As each day lengthens, trees, shrubs, plants and bulbs are bursting into life. The buds and blossom on the trees are a sign that spring is in full flow; some tree flowers are just ornamental whereas fruit tree blossom promises rewards in the late summer or autumn. The birds in the hedgerows and garden shrubs are getting ready for the nesting season, flying hither and thither with twigs etc as their intricate nests are built camouflaged by the new growth.

In the garden, many of the earlier daffodils have gone over, but tulips are taking their place. From origins in the Ottoman Empire to fame in the Netherlands, this is a flower that has remained popular for centuries. Tulip



flowers come in all shapes and colours, some like wine glasses others like a ballerina's tutu. Starting to fill those blank spaces are the perennial plants. In addition, it is now time to start sowing annual seeds, one-season wonders that will give a splash of colour, most of which are loved by bees and butterflies and can be cut and brought inside to be enjoyed. This is also the time of year to start sowing your summer crops. Many people grew their own food for the first time last summer, which led to a seed shortage in some parts of the country. Enjoy an afternoon out at a nursery or garden centre and buy your seeds. A word of warning though: with the unpredictable British weather, be wary of late frosts before sowing or planting out. Please take care everyone and stay safe until this nasty virus has been beaten; we will let everyone know as soon as we get the go-ahead to reconvene meetings.

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Many of us wait anxiously for the outcome of the recent public inquiry into a possible increase in the passenger cap at Stansted Airport, yet the local community's love-hate relationship with Stansted Airport is only the latest in a series of significant aviation events that have occurred within the Hundred Parishes.

In a field at Standon Green End in the parish of Thundridge, a monument marks the spot where Italian balloonist Vincenzo Lunardi landed in 1784 after completing the first manned flight in England. He took off from London beneath a balloon filled with hydrogen. In 1913, Bentfield Hucks was the first Englishman to loop-the-loop in his Bleriot aeroplane. He was born in 1884 in Bentfield Cottage, Stansted and thus acquired his unusual forename.

Duxford airfield, now the site of Imperial War Museum, Duxford, first became operational in World War I. Some of its buildings, constructed by German prisoners-of-war, still stand. In 1938, Duxford was the first airfield to take delivery



of Spitfire fighter planes. Frank Whittle flew regularly from here while he was developing ideas that eventually led to the invention of the turbojet engine just before the end of WWII. Altogether, twelve military airfields operated

within the Hundred Parishes during WWII. Andrewsfield, straddling the parish boundary between The Salings and Stebbing, was the first American-built base in Europe, becoming operational in 1943. Stansted was another American-built airfield. Thousands of Americans were based in this area; many never saw home again.

Many of us have enjoyed the relative peace that the Covid-19 pandemic has brought to our skies, in particular discovering the joy of walking in the countryside. It is sad that it has taken so many deaths to remind us of the quality of life that exists right here, without the need to fly.

Refused, Bloor Homes Planning at Bentfield Green

By now, many of you will know that Uttlesford District Council issued a planning refusal notice in March to Bloor Homes for their proposed development on Pennington Lane at Bentfield Green. The refusal was very comprehensive, citing various conflicts with planning policies including things such as: inappropriate design layout and scale in relation to the character of the setting and surrounding areas, not representing sustainable development, detrimental impact on the Bentfield Green conservation area, loss of open countryside outside the development limits and of agricultural land, no health impact assessment, insufficient information for the Highway Authority to determine acceptability and harmful urbanisation of the site. This is a great outcome by any measure, and I would like to thank everyone for their hard work in making this happen and to all of you who wrote to object. There were over 1500 objections which is unprecedented. Be sure, your efforts were critical to achieving

I would also like to thank our Councillors at all levels who have given us and the community their unswerving support. There is no doubt that the concerted effort by all involved has helped to ensure a refusal by the planning authorities. Bloor Homes have issued a notice of Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate. If this appeal is determined to be 'valid' by the Planning Inspectorate, then Save Stansted Village (SSV) along with the Stansted Parish Council will apply for 'Rule 6' status, whereby we will request to be an active party in the inquiry, as was the case during the Taylor Wimpey inquiry in 2013. Rest assured, we will do everything in our power to achieve the same outcome. The timing of any Inquiry is yet to be determined, but is likely to be in the third quarter of 2021.



