THE ROYAL COMMISSION ON TUBERCULOSIS

Just as many of us have been rightly fearful of the Covid pandemic over the past year, so in the 19th century many lived in fear under the shadow of tuberculosis. This was of worldwide concern. The solution to one of the causes of TB was discovered following ten years of research in Stansted. In 1901 there was an International Congress on TB in London. The speech by the revered scientist Robert Koch, who had discovered the *Tuberculosis bacillus*, was eagerly awaited by the audience of world scientists (*see photo*). To their surprise and dismay Robert stated that humans could not be infected with bovine TB by drinking milk, unpasteurised at that time. Many scientists disagreed. It was decided a Royal Commission should be established.



The treasurer of this London Congress was Sir James Blyth who lived in Stansted. He immediately offered free use of farms in the village for research. For this willing contribution Sir James Blyth in 1907 became Lord Blyth.



This medical research was considered so important that, for the first time, it was funded by the government. The young scientists who did the work lived in houses in Stansted. Their ongoing results were carefully studied and supervised by experienced professors who regularly visited the village. Three wooden laboratories were also constructed here so the results could be analysed. All this took time and the final report was not issued until 1910; it stated that it had been proved beyond doubt that milk from cows who had TB could infect humans, particularly infants. This led to milk being pasteurised, which killed the TB bacteria. The Government fully understood the importance of this work and it was agreed that in the future they should fund medical research, which led to the founding of the internationally respected Medical Research Council.





THE STANSTED IN BLOOM GROUP

High Lane Junction Project

Liz Lake Associates have designed and started to implement some low maintenance seasonal planting to improve the character of the junction and ensure there is an attractive backdrop to the knight sign throughout the year. Inspired by the red and yellow of the Mountfitchet crest there will be a vibrancy to the winter planting which is missing at present. In summer the reds and yellows will give way to fresh greens and purples with plenty of flowers for wildlife. It will take some time for the planting to become established and you can appreciate its full impact, but we are confident it will become an exciting, memorable and well-loved entrance to the village all year round. The total cost of the project including the restoration work in the Knight sign and the planting and landscaping is in the region of £3,000. REDUNDANCY HELP FROM UTTLESFORD FRONTLINE

Job loss through redundancy confronts many of us in these uncertain times; even if it comes as no surprise, its impact cannot be underestimated. There are often severe financial consequences, an inevitable blow to self-esteem and of course the million-dollar question: what next? Redundancy is an extremely complex issue, and while employers have a legal obligation to follow correct procedures, it is always advisable to make sure you fully understand all the ins and outs of what is happening and are satisfied that your employer is fully compliant with the law. For instance, if you decide to accept an offer of 'suitable alternative employment' within your organisation, your employer is obliged to offer you a four-week trial period without affecting any of your statutory rights. If there is a suitable alternative job which is not offered to you, then this could be classed as unfair dismissal by an employment tribunal.

If you are unclear about the redundancy procedure, then trusted organisations such as Citizens Advice can help. They can also advise on the inevitable money problems that accompany redundancy, including how to handle debt problems, and identifying and applying for available benefits. Finding new employment is a challenge for anyone facing redundancy; today's jobs market is highly competitive and you may feel you lack the necessary skills for success. Practical help with job search, CV writing, application letters and interview techniques are offered free of charge by The Transition Project in Saffron Walden and the new Employment Support Scheme from the Council for Voluntary Service Uttlesford. Their volunteers are trained in negotiating the complexities of the job-seeking market. Details about all these services are instantly accessible from Frontline, a comprehensive online library of local resources giving you direct access to specialist organisations which provide help with many of life's problems - in most cases with the opportunity to self-refer. THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

This month begins with the Christian celebration of the two central commemorations of the church's faith: Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Good Friday finds us gathering around the cross of Jesus Christ. Christ suffers extreme physical, mental and spiritual pain and eventually dies on the cross. He bears costly witness in his own being to how deeply God in love suffers with each one of us and with everyone's experience of suffering and death. It will take us time to recover. Of course, the pandemic has not put a hold on suffering from other causes: sickness and bereavement, strife and unrest, famine and disaster. Hope to sustain us through what we now trust will be a one-way journey out of the worst of the pandemic. Love and hope renewed within us to encourage us to reach out to others in all their suffering, however it is caused. This is the ministry of the crucified and risen Christ to us. On a personal note, this is the last message I shall write in The Link as I move on later this year into retirement from Stansted and the other communities where I minister locally. It has been a joy to minister to you through The Link and, for one final time, I pray that God will bless you all with the love that lies at the heart of our Easter story.

