report:

Local government continues to undergo significant change. Local Authorities will need to change the way in which they operate. This change not only requires new ways of working, but also new ways of thinking. The Residents for Uttlesford (R4U) administration agreed to review the effectiveness of the Cabinet system and whether it should be changed. A working group has been set up on a cross-party basis. Cllr Geoffrey Sell and Cllr Khan are members. At the last Council meeting, Members declared a climate and ecological emergency, committing to meet net zero carbon status by 2030. A robust action plan will be drawn up, working alongside the community. The decision by Essex County Council to change the way it operates and manages libraries was condemned by Uttlesford. In our opinion, Essex's proposals are a fantasy.

In July, the Uttlesford Local Plan Examination in Public was carried out by two Planning Inspectors who are appointed by the Secretary of State. An interim report from the Inspectors is expected to be received in mid-October. There has been no indication to date that the Plan will be found to have serious flaws, but their opinion will become clearer this month.

After much delay and debate, agreement has been reached to complete the permissive path network around Stansted Park. This is a planning obligation tied to the development at Elms Farm, Church Road. The missing element is a new footbridge across Stansted Brook to connect the parkland with the existing right of way alongside the railway about 1km east of Church Road. Once finished, the new footpaths, which Cllr Melvin Caton and I have checked out, will be a wonderful community amenity for walkers, providing splendid views. We continue to pursue about 15 outstanding planning actions, including hedge damage in Pennington Lane, a pedestrian crossing in Lower Street, the future of vacant land at Walson Way and replacement dwellings for Fuller's Almshouses.

Councillors are able to make grants each year to local good causes. In the last financial year, our allocation went to Music@Stansted for a youth event, Stansted Surgery for ankle machinery (also by our colleagues), Stansted Foodbank for supplies, Aubrey Buxton Wildlife Reserve for trees, Stansted Mountfitchet Social Club for tower repairs, Uttlesford Community Transport for journeys, a contribution to Stansted Parish Council for the long-awaited PCSO and finally a bench for residents at Cannons Mead. So far this year, our allowance has funded a coffee machine for the Day Centre.

STANSTED EVENING WI

In August we welcomed ex-policeman, Martyn Lockwood, who explained how easy it was to kill off great numbers of your family by poisoning them with arsenic! Martyn served in Harlow for many years and then as an emergency training officer. He is a founder member of the Police Museum in Chelmsford and is now a trustee. His research into old murder cases uncovered the grisly details of women poisoning their husbands and children to obtain insurance money.

Arsenic was considered the 'coward's weapon' because it imitates the effect of natural disease and is hard to detect. It has no smell or taste and is soluble. It resembles sugar, so a nice spoonful of arsenic can be put in your tea. In 1858, 20 children died and 200 were ill when, as a result of taxing sugar, a local manufacturer used a mix of sugar and plaster of Paris as a substitute. Unfortunately, the latter contained arsenic. He was charged with manslaughter but acquitted.

One of the most notorious cases concerned Sarah Chesham, the 'Clavering Poisoner'. She was pregnant when she married at 19 and had five more children. When two sons died it was diagnosed as cholera; but suspicion grew when 18 months later another son died. Sarah was the last person to be hanged for attempted murder in 1851 and over 7,000 people went to Chelmsford to witness it. Mozart, Napoleon and Jane Austen could possibly have all died through some form of arsenic poisoning, especially as it was used in the dyeing of fabrics and wallpapers.

Our next meeting is on **Thursday 10th October** at 7.30pm in the Day Centre. We are having a talk by the Essex Air Ambulance; visitors who would like to come and hear about their work are very welcome.

The hare is one of the UK's most iconic species. An inhabitant since ancient times, it is a creature that has long fascinated and delighted all those lucky enough to see it. Today the hare is under serious threat. Numbers have declined by 80% since the late 19th century and it is seldom seen in many parts of the country. Shockingly, although given priority status under the UK Biodiversity Plan, the hare is the only game species in England, Wales and most parts of Europe not protected by a closed hunting season. Consequently, hares can be shot throughout the year, including during the breeding season, leaving young hares (leverets) to starve in the fields. This is an unacceptable affront to modern animal welfare standards. Entry: £3 members, £5 visitors.

