Investigators is a group for children aged around 7-11 years on Fridays 6.30pm-8pm in the Free Church Hall. We enjoy a mixture of games, challenges and creative activities. We also have a Bible story most weeks, and use this to stimulate discussion on topics relevant to children such as friendship, including and valuing everyone, sharing and encouraging others. Investigators has a lively, friendly and supportive atmosphere, with children from at least five different primary schools, and it has been successful in helping some quite shy children to boost their confidence. Investigators is run by Stansted Family Church. Although some children who come attend a church, or a church school, most do not and everyone is welcome. Just before Covid we made lanterns. and some bug-themed crafts, as well as playing various lively and quieter games. Dodgeball and balloon volleyball are definite favourites, as well as Islands and Sharks and Human Noughts and Crosses. The children have also created puppet plays and taken part in drama activities sometimes. No two Fridays are the same!

We are planning to return on 10th September after a long break caused by the pandemic. If your child would like to try out Investigators, please contact me as soon as possible as places are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Although most children attending are 7+ we do welcome some 6-year-olds, especially siblings. We know many do not want to wait until their 7th birthday to join in the fun, so there is some flexibility after their 6th birthday has been reached. All leaders are DBS checked, have appropriate safeguarding training, and are experienced in working with children.

Young members of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Questioning (LGBTQ+) community were able to express themselves among their school peers with time devoted to diversity. The school acknowledged Diversity Week with a programme of activities to bring about conversation. Students who attend the school's LGBTQ+ club and the student executive team helped to create a display of handprints decorated by their classmates showing their support to the community. Students also took part in a quiz about the LGBTQ+ community to get them thinking about the diversity of people around them. They also watched videos of young people's stories of growing up in the LGBTQ+ community and took part in a house challenge based around Diversity Week with maths, general knowledge and celebrity sections.



Sarah Power, enrichment lead, said: "The month of June is Pride month when we work with the LGBTQ+ charity Just Like Us to mark Diversity Week. We sign up every year to access their fantastic resources, masterclasses, workshops and guest speakers to promote LGBTQ+ in class. It was just so nice to see our students in this community being themselves completely in a safe space. They are very young and it was lovely to see them really happy. It was great to put up the display of hundreds of 'helping hands' to show our whole community coming together. It is important to show we are supportive of all of our students, regardless of their gender, background or sexuality. Students have been at home for a lot more time than usual and so have been exposed to just one or two opinions, which has had an effect on them. It has been good to be able to expose them to more."



MINDFULNESS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

What is Mindfulness?

In a nutshell, mindfulness is paying attention to what Is happening in the moment. It is about connecting to your breathing, tuning into your senses and listening to what your body is saying. It teaches you how to remain grounded and how to respond to situations thoughtfully instead of reacting impulsively. Teenagers can at times feel especially overwhelmed with what Is going on in their mind and body, and this is where mindfulness comes in. These overwhelming feelings and emotions can arise through pressures created by everyday things such as:

- responsibilities from school, college and university
- high expectations from others around them
- · emotional break ups and conflict

The feelings manifest themselves in symptoms of anxiety, stress and other mood disorders. Mindfulness provides techniques to deal with these over-arching emotions through the practice of meditation, group activities, discussions and games. I run fun and inspiring workshops which allow young people to explore gratitude and kindness, and assist in building resilience, self-esteem and confidence by helping to:

- build connection and communication skills
- focus on strengths within oneself as well as others
- explore empathy, compassion and humility in a non-judgemental environment
- increase positivity
- understand how emotions can manifest in the body
- regulate emotions.

Workshops are based on the *Youth Mindfulness SOMA* programme, and run over four modules. Day 1 can be attended as a taster day, Days 1 and 2 can be attended as a mini workshop; for full benefits, the four-day course is recommended. The days are made up of four 45-minute sessions with breaks and lunch, and there will be a certificate ceremony at the end of the fourth day which parents/carers are welcome to attend. During the school holidays, there are courses at various venues in Uttlesford including Stansted Free Church Hall. Mouth taping reduces snoring, increases immune system, improves sleep quality and reduces anxiety. Yes, taping your mouth shut at night sounded awful to me too. Read on. A good way to start this daunting drill is to start small. Get some micropore tape from the chemist, which is the best for this task. Others are too weedy and just slide off. Shut your mouth and place a small bit of tape vertically over the centre of your lips and go to bed. You will breathe out of the corners of your mouth during the night, but your mouth cannot hang open like a basking shark, so the snoring will be less and the tongue can sit higher within the mouth.



