

Our October meeting brought the welcome return of Charlie Haylock who spoke of The History of Surnames. He was the Suffolk dialect advisor on the 2021 film The Dig starring Ralph Fiennes, Carey Mulligan and Lily James. He reminded us of the sounds of letters, particularly the vowels; many years ago they included the Letter Y. He ran through some of the derivations of many other letter combinations and the different sounds which they can provide. Surnames were relatively unknown in England until the Norman Conquest in 1066. People were commonly known for what they did or where they lived. If they lived in Stansted and they were a butcher they would be John the Butcher. If, for example, they moved to Elsenham then they were likely to be called John of Stansted. This changed significantly after the Norman Conquest in 1066. Many then had hereditary surnames. This caused havoc with the Anglo-Saxon population, but it has stayed to the present day. You can still change your name by deed poll.

Charlie regaled us with the origins of surnames of many of the members telling stories of these and of other talks he had given, some of them rather embarrassing. One lady, hearing of the origin of her surname caused laughter by agreeing, saying "That sounds just like me". It was a most enjoyable evening. Charlie has written a number of books and issued CDs on the subject, and anyone interested should search for him on the internet. The next meeting is on **Thursday 4**th **November** 8.00pm in the Day Centre when we welcome Tim Turner from Sworders who will talk to us about *The History of Hallmarks*.

At the end of September about 40 of us set off on a five day trip to Weymouth. We had fabulous weather and so were able to enjoy lots of time out. On the way down we visited Mottisfont, an 18th century building with a medieval priory at its heart and the largest plane tree in Britain. On the way home we visited Kingston Lacey, a lavish family home re-imagined as a Venetian Palace in the rural Dorset countryside. In between we visited the market towns of Dorchester and Bridport, Corfe Castle and the model village, and then to Swanage on the Heritage Steam Railway.



In October we visited Knole in Kent (see photo below) which has the last dedicated deer park. Originally an archbishop's palace, the house passed through royal hands to the Sackville family: Knole's inhabitants from 1603 to today. It is also home to some of the last surviving furniture from Whitehall and Hampton Court Palaces and splendid 17th century tapestries. It was a most enjoyable day and they made really good scones too!



In 2022 the trust is creating a U3A 40^{th} anniversary woodland in the Brecon Beacons. This will benefit the environment, wildlife and climate for future generations. The target is to plant 5,000 trees by 22^{nd} March. You can buy a tree at the U3A Brand Centre online.



It is only a Matter of Time

The locations where we are allowed to speed watch are: Church Road by Churchfields, High Lane by Mountfitchet House, Cambridge Road opposite Hargrave Close and Silver Street by Blythwood Gardens. There are only four of us and we all have other activities in our lives that we want and need to do. We urgently need more volunteers. The team will probably have to stop this activity sometime next year if more people do not volunteer to become speed watchers.

We were speed watching recently on Church Road when our young people were going home from school. This road has a very narrow pedestrian walkway with earth spilling onto it, making it even smaller. These young people and adults have to walk close to the kerb and it is very frightening as speeding vehicles miss them by millimetres; we are very concerned that a fatality may occur here. The speed limit is 30 mph and this needs to be strictly adhered to in this very dangerous road. 

Brain stacking is for improving cognitive ability, balance, and reducing tremors:

Stand on one leg and notice how wobbly you are. Most advanced: shut eyes, easiest: simply put feet together. With your right thumb draw a slow, smooth circle. Move only from the base of the thumb. Notice how this affects your balance. Now circle the left thumb; one thumb makes balance better and we will work only with this one. For simplicity, I am assuming that the left thumb gives the better balance. Swap these instructions to suit you.

Moving the left thumb activates the right side of the brain. To maximise the drill, we will add more inputs. After each sequence retest your balance.

- Begin by adding a nice smell, maybe a sprig of mint or vanilla. Sniff this with the *right* nostril if working on the left thumb. Retest your balance which should be improving
- Now rotate yourself so that light is coming onto your face from the left side, preferably from below.
 Do more slow, precise thumb circling whilst enjoying the smell
- Next input: try poking your tongue into your left cheek, whilst circling the left thumb, enjoying a whiff and light streaming onto your face from the left. If that does not work, circle your tongue around the outside of your teeth with the lips closed
- Final input: rhythm! You can use a ticking clock or download a metronome app and set it at 60bpm.
 Circle the thumb precisely at exactly that speed.



