Our first full season Open Day at the gardens is Sunday 24th April and we are hoping for fantastic weather and joyful visitors, to help put the dark, windy and wet days of winter fully behind us. Since the new year, it has been one step forward, two back at the gardens. Dry weather in January allowed us to work steadily through our winter jobs, prepping for snowdrop open days; however snowdrop season was also storm season, so in March we were clearing up all the dead wood. Trees have limited lives and some of those planted in 1902, when the Countess of Warwick had the gardens remodelled by Harold Peto, are now becoming frail. So recently we have been planting new trees to add different specimen trees and ensure succession. This last year many interesting specimen trees were given to us by the widow of Henry Girling, who was a renowned arboriculturist. Visitors in April will be able to seek out all the new trees and the county champion trees, and there will be a tree trail and craft activities for children.

April is a lovely month, with fresh leaves on the trees; the acers are particularly stunning and there is blossom on the plum trees in the walled kitchen garden. The daffodils are usually still massed in flower in the lime wood and provide a carpet of yellow in the glade; while the tulips look vibrant against the lime green of the euphorbia in the Italian garden.



The Trust's volunteers will stand ready to welcome visitors from 11.00am and to provide the usual excellent fare at the gardens: local bacon rolls, or cheese or hummus, and homemade cakes, hot and cold drinks. 

IN MEMORIAM BRIDGET GOTT

9th February 1932 - 18th February 2022



Bridget was born and spent her early years in Potters Bar, the only child of Phyllis and Cyril Watts. She was evacuated to Scotland twice during WWI. In the early post war years, the family moved to Enfield where Bridget joined a light operatic society and enjoyed playing hockey. At 17 she went to work in London at the Bank of India. She became a member of Enfield Young Conservatives and soon got involved in their social and political activities. She met her future husband John at Blackheath Sports Ground. However, John went off to work in Baghdad and Bahrain and then West Africa; they finally married in 1955 in French Gabon where they ran a store and traded in local commodities. They returned to England, and lived in a thatched cottage in Great Canfield with no lighting or heating, then moved to Enfield, where Bridget joined the young wives' group at her church. They now had three children: Robin, Alan and Charlotte.

Bridget and John came to Stansted in 1972 and bought North End House in Gall End where they were joined by her parents who purchased and renovated Yew Tree Cottage next door. Later they all moved to The Porch in Lower Street, and finally she moved to Bentfield Causeway. Bridget soon got involved with Stansted life, chairing the local Conservatives social committee for over 40 years, and attending Conservative Party Conferences, including Brighton, but fortunately was not staying at the bombed Grand Hotel! Being a born organiser, she arranged numerous, enjoyable and successful events. She served as an Uttlesford District Councillor from 1983-1987 and as a Stansted Parish Councillor continuously for 30 years, retiring in 2015, where she was involved in various activities and committees, such as the Stansted Airport Consultative Committee, and was active in the campaign to stop the airport expansion. 

Is Messy Play educational?

The simple answer is YES!! The children have loads of fun and we enhance their learning by teaching the Mark Makers Programme. I am your *Little Learners Uttlesford and Bishop's Stortford* local host and I am absolutely thrilled to be able to present the Little Learners Messy Play and Mark Making programme in Stansted.

At a Little Learners class there is all the mess that you would expect from a messy play class, with the bonus of the *unique* early writing program for under 5s devised by qualified teacher and director of Little Learners, Rachel Fay. Each week we introduce one of the four *Mark Makers* characters and their marks: Lionel and the Soldier Marks (Straight lines); Archie and the Rainbow Marks (Arches); Swirlo and the Magic Marks (Swirls and Circles) and Ziggy and the Monster Marks (ZigZags). The class always starts with singing and dancing with ribbons, as research has shown that it is important to be able to make the big marks to enable us to make the small marks. We then ask the children to make the week's chosen mark whilst they are playing in the trays. We encourage them to make their marks in an array of different textures: sand, playdoh, paint, rice, spaghetti and many more, using their hands, fingers, feet and toes. The class gives you and your child a chance to work together on their early writing journey, and of course a chance to socialise with other children and adults. The more fun that children have mark making and developing their motor skills, the more prepared and confident they will be when it comes to writing at school.