The Stansted Airport Public Inquiry to consider plans for further airport expansion ended on Friday 12th March after eight weeks of evidence hearings and cross-examinations. The panel of three inspectors will decide whether to approve the proposals, and a decision is expected in around three months. On the first day, Uttlesford District Council (UDC)'s barrister declared that Manchester Airport's Group (MAG)'s proposals were acceptable, subject only to certain

timid conditions. It was an extraordinary start to UDC's defence of the decision made by its Planning Committee in January 2020, by a margin of 10 votes to nil, to refuse permission for the expansion proposals. UDC failed to defend the decision of its own Planning Committee.

This Inquiry might not have been necessary if UDC had supported SSE's call, three years ago, for the Secretary of State for Transport to deal with the Stansted Airport Planning Application nationally. Instead, UDC insisted on dealing with the application itself, despite its limited resources and expertise in this area. UDC submitted evidence to the Inquiry on just four topics and for each topic it concluded that MAG's proposals were acceptable. By contrast, SSE's team of specialists, supported by external expert consultants and two of the country's top planning barristers, presented comprehensive evidence to the Inquiry on 11 separate topics. The result was that MAG directed most of its firepower at trying to counter the SSE evidence, rather than UDC's evidence. SSE Chairman Peter Sanders commented "We all realise that this is a David and Goliath battle, but it is important to remember that it was David who won that battle, and he did so by giving it his best shot. That is exactly what SSE has done on this occasion. We must now wait to see whether the powerful evidence that we have submitted will be enough to win the day."

BRAIN TRAINING

You cannot beat a good stare. Do a few squats and notice how low you can go, how straight your feet are and how upright you can keep your back. Now stare straight ahead at a target and do not let your gaze waver. Do some more squats. Now try the diagonals: find targets up left/right, down left/right. With the gaze fixed in one of those positions at a time, do a few more squats, making sure both eyes can see the target. Apart from anything else, I bet you were less bored than doing 30 squats in the normal way. For a bonus 10 squats, try fixing your eyes directly left, then directly right. Most people's movement improves with a good stare, particularly in the best eye position for them. The reasons why are extremely complicated; applied neurology is. However, fixing the eyes is very activating for huge amounts of the brain, both old and new brains. Movement is brain derived. Better brain, better movement, better thought: to keep the eyes fixed on a point requires concentration. It is much easier to let the eyes have a little wander about. Disciplined eyes underpin many sports and martial arts, as the picture is demonstrating.



The compass point fixations activate lots of things, but particularly the part of the balance organs or vestibular system which helps regulate blood pressure and heart rate: blood pressure should rise when we stand up to prevent dizziness, and the heart rate should respond rapidly and adequately to changes in activity level. If you are prone to dizziness when standing or your heart ceases to pound only slowly, this is a good drill to work on.

Our open spaces have been invaluable to us and more of us have been walking the lanes and footpaths around our local fields this last year, maybe for the first time. I hope you are enjoying all the wildlife around you along the way. Did you know we are lucky enough to have skylarks and yellowhammers on some of those fields? Lucky because numbers of these ground nesting birds have seen a big decline since the 1990s and are still in decline. Have you seen them? For skylarks look up high and listen for their melodic song.

What you can do to help Adults, children and dogs can cause stress to breeding birds if they walk or run freely through nesting areas. A nest often will not be visible until you are



walking on it. Even if no physical harm is done to the birds, being disturbed may cause the parent to desert a nest and it can also cause birds to scatter, making them vulnerable to predators, like birds of prey. Repeated disturbances can also stress birds out, use up valuable energy and leave them weaker and more vulnerable to other threats. A field may have cereal crops in it or silage (grass crop). Some fields may have been left fallow (unused) and you may think there are only weeds or wildflowers growing so it does not matter if you take a short cut across. Please think about these precious birds who may have made their nests in our neighbourhood and walk on designated footpaths. The breeding season can be April to August so we need to be mindful all summer long and help these birds as much as we can. Thank you.

CALL FOR SITES

The Parish Council is looking to deliver up to 8 almshouses to remain affordable in perpetuity and are keen to hear from landowners willing to donate land on a legacy or philanthropic basis to this project.

Almshouses on Church Road were sold in 2013 after they had become unsuitable as homes for the elderly and proved too expensive to modernise.

The sale netted three quarters of a million pounds which has been set aside to fund the project, while a recent partnership with Legacy East Almshouse Partnership (LEAP) has added momentum to the Council's plans.

LEAP runs more than 14 almshouses - most of which are in Essex - and the local charity will manage those built in Stansted under the Council's scheme.

