STANSTED LIBRARY POST LOCKDOWN

As shown on the front cover, it has been great to get back to the library with my children. Visiting today, the librarian was keen to tell us they are happy to be welcoming more people and are as Covid-safe as possible. There have been a few changes to make things safer. Children's books are helpfully bundled up so you can pick up a set to take home without worrying about touching and putting back. While my kids used to love choosing their own books, they love the surprise of opening the selection at home at least as much.

While it is not a new addition, I also strongly recommend the BorrowBox app. It is free for library members to use and allows you to download audiobooks and e-books to your phone or another device. Not every book I have looked for is on there but there is a really good selection and I have found some great things which I was not looking for. Audiobooks were especially good whilst stuck at home in lockdown. I felt a lot less guilty distracting the kids with a story than sticking them in front of the television; and listening to a book made washing-up at 9.00 or 10.00pm after a day of working and home-schooling a lot more bearable.

Now the library is open again I realise even more how much we all value it. Audiobooks are great, but having new books to sit and read together is better. I don't know what the current situation is with plans for the library, but I imagine its future is still far from certain. I hope we can all make the most of it and support them to continue. FORGOTTEN GARDENS OF EASTON LODGE

We are now starting our closed season: a time for taking stock and looking forward. The rains of early October were welcome as the groundwater is still well down in the area, following three years of low rainfall. The Peto lilypond's water level is a good indicator; it is normally entirely dependent on rainfall as we do not have a mains water supply. We refilled it from a standpipe in March 2019 when we had cleaned the pond and it is still well below its ideal level. The rains helped the dahlias finish their season in style; tall and covered in flowers, and watered in the 1000 cuttings we took at a workshop led by Christine Walkden, one of our new Trustees.



October was particularly exciting for us, because we signed the contract to restore the balustrade around the lilypond. The work will involve replacing 91 of the 134 balusters and then rebuilding the balustrade, hopefully in time for the first full season open day in 2021. We are now fundraising to help ensure the project does not completely exhaust our reserves and leave us exposed for the uncertain times we are living through. Please consider helping us; a donation of £250 will fund a new baluster, but any donation, however small, would be fantastic. You can find more details in the fundraising section of our website.



Children are getting a flavour of what life at secondary school is like via the internet. 



Peculiarities of the English Language

Here is a simple breathing exercise for asthmatics, people prone to anxiety and athletes:

- 1. Stand in front of a mirror
- 2. Wrap a dynaband around your lowest ribs, keeping it wide, not rolled up
- 3. Pull on the band to tighten it up, holding it at the front
- 4. Breathe in gently, expanding your low ribs into the band. You are aiming for an entire torso expansion: front, sides, back and belly. Check your shoulders remain low and relaxed. Your throat should remain relaxed too
- 5. Breathe out, with the entire torso subsiding, front, back, sides and belly, with shoulders and throat nice and calm.



Remember that the diaphragm relaxes as we breathe out, so encourage a lovely long stress-free out breath, but avoid equating relaxing with slumping! The spine remains long, or, for bonus points, lengthens up. This exercise starts very gently. As things improve, the intensity can be increased with bigger breathing. You should notice a distinct pause building up between the in breaths and out breaths. This is a good thing.

Someone who works for Z-Health is an iron man athlete and he does very well in competitions. He does not run, swim or cycle long distances in his training programme, but he does do 20 minutes breathing drills daily. Successful cardio is heavily dependent upon efficient breathing. Instead of panting when the going gets tough, increase the breathing volume: calm breathing, calm brain.