At this difficult time, we are fortunate to live in such a lovely area where we can take exercise close to home in attractive and interesting surroundings. One of the local delights is the number of thatched buildings. Thatch was once the roofing choice of the poor as it was locally sourced, inexpensive, and sustainable; now it seems that only the better-off can afford the necessary regular servicing and replacement. Most roofs are thatched with long wheat straw and many are topped out with a decorative straw feature on the apex. These are called straw finials. Pheasants and foxes are still among the favourites for this tradition that goes back centuries. These finials may once have been installed to keep away birds or even witches, while some may have been the trademark of the individual thatcher. Today, they are more likely chosen by the customer from an online catalogue. They seem to be more abundant and varied than ever. I have spotted some fine examples around The Hundred Parishes. Do keep looking up!



NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN 2021

WHY IS A PLAN NEEDED

A Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) is a means of enabling residents to participate in and contribute towards improving the social, economic and cultural well-being of their local area.

It is part of the Government's approach to planning that aims to give local people more say about future development in their area. Deciding where any future development should go is a primary part of any NDP, but it is also about much more than that.

It allows the Plan Area to be considered holistically to ensure that development is sustainable in the future and, if adopted, the Plan will carry considerable weight when discussing Stansted with other authorities.



Access for young people to sports pitches and play areas is just one area dealt with in the Plan.

WHAT ISSUES DOES THE PLAN COVER?

The plan covers a range of areas. Below we name a few of these but by no means all of them:

- What is Stansted a Village or a Town?
- · Provision for health and well-being
- Highways issues (we have lots of these)
- The local economy including our shops and businesses
- Green infrastructure landscape, views, footpaths
- Provision for sports what do we need?
- Our Under-18's what can we offer you?
- Housing do we take more, and if so where?

The draft Plan contains 12 chapters on specific issues and we will be seeking your feedback to questions relating to each of them.

WHY ARE WE BEING CONSULTED?

Opinions shape the plan. Stansted belongs to all of us, not just to the group of volunteers compiling the document. That's why we we are seeking to engage as many residents as possible to ensure we hear a broad range of views that reflect the entire community.

Consultation is also a regulatory requirement. It is not only desirable but also necessary to inform the decision makers. Further consultation will take place once the draft Plan is finalised, prior to a referendum being held.

HOW CAN WE LEARN ABOUT THE PLAN?

- Hard copies of documents will be available from our office and community areas around the village.
 You will also be able to request copies via email or telephone.
- Videos on Facebook and our website will highlight key issues for each of the 12 consultation documents
- Our weekly newsletter will provide regular updates throughout the consultation
- Short online surveys seeking feedback on key aspects
- Door-to-door leaflet drops
- Direct face-to-face engagement in community settings

Whether it be online surveys, informative videos or community events, school projects, workshops or popup stalls, the Council will endeavour to seek broad dialogue across the community.

WHAT IS THE TIMETABLE?

The aim is to start the consultation in April 2021 seeking feedback on one of the 12 topics each week. The consultation kicks off online with a short survey seeking your



view on a simple question - is Stansted a town or a village?

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER CONSULTATION?

Once the consultation stage has been completed, a draft plan will be submitted to the local planning authority. Before they make a decision on whether to approve the plan, it needs to be assessed by an independent examiner, who seeks to ensure it meets a number of basic qualifying criteria - for example if the plan enhances the preservation of an area's character or appearance.

Once the plan has the approval of the local planning authority and the independent examiner, there will be a referendum. This will allow residents the opportunity to approve the adoption of the plan.

ELECTIONS 2021

You can participate in three elections next month with chances to vote at parish and at county level, as well as the opportunity to select the next Police Fire and Crime Commissioner. Voting day for all three elections is Thursday May 6, with a deadline for postal voting of 5pm that day.

If you wish to either stand or vote in the elections there are some key dates to keep in mind this April:

April 1 Poll Cards sent to all households

April 8 Deadline nomination papers

April 19 Deadline Voter Registrations - students can

register to vote at home and university but

can only vote once

April 20 Amend/Cancel postal votes

April 27 Proxy Vote deadline



WHO CAN I VOTE FOR?

You can help select candidates for a couple of vacancies at the Parish Council. Both the north and south electoral wards of the village have a councillor position that needs filling. Successful candidates will represent their community on the Parish Council and help it shape planning decisions, define bye-laws, and oversee local spending.

COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTIONS

There are 75 councillors elected to Essex County Council, where decisions are made on schools, roads, and social care, among other responsibilities. Your vote will decide who represents the Stansted Division.

