

#### STANSTED SURGERY

Thank you to all our patients for their continued understanding and support while we weather the storm of COVID-19. We share your frustration and wish to be able to return our service to normal but we have to keep following the guidance, to protect patients and our staff. This means our front door is still locked, and access to our premises is limited to invited patients only. If you have any enquiries for the surgery, please telephone, or email us in the first instance. To help us deal with the morning time demand on our phone lines, please call for test results after 2.00pm. Please ring the buzzer downstairs to gain access to the surgery if you have been asked to attend in person. The intercom system is not designed for long conversations, just to screen for access control, so please telephone or email the surgery with all enquiries. We ask all visitors to the surgery to wear a face covering when attending the surgery in person (except children aged under 11).

#### Our plans for Flu 2020

Delivering the flu campaign this year will significantly impact our workload, and we ask for patients' continued support to get this done as safely as possible.

- All those patients who were advised to shield during the pandemic will be vaccinated first. The nursing team will run a separate clinic for these patients on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> September, and we will be contacting this group directly with instructions.
- 2. We will be using the **three Saturday clinics** (26<sup>th</sup> September, 3<sup>rd</sup> October and 17<sup>th</sup> October) to vaccinate the bulk of our *at risk group*, ie **all** those aged 65 and over, and those with an ongoing chronic condition aged 18 to 64; those who are usually invited annually for a flu vaccination. Patients will be invited in a staggered way, by letters of the alphabet. Entry will be on a one-inone-out basis, and all queueing will be outside the surgery, with social distancing in place. We have many clinicians and support staff to help, and we hope that these clinics will run quickly and efficiently. You **do not** need to book an appointment if you are able to attend in your allocated timeframe.

- All children UNDER THE AGE OF 18 will be vaccinated on a different day and we will be in touch with those parents and/or guardians once we know when the childhood flu vaccination will be available to us.
- 4. Patients who are housebound should contact the surgery if they wish to have a flu jab this year. We will arrange a date/dates for home visits once we have an idea of the number of patients requiring a home visit.
- 5. The new cohort announced this year will be done during November and December but we will endeavour to get this done as soon as we are advised how to source the additional vaccination required. This cohort includes healthy patients aged 50 to 64, who did not qualify for a flu jab in the past, as well as the household members of shielding patients. Currently, this cohort has not been confirmed by NHS England; we await further guidance

We have created a **FLU 2020** page on our website, which we will keep updated as and when updated guidelines are received from NHS England and Public Health England.

I wonder how many of you have looked out of the window, stood in a lane or sat on a bench and noticed some event which you would have missed if you had not timed it right. In my garden I have seen some amazing sights just because I looked at the right time. Years ago, I saw a turquoise flash of colour flying away from the pond. Surely not ... but ... it could only have been a kingfisher! Other pond events include a heron which flew the minute I saw it. A few times I have seen a grey wagtail bobbing around the pond usually the same time of year. I see frogs and spawn a-plenty and have had toads but sadly, for no obvious reason, no more. There are newts but they are elusive. Once during lockdown, I saw Mrs Blackbird tossing a long wiggly creature onto the path; pick it up, stab it, and hit it back down again. I thought she had a worm until I saw the bright orange and black spots underneath. She had caught a newt in fine breeding colour and was despatching it for food. Over the following days I saw her looking into the pond around the same time of day and yes, she got another two. At first my instinct was to shoo her away but then I reflected on the likely outcome: Mrs Blackbird and maybe her chicks with no dinner. I decided to let nature take its course and not intervene. I have not mentioned the damselflies, the pied wagtail predating the dragonflies, a squirrel eating my strawberries, a tawny owl, a sparrowhawk, and, another highlight, a few visits from a hedgehog or two! Keep looking out of your window; you never know what you might see.