As you get used to this, increase the amount of mouth you cover, working up to covering the whole mouth so you have to breathe through your nose all night long. Now you get the benefits of nasal breathing: the warmed air passing through the mucus membranes, our first line of defence. When we get very stressed, we mouth breath. Therefore, breathing through the nose is interpreted by the brain as low stress levels, hence why it is calming. When we are asleep, we fight bears! At least we fight them calmly. So nasal breathing will help improve the quality of your sleep. It may also help teeth grinding and sleep apnoea. Nasal breathing is far more efficient, and one theory is that it is lack of oxygen that makes the teeth snap shut for a good grind, or wakes us up briefly to take a good breath. No, it will not cure everything but it is a good move in the right direction for minimal outlay and a moment of time, plus a handful of determination.



Our County Chairman said that the pandemic has not caused membership to drop as much as feared. There were two speakers: Danny Oakes and Nick Newlands. Danny played rugby throughout his school days and became a member of Thurrock Athletic Club. His ambition to be a professional rugby player was dashed when he was involved in a serious accident at the age of 21 in which he lost his right arm. He became determined to succeed despite this and tried various things before becoming an international Paralympic athlete and, as a runner, won a gold medal in the Athens Paralympics of 2004. He retired from top athletics in 2009 but has been involved in cycling, running marathons and commentating ever since.

Nick talked about his work for the charity Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW) of which the National Federation of WIs was one of the founding members. This supports rural women, helping them with training and development programmes and enabling them to earn money and improve family life. Nick sits on a committee which involves women's rights, some of which are being breached by governments. Most Institutes raise money each year for ACWW, so Jenny found Nick's information on the various projects very interesting. One of these is the Revolving Piggery Project, a scheme whereby women are given four piglets to rear and when they have increased in number, they donate two piglets to continue the project.

Hopefully you are all enjoying being able to get out into the garden and are making the most of the sunny weather. The harvesting of vegetable patches has begun; home grown food tastes so different, the short time between plot and pot makes such a difference. The flower borders are bursting with colour too; it is amazing how much growth and colour you get from those small seeds and tiny plants in just a couple of months! If you sit with your eyes closed and just listen - the garden is alive with the buzz of bees and bird song. Dead-heading your plants and roses will help them to continue to flower over the summer. Some plants though need a real hair-cut; hardy geraniums are a good example. When the first flush of flowers is over, cut the plants right down leaving just the newest shoots and you will get a second flush of flowers towards the end of the summer. It is also an ideal time to start sowing biennial seeds (Sweet William, wallflowers, honesty, foxgloves, etc.) so they get a head start. They will start to flower as early as May next year.

Open Gardens

Every week more and more gardens are opening their doors and welcoming visitors again. Many of the National Garden Scheme open gardens are small family gardens and on occasions the number of visitors has to be restricted; it is always advisable to check in case booking is required.

Future Meetings

At the moment the Day Centre is still closed. However, there is light at the end of the tunnel as there are on-going talks with a third party regarding the running of the centre. As soon as we hear anything we will let everyone know. In the meantime, enjoy your gardens.

At our monthly Open Day on **Sunday 22nd August**, we will celebrate the variety of trees at the gardens which reflect the enthusiasm of plant collectors in the Victorian and Edwardian era. Many of the venerable species are not native to the UK; for example there is a sequoia by the car park: *Wellingtonia gigantea* (named after the Duke of Wellington after his death in 1852); a huge cedar of Lebanon, planted by Edward Prince of Wales in the late 19th century and a marsh cypress, which is native to the South East of America.

Harold Peto used trees to create structure in his designs for the gardens in 1902. He introduced formal avenues of pleached limes, which enclosed the Countess' treehouse in an oak, and limes and yews lined the side of what we now call the Glade. The Countess of Warwick's son, Maynard Greville, added further trees.



