SOUTH SEAS CHRISTMAS PUDDING

This is a much lighter version of the traditional Christmas Pudding. It can be frozen and reheated in a microwave oven.

Ingredients

225g can pineapple rings

4oz / 100g soft margarine

4oz / 100g caster sugar

2oz / 50g glace cherries, quartered

1oz / 25g angelica, chopped

2oz / 50g fresh breadcrumbs

2oz / 50g stoned raisins

Grated rind of one orange

2 eggs, beaten

3oz / 75g self-raising flour

2 tablespoons golden syrup

Method

Drain pineapple. Reserve three half rings and chop remainder coarsely

Cream margarine and sugar

Add orange rind and beat in eggs

Fold in flour and breadcrumbs

Add chopped pineapple, raisins, cherries, and angelica. Mix well

Butter a 1½ pint / 1 litre basin, put syrup in bottom, and arrange pineapple rings in a circle

Spoon sponge mixture on top and level it. Cover with buttered paper and foil, and steam for 1¼ hours.



CHARITY CRICKET MATCH

The annual pub charity cricket match took place earlier in the year at Hargrave Park, home of Stansted Cricket Club. TIPPER TRUCK DISASTER

Many Stansted residents are undoubtedly fed up with the constant disturbance experienced each weekday, from 6.00am throughout the day until 4.30pm, caused by tipper trucks collecting unwanted soil from various development sites around Bishop's Stortford. This material is then deposited at various sites around Elsenham at a rate of approximately 250 loads daily. They collect in Bishop's Stortford, take a route around the back of the airport to Hall Road and Elsenham, unload, then return via Elsenham along the B1383 into Stansted, down Grove Hill, Chapel Hill and Silver Street back to Bishops Stortford. These roads are totally unfit for such traffic in terms of width, speed, danger to pedestrians, congestion, noise, air pollution, damage to road structure and surfaces. Schools in Elsenham and Stansted line these HGVs' routes, which is a particular concern.

After years of campaigning to rid the village of HGVs, it seems that neither our village parish councillors nor the local County Councillor have the authority to implement solutions to these issues. Lee Scott (County cabinet member responsible for Highways Maintenance and Sustainable Transport) attended a meeting in December 2021 confirming an approved funded scheme on all village roads where 7.5t weight restrictions would be applied. Cameras would record vehicles which break the weight restrictions and there would be penalties. A consultation period should



have started, but nothing of note has been reported since, despite residents regularly requesting detailed updates and communication. This was confirmed in a follow-up meeting in February 2022 with Kemi Badenoch in attendance endorsing the approved scheme.

In the meantime, a Grove Hill/Elsenham Road Group of residents who have been campaigning for action have decided to up the ante and take the matter to the Chief Executive of Essex County Council, Gavin Jones email: gavin.jones@essex.gov.uk. We are looking to add more substance to our cause by involving many more residents from Stansted, Elsenham and other affected areas. Textiles in East Anglia

Our speaker, John Miners, has an amazing ability to bring his subject to life. He grew up near the Courtauld factory in Bocking; and later worked there as a textile apprentice. The East Anglian cloth industry started in medieval times, making many small towns rich. During the industrial revolution these old industries died out, leading to extensive unemployment and the growth of factories producing much more cloth very cheaply. Persecuted Huguenots, including silk weavers such George Courthauld (1761-1823) migrated to England, although George soon moved to America to make his fortune. On his return, he set up a cloth mill at Pebmarsh: his son Samuel built mills in Halstead and Bocking. By the 19th century Courtaulds had developed into a major cloth manufacturer specialising in black mourning cloth with embossed patterns. It became a huge business; much of their wealth was returned to the country by donating works of art to The Courtauld Gallery for the nation. Courtaulds closed in the late 1960s.

STANSTED PHARMACY UPDATE

Last month I quoted Cllr John Spence's letter indicating that the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) does not support the granting of an NHS dispensing license to a second pharmacy in Stansted. However, Essex County Council (ECC) Health and Wellbeing (H&W) can *recommend* to NHS England-East the granting of such licenses.