The County Council also hosts the Essex Youth Assembly. Elections are held every two years. In 2019, almost 25,000 young people voted. Voting for the Assembly will take place from April 12-30, with countywide declaration events revealing the newly elected members to be held on May 10. A previously elected representative for Uttlesford was George Braeckman, now on the Stansted Youth Council (see page 2).

POLICE, FIRE & CRIME COMMISSIONER

Police, Fire and Crime Commissioners are elected every four years. The last run-off was in May 2016 and the Covid crisis has postponed voting by a year. On May 6 you can choose the next Commissioner to act as the voice of the people, holding the police and fire services to account in their efforts, for example in the case of the police, to reduce crime.

CAN I VOTE?

First you must be over 18. Next make sure you are on the electoral roll. If you are 16+ and have a national insurance number, apply at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote. If you are without a poll card by Friday 9 April 2021, this may mean you are unregistered.

Check especially if you have moved house recently, and also if you have moved within an election district. You can do so by visiting the 'registering to vote' page at GOV.UK or by calling 01799 510510. A letter will confirm your registration or request further details to put you on the roll.

Young people can vote in the Youth Assembly Elections by using a ballot paper at participatory schools or youth clubs.

ANONYMOUS REGISTRATION

People who may be at risk of danger if their name and address were to appear in the electoral register have the option of signing-up anonymously with the Electoral Commission, which lasts a year.

POSTAL VOTES

If you cannot get to the polling station on the day of an election you can vote by post. Postal voting is open to anyone so long as their name appears on the electoral roll. Applications must be received by 5pm on Tuesday, April 20.

PROXY VOTES

You can also request a proxy vote if you want someone to vote on your behalf because you can't get to a polling station. Proxy voting is restricted to certain categories of people. The deadline for applications is Tuesday, 27 April at 5pm.

POLLING STATION

The public library at the Mountfitchet Exchange will serve as one of the polling stations for the village on May 6. Voting booths are open 7am-10pm.

DEADLINES FOR CANDIDATES

Nomination papers to enter the election races for the posts of Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, Essex County Councillor, and Parish Councillor need to be submitted by April 8.

UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Ayub Khan writes:

It would be remiss for me to start my update without mentioning the magnificent work of Stansted Surgery to administer the COVID 19 vaccine to Stansted and surrounding area residents. The staff and volunteers have worked so hard and we applaud them for their efforts.

Uttlesford District Council (UDC) has now agreed the budget for 2021/22. Key headlines are:

- Funding for projects across Uttlesford to address the climate emergency
- Funding to support Business for post COVID recovery
- Funding for sports facilities in the largest settlements across Uttlesford

In addition, UDC has agreed a 3% increase in council tax for the forthcoming year. This represents an increase of £5 on a Band D property. Government funding for Local Government has reduced over the last few years. UDC, like other local authorities, needs to find ways to close the funding gap to ensure essential services are maintained.

When it comes to the leadershp of UDC by Residents for Uttlesford (R4U), there are some important issues to share with you. Cllr Alan Dean touched on these in his article for the February edition of the Link.

Over the last few months, we have witnessed an external auditor refusing to sign off the annual accounts because of a police investigation into one or more councillors.

To add to our concerns, at the Council meeting on the 8th December 2020, R4U Councillors voted down a motion put forward by Cllr Caton to uphold the code of conduct and the Nolan principles, which are the basis of ethical standards in public life. That's since been corrected.

More controversially, the majority proceeded to invest £38m in a company closely associated with the arms industry and, according to Oxfam, with the humanitarian tragedy in Yemen. All Stansted's district councillors voted against this investment. This might have been avoided if the Council had established an ethical investment policy, something that Cllr Sell, and I, as members of the Investment Board, have been calling for since 2019.

You may ask the reason why I am sharing this information with you. Well, to have good public services we need people in power who have integrity and who demonstrate good ethical leadership.

I, along with my colleagues, will continue to challenge poor leadership, standing up for what we think is right.



The balance organs or vestibular system

The prime job of these is to tell us which way is up and which way we are going. There are two distinct parts of the vestibular system: the semi-circular canals and the otolith organs. The first detects head movements as they are occurring, the second where the head is in space when it has stopped moving and also detects linear motion and acceleration or deceleration. The eardrum is part of the inner ear and all signals from the balance organs and the eardrum travel up the same cranial nerve to the brain for further processing.