UGLEY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

A wedding and the ring were two features of John Barber's fascinating talk given to members at our February meeting. The wedding took place in the idyllic setting of the Château du Cande in France on a June day in 1937. The groom, the former King Edward VIII; his bride, the former Wallis Simpson. The château was owned by Charles Bedaux and his wife Fern who bought it in 1927. Ten years later Edward, Duke of Windsor chose it as a wedding venue, subject to certain improvements being made! John illustrated this part of his talk with a photo of Fern taken by Cecil Beaton who also took the wedding photos

Now for the ring. This is a delightful cottage on the Audley End Estate, restored by Betty Hanley, niece of Fern Bedaux. Born in the USA in 1915, she studied interior design and decoration at Parsons on the Place Vendôme in Paris. She moved to England in 1947 and later established her own interior decorating and lighting company, Clare House in London. Her talents were highly regarded by royalty and she was given the Royal Warrant for lighting. Her talents for interior design ensured that The Ring Cottage at Audley End was one of the most photographed cottages in England, with its image appearing in magazines at home and abroad; a fact illustrated by a small selection of books and magazines brought in by John for us to peruse. *Renoir* will be the subject of a talk given by a member at our next meeting to be held on **Wednesday 20**th **April** at 2.15pm in Ugley Village Hall. Our mission statement is "To maintain, preserve and keep as an historical monument the windmill for the benefit of the inhabitants of Stansted." The Millers are a small group of enthusiastic volunteers who give up their time to fundraise and undertake routine maintenance tasks, but a lot of the work requires specialist skills and equipment for which we employ a specialist millwright. Our photo shows chairman, Tudor Owen liaising with millwright, Paul Kemp. Thanks to Luke Thomas for the photo. The project we are focusing on at the moment is to install stock clamps; large timbers fixed to each side of both stocks (the large cross timbers that support the sail frames) at the centre. This prevents the sail from failing (as happened at another nearby windmill a few years ago!).

It was with great sadness that we learnt of the death of Bridget Gott who was our longest serving Committee member (see page 9). Bridget was a passionate supporter of all our activities and we will miss her wit and wisdom enormously.



CONSULTATIONS: WAITING RESTRICTIONS

In the December-January edition of The Link we highlighted several waiting restrictions in different parts of the village for which the Parish Council was considering applying to the North Essex Parking Partnership. As two of the proposals have potential ramifications for

residents living outside the proposed areas as well as within them, we are asking for your thoughts on the implementation of waiting restrictions on Chapel Hill and at Foresthall Park. Email parishcouncil@stansted.net





CONSULTATION 1: BENTLEY DRIVE, FORESTHALL PARK


RESTRICTION The first proposal concerns the implementation of No Waiting at Any Time restrictions on the corners of Bentley Drive with Bayford Way. The red lines in the image above show the restrictions would run on the road corners, and the full length of the frontages of houses number 1 and 2 on Bayford Way and also the for the full length of the houses 2 to 6 on Bentley Drive.

REASON Cars parked on the corners of Bentley Drive have the potential to cause traffic accidents by obscuring the views of drivers and pedestrians, while the parking of cars can lead to the narrowing of the road. This not only impedes the the progress of passing traffic, but risks blocking access to emergency service vehicles.

CHAPEL HILL

RESTRICTION The second proposal calls for No Waiting at Any Time restrictions from the end of the current restriction on the boundary between house numbers 53 and 55, going uphill to the start of the yellow hatched lines outside the fire station. Chapel Hill is an extremely busy road for both vehicles and pedestrians accessing village schools, shops and services. It is also frequently used by the Fire Service.

REASON: A particular pinch point is coming uphill just before the fire station where traffic has to come out and around the parked cars. Once this is negotiated drivers find themselves upon a zebra crossing which is hidden from view until that point. Pedestrians regularly complain that cars do not stop at this crossing.



NEW COUNCILLOR

n February the Parish Council welcomed a new Councillor to its ranks. Peter Jones was co-opted back onto the council, after having previously served the community in this capacity until 2019, when for personal reasons he had to relinquish his position.

Peter is a keen walker and regularly covers the streets, lanes and footpaths of Stansted and feels closely in touch with all areas of the village. "Although the parish is divided into two wards, my approach is to view the

village as a singe entity," says Peter who was coopted for the North Ward. "Forest Hall Park and Mountfitchet Estate are as important as Lower Street or the Bentfield area."

DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS



Alan Dean District Councillor Stansted North reports



he last time I wrote in The Link was in October, when we were still awaiting the result of the planning appeal about development west of Pennington Lane. It was a relief to many people when the planning inspector's decision to dismiss the appeal came through later that month – though after The Link had gone to press.

I mention that because in early February planning appeals brought about what is probably the biggest issue currently to confront Uttlesford District Council; maybe even the biggest shock since UDC was created in the 1970s.

Inadequate Performance

It all began on the 7th with a letter from the Minister of State for Housing saying: "The Secretary of

State...considers that there are respects in which the local planning authority at Uttlesford District Council...is not adequately performing their function of determining planning applications for major applications [over 10 houses or over 1 hectare of land]."

This means that planning permission applicants now have the option of applying either to UDC in the normal way, or by bypassing the district council and applying instead to the national Planning Inspectorate. Time will tell how this will pan out. I am aware that there are some new applicants who have decided to continue with the Council's decision-making channels.

Designated Status

Uttlesford is now the only council in England that is currently in this so-called "designation" category. There has been no other council so designated for about eight years; it's not common and it's nothing to be proud of.