Surge in Demand for Mental Health Support

We are supporting a countywide campaign to tackle declining mental wellbeing as a result of coronavirus. The campaign is led by Essex County Council (ECC) and supported by Essex organisations. Latest figures show the number of adult mental assessments have increased by around 50% and referrals to mental health professionals have increased significantly. The Essex Mental Health and Wellbeing Team is also seeing its highest ever number of referrals. In response, ECC is launching *Mental Health Essex*, which aims to reach those most at risk of suffering with mental health issues as a result of Covid-19, providing information and support. The campaign uses local insight to target these specific groups who may be suffering with their mental health:

- People with employment issues (furloughed, newly unemployed, at risk of redundancy)
- Adults with young children: those with children age 0-4 are the highest risk, but those with older children are also experiencing mental health issues
- Women (due to caring responsibilities)
- Younger adults

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY - MUSEUMS

www.hundredparishes.org.uk

Since March, getting out in the countryside has been greatly encouraged. Successive generations have shaped this fertile land. They have planted hedges and cut wood from ancient, coppiced woodlands, tended animals, planted orchards and harvested honey from bees. Profiting from this productive land, many constructed beautiful buildings that reflected pride in their locality. Today, a significant number of these are listed buildings. Our rich architectural tapestry is brilliantly recorded in *The Hundred Parishes: An Introduction*. There are a few copies still available by mail order from the society's website or from local bookshops and Tourist Information Centres.

Museum collections of assorted artefacts and documents add another dimension to the human history of the area. Saffron Walden Museum opened in 1835 and houses a real treasure trove of historical and other material relating to the local area. A recent grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund is enabling the development of plans to attract new visitors to the museum and adjacent castle.

Smaller museums hold collections of agricultural implements, local artefacts and archive material. The Grade II* building of the Forge Museum in Much Hadham houses a collection of metal tools, and striking medieval wall paintings reveal details of Tudor fashion. The Ashdon Village Museum has exhibits about life in the 20th century and the curator is updating information on the family trees of seventy local residents and preparing displays in anticipation of re-opening in the future.







Meanwhile, we can enjoy our heritage and celebrate the past by continuing to explore the countryside and local villages, such as Barkway shown above. With regular additions of new walks to the society's website, we can use these descriptive routes, some as short as one mile, to explore the cultural landscapes that make up the Hundred Parishes.

The proposed aims of the Stansted in Bloom Group are to encourage the local community to improve the village environment through imaginative planting of trees, shrubs and flowers in public and private open spaces. They will also work with other interested parties to encourage conservation and recycling projects and to eliminate eyesores such as litter, graffiti and vandalism.

The group is independent of the Parish Council but will be working very closely with it to complement the good work that they already do. The group will seek funding from the Airport Community Fund and other agencies and is open to discussions with any organisations who would like to be associated with this initiative.

We hope that lots of residents will want to get involved and support this group. If you are happy to give a few hours to do some physical work, or want to suggest projects for a particular location, please get in touch by emailing

PARISH GRANTS

Each year the Parish Council makes small grants to organisations and/or charities which support our community. The Finance Committee considers applications in March and 1% of the precept is made available which means that £3,500 will be distributed locally.

SPORTS STRATEGY

As part of the evidence base for the withdrawn Local Plan in 2018, Uttlesford District Council commissioned a study into the supply and demand for sports playing pitches in the District. The analysis was based on four geographical areas: Saffron Walden, Great Dunmow, Stansted Mountfitchet and the wider rural area.

In the Stansted area it found a shortfall of football pitches for adults and youth teams, and that pitches for younger age groups were used at their capacity. The study also identified a shortfall of one full sized floodlit 3G pitch in the village as there are no floodlit 3G pitches at all currently available in Uttlesford. The study also identified a shortage of tennis courts in the district.

The Parish Council recently decided to set up a working group to work with the sports clubs and the wider community in Stansted and district to develop a sports strategy for the south west part of the Uttlesford District. An initial meeting with some of the clubs was held on 7th October by lead working group members, District Cllr Melvin Caton and Parish Cllr Daniel Brett.

The Parish Council is hopeful that it will be in a position to bid for a slice of the £450k fund set up by the District Council to support three major sports projects over the period to 2023. It is likely that the first grant will go towards the new floodlit pitch on the Saffron Walden County High School site.

Much of our communication takes place via emails — to which councillors are expected to respond! In order to apply you must be 18 years of age or older and a qualifying citizen.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Ayub Khan writes:

I want to start by thanking *Save Stansted* as well as Stansted residents for the campaign against the proposed new development in Pennington Lane by Bloor Homes. I have been particularly impressed with the clear concise information and level of detail that has led to over 1500 objections on the Uttlesford planning portal. My own view on this development is that it is totally unsuitable for Stansted and provides no benefit to residents whatsoever.