Close examination of 2022 PNA shows that nowhere does it mention Stansted's particular characteristics, such as the steep Chapel Hill or that the Boots pharmacy on Cambridge Road has steps making it nearly impossible for disabled people to enter. There are even more steps at the rear side. I made an oral statement to Uttlesford District (UDC) Full Council meeting on 11th October and put a few questions to all District Councillors and officers, which they answered. One was of particular interest so I put a Freedom of Information request to ECC reference: ECC13607619 10 22. I am informed that ECC officer(s) including the Director of Public Health (DOPH) visited Boots and reported, "that there is access to the pharmacy from the side, which enables people with access issues to enter the pharmacy." This is an important issue for the disabled members of our community. There is no recognition that Boots has two steps to enter it, so the disabled members of our community are discriminated against. I asked if there was an officer in Uttlesford District Council who could advise me concerning this issue.

Response from UDC: Telephone conversations have been held with the pharmacy lead at ECC and they informed the council that they had previously visited Boots pharmacy with the Director of Public Health. They said that there is access to the pharmacy from the side, which enables people with access issues to enter the pharmacy. I asked if they would provide me with the written report which the DOPH or the accompanying officers must have written following the visit to Boots confirming suitable access from the side enabling disabled members of our community to access the pharmacy? I can confirm that ECC does not hold this information because there was no written report following the visit and we have no history of this statement on record. This can only mean that Stansted Mountfitchet and surrounding communities do not have an NHS licensed community pharmacy that is disabled persons friendly. If the readers of The Link or others are disabled, please contact me; I would like to know your views.

Before the middle of the 20th century most people did not have watches; they relied on public clocks which could be seen at railway stations, post offices and on church towers, as well as on other public buildings. This reminds me of the lines written in 1912 by the homesick poet, Rupert Brooke:

"Stands the church clock at ten to three And is there honey still for tea?"

The Hundred Parishes has a variety of interesting church clocks. In Furneux Pelham, St Mary's clock is topped by Old Father Time and the words "Time Flies, Mind Your Business". It would be interesting to know what prompted those words to be included.



The bell tower at Sheering has two clock faces which were installed in the 1940s to remember those who served in the War. The north-facing one tells us to "Work and Pray" whilst the west-facing proclaims "Today Is Yours".



The church at High Wych was built in 1861 to the design of local architect George Edward Pritchett. Its clock is almost as wide as the thin flintstone tower on which it is mounted. Hinxton may have our oldest church clock, believed to date from 1700, albeit extensively renovated in 1809 when a new face was fitted. Artist Eric Ravilious lived in Great Bardfield and his wood engraving of the church of St Mary the Virgin clearly shows the enormous clock that was added to commemorate the coronation of King George V in 1912. Presumably the residents of Great Bardfield are never late for work or church. The engraving has been adopted as the logo of The Hundred Parishes. The Society's trustees join me in wishing you a Merry Christmas.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

...with news of parking schemes and road consultations, our tree planting project, dates and times of free festive parking, as well as an update on the village Christmas Light display, and help to cope with the Cost of Living Crisis



TRAFFIC, PARKING ROUND-UP

t has been a busy year for our highways sub-committee as it has sought solutions to the all-too-many traffic and parking problems afflicting the village's street and roads. Here, as another year comes to an end, we provide a round-up of the various consultations and proposed solutions being looked at by the sub-committee currently.

Grove Hill & HGVs

Essex Highways' strategy to reduce HGV traffic in our village depends on identifying alternative routes for HGV use that wouldn't impact nearby villages. One alternative – Hall Road – has recently suffered three serious accidents and subsequent safety investigations need to be completed before it can be considered viable.

... & Traffic Lights

Essex Highways have looked into introducing an additional set of lights up Grove Hill to deter drivers jumping the existing set of lights at the foot of the Hill. But they have concluded this would only add to road safety problems in the area. An existing safety concern is the presence of traffic cones running along the kerbs of Grove Hill. EH say these are illegally sited and need to be removed, warning that putting cones out in this manner is prosecutable.