It has now come to light that the risk of this happening was first flagged up in 2018 and again in the past two years. However, few people within UDC knew. No-one did much or anything effective to tackle the underlying problems, which apparently are about the Council refusing too many planning applications that appeal inspectors think were in accordance with planning policy and rules, and so should have been approved by UDC.

There have been protests that the government's decision flouts local democracy. But quasi judicial decisions that planning officers and councillors make should conform with planning laws and regulations.

Two Years to Get Back to Normal

The planning set-up at Uttlesford is undergoing major changes of staff. Councillors involved in planning will also have to learn new skills. It may take around two years for UDC to get back its normal local planning responsibilities. In the meantime, I just hope that poor plans do not get through this unprecedented approval system that would have been avoided had the alarm bells been heard and acted on some years ago.

BRAIN TRAINING

Increasing Blood Flow to the Brain and helping Insomnia Last month I described tight shoulders and sleep struggles. This month tackles some pesky muscles at the front of the throat. When they get tight, the base of the skull, the occiput, gets compressed and this restricts blood flow to the brain and stress levels rise. These muscles pull the skull back and down and are called the sternocleidomastoids (SCMs) and the Scalenes - this name always sounds like a disease to me! An example of this head position is the Verger in *Dad's Army*. To stretch this area out, stick your fingers in your earholes and your little fingers by your eye sockets. Lift your earholes to as near level with your eyes as you can get them. This will take your head forwards. Holding that position, now move the very top of your upper back backwards, holding the chest and low back still. Hopefully you'll get a stretch across the base of the skull.



The second part of this stretch and another way to increase blood flow to the brain is to breathe out. Another function of the SCMs/Scalenes is to raise the ribs on a full inhalation, so exhale and lower the ribs when stretching the SCMs out. It has been found that decreased blood flow to the brain is associated with hyperventilation, high stress levels and insomnia. A third way of raising blood flow to the brain is getting reasonably out of breath for about 30 minutes. The effort level required is 6/10, with 0 being resting and 10 flat out. Three ideas, all interrelated and all giving huge benefits. Result!



The Society has now sold all 800 copies of its first hardback book *The Hundred Parishes: An Introduction.* There will be no reprint, although we may write a second book. Preparation of our first book took several years and was only possible because of the vast resource of what had already been written about individual places, people and events. The Society holds more than 300 local books and pamphlets. Our website has recently been updated to ensure, amongst other things, that individual parish introductions include references to their share of available literature. A good number of local books are available, in person or online, from the four excellent outlets which have sold many copies of the Hundred Parishes book: *Harts* and *The Tourist Information Centres* in Saffron Walden and Bishop's Stortford, and *Between the Lines* bookshop in Great Bardfield.



A few parishes have no book of their own, or just a pamphlet in the church, whilst other places have extensive coverage. One of our trustees, Peter Sanders, conducted research for 30 years before compiling a definitive history of Stansted Mountfitchet. Another easy-to-read classic, *Littlebury: A Parish History*, was produced by a team of authors. I have recently been absorbed by a largely pictorial history of Sewards End, and the 4th edition of *Around Cold Christmas*, not least because the latter has frequent references to my wife's distant relatives. Clavering's Jacqueline Cooper always seems to be working on a book about Clavering or Saffron Walden. Several local history societies have generated books or booklets, or have work in progress. So rich is our local history that there is no shortage of reading material or potential subject matter.

At our March meeting, Jenny Oxley from Saffron Walden Museum gave a talk on the *Piano Hoard Treasure*. She introduced the background of the museum from the early 1800s and explained the wishes of the trustees in 1845 to *Cultivate a taste for the beautiful in Nature* and to illustrate *The Arts, Manufactures and Habits of different nations*. There are over 175,000 items in this museum which is big by provincial museum standards.

She then told us about the remarkable recent discovery of packages of gold coins, formed of full and half sovereigns, found in a piano which was being tuned. The piano was owned by a college in Shropshire. It had been supplied by the makers, Broadwood, to a shop in Saffron Walden in the early 1900s, but little is known of its whereabouts until the 1980s when a family acquired it; they gifted it to the Shropshire college after owning the piano for 33 years. The find was reported to the coroner and, after being examined by the British Museum, was duly declared Treasure Trove after no owners could be found, although on hearing the news, many came forward to claim it! Saffron Walden Museum showed an interest, because of the town's connection, and acquired the piano and a representative selection of thirteen coins. The 913 coins ranged from late Victorian to the early 1900s. Some had been packed in old cereal boxes which helped date part of the find. The piano, with the coins, now forms a museum display. This was a thoroughly entertaining evening with good attendance. At our next meeting on Thursday 7th April 7.45pm for 8.00pm in the Day Centre, John Scraggs will talk to us about Photographs of local airfields.
