Events last December included welcoming Steven Geller to our monthly General Meeting. His talk was about *A Career in Music*. He played the banjo and sang songs from the 60s and 70s, whilst voices, muffled by masks, were raised, bodies swayed and feet tapped. His enthusiasm was infectious and the event most enjoyable. The Stansted u3a Singers performed at the Great Hadham Golf and Country Club and the Strummers performed at St Mary's Church (see page 13). The Art Group was visited by a local artist, Bill Morris, whose demonstration they found inspirational. The Christmas Lunch at Bury Lodge was attended by 65 members, with entertainment provided by Stansted u3a Singers. It was a lovely meal and a good time was had by all.



At the General Meeting on Thursday 17th February 1.30pm for 2.00pm in St John's Hall, Tanya Fern-Smith will be speaking about the long and varied history of Stansted Hall. Stansted was gifted by William the Conqueror to a nephew in 1066 and by the 16th century there was a Tudor Hall whose owners included the de Vere family, the Earls of Oxford and the Duke of Norfolk. This was later replaced by a Jacobean hall and the grounds redesigned by Repton. Following a fire in the 19th century a new hall was commissioned in 1876 which was purchased by Arthur and Gertrude Findlay in the 1920s. During the war it was loaned to the Red Cross as a convalescent hospital. It is now a training college and headquarters for the Spiritualists' National Union. It is hoped that this talk will be relayed to Stansted's twin town, Rungis in France, as part of the Town Twinning Association's programme for 2022.

### **Finding Help and Support this Winter**

Health services come under extra pressure in the winter, so it can be a good idea to consider other routes to help. Our website can be used to search and identify local services and make a self-referral; therefore you get the support you need more quickly. The website is easy to use; look for services by entering key words into the search area. For example, typing in 'cold' will bring up all the local organisations that provide cold weather support, including help to apply for winter benefits and home improvement grants, plus energy efficiency advice, information on oil clubs, switching suppliers and handyman services.

The website can also be used to access fall prevention services, community transport options, money advice, mental health services, heart health checks, carer support, child and family wellbeing services, support for long term health conditions, including cancer, weight management services, drugs and alcohol programmes and more. If you use a mobile device, you may prefer to download the *Frontline Public* app from the App Store or Google play. Alternatively, if you do not have access to the internet at home, you can ask staff to help you get online for free at Stansted library, or call Healthwatch on 0300 500 1895 for details of services in your local area.





## **Chocolate Berry Marble Cake Ingredients**

225g butter, softened
225g caster sugar
4 large or 6 medium eggs
225g self-raising flour
3 tbsp milk
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 tsp baking powder
2 tbsp cocoa powder
40g fresh or frozen mixed berries (not strawberries)
1 wooden kebab skewer or similar
Baking parchment

### Method

- 1. Heat oven to 180°C/fan 160°C/gas no 4
- 2. Grease a 20cm cake tin and line the bottom with greaseproof paper
- 3. Beat together the sugar and butter in a mixing bowl. Add a little of the flour/baking powder and mix in. Whisk up the eggs and add a little to the mixture
- Repeat the process until all the eggs and flour are mixed in
- 5. Split the cake mix between two bowls and sieve the cocoa into one of the bowls and mix in
- Take two large spoons and starting with the cocoa cake mix do a chessboard pattern, then switch to the other cake mix and fill in the gaps to form a chequered pattern
- Take the kebab skewer and point it down into the cake mix. Do a circular motion across the cake mix to make the cocoa mix swirl into the other mix
- 8. Sprinkle the berries evenly over the top of the cake mix and put it into the oven
- 9. Bake for 30-50 mins or until a skewer inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean.

### THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

February is often seen as a dreary month. Yet for the Church February is a wonderful month. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> the Church celebrates the feast day of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, also known as Candlemas. This feast traditionally brought an end to the Christmas festivities. Forty days after Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph brought him to the great Temple in Jerusalem. There they presented Baby Jesus to the Heavenly Father. That was the Jewish law, and Mary and Joseph obeyed it with loving hearts. This was a very popular feast and gained the name Candlemas in past centuries as candles were blessed and carried in procession at Mass, to show the entry of Jesus into the Temple as the light of the world.