Do join us on 22nd August to learn about our trees. We will showcase those which, by dint of their height or girth, are county champions and our national champion apple tree, the *Easton Countess*. This old apple tree could not be identified and DNA analysis of its leaves confirmed that there was no known match, therefore it is unique to our gardens. We will also welcome the return of *Woodwind of Stortford*, who are itching to get out to play again once that is allowed.



RANDOM JOTTINGS

A few old harvest related tools

As it is harvest time, I searched the shed for a few old tools which would have been used at this time of the year. The photo shows the scythe which was the universal tool for cutting the corn for centuries before mechanisation took over.



In the angle of the scythe is a plaited leather belt with a holder for the sharpening stone, which was used little and often to maintain a sharp edge on the blade. The simple cranked tool with a hook is a wimble or straw twister which was used to make short straw ropes from the wheat straw which were then used to bind together the sheaves of cut corn.



The other photo shows this operation in a harvest scene on an old biscuit tin. There is a reaping sickle and a heftier bagging hook which I used recently to clear an overgrown patch, along with the crotched stick which was used to hook up any stuff lying flat.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS



GRASS CUTTING

s any green-fingered residents may well know, warm, wet summers like the one we have had this year are a boon to our hedges, lawns and verges. Days of sunlight and showers result in lush, green foliage that unfortunately becomes quickly overgrown.

Maintaining the village's green spaces isn't just about ensuring they don't become unsightly. It is also about ensur-

ing public safety. Overgrown hedges can block the views of motorists and tall grass can hide obstacles on footpaths from unwary pedestrians.

Cutting grass and clipping hedges to protect public safety is a task the Council takes seriously. This year £21,200 of our budget is set aside for this purpose. In the summer months, between April and September, the Council's contractors follow a timetable that sees them mow all local authority adminis-

tered lawns and verges twice a month. This is no small task. There are more than 50 grass areas in Stansted. This number includes the Cemetery and Churchyard, the Recreation Ground, Bentfield Greens and most of the verges along Cambridge Road.

Our efforts do not go unnoticed. At a recent Full Council Meeting, a long-time resident praised the Council for the upkeep of the Memorial Gardens on Chapel Hill, saying they looked the best they had ever been. Residents are also quick to point out areas of the village in need of attention. But arranging a cut or a quick prune can take time. Why is this?

Part of the reason for this is down to levels of local government responsibility. Not all of the hedges and verges fall under the Parish Council's control. Take the neglected verges at Foresthall Park - those belong to Essex Highways. Meanwhile Uttlesford District Council retain ownership of many of the verges surrounding the Mountfitchet Estate.

Clouding the picture of responsibility further, the Parish Council has entered into a formal agency agreement with Essex County Council to cut the areas in Stansted they otherwise would be duty bound to up-keep. This agreement has been in place for very many years and therefore does not extend to Foresthall Park! (Boring fact - the Parish Council cannot spend public money on maintaining land which it does not own or have a legal agreement for - hence we can't just take on the Essex-owned bits of FHP).

So who should you report to a patch of grass that needs cut or hedge that needs a trim?

In the first instance contact the Parish Council. We will be able to identify which authority is responsible for the land in question. If it falls under our care, we can work with our contractor to resolve the issue. We can also raise your concern with other tiers of local government when responsibility lies elsewhere.

STANSTED CEMETERY

One area of the village that demonstrated exemplary community and Council co-operation on grass cutting has been the Stansted Cemetery. The grass appeared to be running riot and residents rightly brought this to our attention, though all was not necessarily as it seemed.

Parts of the cemetery where spring daffodils had grown were deliberately allowed to become fallow. Best practice calls for vegetation in such spots to be left for between 6-8 weeks. This affords time for vegetation to die back naturally so next year bulbs will bloom successfully.

Letting nature take its course meant grass and weeds in these areas thrived without a mow. Now the waiting



period has passed, the normal cycle of mowing has resumed and the overgrowth has been brought under control.

The installation of a rabbit-proof fence at the start of the year has also had an unintended consequence. The strimmers used to deal with the thick vegetation in the rest of the cemetery are too powerful for the fence. Cutting growth too close to it would result in the netting being torn. Avoiding this has meant allowing foliage to grow longer at the cemetery's edge.