Almshouses have a long history in the village, with the ones in Stansted dating back to the 1830s when one of the Fullers, a family of wealthy London bankers, married a local landowner.

LEAP and the Council wish to honour the Fullers' original wishes of providing homes for older people who have been unable to buy their own home during their working lifetimes.

It is hoped the homes can be built as a series of bungalows around a courtyard with benches to help residents socialise. The ideal size for a plot of land would be at least one-third of an acre.

RECYCLING INITIATIVE


Terracycle has established several local drop-off points to make it easier for residents to recycle more and reduce community waste. Once collected, Terracycle manages the recycling process.

UTTLESFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cllr Geoffrey Sell writes:

UTT/20/212 Land west of Pennington Lane

I should like to thank the hundreds of residents who objected to this planning application. I am convinced that it made a difference.

Bloor Homes application was for up to 168 properties. There was a real danger that time would run out and the application be non-determined as was the case with Fairfields at Elsenham.

Thanks to the intervention of Cllrs Melvin Caton and Janice Loughlin, members of the planning committee officers issued a refusal notice. The application did not go before the planning committee. Compared to 2013 when the officer recommended approval in an adjacent location, this represented a big improvement.

A battle has been won but not necessarily the war. Bloor Homes will undoubtedly go to appeal. As happened eight years ago the Parish Council will join forces with Save Stansted Village to ensure the appeal is dismissed.

Some of the reasons for refusal were:

- The design, layout, scale and appearance of the development is inappropriate in terms of the character of the site and surrounding area. The development would erode a distinctive open rural landscape area of significant importance to the character of this area of Stansted Mountfitchet, as well as the nearby conservation area and other heritage assets.
- The proposed development does not represent sustainable development as it cannot show that the economic, social and environmental aspects of the development are satisfied in a positive

- and beneficial way. The development scheme as submitted will involve a detrimental impact on the Bentfield Green conservation area and other local heritage assets and the loss of open countryside outside the development limits
- The loss of agricultural land and the impact on nearby heritage assets and the conservation area would outweigh the benefits of the development, especially with the limited level of mitigation being proposed.

STANSTED AIRPORT PUBLIC INQUIRY

The public inquiry into the appeal against the District Council's refusal against further expansion at the airport has concluded. We now await the verdict of the Inspectors. A decision is expected in around three months. The planning committee of which I was a member made the decision in January 2020 to refuse permission for the airport to expand to 43 million passengers per annum (MPPA).

Some councillors including myself were unhappy with the way UDC conducted the appeal. We made a number of representations to the leadership of the Council but to no avail. As Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) puts it:

"There was no attempt whatsoever by UDC to mount a robust defence of the decision of its own Planning Committee. MAG has made it clear that, if it wins its case, it will seek an award of costs against UDC but not against SSE. Costs at a Public Inquiry can only be awarded in the event of "unreasonable behaviour" and MAG claims that UDC behaved unreasonably in defending the appeal."

If Stansted Airport is successful in winning the appeal the consequence for the Council and the residents will be severe. Not only in environmental terms but also financial. An award of legal costs against the Council would be substantial.

Nature Notes

Elder Sambucus nigra

This is an exceptional tree, a constant in our hedgerows along with dog rose, hawthorn and bramble. The flowers are much smaller, and one could say much more fragrant, but it is not a perfume enjoyed by all. Today we might use the flowers in culinary delights, but better known as the base for elderflower wine, fizz (champagne) and cordial. My own favourite is the latter, steeping the flowers in vodka, then straining, and adding a little honey. This is a perfect winter pick-me-up on a cold day. This plant in its entirety has been regarded as the country medical chest. Elderflower tea in early spring could reduce the symptoms of hay fever. The flowers had pain-killing properties, could induce sweating, and could bring down a fever. The berries have always been regarded as a good source of Vitamin C and are being produced commercially into syrups as a treatment for winter ills. The leaves can be used in an ointment for sprains and strains.



Folk in the old days would use the flower-heads as an insect repellent and would hang bunches over the horses pulling carts to put off the irritating flies. Barns could be rid of mice and rats by strewing the leaves. The berries were used as hair dye or ink. "If the medicinal properties of the leaves, bark, berries etc were thoroughly known, I cannot tell of what our country-men could ail, for which he might not fetch a remedy from every hedge" said John Evelyn, a mid-18th century herbalist. When one thinks of it, many of our ancestors were poor, but nature was free to them, provided they knew how to use all the benefits.