#### STANSTED VILLAGE 1940-1950

Starting at the Chapel Hill junction with Cambridge Road, going north on the left-hand side, was Frank Bull's garage. Next was Reed Cottage which became an engineering works and a restaurant, then a large open space followed by two cottages, one where the district nurse lived but unfortunately it fell down whilst being repaired! The next shop was Milton's greengrocers, now Yummies. The fish and chip shop was a butcher. Dorringtons was Miss Kitson's, a toy shop and haberdashery. Next to the alley was The Dorothy hairdressers, more recently David Lee. The next building along was Bedlows, a wheelwright. Past Hargrave Park was the army camp then the doctors' surgery. Crossing over the road was the Three Colts public house. Coming along Cambridge Road on the east side was Levy the Builder, then the Co-op; at the arch was Clarkes garage, and then Mayhews garage with petrol pumps that swung out over the pavement.



London and Stansted Furniture, an electrical store and Barclays Bank were next; Greens Stores building, which still stands, was a first-class general store.



Turning east into Chapel Hill, first was the fire station. Ecclestone's the Chemist stood on the corner of St John's Road. At the bottom of the hill was Lloyds Bank, then Matthews bike repair shop. LCM Butchers was next, Mr Wenn's gents' barbers was where Goldings now stands. The long building next door was Barret's Café. Miss Stacey came next: a vegetable and sweet shop.



The first shop in Lower Street was the Off Licence, then Robinson's wood yard (now Glasscocks). Next was Ben Turner's dairy and grocery store; in the middle on the triangle was Rawlings Café. On the other side the Dog and Duck pub and on the junction with Grove Hill stood Mumford's fish shop. Next was Stringer's Store. Dewbury the barber, Hicks corn merchants' office, the library and council office followed by Smith watch and clock repair. Then there were the butchers and Buntings the greengrocers. On the corner of Station Road was Kevil Jackson radio shop. Next was R C Johnson watch and clock repair, the next building was an old green wooden café; at the end was Mayhew's garage repair shop. On Stansted Station stood W H Smith paper shop.



# Walk-In NHS Hearing Aid Maintenance Service Update

#### SSE renews Call for Airport to accept Planning Refusal

In an email sent on 28<sup>th</sup> July, Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) congratulated Steve Griffiths on his appointment as Managing Director of Stansted Airport, but urged him to listen to the local community and to reconsider the Airport's proposed appeal against the unanimous rejection of its planning application by Uttlesford District Council. In the email, Peter Sanders (SSE's Chairman) said an appeal would be costly and time-consuming for all parties at a time when they are hard pressed by other important issues. The wording of the letter sent to Steve Griffiths is as follows:

"On behalf of Stop Stansted Expansion, may I congratulate you on your appointment as Managing Director. I also take this opportunity to express the hope that you will be more responsive to the local community than STAL's former CEO. In particular I urge you not to proceed with the proposed appeal against Uttlesford District Council's unanimous decision to reject MAG's planning application to increase the throughput of passengers and planes on the existing runway. Such an appeal would inevitably be costly and time-consuming for all parties at a time when they are hard pressed by other important issues."

#### THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

It has been a strange summer. The lifting of some of the COVID-19 restrictions has led to greater freedom for some and increased fear for others. Local lockdowns, the need to wear face coverings in enclosed spaces including churches re-opening for worship, and the imposition of quarantine periods on some returning from holidays abroad have all reminded us that the virus is still active. There has been a delicate balance needed to be struck between keeping us safe, allowing us to get on with our lives, sustaining our children's and young people's education, and trying to regenerate economic activity. We all have difficult decisions to make about our own living as do all levels of government about our life together. It is hard to know what this autumn and winter will bring for us. What I think I have learnt most in the past few months is that we need to live a day at a time and trust that God will give us the resources to do that: strength to get through each day, hope to encourage us, love and concern for those around us, and gratitude for the daily gifts of goodness and love we discover, however small. I pray that God will uphold us all in these still unsettling times.

# THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

We continue to add circular walk routes to the Society's website so I would like to repeat last month's encouragement for people to go and try them. There is no need to travel far. The walks range in distance from 1 mile to 10 miles. The routes have been chosen for the quality of scenery or heritage, or both, and the route descriptions seek to add to your knowledge of the places you pass. Each route description can easily be downloaded and printed from the *Other Walks* section of the website. We try to make the route description as easy as possible to follow and we have a small team of volunteers who check them. We welcome feedback and comment.