Not all these inputs will work for everybody but use as many of them as are effective for you while stimulating your brain. Of course, you can work through the other fingers of the same hand. Do **not** do it again reversing sides! You will utterly negate the considerable benefits.

Airport in Shameless Bid for More Night Flights

In last month's issue of The Link, we highlighted the need for the health and wellbeing of local residents to take priority over economic benefits, by ending night flights at Stansted Airport. Now Manchester Airports Group (MAG), the owners of the airport, have sent a submission to the Department for Transport (DfT) which includes a proposal that the current limit on the number of permitted night flights at Stansted should be completely removed. MAG has also told the DfT that it opposes proposed night-time bans of the noisiest aircraft types.

Stansted Airport Watch (SAW) Chairman Brian Ross pulled no punches when he raised the matter with the airport Managing Director at a meeting of the Stansted Airport Consultative Committee recently. He read out the terms of a planning agreement which Stansted Airport had signed with Uttlesford District Council (UDC) in May 2003. Neither the airport Managing Director nor his MAG colleagues were able to provide a satisfactory explanation for this clear breach of the planning agreement. SAW has now written to the Chief Executive of UDC asking him to intervene. SAW Noise Adviser Martin Peachey added: "Stansted Airport's 144-page submission to the DfT makes no mention whatsoever of the WHO's strong recommendation that aircraft noise at night should be brought below 40dB". SAW Chairman Brian Ross concluded: "This is not just about MAG putting profits before the health and wellbeing of local residents. It is also about trust and integrity. How can we have confidence in any agreement which Stansted Airport signs up to when MAG is prepared, shamelessly, to break that agreement when it is in MAG's financial interests to do so?"

Uttlesford Calls Time on Airport Planning Appeal

At a special meeting of UDC on 6th October, councillors decided not to proceed any further with its intended High Court appeal against the approval of the Stansted Airport planning application for a throughput of 43 million passengers per annum (mppa). SAW has relentlessly fought this planning application since the initial proposals were submitted by MAG in June 2017, and we had intended to support UDC in the High Court. That option no longer exists and we are, of course, bitterly disappointed that it has come to this. There is no further avenue for appeal.

However, having regard to all the circumstances, we believe that UDC had very little choice but to call a halt to its legal challenge. On 1st October, a senior High Court Judge, after reviewing UDC's case, refused permission for a full court hearing on the grounds that UDC did not have a sufficient legal basis to challenge the result of the Public Inquiry. There needs to be an independent inquiry to establish who should bear the responsibility and to learn lessons.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

BROWNFIELD LAND INTO GOLD

Soon after news that Bloor Homes had lost its Pennington Lane appeal, the Parish Council hosted a Full Council Meeting in September where two more developers presented plans for projects in and around Stansted.



Columbia Threadneedle Investments plan to turn 100 acres of brownfield land tied to Stansted Airport into a commercial estate creating 3,500 jobs in the tech, logistics, media and life science sectors.

Columbia Threadneedle Investments plan to develop 'incredibly rare' brownfield land bought at Stansted Airport in 2020, transforming it into commercial real estate. The company manages over 1,000 commercial property sites and had previously sketched out its plans to the Parish Council in March. It is now consulting residents before filing a planning application with Uttlesford District Council by the year's end.

The project calls for the construction of commercial premises built to high sustainability standards. Columbia Threadneedle expect the development to be a boon to local employment. They say up to 2,000 construction jobs could be created by the development. Meanwhile the tech, logistics, media and life science businesses attracted to the site could provide work for 3,500 people, many of them potentially local to Stansted. The developer is in talks with Stansted Airport College to explore synergies to enable students to train in fields beneficial to these new businesses.

IT'S A THUMBS DOWN TO PINES HILL

The second developer to further detail their plans was Luxus Homes, who wish to construct 31 homes in the village near Stoney Common. The site falls into an area that is part of the Metropolitan Green Belt.