Soil Dumping

Locations such as Gypsy Lane & May Walk are being used to dump soil waste. Essex County Council has proposed a multi-agency summit involving the Highways Agency, the Environment Agency and the district council to tackle the problem. Swoops on nearby construction sites to read the tacho metres of HGVs have been mooted as a way to address the problem.

Foresthall Park Consultation

The working group of councillors and residents set up to explore options to tackle parking issues at Foresthall Park has conducted several fact-finding walkabouts of the development. Once it has settled on its proposals for different areas of Foresthall, it will launch a consultation with residents before settling on the preferred options.

Double Yellow/Red Lines


An application is to be made to the North Essex Parking Partnership (NEPP) for appropriate restrictions to be introduced along Bentfield Road from its junction with Bentfield Gardens to Bentfield Causeway. Residents say the recent growth of non-residential parking has impacted on sight lines and road safety. A consultation will be needed, with the NEPP having the final say to sign off on the lines.

20 is Plenty

In October a resolution was passed to apply to Uttlesford Local Highway Panel to fund a feasibility study into a 20mph limit for Lower Street, Chapel Hill, and Church Road. The Parish Council has already submitted a proposal for traffic calming and crossing points to be introduced along High Lane.

Footpath Improvements

A proposal has been made to the Uttlesford Local Highway Panel to widen and improve the surface of a section of the footpath on Cambridge Road (towards High Lane). An application has also been made for S.106 money (held by Essex Highways for highway work tied to Foresthall Park) to improve the footpath along Church Road. Updates on previously submitted proposals for a crossing on Silver Street, town twinning signs and work to High Lane's footpath are being sought.



TREE PLANTING CONSULTATION

This autumn the Parish Council has been engaging with residents over the siting of trees in eight locations as part of a county-wide effort to combat climate change and fight habitat loss. The Essex Forest Initiative (EFI) have secured £10k in funding for the Parish Council to cover planting costs as well as for tree care for the first three years. Woodland officers surveyed each location before proposing them as sites:

- The Rec / Windmill fields (12 trees)
- Upper & Lower Bentfield Green (18 trees)
- Mountfitchet Green (10 trees)
- Urban Square (11 trees)
- Walson Way Green (10 trees)
- Wilkin's Crescent (10 trees)

In October, residents who potentially may be the most affected by the siting of new trees in each location were invited to give their opinions via consultation letters.

FREE HOT MEALS & MOVIE CLASSICS

Free hot meals, warm drinks, and classic movies are now being served up by TouchPoint at the Day Centre to see you through the winter. Their Breakfast Club is offering bowls of porridge, cereals, bacon sarnies, and tea & coffee from 8.30-10am on Fridays. Also at 72 Chapel Hill from 3.30-5.30pm on Tuesdays, free hot meals and fun activities are being put on for schoolage kids, their families and carers. Look out too for Santa and his elf - both will be popping in for Teatime Tuesday on Decemeber 13.

And if your household needs some free heart-warming entertainment on a weekend, why not pull up some seats at TouchPoint's Sunday at the Movies, when a classic movie will be shown and free cake and refreshments will be served at the Day Centre, 1-4pm. For more info, visit www.touchpoint.org

The wider community were asked for their thoughts on the initiative via our Facebook page and website. Consultation continued in November when a second phase of engagement was started with villagers after tree layouts were revised in light of concerns about the original siting of the new trees.

Feedback from the consultations has been used to nail down, and in cases adjust the trees' siting at each spot. In one area residents concerns prompted one site to be cut from the project. This was at Lower Bentfield Green. The open views afforded of the surrounding countryside at this site have been cited in several planning appeals against development in the area. Keeping the Lower Green in the project could have unintended planning consequences.

Planting at the other seven sites will start in January. Adding trees around Stansted goes beyond merely trying to beautify village views. The primary goal is to boost biodiversity while also doing something about climate change at a local level. But as the above infographic details, trees deliver many other upsides. A single tree, for example, can bring £8,000 worth of community gains, from limiting flood damage, cutting energy costs on buildings, and increasing property prices - houses on tree-lined streets are worth up to 18% more than those on streets without tree cover, according to the organisation Treeconomics.