Shorter walks tend to focus on a single interesting town or village; for example Bartlow, Clavering, Great Dunmow, Hatfield Broad Oak, Hildersham, Much Hadham, Sawbridgeworth, Stebbing or Thaxted. Some routes combine town and countryside; for example from Buntingford, Saffron Walden or Standon. Others are mainly countryside routes, such as those starting from Broxted (see above), Henham, Little Hadham, Matching or Wareside. Some routes range over two or more parishes; for example seven miles between Pleshey and Great Waltham or eight miles between Albury, Braughing and Furneux Pelham. Two different routes run between Finchingfield and Great Bardfield. An 8-miler starting from Chrishall (see below) passes through four parishes and offers extensive views from upland paths in the Essex/Cambridgeshire border area.





These are just some examples to give you a flavour and to whet your appetite. We are regularly adding new walks, in case your favourite walk has not yet been mentioned. Even if you think you know your local area, I assure you that, not far away, there is more to be found and enjoyed!

# Stansted Network

#### NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

#### **BUSINESS - ALMOST AS USUAL!**

The new rules for easing out of lockdown have not changed the way we are working. Physical meetings of Councils are still not permitted except under certain criteria. We will continue to hold meetings via Zoom or Teams as required and appropriate and in line with guidance/current regulations. Virtual Council Meetings will resume in September and are likely to be held monthly or as and when decisions are required to be made.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL RANGERS AND HANDYMAN**

As usual, Lucy, Levi and Lee continue to work their usual hours; thankfully all three remain well and busy. Sadly Lucy and Levi have noticed an increase in dropped litter – primarily disposable face masks.

#### **OFFICE**

Office-wise all regular duties continue to be undertaken. The Chairman and Clerk continue to attend regular virtual forums organised by the Essex Association of Local Councils with Chairs and Clerks of other councils. Staff have completed a number of training courses as well. A recent meeting with Cty Cllr Ray Gooding has confirmed that officers at Essex Highways are reviewing our main routes through the village, particularly Grove Hill, and he will be in touch with us when there is a viable proposal to consider. Our Crisis Management Team meets regularly to review everything in line with the latest Government advice which, as we all know, can change quite swiftly!

We recently advertised a vacancy for the role of Receptionist/Media Co-ordinator and were pleased to have received a number of applications. We hope to be able to introduce a new member of the team shortly.

#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN**

The final draft of our Plan is not perfect, but without a District Local Plan in place, is about as far as we can take it at the moment. We think it is therefore probably good to start a consultation soon to invite comments. Whether we like it or not, Stansted is likely to have to accommodate more additional homes than originally notified (60) so amongst other things we'll be seeking your views on WHERE these homes should be located IF we have to have them and what kind of COMMUNITY BENEFITS you consider we should aim for.

#### **RESPONDING TO PLANNING APPLICATIONS**

You may be aware that the Government has introduced new planning legislation. Without the Local Plan in place, and with the Government push for more homes, we believe that we shall see an increase in the number of large-scale planning applications. To this end, the Council is considering establishing a sub-committee to undertake thorough reviews of such applications and how they affect the community, to assist the Parish Council in providing a more robust response to the District Council during the consultation process.

#### **STANSTED IN BLOOM**

At one time it looked like Stansted in Bloom 2020 would suffer the same fate as the Chelsea Flower Show but following relaxation of the Covid-19 lock-down rules it was agreed that the competition could be judged without breaking social distancing guidelines and the organisers were given the green light to go ahead. The lockdown meant that entries from care homes were not possible and the business section was also a non-starter. The closing date for entries and the judging day were set for slightly later in the season which was an additional challenge for the entrants but on the plus side it gave them a few more weeks to get their gardens in pristine condition.

