Year 2 pupils at Magna Carta Primary Academy were visited by a chiropractor as part of their studies into the human body. The visitor spoke to pupils about the skeletal and muscular system, giving them an opportunity to look at a life-size skeleton as they learnt. It was also an opportunity for pupils to hear about the role of a chiropractor and the path you need to take to enter the profession.



Maria Carlisle, Year 2 teacher, said: "The aim was threefold: to make links with the community, to enhance learning and study of the human body and to inspire children to think about a profession as a chiropractor when they get older. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed looking at and touching the skeleton models and it helped them to make links to what they had already learned. Seeing a full-size skeleton had a great impact as they could relate their own body parts to the skeleton they saw before them. Pupils also enjoyed being part of the demonstration when the chiropractor showed how she diagnostically assessed a new patient."

STANSTED SURGERY NEWS

We have a very excited nursing team shown here with our new piece of equipment: a brand-new Ankle Brachial Pressure Index monitor, which is used to detect and diagnose peripheral arterial disease. The team all agree that this device has transformed the way they look after patients, and this new equipment will ensure we use less clinical time per procedure. The machine only takes up 10 minutes of Healthcare Assistant time rather than the 30 minutes of Practice Nurse time needed with our old equipment. In addition to freeing up valuable nursing time, it gives much better clinical results and offers a much better experience for patients.



We would like to thank the Uttlesford District Councillors who have supported our Patient Participation Group (PPG) by donating towards this device. We are very grateful for their support and for that of our PPG, and we will continue to fundraise to purchase the best equipment for our patients. Climate change: deeds must now match words

Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) has strongly welcomed the resolution by Uttlesford District Council (UDC) to declare a climate and ecological emergency and to commit to achieving net zero carbon status by 2030. The resolution was approved by an overwhelming majority of local councillors in July. SSE Chairman Peter Sanders has called upon all UDC councillors to demonstrate their commitment to tackling climate change saying, "It is now time to convert words into actions. The Council's declaration of a climate emergency would be a hollow gesture if it were now to approve the expansion of the airport to 43 million passengers per annum, almost equivalent to today's Gatwick." Aviation is the fastest growing contributor to global climate change and Stansted Airport is the largest single source of CO₂ emissions in the East of England. If passenger numbers were to increase to 43mppa, 4.9 million tonnes of CO₂ would be produced, up from 3.8 million tonnes. 4.9 million is the same amount produced annually by two million family cars.

Hertfordshire County Council, historically a strong supporter of airport growth, unanimously declared a climate emergency in July. This led to serious concerns being expressed regarding the proposed expansion of Luton Airport. In addition, eight Conservative MPs representing constituencies around Gatwick issued a public statement and wrote to the Secretary of State opposing further airport expansion. Peter Sanders commented: "We very much hope that councillors will agree with SSE that reducing the adverse environmental impacts of aircraft carbon emissions is now a high priority matter. It is not only in the UK where there is growing concern about aviation's impact on climate change. Marseilles Airport has been forced to revisit expansion plans after France's Environment Authority questioned how they can be reconciled with France's net zero emissions target."





SUPERMARKET WINES

In previous editions of The Link I have reviewed local supermarkets giving value at the lower end of the market. This month it is the turn of Waitrose, which equally offers value, but at a higher price. With so much of a bottle of wine being tax, bottling and shipping the actual cost of the wine inside can be quite small so by stepping up from £5.00 to £10.00 the quality of the wine can increase dramatically. The buyers at Waitrose are excellent and won *Supermarket of the Year* in the 2018 Decanter awards.