The developer says this land, however, was designated in 2016 by Uttlesford District Council (UDC) of being worthy of only moderate protection, compared with the rest of the Green Belt in the district. They also believe that without a Local Plan and because of the pressing need for housing in the area, that as 48% of the development has been set aside for affordable housing, this should rule in its favour in the planning balance, where a project's harm is balanced against its benefit. Luxus Homes state their plan is much less intensive than ones previously rejected, some of which had intended to build up to 68 dwellings on this site.

The Parish Council disagrees. Along with over 30 residents who have written to UDC calling for this project to be rejected, we say the project is unsustainable. It comes with few extra amenities, such as play areas, for example. We note that the ecological and road assessments are incomplete at this stage, too. And the project calls into the question the viability of the Green Belt, which serves to prevent the coalescence between nearby towns and villages. For these reasons Parish Councillors voted unanimously against this application.

Readers are reminded though, the Parish Council only has an advisory role in planning applications. The final decision resides at the District level.

hether by emailing us or by engaging in our posts on social media, hundreds of residents have participated in the consultation stage of the Parish Council's Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) since it began in June. You have offered your views on topics ranging from sports amenities, and air pollution, to how to prepare for climate change. Compiling all your comments to be submitted to the Uttlesford District Council is the plan's architect Peter Jones. Here he answers questions about what happens to the plan now.

What stood out from the consultation?

The hope for an indoor swimming pool came across loud and clear. We have also heard a call for faster broadband in the village. And it was little surprise to read of people's concerns for the loss of green space and the existential threats to Pennington and Lime Kiln Lanes. Other matters raised have included more footpaths, a bypass, a second dispensing chemist and better NHS dental provision.

How will residents' replies shape the Plan?

After an initial period of data collection and analysis, the Neighbourhood Development Plan has been rewritten and made more comprehensive. Following consultation we are now asking residents to give their views on the critical issue

of future development, always remembering that "Development" is a key word in the title.

What are the next steps in the process of forging a plan? The next stage is to produce a final document including a substantial number of photographs, finalising information in the supporting appendices and checking that proposals do not conflict with planning policies. Once complete the NDP will be submitted to UDC to check that it complies with policies. Assuming approval the NDP will go before an independent Planning Inspector. If there are no objections then the NDP will be put to a referendum of the electors of Stansted Mountfitchet. If 50.1% of the votes support then it will be adopted and used in future decision making.

What role will the NDP have shaping future development? During the Bloor appeal, the emerging NDP was referred to by the parties and the Inspector, even though it carried little weight. Once adopted the NDP has to be taken into account. This is even more important during the period when Uttlesford District Council has no Local Plan (one isn't likely before 2024). Currently developers have the upper hand so we need to find some balance by having a Neighbourhood Plan.



SPEED WATCHERS NEEDED

Concerned about dangerous, whizzing cars? Then why not volunteer for Speed Watch and keep the village safe.

The group recently put out a plea for new members to ensure the road safety group continues. Speed Watch was set up a decade ago and relies on a small team of residents, two of whom are unable to continue for age-related reasons, and the remaining volunteer is soon to leave the village.

So what does it involve? Firstly you are trained by the police to use a speed monitoring device. After that you meet up with fellow Speed Watchers to record traffic speeds around the village. A session typically lasts no more than a couple of hours. You then submit your log sheets to the casualty reduction unit for processing at Essex County Fire and Rescue Service and the Safer Essex Roads Partnership.

Drivers who have broken the speed limit are sent warning letters, and the log sheets inform police where additional police enforcement resources are needed. Find out more: raymond.woodcock@btinternet.com.

DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS



Melvin Caton District Councillor reports



Peter Holt has been appointed the new Chief Executive officer at Uttlesford District Council. He replaces Dawn French, who stepped down as chief executive in August after five years in the role. Peter has extensive local government and leadership experience, as well as a background in organisational transformation. He has been an independent strategic consultant since April, having previously been Assistant Chief Executive and Deputy Monitoring Officer for South Northants Council from 2018.

Peter took up his new post on 1st October. On the same day Uttlesford heard that the High Court had refused the council permission to apply for a statutory review of the decision to grant Stansted Airport permission to expand to 43 million passengers per year. An emergency council meeting is being held to decide whether to appeal against the decision.