The judging day of Sunday 12 July proved to be a beautiful summer's day which meant that the gardens looked their very best and the judges were certainly impressed with all the gardens they saw.

All entrants received a plant donated by the Parish Council's gardening contractor, GWB Horticulture Ltd.

#### SECOND PHARMACY FOR THE VILLAGE ......

Regular readers will be aware that we have been trying to secure a second dispensing pharmacy to serve our community. The process is long and complicated but starts with a review of the Essex County Council Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment. We requested a review of the previous document as we didn't think it painted an accurate picture in terms of population etc, but that was refused.

We did not consider that it was appropriate to push the matter in the middle of a global pandemic, and ECC had informed us that the next review was likely to be postponed for a year. This has now been confirmed and the review will take place in 2022, with consultation commencing in late 2021. We'll be stating our case loud and clear then.

#### **OUR YOUNGER COMMUNITY**

We are delighted to report that Gemini Youth Support, who run the youth centre on our behalf, were able to start some outreach work around the village towards the end of July. They chatted with a number of youngsters, many of whom were not members of the youth club – but hopefully some of them may join now! We have been liasing with Uttlesford District and Essex County Councils to ensure appropriate safety measures are in place. Sadly it may be some time before the youth club is actually able to meet again in their usual home.

Just before "lockdown" we had started some work on establishing a Youth Forum to gain representative views of young people. We hope to resume contact with our secondary schools in September to try to reach as many of our teenagers as possible.

#### **SKATEPARK JAM**

This year's Jam is scheduled to take place on Sunday 13 September. For those of you who are not fully up on skatepark culture, a Jam is more like a festival than a competition and although there are elements of competition it is more about competing with yourself rather than trying to prove you are better than someone else!



Covid-19 protocols mean that the organisation of the Jam will be different from previous years and, unfortunately, we will have to be a bit stricter about enforcing the safety guidelines, in particular limiting the number of people in the skatepark at any one time. In order to achieve this we will be starting earlier and having more sessions over a longer period. We will also need more volunteers to act as marshals. Please email Sean Tompson at sean.tompson@gmail.com if you are willing to help.

There will be sessions for scooter riders, skateboarders, BMX riders and inline skaters. Sessions for younger and less experienced participants will be scheduled for the start of the day so the older riders can enjoy a Sunday lie in. Please make sure you know the time of the session that is most appropriate for your age and experience and arrive 30 minutes before the session starts so you can sign in and collect your wristband. Final details of timings will be posted at the skatepark and on social media at the beginning of September.

There are no entry fees but donations for the skatepark's maintenance budget are always welcome.

This is the sixth Jam since we rebuilt the skatepark and we always attract a lot of support from riders across the district, plus the occasional visitors from further afield who have heard good things about our events. We are supported by a number of generous sponsors so there are always good prizes on offer.

#### **PUBLIC OPEN SPACES**

Elms Farm – the seven acres of land is still some way from being officially transferred to us but a working group is considering how to manage and make the best use of this community space. Sadly, there are many issues for the developers to put right before we will accept the handover.

Walpole Meadows – The allotments and play areas are progressing but not quite ready yet.

At each area, the developers have to undertake maintenance of all public areas for one year after the handover period.

#### **NEWS FROM ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL**

#### **Cllr Ray Gooding writes:**

Clearly the Covid-19 issues have been the major items that we at ECC have been presented with over the last few months and the following is a snapshot of the challenges faced.

The school term has now finished, and children are at home officially without the need for parents to "Home Educate". However, the majority of our schools in Essex have been open throughout and as the weeks have gone by increasing numbers of children have returned to school.

When the government announced that schools will reopen, the professionalism and desire to make the school environment a safe place so that children could return to learning was fantastic. We had an amazing response from schools, and I thank all those teachers and support staff who not only continued to teach key worker and vulnerable children throughout the pandemic but were instrumental when the schools reopened to wider cohorts.

Adult Community Learning has been supporting residents, communities, and businesses across Essex to quickly and easily access new learning and upskilling opportunities during this time. Impressively, as well as sustaining its apprenticeship training provision, it has also attracted new apprentices.