WHICH ONE IS YOURS?

Firework Season

Shaking jellyfish, whirling dervish, quivering wreck? Help is at hand for whatever your pet turns into. We have tried some anti-anxiety products at the surgery; here is a quick quide:

- Nutracalm A fast acting anti-anxiety product. Contains L-Tryptophan, a precursor to serotonin and Passiflora, a calming herb
- Zylkene Contains an amino acid that promotes relaxation. Best started several days in advance
- Adaptil and Feliway, pheromones which cats and dogs release when they are happy and relaxed
- Pet Remedy, a herbal product containing valerian; we are really impressed with this. It comes in a plugin diffuser, a spray for your pet's bed or collar, or wipes that you can wipe on its fur.

It is also important to consider your pet's environment. You could build a den, a safe place with which your pet has positive associations and which gives them somewhere to hide when they are worried. Prepare the den three weeks beforehand for your pet to get used to it, in a room where your pet feels comfortable and has constant free access. Ensure it is large enough for your pet to stand up, lie down and turn around comfortably; line it with used blankets or old clothes to make it smell familiar, provide treats and toys and cover it with a blanket where appropriate to muffle the sounds further. Cats often feel more comfortable up high; extra litter trays might be needed. An owner's reaction to their pet's anxiety is important; cuddling your pet serves to reinforce fear, so although it is counter-intuitive, try to resist picking up your pet, just carry on as normal and distract it with games or toys. Our nurses and vets are full of useful advice to turn your jellyfish back into your dog!





The tradition of village signs is believed to have started around 100 years ago on the Sandringham Estate in Norfolk. The idea has spread and is particularly popular in the Hundred Parishes. Around two-thirds of the parishes have a welcoming sign that usually tells us something about the place and its history. The installation of a village sign has often been prompted by a significant event or anniversary. The Queen's Silver Jubilee inspired the erection of Stansted Mountfitchet's knight signs at either end of the village in 1977. The arrival of the new millennium (was it really 20 years ago?) saw a rush of signs, followed by the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002. The 800th anniversary of Magna Carta inspired the installation in Little Dunmow in 2015.







Signs are generally made from wood or steel and their designs often show great imagination and artistic skill to depict aspects of life or history that are important to that parish. Several include an aeroplane, recognising the part played by their local airfield in the Second World War. Some parishes have more than one sign: for example, Much Hadham has its own plus others in the hamlets of Perry Green and Green Tye. Some signs, such as Finchingfield, have different images on front and back. Most are at the entrance to the village or in a prominent place, whilst a few are somewhat off the beaten track, for example in Broxted and Thaxted. I would be interested to hear of any signs older than those in Stansted Mountfitchet or newer than the one erected in Albury in May 2019. I would also like to hear if any have been listed. If you are a photographer or artist, there is much scope for trying to 'capture' these charming works of art.

RANDOM JOTTINGS

The Professor

I was 11 when I joined the evacuees at the big house, home of a Professor of Art and his family. He had arrived from Australia before WWI and was an official artist during the hostilities. As a child he had contracted polio, so his legs were different lengths. I can recall those uneven footsteps. exaggerated by the galoshes which he wore in the garden. He was bearded and presented a formidable figure to small children; I think of him today as a kind of Saxon Viking. He was always kind and fair. I rarely saw him painting. The one exception was the occasion when three boys were gathered around a hanging goose to pluck it. They were evacuees dressed in adult size dungarees and I was one of them. We were, years later, able to acquire this water colour picture and I have it now. He kept a small flock of geese, including an aggressive gander, which sometimes needed to be moved to a new patch. Geese are more independent than sheep and herding any flock can be exasperating. When a goose wandered off track, he whipped of his hat and threw it in the path of the offender. This worked well and the geese were always wary of the hat. It was a plain, old and battered felt hat, but it had magical powers. If the professor put out food for the geese and placed his hat beside it, the geese would stay away until the hat was removed. The sight or sound of geese today always takes me back to those days during, first, the 'phoney' war and then the Battle of Britain.