Let us start with a great sparkling wine I have suggested before. The Jansz Premium Cuvee from Tasmania. It punches well above its weight at £18.00 with nutty aromas, delicate citrus and strawberry flavours and a good creamy finish. Catch it when available. If you have not tasted the Semillon grape from the Hunter Valley in Australia before then try the 2018 Brokenwood Semilion, which at £10.00 is a star wine. It is all grapefruit, lemon and lime when young and is delicious but with time develops more buttery characteristics. The Rustenberg Chardonnay from Stellenbosch 2018 at £15.00 is my current favourite chardonnay and has just won a silver medal at the 2019 World Wine Awards. Lovely apricot and orange peel aromas followed by flavours of marzipan and citrus. A couple of star reds are the Altos Las Hormigas Malbec from Argentina: a great grower producing incredibly well-rated Malbec. The 2018 at £13.50 is a good example. No oak ageing, so it is full of fresh bright brambly fruit flavours. Finally, a Waitrose own-label Recchia Valpolicella Ripasso Classico Superiore, 2016 at £13.00. It is a fruit forward wine due to the addition of Amarone style dried grapes. Good purity of fruit with a hint of chocolate from oak ageing. Enjoy!

I was the eldest, at 11, of eight evacuee children and a lasting memory for me is of us all sitting around a large kitchen table and being told to draw something. It is winter, between tea and bedtime. It is cold and dark outside and we have to brave it to get to our rooms, but inside is warm from the large grate at the end of the kitchen. My efforts must have been all squares and triangles because I was then given the prof's copy of Euclid's Elements. This is a collection of geometric theorems and propositions that are *proved*. Each proof ended with QED (quod erat demonstrandum - thus it has been demonstrated). I spent hours poring over these theorems, which are, of course, puzzles. I have found geometry fascinating ever since. There is a geometric proposition which I came across many years ago and which I have never managed to prove. Apparently Napoleon Bonaparte, a keen geometer, did solve it. If anyone would like to tackle this, drop me an email. I would be delighted to see a proof at last. I have my own copy of Euclid now.

Once I was an avid crossword fan but I now favour the number puzzles, many of which are Japanese. Sudoku appears in most daily newspapers, together with variants such as Killer and a new one called *Sandwich* Sudoku. There are also Futoshiki and Suguru, which are not too difficult to solve. I have been very successful with these. Numbers are my second love; I never fail to find wonder and beauty in numbers. There is not an uninteresting number. We all owe Leonardo of Pisa a debt of gratitude.

Mechanisation had arrived by the time of my childhood but people of my generation have fond memories of chasing rabbits, which fled the corn as the binder reduced the crop to an ever-smaller area. Perhaps not so fondly remembered was the back-breaking toil of potato picking as you had to gather the potatoes from your allocated strip before the spinner came around again. On the upside, everyone went home with a bucketful of oven busters and could look forward to a baked potato with lashings of butter and baked beans or grated cheese.



The photo, taken a year or two ago not far from Stansted, shows a field of stooks of wheat sheaves which is a rare sight these days. I must say that these are rather untidy compared to the corn stooks which we put together. We worked in pairs gathering two sheaves each and stacking them together, then gathering another two each to make a stook of eight sheaves.

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

If you have a bible anywhere in your house (or just 'google' it if you have internet access) look in the second half, the New Testament, find the fourth section called John, and then find chapter number six and read it. For those of you familiar with the Bible, this is *John 6*. This chapter contains a series of possibly familiar events in the life of Jesus: he performs healing miracles, feeds the 5,000, walks on water and teaches. For the best part of the time there is this large crowd quite literally chasing him around the sea of Galilee. He had immense popularity and no doubt the disciples were encouraged by this, with so many people following Jesus; but towards the end Jesus starts teaching things which were hard for the people to hear. Do you know what happened? Some of the crowd walked away; they made their choice not to follow Jesus any longer.

Our society has lots of problems but one that I see time and again is lack of respect: for people's property which leads to theft or vandalism, for their human rights which leads to harm or abuse, and for their personal choices, leading to discrimination. There are people who make the choice not to follow Jesus. In the same way, at the end of *John 6*, Jesus didn't condemn people, and we too must respect people's choices. There are people who want to learn about Jesus but want to do so in a way that is relevant to them and their lifestyles; that is their journey and we must respect that. There are those who have decided to follow Jesus, no turning back, and that too must be respected.