The Youth Service has been running an extensive programme of activities including holding a weekly timetable of Zoom sessions that young people can access for help and advice including mental health and wellbeing. Our Young Carers team have maintained support to their caseload, as well as keeping in contact with all young carers that have been referred to the service to reduce social isolation.

We have very recently been awarded £56,000.00 from the Youth Endowment Fund. This will enable us to extend our early help offer with online Prison No Way, Sisters in Strength and the Goodman projects for 10 – 14 year olds.

#### **NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL**

#### **Cllr Alan Dean writes:**

A bright spot during lockdown has been the opening of the permissive footpath network from the new bridge across Stansted Brook and around Stansted Park (see pages 4 and 5). I have spent many an hour walking by the widened brook observing ducks, geese, herons and other wildlife. The walks from the Elms Farm/Stansted Park network to St. Mary's Church, Burton End and Elsenham are a pleasurable adventure. One Sunday in July, I had lunch on the steps of the bridge before I set off to the Gardens of Easton Lodge near Dunmow.

Whilst on the subject of personal exercise and wellbeing, here is a link to Uttlesford's resources for staying physically and mentally well during the pandemic (and beyond, I hope) https://bit.ly/3i7uJaM

The Uttlesford Community Response Hub for the pandemic continues to offer a contact service to residents for the foreseeable future. The number **03333 408 218** is available Monday to Friday, 9am to 4pm, which will enable people to access support for shopping and prescription pick-ups. People can also email communityresponse@uttlesford.gov.uk. In addition, the Hub will offer support to those who are feeling lonely or isolated, as well as those affected by redundancy or needing advice on mental health, domestic violence, debt, benefits or housing.

Redundancy and unemployment are of concern to many people, including from the loss of jobs at our main employment location, Stansted Airport. As someone who is retired and with a steady pension income, I feel a great sadness for all those mainly younger people whose livelihood is now less certain than my own.

The collapse in air travel is affecting many local people and businesses. On the other side of the equation, the reduction in pollution from both air and road transport has brought health benefits to many people. Balancing life, environment and economy is never straight forward.

I am puzzled why the Manchester Airport Group needs to appeal Uttlesford's refusal of planning permission to grow air traffic beyond 35 million passengers each year; for better or worse, throughput in 2020 is likely to be below half the present cap.

With that appeal now live, together with Local Plan Mark 3 just getting underway, and central government twisting the arms of Essex County Council and all districts to merge into bigger, unitary authorities, it is clear that pandemics and lockdowns have not stopped local government. It has, however, slowed down; but you can't get much slower that almost 20 years to agree a Local Plan, can you?

#### **UPDATE FROM PCSO NIKKI MORRIS**

I have been in the village a lot since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, either alone or with colleagues, helping to enforce the Government's rules.

With more people out and about taking their daily exercise, I had the opportunity to meet more people than I usually would!

Whilst in the Police world every day is different, an average week would find me on foot patrol around many different parts of Stansted - some obvious and others not quite so much. We have been called out to neighbour issues as well as to emergencies.

I have assisted colleagues on special operations around the district, undertaken speed checks at numerous locations and searched for missing people. I have also undertaken some online training courses, dealt with cases of anti-social behaviour and viewed CCTV recordings for evidence.

#### Sock Fun!

In July 2018 I introduced the huge drill letter ball, in which we merrily toss a ball with letters written on it to a partner, calling out the letter we see as we catch the ball. In these dreadful COVID days, classic letter ball can only be played by those in bubbles. However, solo letter ball has huge benefits and here are two simple drills to have fun with:

You need a projectile - a ball with letters written around it, or nearly as good, a balled-up sock or juggle ball – at least these two won't roll away and so can be done if seated.

First drill: watching the projectile fly up and over to the other hand. Toss your chosen missile from hand to hand, watching it throughout the flight path. It is very important to see it leave your hand as well as land in the other hand. This will require concentration since it is common to look towards the flight path and not the throwing hand.