HATFIELD FOREST

Heading into autumn at Hatfield Forest, we prepare to say our annual farewell to the red poll cattle. During the summer they aid our conservation work, but as the ground gets wetter there is greater risk of compaction so they return to their winter quarters. Cattle are not the only creatures whose footsteps impact the forest. We welcomed many visitors this summer and it was wonderful to see people enjoying themselves in this special place. However, we need to consider the effect of so many feet on the forest in winter.



One way we care for the forest is to close worn paths. This rolling plan of closures has seen the most compacted paths shut in order to recover, while others reopened as they regenerated. There have been some positive signs of growth, but green is not always good. There should be up to 40 species of plant life, rather than just grass. If you encounter a green path which is still closed, this may be why. One success story is Collins Ride. The path is now established and open, having undergone intensive treatment. The vegetation survived the summer well, but the real test will come with prolonged wet weather. The forest has survived the last thousand years; now we must help it thrive for the next millennia. You can help by visiting less over the winter months, reducing footfall when conditions are wet. If you still need a forest fix, there are events coming up before the worst weather arrives: two deer rut walks, a Spooky Bakeoff and landscape photography workshop. Most wines under £10 are not made to be aged and some wines should not be kept for more than two or three years, like most NZ Sauvignon Blanc. So why do people bother to store or cellar wine? Many red wines, particularly those at the higher end of the market, benefit from several years in bottle to soften, for example big Rhône wines, top Bordeaux and some Italian reds. In 5-10 years, their initial mouthpuckering tannic structure softens to reveal more delicate flavours. Similarly, some heavily oaked or high acidity white wines mellow wonderfully with age; their acidity levels decline to reveal softer more delicious secondary flavours. Scarcity and cost are other factors with many of the world's great wines disappearing quickly on release to collectors and merchants; then they reappear several years later at a higher price when ready to drink. If you do find a wine for keeping, buy several bottles and enjoy tasting them over time. You will notice the difference as they mature and decide when they are at their peak for you.

So where to find older bottles for keeping? In my experience, wine merchants such as Adams or Joseph Barnes Wines in Saffron Walden or Noel Young and Cambridge Wine Merchants in Cambridge have good selections and experts on hand to offer advice. A couple of older wines to try: a red from Joseph Barnes Ch Paillas 2012, a Malbec from Cahors at £12.25 with dark fruit and spice and a white from Cambridge Wine Merchants Ch de Chasseloir Muscadet Sevre & Maine Sur Lie 2014, a dry white wine with great depth of flavour made from 100- year- old vines. So how do you store wines and when do you drink them? More on that next month.

Nature Notes

Lichens

The name comes from the Greek meaning 'leprous', referring to Lichens as a treatment for skin conditions.

Knowing the particular hedge in the churchyard where I could find sloes, I was surprised to find another shrubby tree with almost identical white flowers and flowering at the same time. This I took to be cherry plum. In time both plants fruited: the sloes, and the other, small and round, but not plum shaped. This turned out to be bullace, and it made excellent jam!



Then I became interested in the lichens, one greyish green, the other bright orange, growing on the gnarled branches of this small tree. Lichens are an ancient plant species of simple cell construction. They are found growing on stones and tree bark. They behave in a similar way to mosses; they thrive in moisture and survive in drought, only to be revived when the rain falls again. The

more I looked, the more beautiful I thought they were.

This is how they came to be: the earth was hit by an asteroid 66 million years ago; this heralded the end of the dinosaurs and many other life forms, but lichens survived. "Over 25,000 free living fungal species have allied with algae and cyanobacteria to form lichen. Lichens can attain an age of 9,000 years living in harsh environments. Over time, lichens dissolve rock, and in concert with rain, freeze and thaw, sunlight, and oxygen, begin to render that which makes our lives possible: the soil. So, when we think of 'be fruitful and multiply,' we can thank this ancient pioneer community from two divergent kingdoms of life". Brian Kie Weissbuch, L.Ac., RH (AHG) botanist and herbalist