In August the district council published the 299 sites that landowners, promoters and developers had put forward to be considered for development which, if all were approved, would amount to in excess of 70,000 homes. However, many more sites and locations have been put forward than will be required for the district's development requirements.

Over the coming months the council will be gathering evidence and carrying out technical assessments to decide which of these potential locations may be chosen to meet the requirement for up to 17,000 homes over the next 20 years. Any sites which may be included in the Local Plan will be fully consulted on, with everyone given the opportunity

to comment on the first draft of the plan which is due to be published in 2022.

At a meeting of the Uttlesford Cabinet on 2 September, members approved a report that would see the district council, and all landowners, promoters and developers who propose a site for larger scale development, jointly sign a commitment to providing well-designed, low carbon developments and to work with local communities to prepare masterplans reflecting this. Other requirements include providing timely infrastructure and hopefully, other community benefits.

The commitment - called a Memorandum of Understanding - will only take effect if the district council, in the event, selects a site for inclusion in the Local Plan, which will follow a thorough assessment of the suitability of all the proposed development sites district-wide. Three of the 16 large scale sites identified, and if included in the final version of the Local Plan, would have a substantial impact on Stansted Mountfitchet.

These are the proposed new settlement on Bollington Hall Farm, west of Ugley adjacent to the B1383 (estimated capacity 5812 homes), extensions to Birchanger between Pesterford Bridge and the A120 roundabout (capacity 4337 homes), and an extension of Stansted to the north and east of the village (capacity 1,658 homes). The last scheme includes land west of Pennington Lane, which was subject to the recent appeal by Bloor Homes that was dismissed by the Planning Inspector.

Residents and Parish Councillors can find out more about the Local Plan on the district council's website, or sign up to receive regular updates by subscribing to the e-newsletter service. As part of the evidence base for the Local Plan, Uttlesford has commissioned a Retail Capacity Study for the main centres in the district including Stansted.

The key findings of the Health Check of Stansted are listed below:

- The centre is split across two distinct locations
- There are 6 convenience units within Stansted Mountfitchet, which make up 11.8% of all units, exceeding the UK average of 8.3%
- Overall, services equate to 74.5% of units within Stansted Mountfitchet
- The centre has a higher proportion of leisure services (39.2%) compared to the UK average (24.7%)
- Stansted Mountfitchet has an extremely low vacancy rate at 2.0%, well below the UK average of 12.0%
- Few development opportunities were identified in the centre

The Cabinet in September, after pressure from Stansted members, re-instated the full revenue budget of £94k in the current financial year in order to support the creation/provision of multi-generational community hubs in the main settlements in the district; Dunmow, Saffron Walden, Stansted Mountfitchet and Thaxted. The Parish Council is already working with TouchPoint and other potential service providers to make a new style community hub in Stansted a reality.

Uttlesford also gave a grant of nearly £7k to Stansted Tennis Club for much needed improvements to their floodlighting.

Nature Notes

Mistletoe Viscum album

Memories of Christmases past; hovering hopefully under mistletoe waiting for the right person to come along and claim a kiss. However, there is a bit more to the mistletoe than that. It is a magical plant with an interesting history. Mistletoe has medicinal properties, and was known as 'all healer' by the Druids. They harvested the mistletoe from the oak, the host tree. A golden sickle was used to cut the huge bunch, which allowed it to drop onto an outstretched cloak. Two oxen were slaughtered at the foot of the tree in a ritual. As to how the mistletoe got onto the tree? William Turner, 16th century herbalist put it this way: "The (missile) thrush shiteth out the miscall berries". Just so! Three notable herbalists in Tudor days were Gerard, Parkinson and Culpeper; they used mistletoe in the treatment of tumours and hard swellings, to help with heart and circulatory problems, and to treat the falling sickness (epilepsy).