And then there has been the nature of the ground itself. The cemetery is densely populated with graves and gravestones which make cutting the grass challenging if damage is to be avoided. Over the summer, the Council's contractor has been training up a new staff member to take on this task. While they have been learning the ropes, there has been more space for weeds and grass to grow. It is hoped with time and experience tighter, neater cuts of the grass in the cemetery will naturally result.

The contractor kindly scheduled an extra cut for the cemetery. We are pleased to report that it is looking in much better shape now. We would like to thank the public for bringing this issue to our attention, as well as for their patience whilst we sought an explanation and arranged a remedy.



ikki Morris is keen to meet you to discuss crime-related matters at her Street Beat events. The PCSO, who is partly funded by the Parish Council, sets her stall out each month at a venue around the village to hear residents' concerns about crime in the area.

PCSO Morris says the meet-and-greet sessions are vital, not just to pick up intelligence about local crime from the public, but also because the events serve as a reminder that the police are active in the community fighting crime.

At a recent event, PCSO Morris and Police Constable Steve Sharma chatted to residents outside the Surgery. A busy session saw them offer advice on how to manage online

abuse and how to deal with intrusive neighbours, as well as strengthen community ties by minding a shopper's dog! The public were also invited to take away free torches, stickers to ward off cold callers, personal alarms and door-handle alarms (useful for securing a shed).

Over the summer PCSO Morris has been busy conducting speed checks in Stansted and ensuring knives are kept off our streets by manning a knife arch at the train station. She says that much local crime is low level, typically confined to issues of anti-social behaviour and neighbour disputes.

"I would advise people not to get involved themselves if there is a problem relating to anti-social behaviour," she says. "The safest thing is to write down the details of the incident and report the situation to the police using the 101 number."

She adds that not all anti-social behaviour is necessarily a crime and urges the public to engage with Uttlesford District Council, which has a dedicated team to deal with the issue.

The next Street Beat session is on 29 July at Foresthall Park. Times and dates are subject to change.

Paul and his family moved to the village in 2019 and were previously residents of Little Dunmow, where Paul served as an Uttlesford District Councillor for four years prior to relocating.




Party affiliations aside, he is keen to put people before politics and to promote anything that stands to benefit the community.

Ayub Khan District Councillor reports



Vote of No Confidence

The Stansted and Stort Valley Councillors, as well as members from other opposition groups, produced a motion of No Confidence in the R4U Leader and Cabinet at Uttlesford District Council (UDC) on 28th June. The motion was put because since being elected in 2019, R4U has presided over a catalogue of failures. These include a failed appeal on Stansted Airport expansion where the Inspectors have awarded costs

against UDC, a current police investigation into one or more R4U councillors and a culture of bullying and deceit. The loss of the appeal on airport expansion will be expensive. UDC legal fees alone are in the region of £1.1m, add in Manchester Airport Group's costs, and you can see a bill of more than £2.5m. This is money that could have paid for valuable services across the district. The Council's accounts for 19/20 have still not been signed off by the External Auditor and whilst the police and internal investigation continues, the 20/21 accounts will remain unsigned. The number of R4U councillors meant that the motion was defeated, yet we have exposed the maladministration of R4U. Integrity matters in any political administration because the public demand it. You can listen to the debate as the recording is now available on the UDC website.

A new Chief Executive

Rob Tinlin is the Interim Chief Executive at UDC. Rob replaces Dawn French who has decided to spend more time with her family after several years working in local government. Rob brings significant experience to UDC, having previously led a large unitary authority. His immediate priorities will be to focus on the big issues such as the Local Plan, as well as provide good leadership to the paid staff of UDC. Stansted Councillors have already met with Rob and very much look forward to working with him.

Local Plan

Work continues to develop a new Local Plan for the district. The new plan will now require the district to build 706 new homes per year until 2040. The previous plan which R4U withdrew had a requirement of 636. The increased number will put pressure on the whole of the district as well as our own neighbourhood development plan for Stansted. Put simply, speculative development as well as developers building homes that offer no additional facilities for the community such as new doctor's surgeries, dentists and schools is not sustainable. Clearly, the Conservative government continue to push through new planning laws which is making it difficult for local authorities to oppose. House building is needed, but they must be carefully thought through and planned. Sadly, this does not seem to be the case.