FESTIVE PARKING

The run up to Christmas and New Year is a key trading period for high streets. This is particularly true in 2022 with many predicting a bumpy ride for the economy. The District Council hopes to encourage Uttlesford residents to support local high streets by setting aside free parking days in its car parks over the festive season. The free days began in November and continue into December at the Lower Street and Crafton Green car parks, where it will be free to park from Monday, December 26 to Monday, January 2. Stickers indicating free parking times will be displayed on the ticket machines in each of the car parks. The machines will be covered for this free all-day period. UDC have also requested that the MiPermit app will be set to free, too.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

Prudent budget adjustments in the face of rising inflation and the cost of living crisis has seen the Finance & General Purposes committee revisit its scope for funding projects in 2022. One area that has required reconsideration was delivering an enhanced Christmas light display along Lower Street.

Increasing the lights on Lower Street was already proving complicated even before economic storm clouds gathered. One barrier has proved the make up of the street itself. The road's mix of private residential and food and drink businesses is unlike that of a typical high street. Many business premises are leased, and property owners are known to discourage external Christmas lights being fixed to their buildings.

The Parish Council hopes to work with businesses to improve Stansted's lights next Christmas, like it has with the Social Club on Lower Street, which will feature a new lcicle drop LED lighting display. This year there will also be extra LED lights at the fountain at the top of Chapel Hill.

Residents are reminded that there will once again be community Christmas trees outside Castle Maltings and the Dog and Duck pub. Funds left over from the 2021 community appeal have been added to money raised by Patsy Banks undertaking pub quiz nights to pay for this year's trees. We are sure you will join us in thanking Patsy for her efforts.

winter approaches, we must be thankful that voluntary organisations such as TouchPoint are bringing help to many people in need of food, companionship and other support in Stansted and in some surrounding villages. See the box at the bottom of page 21 for how TouchPoint is supporting our community through the Cost of Living Crisis.

The Essex County Council, meanwhile, has published a document called Cost of Living Support for Households and Communities. Head to https://bit.ly/3h3QmgS on the internet where the document can be downloaded. It contains a 6-point plan about what ECC is doing, though it doesn't say much about how individuals should go about obtaining help, but may provide some signposting for voluntary groups to where that is available.

Airport Compensation

The bad news from Uttlesford is that agreement has finally been reached with Stansted Airport to pay the company £2,100,000 compensation for the Council's irregular behaviour in mishandling the planning appeal to expand the airport's annual passenger throughput. The planning inspectors decreed that Uttlesford District Council had "acted unreasonably" in the way it fought the appeal. A council that loses an appeal would normally not have to compensate the applicant with a cash payment, because each party is ex-

pected to pay its own costs, which include bills from expensive lawyers.

When UDC's planning committee's REFUSAL was taken by the airport to an appeal before national planning inspectors, the District Council's appeal team surprisingly decided to argue for the opposite - an APPROVAL plus some legal jargon. This was considered by the inspectors (as well as by many councillors) to have been unacceptable and unreasonable behaviour. So, the District Council - or rather, we tax-payers - was effectively fined £2,100,000. Add to that the Council's own external costs for lawyers, et al, of £1,368,890, PLUS unquantified costs within the District Council for staff time. All this adds up to a wasted total cost to UDC taxpayers of around £4,000,000.

UDC's annual Council Tax income for last year was £6,120,521.61. So the financial loss from this major maladministration comes to around two-thirds of one year's tax payment to UDC by all households across the Uttlesford. The good news is that the District Council's planning procedures are likely to be changed in future to increase the transparency of the system to both opposition councillors, like me, and to the public across Uttlesford - with the aim of ensuring this type of episode will never be repeated.