We continue to hold the administration at Uttlesford to account on issues of planning matters. The disastrous decision to withdraw the local plan earlier this year has given rise to a number of speculative applications across the district. The truth has been laid bare for all to see now that we have no local plan. In order to maintain a five-year land supply we will need to build 1230 new home per year if the Government enact their new "mutant" algorithm. I am not against house building but some of these developments such as Pennington Lane are completely unsuitable. The legacy that the administration will leave behind is one of planning chaos for the whole of Uttlesford. The Government have also muddied the waters by publishing a White Paper setting out radical changes to the Planning system. The collision of local decisions and the Government proposals do not bode well for the District. Locally we continue push UDC to ensure that they maintain the open spaces around the play area at Mountifitchet Green. It is not acceptable that work continues to be delayed.

Finally, I want to say a huge thank you to the excellent team at Stansted Surgery for their dedication and hard work during this uncertain time. I also want to extend my thanks to residents, local businesses and charities that have adapted to the ever changing government guidance. We still need remain cautious and at the same time stay safe.

In October, the trees and shrubs give us a final eruption of colour before their leaves start tumbling down and they go into winter mode. Do not waste these leaves, collect them in a sack and store them; they will turn into leaf mould. If left on your flower beds they can harbour diseases and pests. Do not use leathery leaves, nor those infected with diseases such as scab, black spot and mildew; these are better burned or disposed of. If you do have a bonfire, please check that there are no animals hibernating. Hedgehogs are in decline and are classified as vulnerable to extinction; help them find a place to hibernate, cut a small door through your fences so that they can roam and think yourself lucky that your garden has been chosen as its refuge! The autumn flowers are giving everyone a late show of colour: Michaelmas daisies, Japanese anemones, chrysanthemums, nerines and rudbeckias. Autumn is a busy time of the year as crops are harvested, foliage is cut back, trees and shrubs are pruned, cuttings are taken and plant bulbs are split in readiness for next spring. Plants are fed and the lawn is cut for the final time. Have a walk around your garden with a notebook and jot down things to do; it will help you to get organised and it is very pleasing to tick off the jobs, even if they are only little ones like oiling tools, washing the flower pots or helping you plan major jobs for next year by splitting clumps of flowers or moving shrubs during their dormant season etc.

WINE AWARDS 2020

It is that time of the year when the Decanter World Wine Awards 2020 are announced and we will start to see Gold, Silver, Bronze, and Commendation award stickers on wine bottles in the supermarkets. I have become a little disillusioned recently with these awards as they keep adding even higher levels such as Platinum and 'Best in Show' meaning the lower levels such as 'Commendation' meant very little. This year they still have these levels of winners but the numbers of wines awarded at Platinum and Gold seem greatly reduced and many of those that are included are in the £15-20 range or higher, as you would expect. It is great therefore when something with a gold medal is at an everyday price, so here are two Platinum and three Gold winners (four reds and one white) to seek out in ascending price order:

- Asda extra special Douro red, Portugal, 2017 (Gold) £6.50; traditional port grapes used to make a delicious wine at a great price. Expect lush blackcurrants and plums with a savoury core and smooth tannins
- Vina Indomita Zarper Gran Reserva Malbec, Bio Bio, Chile 2019 (Gold) £8.25 Morrisons 100% Malbec.
 Deep damson and menthol with a savoury edge, great with steak
- Cederberg Waitrose No.1 Syrah, South Africa 2018 (Gold) £8.50; raspberry, blackberry and smoky aromas followed by plush mouth filling sweet fruit
- Vinalba Reserve Malbec Touriga National, Uco Valley, Argentina, 2019 (Platinum) £9-13 Tesco/Majestic 80% Malbec and 20% Touriga (the port grape); this has long been a favourite of mine, aromas of blackcurrant and coffee/mocca, lovely fruit, refined tannins and a long finish. What's not to like?
- Paco and Lola Albarino, Spain 2019 (Platinum) £12-15 from Sainsburys/Tesco: fresh, vivid and pungent white with a long finish. Outstanding quality. Happy hunting.