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Almost every parish within the Hundred Parishes has a church of great antiquity. Each one is different. The most notable external feature is often the tower, erected originally to house a bell or set of bells, raised high so their sound would travel above the surrounding rooftops to summon parishioners to prayer or for a special occasion. Almost all our church towers are square with just two being round: Bardfield Saling and Bartlow.

Some churches have a spire, usually extending upwards from the square tower base and tapering to a point. The combination of tower and spire may be called a steeple. The shapes of spires vary greatly; tall and thin styles are often referred to as 'Hertfordshire spikes' although they are not confined to Hertfordshire. The tallest local steeples are at Saffron Walden (193 feet) and Thaxted (181 feet). A few churches have a bellcote, where one or two bells hang in a small frame above one end of the roof. Wimbish seems to be our only parish church with no tower, spire or bellcote, following the demolition of its tower in 1883. A few churches have unusual towers or spires including Little Dunmow's separate thin turret, Wareside's octagonal bell tower and High Wych's thin circular spire. The spires of two churches in adjacent parishes, Ickleton and Hinxton, each have a 'sanctus' bell, high up on the outside of the spire - an uncommon design feature. A picture of each parish church appears amongst the thousand photos in the Society's book, The Hundred Parishes: An Introduction, available in tourist information centres and libraries.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

LIBRARY DEVELOPMENTS

You have read in the press about Essex County Council's change of stance over its proposal to cut back library services across Essex. After careful consideration of the revised proposals, the Parish Council still has significant issues with what is being proposed and is supporting the motion below put by Uttlesford District Council (see page 21):

"The Council condemns the action of Essex County Council with regard to the proposed strategy of over-reliance on volunteers to run our village libraries with short-term and insufficient funding. Uttlesford District Council is concerned that this may lead to their eventual closure and RESOLVES (1) to demand that ALL libraries in Uttlesford get continued access to Essex Library service computer and management systems, inter-library lending and stock rotation and core paid staff for the foreseeable future, and (2) to work with Essex County Council, parish councils and the wider Uttlesford community to achieve this goal."

MOUNTFITCHET EXCHANGE

The infrastructure for the broadband internet connection for the building was finally installed by BT Openreach during August. We still need operating manuals and health and safety documentation from our construction contractors but we are hopeful this will all be in place so we can finally open the building early in the early Autumn.

CEMETERY MATTERS

Historically the Stansted Mountfitchet cemetery was in the churchyard of St Mary's Church, BUT in 1956 the Parish Council opened a municipal cemetery on land adjacent to St Mary's Church. The oldest external memorial in the churchyard is to a William Cooper who died in 1659. The first interment in the new cemetery was a Mr Wenn who was buried in July 1956. Generally, only people who were residents of the village when they died can be buried in the cemetery although we have on occasions made exceptions for people who have a very strong connection with the village.

At a time when, each year, 140,000 people in the UK still choose to be buried, cemeteries around the coun-

try are running out of space. A BBC study found that a quarter of England's local authorities — which oversee the overwhelming majority of cemeteries — expected those they managed to be full by 2023.

The situation in Stansted is that St Mary's Churchyard is at full capacity and is officially closed so no more new graves have gone in there for some time. The Parish cemetery still has some space but a significant amount of this is accounted for by people who have pre-purchased graves (a practice stopped some years ago). It is very difficult to predict exactly when we will reach full capacity but burials seem to have become more popular so it won't be long before we run out of space and we are therefore looking for a site where future generations of Stansted residents can be buried. This is a complex and potentially expensive project for the Parish Council. The cost of acquiring the land will be significant. According to a local land agent, typically agricultural land in our area sells for £10,000 an acre but if the land had permission to be a burial site the value increases up to five times. The land would need to be prepared and boundary hedges and fences erected around the site. We have held preliminary talks with a landowner and we will keep you informed as we take the project forward.