Local Plan Pushed Back to 2023

The second bad news is that the initial stage public consultation for Uttlesford's long-awaited Local Plan has been delayed from this autumn until the second half of 2023. This means that there will be several more years of planning uncertainty, resulting in yet more house building in unsuitable locations as developers and landowners exploit the absence of a Plan.

Developer Fails to Deliver Footpaths

Finally, on the day in early November that I wrote this report, I received a disappointing update about two footpaths to Cambridge Road and High Lane from King Charles' Drive that the housing developer had failed to deliver in line with a legal agreement. In September the Planning Committee agreed with me that the developer should not be allowed to get away with neglecting to deliver what they signed up to. Sadly, the developer has said they will submit an appeal against the committee's recent decision, so there will be further delay. I hope that District Council planning officers will support their Planning Committee Members on this occasion by fighting the appeal with robust evidence.

My fellow district councillors and I wish everyone a Very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. May 2023 bring more cheer than did 2022.

November Meeting

Our speaker, Dr Chris Gibson, had a long career with Natural England and was the Government's advisor on nature conservation. He began giving talks, walks and seminars on natural history and ecology when he retired. We saw slides showing how the climate is affecting both flora and fauna. Birds and plants from warmer climes are now commonplace here. An example is the collared dove, rare in the 60s but now a frequent visitor to our gardens. The warmer weather is causing problems for birds as breeding times are no longer

coinciding with a glut of insects, therefore many nests of young birds are dying of starvation. The flooding of salt marshes and extension of reservoirs was discussed. East Anglia, instead of being a stop-off destination in the bird migration south, is becoming the preferred winter home of northern birds. Humans have been responsible for the eradication of some species, but in recent years animals and birds have been reintroduced to the countryside to help bring a balance. "Every little thing you do helps" were our speaker's closing words.

BRAIN TRAINING

How eating can improve your balance, speed and strength The better balanced we are, the faster and more powerful we are and the less prone to falling over. We have a left and a right set of balance organs as well as a left and a right brain. These also need to be balanced, but too often one side dominates the other. When one side of the brain is weaker than the other, when we pick up a foot to step or stride forwards, the foot will not pick up as cleanly as the other foot, leading to a potential stumble, or just lack of speed. How does this relate to chewing our Christmas dinner? The jaw is a big deal in the brain! Most people benefit hugely from stimulating one side of the chewing muscles.



It is very common for jaws to become imbalanced; perhaps an easy way to tell if chewing on one side will help is this. Test out your balance, any way you like; then lightly grip a pen between your right teeth, noticing the effect on your balance, then change to the left teeth. If this made no difference, grip the pen quite firmly between the right then the left teeth. Chew on the side that gave the best result. The amount of pressure will make a difference to the result. For an added bonus, which may help headaches, rub behind your ear on the same chewing side, rubbing where the ear meets the skull, about halfway up. This stimulates the vagus nerve, which is intertwined with the trigeminal (chewing) nerve.

In November we had a very successful trip to the Phoenix Theatre in London to see the musical *Come from Away*, which is based on events that happened after 9/11 in 2001. While the US and Canadian airspaces were closed, US bound planes were diverted to Gander International Airport in Newfoundland. The 10,000 inhabitants of Gander welcomed over 6,500 strangers into their midst for five days. This is the story of some of those people, the residents who struggled to feed and shelter them and those who were on one particular flight. Our last speaker was Chris Truran, a retired Crime Scene Examiner, who gave a fascinating insight into the use of forensic science. He said that he has probably examined over 25,000 crime scenes, ranging from shop-lifting to murder. Edmund Locard from Lyon was the first forensic scientist; he formulated the principle that every contact leaves a trace, which revolutionised criminal detection. A partially eaten apple was once used to trace a killer; by examining the bite mark they could tell that the man was tall and gangly. I have not yet worked that one out. It is not necessary to have a degree to succeed in this line of work, more an enquiring mind and lots of patience. On Thursday 8th December at 7.30pm in the Day Centre we look forward to a musical treat from 3's Company. Our first meeting of the new year is on Thursday 12th January at 7.30pm in the Day Centre. 