Day Centre Provision

The plans for our new community provision including The Day Centre, operated through Touchpoint ,are progressing well. I am working with colleagues at UDC to secure funding to enable some refurbishment to take place at the premises. This is a valuable service and the exciting plans that Touchpoint have will be of great benefit to the whole of Stansted.

Stansted South District Councillor surgeries

Now that restrictions are beginning to ease, Cllr Melvin Caton and I will be re starting surgeries for the community in Stansted South from September. These will take place on a Saturday 10 am – 12 pm. Further details and dates will be posted on local Facebook pages as well as the Parish Council website.

Finally, it is worth taking the time to congratulate the team at Stansted Surgery for their continued work in administering the vaccine. In addition, the contribution of the range of volunteers and community groups across Stansted from litter picking, to flood control, to speed watch cannot be underestimated. Thank you for all that you do.

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY - POSTCARDS


On a recent visit to Thaxted's Tourist Information Centre, I could not resist buying their new set of postcards, featuring some of the town's well-known views. Nowadays, it is quite unusual to see postcards for sale and even rarer to receive one in the post. How times have changed.

Picture postcards became extremely popular in the UK after the introduction in 1902 of the format with a picture on the front and a divided back - half for the address and the other half for a message. Pictures were generally black and white but sometimes coloured.

Popularity waned after the First World War but it remained customary to send postcards to family and friends from somewhere visited on holiday or a day out. That custom has now almost died out, no doubt due in part to the availability - albeit only in this century - of more immediate means of exchanging messages and photos electronically.









Many people used picture postcards for sending short messages. Until 1918 it cost only an old halfpenny to send a card; that is 480 cards for £1 (today's price is 66 pence per card). In those early days, there could be as many as five postal deliveries in a day, so it was not unreasonable to expect a reply the same day.

Almost every town and village had its own postcard or set of postcards, not just seaside towns. Within the Hundred Parishes, it seems that only one parish has never had a postcard: Flitch Green, which became a parish only in 2008. Many of those old cards have survived and often provide a revealing insight into our past and into an earlier way of life, such as buildings, roads, transport and dress.

We had a Zoom meeting of Forum members on 2nd July and are pleased to give an update on what we are doing. The Accountancy Practice has stayed open during the pandemic with staff working from home. Nature Notes

Wildlife in the Garden

Heeding a plea from environmentalists, I did not mow the lawn during May to allow any wild flowers to grow which would attract insects and benefit wildlife generally. The buttercups and daisies put on a good show and the pigeons liked the chickweed seeds and no doubt lots of other little creatures had a good time. Apart from an impressive hay crop I was struck by the variety of wild flowers blooming in the garden, which at any other time would be called weeds.



There were over 20 different wild flowers, mostly with small insignificant blooms, but when looked at closely many can be as eye-catching as our larger garden flowers.



Above is a photo of two of these little weeds and also a photo of a pair of ladybird larvae apparently drinking dew instead of doing what they are supposed to do, which is devouring the greenfly and blackfly which are also thriving in this eco-friendly environment.

Swifts will have already left for Africa by mid-August. Swallows (see photo below) and house martins hang around a little longer and can be seen on telephone wires, meeting up in groups ready to migrate, applying the adage 'there is safety in numbers'. It is harder to spot some of our shy all-year-round residents, such as the dunnock and wren, hidden in hedges and thickets.



Many people put food out for birds, but fewer provide a regular supply of clean water. If you keep a bird bath well topped up with water, you will tempt birds out for early morning bathing as well as provide much-needed drinking water in dry weather. It is a good idea to raise your birdbath off the ground, and place it in the open, giving birds a clear view of danger. Keeping a bird bath clean helps to prevent birds catching diseases; you should clean it regularly and change the water. A layer of algae, dead leaves or bird droppings will soon build up, so give the bath a thorough clean every week or so. Scrub the sides and bottom to remove algae and other dirt. You can use dilute household disinfectants, but make sure that you rinse the bath out thoroughly to remove any traces of chemicals. There are also non-toxic products on the market which can be used to clean bird baths.