CLOTHING RECYCLING

A clothing recycling bin that helps raise funds for the disability charity, Scope, is now in place at Crafton Green. Judging by the first few days' experience the bin may fill up very quickly. You will not be able to get large bin bags full of clothing into the bin so please bring them in a carrier bag size bag or be prepared to put items in the chute individually and take your bin-bag home with you.



There will be regular collections but if you find you can't get your clothing into the bin please take it away with you and try again once the bin has been emptied.

NEW OPEN SPACES TO MANAGE

The Parish Council is currently planning for when it takes over additional open spaces associated with the new developments at Walpole Meadows and Elms Farm. At Elms Farm we will be taking over an area which the original plans described as "informal public open space for relaxation, with meadow grassland and woody plantings to benefit wildlife."

There will be a permissive path from the estate, that links into the network of paths around Stansted Park. The path will be cut through the meadow area and maintained at a height that makes it comfortable to walk. We have concerns that the path will become a quagmire in the winter and will erode fairly quickly. The affected section may need to be fenced off using temporary fencing and prepared and re-seeded in April/May or September/October. Should main paths become eroded on account of frequency of use it may be desirable to upgrade the surface with some kind of gravel path.

At Walpole Meadow we will be taking on the maintenance of a new allotment plot, a play area and a kick about area as well as a community orchard.

Working groups have been established to oversee the take-over and future management of the new areas. The working groups are trying to liaise with developers and the planning officer at UDC who is responsible for ensuring developers comply with the \$106 agreement which details their obligations and criteria under the planning permission they were granted. Experience suggests that trying to get developers to do any more than the minimum they are legally required to do is very difficult.

PAVEMENT OBSTRUCTIONS

There are a number of locations in the village where the effective width of pavements is much reduced as a result of nearby house owners not cutting back their hedges to remain within their curtilage.

This creates hazards for carers with buggies and wheelchair users, as well as pedestrians, who are obliged to go into the road to pass the obstruction. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that any trees or hedges on their land do not obstruct the public highway.

Please check your boundaries and cut back any offending hedges and trees and avoid getting an official letter from the council.

NEW PARISH COUNCILLOR CO-OPTED

Four residents put themselves forward to fill the vacancy on the Parish Council. All the candidates provided written submissions explaining why they wanted to take on the role and three of them appeared in person at the meeting of the Full Council on Wednesday 7 July to present their case and take questions from councillors.

All the candidates had the qualities and experience to make useful contributions so it wasn't a easy decision for councillors. To get elected candidates need to secure 50% of the votes. Deena Bowman secured enough votes on the first ballot to be elected and we are therefore very pleased to welcome her on your behalf as the new councillor for the South Ward.

Deena has supplied the following brief biography:

"Born and raised in Camden, Deena and her husband moved to the village in 2008; indeed they were only the second residents to move onto Foresthall Park. Deena works full-time in HR and people are her passion. She is committed to social mobility, helping the young people of the village to achieve their full potential and to ensuring that the unique identity of the village is preserved and protected for residents and local business owners. She is a passionate advocate of the need to tackle the climate emergency locally and nationally."

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Geoffrey Sell writes:

Even though there is a new administration at UDC the issues facing the Council remain the same. Where to put the additional housing, the growth of Stansted Airport and lack of central government funding.

The most visible of our services is refuse disposal. The operatives do a tough job out in all weathers. I was sad to learn of an accident in Lower Street involving one of our vehicles and two loaders. A car ran into the back of the vehicle with one of the loaders thrown over its bonnet. He sustained a broken foot whilst the other loader suffered lacerations. Both were shaken up and are still off work.

Climate Change

This is one of the big issues facing the world. Uttlesford has declared a Climate and Ecological Emergency. It commits the Council to achieving net-zero carbon status by 2030. This was an all party motion. The Council is already doing some useful work through its waste awareness campaign. Officers have been attending schools speaking about waste recycling and reduction of the issue of plastic.