Having mastered that, now keep your head still and use your eyeballs to watch your sock fly. You may have to remove glasses – both from your nose and from nearby tables. This is a magnificent eye exercise along with hand-eye coordination. Instead of really using our eye muscles to track things, we turn our heads to do this. Since the eye muscles are innervated in the brain stem, it is critical to keep them active!



Second drill: using the peripheral vision. Just the same as above, only this time look straight ahead and see the sock fly in your peripheral vision, throwing and catching without looking directly at your hands. Good peripheral vision is vital for safe driving and for night vision.

#### **RANDOM JOTTINGS**

#### Walking on the Right Side

It is great to see so many more people out walking and jogging around the village during the lockdown. We are very fortunate to have access to a variety of public footpaths and bridleways in and around Stansted (including some new permissive footpaths, as shown on the cover of this issue). However, in order to reach some of these paths it is often necessary to walk along narrow roads or lanes that lack pavements. I had it drummed into me from a very early age that whenever possible pedestrians should face the oncoming traffic when walking along a road that has no pavements; that means walking on the right-hand side of the road, not the left as I have noticed many people doing.

As a youngster I did not see why I should obey this rule, thinking it was another stupid rule devised by adults just for the sake of it, but now it makes sense. With your back to oncoming traffic, it may be possible to hear a fast-approaching vehicle in time to get out of the way (even when 'plugged in' to some sort of device) but this may not be the case when a silent but speedy bike is involved. Please keep on walking but keep safe. Don't walk on the 'wild' side - walk on the right side.

#### **CO-OP WINES**

Lockdown has meant that many of us bought wines online over recent months; as a result the wine trade did quite well out of it. Now we can get out and about more it is time to look to other sources and one of the supermarkets getting really good reviews of its wines at the moment is the Co-op, which of course is right on our doorstep. As I write this article, the Co-op in Stansted is selling a good white NZ Sauvignon Blanc from Yealands and their 2019 at £9.50 is a grassy mineral wine punching well above its weight. Other Co-op white wines to seek out include a 2019 Marsanne du Languedoc, a bold nutty white wine with apricot flavours at £8, and the Terre Madre Catarratto from Sicily, a natural citrusy wine at £6.50. Neither of these is currently in stock locally but worth keeping an eye out for in future should they appear.

The Stansted Co-op currently has many of the reds recommended so here are some suggestions. If it is a lighter red you are after the 2019 Co-op irresistible Pinot Noir from Chile at £8 is impressive for the price with light raspberry aromas and pleasant cherry and red fruit palette. They also stock the 2018 Côtes du Rhone La Grange St Martin, a silky-smooth damson and plum red that would go well with bangers or a late summer barbecue. Something with a little more weight is the 2019 Aussie old vine Grenache from Firebrand at £9.50 from 80-year-old bush vines and thus a serious concentrated palate of darker fruit and fruit cake spice. Good as the evenings draw in. Keep it local I say; well done the Co-op.

It is a lovely time of the year. I went for a short walk along Pennington Lane in the late afternoon sunshine and marvelled at the rich assortment of late summer fruits on the more than 20 different trees and shrubs which grow down the lane. Already there is a bountiful crop of ripe blackberries and plenty more to come. There are the red hips and haws mixed with the blue sloes and damsons and the green crab apples, hazel nuts and acorns.



Quite a few of the acorns have been infected by the little gall wasp maggots which act like a cancer in the acorn which becomes deformed into grotesque shapes. The verges contain a lot of dried seed heads and there are not many flowers at the moment but the pink mallow flowers are worth a close look and some of the burrs are impressive.

There is colour in the rose galls and the bright red berries of woody nightshade which stand out against the golden background of corn stubble. The presence of hops reminds one that there were breweries in Stansted and the osiers may have provided withies for basket makers. There is still a guelder rose almost overwhelmed by larger trees. Its red berries can be boiled up to make a sauce but can be fatal if eaten raw. There's a happy thought to finish on.