Moving on to modern times ... Rudolph Steiner, the founder of the Anthroposophical Society, brought mistletoe to the fore again. Intuition inspired him to travel to England to the home of the Druids. There he perceived that mistletoe grown on the oak tree would provide the cancer cure he was looking for. Iscador was the first commercial preparation of mistletoe; it was used to treat cancer in Austria. It is also used in conjunction with conventional cancer treatment; and is said to speed up recovery times giving the immune system a boost. There are clinics in both this country and in the USA who use Iscador in their treatments. Other notable herbalists have listed mistletoe as a treatment for cancer: Dr A. Vogel, Rudolf Fritz Weiss, MD and Thomas Bartram. Mistletoe is a truly amazing parasite.

November is a busy month in the garden After months of taking care of the growing pumpkins, children have been harvesting them for Halloween and enjoying pumpkin pie. You can fill the empty pumpkin shell with soil, plant some winter pansies, for example, and use it as a flower pot. Once it starts to rot down, bury it in the garden and let the rotting pumpkin provide natural fertilizer to the young plants inside. This time of year will also see many gardens being put to bed, with flower borders starting to be tidied up, vegetable gardens being cleared ready for mulching, and planting out of winter vegetables and collecting fallen leaves. Do not waste this greenery, put it on the compost heap or in a hot bin to rot down and make mulch for next year.



It can be tempting to clear all the fallen autumn leaves from our gardens, but as the temperature drops, our native hedgehogs are already getting ready to hibernate and with their numbers in decline, creating piles of leaves is a great way to help them make a nest, to keep warm and to make it through their long winter sleep. Dry leaves are best, so find a sheltered spot and leave a pile there. The hedgehogs will repay you by eating slugs next year! Remember too, it is worth checking under bushes and hedges before starting any work and if you are celebrating Guy Fawkes Night with a bonfire do check it for wildlife before lighting it.

We are so incredibly proud to report back on our community food share scheme. From 2018 to 2021 we have worked hard to create an allotment space that is open and accessible to all; something we feel we have done well so far. Our volunteer numbers are higher than they have ever been with more volunteers signing up every week. From 2019 to 2021, working in partnership with Spangles Family Hub and the Stansted Food Bank, we attempted to launch a community fridge to facilitate easy access to our veg.



However, the pandemic put an abrupt stop to this. With funding from the Essex Association of Local Councils, local Parish Councillor Dean and a private donor we were able to accomplish the following:

We spend three days a week tending the crops, maintaining the allotment, and then harvesting, packaging and delivering boxes to families in person. Since our inception in 2019 we have delivered over 1000kg of fresh locally grown, organic and pesticide free vegetables to beneficiaries both in Stansted and surrounding areas. Despite all the challenges 2020 brought, our volunteers have been able to help 58 local families have access to fresh locally grown produce. Of the 200 beneficiaries, over 50% are children. This is not including all our volunteers, neighbours, family, and friends. We want to thank everyone who has played a vital role in this becoming a reality. There is no Human Roots without you!

"Please to remember the Fifth of November, gunpowder, treason and plot.

We know of no reason why gunpowder treason should ever be forgot."

This traditional rhyme appeared soon after the failed plot to ignite barrels of gunpowder beneath the House of Lords on the occasion of the state opening of Parliament by King James I on 5th November 1605. The man found with the gunpowder was Guy Fawkes, one of a group of English Catholics whose intention was to assassinate the Protestant King James so that one of his young Catholic children could assume the throne, thereby restoring a Catholic monarchy. Some 400 years later, the preservation of the monarchy and parliament is still celebrated by many with a bonfire and the burning of a Guy.



Like other major events in British history, there is a link with The Hundred Parishes. In this case, the primary link is Sir William Waad (pronounced Wade) of 17th century Battles Hall in the parish of Manuden. Waad, who lived from 1546 to 1623, had pursued a distinguished career in the service of the Crown and in 1605 held the position of Lieutenant of the Tower of London, responsible for those held prisoner there and specifically for the interrogation of prisoners. The king gave permission for the use of torture, including the rack, to assist in this questioning. It was not long before most of the plotters were rounded up, interrogated, tried and executed by being publicly hung, drawn and quartered for their involvement in the Gunpowder Plot. Manuden's most famous former resident is remembered on a tablet inside the parish church. There is a second local link to the Gunpowder Plot. It is believed that Tiptofts, a 14th-century house in Wimbish, may have been used as a meeting place by the conspirators.