It is the first system to develop within the womb; all other systems grow out of it and are inextricably interlinked. If you look at a letter on a wall and nod your head, the object should stay absolutely still, no matter how you waggle or shake your head, at whatever speed. This is a job of the semi-circular canals. If you look at that letter and tip your head in any direction and keep it there, the clarity of the vision should remain the same; it is quite possible it will improve or get worse. This is a job of the utricles. There are many signs of vestibular issues. Needing to hold onto the bannisters when going up or down stairs (like Donald Trump), finding heights challenging, wide stance, vertigo ... the list goes on. It is also a major driver of scoliosis (sideways curvature of the spine). Motion sickness may be a vestibular problem; it is certainly an integration problem of vision and movement. Finally, sound into an ear affects the vestibular system and can be a terrific rehabilitation tool; all part of the complex and fascinating world of applied neurology. Are you, or someone you know, suffering from a bereavement? If you have suffered a loss, whether Covid-related or from any other cause (illness, old age, accidents and trauma, suicides, miscarriages and stillbirths) then please accept my condolences. You are not alone; this pandemic has brought to the forefront the fact that death and grief are universal. Please reach out to someone if you need to.

If you know someone who has suffered a loss, please check in on them. Ask them how they are today (because their grief will change by the day, sometimes by the hour). And please do not think about 'not wanting to hurt them' and avoid mentioning the name of the person they have lost; they are very aware that they have lost a friend, a partner, a child, a parent, a sibling. They are already hurting. You mentioning their name will not hurt them any further, but avoiding saying their name could do just that. In our current world where our human contact is limited, the awkward shunning of a recently bereaved person because of not knowing what to say is even more isolating. Heads up no-one really knows what to say. Even saying "I don't know what to say, but I am here for you" shows that you care. Ask them about their loved one: "Tell me about ...". However, things such as "They are in a better place" or "You can always marry again/have more children" can be misconstrued, so are best avoided. Meet them where they are that day, be present, and listen. They may not want to talk much. They may be desperate to talk about them. You cannot fix what has happened, but you can be there so that they are not facing it alone. Take care, everyone.



STANSTED EVENING WI

Our speaker on Zoom for our February meeting was Annamaria Dall'Anese, a Blue Badge guide for London. Our president had asked if she could link her talk to Valentine's Day. She put together a presentation called *Love in the paintings from the London Collections*, which she devised just for us.

From the National Gallery she spoke of Titian's Bacchus and Ariadne, the story of a god falling in love with a mortal then turning her into a constellation. She discussed Venus and Mars by Botticelli - the goddess of love and the god of war, which has been interpreted as the temptation of Adam by Eve. We saw Venus and Cupid by Bronzino, Van Eyck's Arnolfini portrait which depicts the love of money and the Rokeby Venus- a sensual painting by Velasquez of the naked Venus, completed when the painting of nudes was forbidden. Sadly, it was slashed with a meat chopper and damaged in 1914 by a suffragette. This led to all visitors' bags being checked when visiting the gallery. Next, she spoke of the Great Bed of Ware which is in the Victoria and Albert Museum (V & A), made around 1590 for an inn in Ware. The bed is three metres wide and reputedly accomodates four couples. Sir Toby Belch refers to it in Shakespeare's Twelfth Night. There were many more paintings with interesting stories; we would love to have her as a guide when we can visit London again.

Some of us joined in with meetings at Manuden and a WI in the Bodmin area of Cornwall, called St Mary Bonaventures. The talk was entitled *Sex, secrets and salacious gossip in the Royal Court 17th and 18th Century.* The speaker Sarah Slater is a tour guide at Hampton Court; we enjoyed hearing her stories and the answers to questions we had probably often wondered about but never asked! Their WI will be joining us for our March Zoom meeting when we will be entertained by James Haddow, the taxi-driver poet. We keep in touch with one another but so look forward to being able to meet together again.

We are celebrating the third anniversary since the launch of our social movement project, Compassionate Neighbours. This is an award-winning project which aims to help tackle loneliness within local communities. Since the project started in 2018, it has connected more than 300 people with 166 volunteers who have trained to become compassionate neighbours, giving an hour a week to offer social and emotional support to others who are isolated. The project has come into its own during the pandemic, when instances of isolation and loneliness have increased with lockdown, especially for those who are clinically vulnerable. To date, the project has already matched more than 150 socially isolated individuals. It is open to people to self-refer to the service or for professionals to make referrals. The volunteers are matched with community members based on common interests, lifestyles and experiences; both parties benefit from a mutual, supportive relationship as friends. For example, a mutual love of dogs often forms the basis of a long-lasting friendship.



The project is actively recruiting volunteers who are able to spare time to bring friendship to the lives of lonely people. Regular training sessions are being run, currently via online meeting platform Zoom, and volunteers are DBS checked prior to becoming compassionate neighbours. Volunteering is a rewarding role where people can build genuine friendships by calling or meeting a local, socially isolated person every week.