Libraries

I successfully proposed a motion which read:

"This Council condemns the actions of Essex County Council with regards to the proposed strategy of over-reliance on volunteers to run or village libraries with short term and insufficient funding. Council is concerned that this may lead to their eventual closure and Resolves (1) to demand that ALL libraries in Uttlesford get continued access to Essex Library service computer and management systems, inter-library lending and stock rotation and core paid staff for the foreseeable future and (2) to work with Essex County Council, parish council and the wider Uttlesford community to achieve this goal."

Although the decision by the County Council not to close any libraries is very welcome, there are concerns about the long-term viability. The current proposal is for a three year tapered funding. After that what happens? During the debate I used the analogy that libraries are like the canary in the mine. They are a symptom of the health of local government.

Saffron Walden Museum

Although located in Saffron Walden, the museum is for the whole district. It is a jewel in Uttlesford's crown. I am the Chairman of the Museum Management Working Group and am privileged to get an insight into their work. Amongst the recent acquisitions were:

- Medieval Gold Reliquary Pendant in the form of a cross. Found in Farnham
- Two hoards of late Roman silver coins. Found in Lindsell
- Victorian valentine cards
- Schoolboys scrapbook, Second World War
- Victorian ice-cream making equipment from Saffron Walden.

If you haven't visited the museum, it is well worth doing so.

FLOODING ISSUES

Many of you will remember the flood in Lower Street and Gall End Lane in February 2014 when over 30 dwellings and businesses were affected. A number of businesses were closed for months. One business, following extensive repairs, re-opened but closed shortly afterwards. Many other properties, although not flooded, were inconvenienced in a variety of ways.



All properties in the village receive a free copy of The Link. In the July 2019 issue, page 19, it was reported that the Environment Agency (EA) and Essex County Council (ECC) had planned a community Exhibition and Consultation Drop-In event. This event was also promoted on the Parish Council's website and local social media. The EA also informed every address in Lower Street and Gall End Lane. The purpose of the Drop-In was to give everyone the opportunity to establish if they qualified for a grant of up to £5000 to protect their home or business by fitting flood doors/air bricks or other flood damage prevention equipment. The event displayed flood maps showing the places at risk and ECC had samples of flood prevention materials. It was a rare opportunity to establish what those at risk could do to help themselves and to talk to experts. Only ten people attended this event, which included one District Councillor, two local landlords and two flood wardens. Volunteer flood wardens might now ask themselves why should we bother; if those at risk show so little concern, why should we? It will be difficult for the EA or ECC to justify another of these Drop-Ins. By the way we really need more active Flood Wardens. Do contact me if interested.

HATFIELD FOREST

It is harvest time and at Hatfield Forest we are celebrating an autumn bounty. With the blackberries and sloes ripening, the forest rides are gradually developing seasonal colour. The rides, or pathways, run through the woodland separating areas of coppice and wood pasture. These green arteries, some of which date back to the medieval period, were created for hunters on horseback. Sir Edward Turnor, owner of the forest during the 17th century, modernised the rides by creating a geometric pattern which can still be seen today. This is most clearly visible at Eight Wantz Ways. Under the ownership of the Houblon family, yet more rides were added in the 18th and 19th centuries. September is an ideal time to explore the rides, as summer temperatures cool, while the worst of the wet autumnal weather has not vet arrived.



WoodFest, our annual festival of celebration, takes place from Friday 6th to Sunday 8th September in the lake area. As long ago as the 17th century a festival was held at Thremhall Green (now Elmans Green). WoodFest has its roots in this historic event. The modern festival originated with the Wood Fayre in the early 1990s. WoodFest has expanded to have two stages, featuring bigger bands alongside local artists. The village pub style bar is a setting for informal acoustic and folk music. There will be 50 plus stalls and activities for children - something to enjoy for all ages. 