A holy old priest of the Temple named Simeon learned from God that the Infant Jesus was truly the Saviour of the whole world. He held Mary's Son Jesus in his arms with joy and awe. "My own eyes are looking at my salvation," he exclaimed. God allowed him to recognise Jesus as the Saviour and Simeon put his trust in the little child. We can only imagine what Mary and Joseph were thinking as he spoke these words. Then, inspired by God, Simeon told Mary that she would have to suffer, that a sword would pierce her soul. He was talking about the terrible pain our Blessed Mother would feel when Jesus died on the cross. ## THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Hundreds of prisoner of war camps were set up in the UK during the two World Wars, with several in The Hundred Parishes. Camps varied in design and size; some started as rows of tents with the prisoners engaged in constructing huts. Most have disappeared but I would like to tell you about a few. In 1917, during WWI, a camp was established at Great Dunmow's workhouse, initially taking about 100 German prisoners of war (POWs).



Capacity was later doubled by moving women elsewhere and closing the infirmary. The German prisoners worked on local farms. Dunmow workhouse never re-opened and was converted to the housing that today is called The Close. Bower Hall in Steeple Bumpstead was used as a POW camp in WWI but it fell into ruin and was demolished in 1926. Wynches POW camp in Much Hadham was situated in 40 acres of parkland and in WWII housed both Italian and German prisoners. Ickleton Grange housed a camp for both Italian and German men; nothing now remains.

Radwinter North POW rehabilitation camp was situated in the grounds of Radwinter Rectory (now Radwinter Manor). German soldiers were allowed to visit local families. Karl Weschke was one; he became an artist and his clay sculpture of a weeping mother and child titled *Deutschland 1946* is held in Saffron Walden Museum (see photo below; copyright is held by the museum).



In Mill Lane, Hatfield Heath, the remains of POW camp 116 are still clearly visible - the most complete survivor in Essex, Herts or Cambridgeshire.




The camp was set up in 1941 to house Austrian and Italian prisoners; German men followed later. They worked on local farms and even played football against a Hatfield Heath team who were beaten 11-0!



### NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

### **BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE?**



t the start of last year Uttlesford District Council launched their Call for Sites to landowners and developers interested in constructing commercial sites or housing developments in the district. Nearly 300 sites across Uttlesford were identified as possible sites for housing construction and commercial development.

The Local Plan being drafted by UDC will need to plan for a period of development in the district that lasts until 2040. To meet the government's national house-building targets, the district will need to accommodate approximately 11,600 dwellings over that timeline. As Stansted is one of the four major settlements in Uttlesford, it is unrealistic to expect no change to the level of housing stock in the village over that period.

After UDC published its list of sites, a working group set up by the Parish Council conducted a review of these sites and drew up a list of 21 that could affect Stansted. The Parish Council's position on housing development schemes has been to only back schemes with a substantial element of social housing and/or the opportunity to improve existing community services. In January Councillors met to discuss the merits of each of the schemes at the Special Full Council Meeting.

Of the 21 developments, seven were marked up as projects that councillors could consider supporting. Among these were plans to expand Alsa Business Park, extra housing at Walpole Meadows and Elms Farm, and backing the commercial development of land north of Stansted Airport.

The working group assessed these to have the potential to provide extra housing and jobs for Stansted, as well as yield community benefits, for example, in the form of more allotments, reprovision of Almshouses, extra cycle lanes, new sports facilities, and increased cemetery provision. The largest project Councillors were asked to consider supporting is the construction of a further 250 dwellings at Walpole Meadows.

The working group suggested Parish Councillors oppose larger schemes by developers in the area, such as one to build 850 dwellings on land west of Stansted. That is the same plot of land that the community and Parish Council fought so hard to successfully keep safe from the bulldozer at a planning appeal last September. The working group also advised opposing develop-

ers' schemes for the areas of Bentfield Green and Pennington Lane.

It is worth noting that decisions on planning matters are taken at the district level, the Parish Council acts as a consultee: our views on schemes that impact on the village are (we hope) taken into account by the planning department at Uttlesford when arriving at a decision.

Furthermore, comments made at the Special Meeting on the 21 possible sites will be influential in shaping the crucial final chapter of the Parish Council's Neighbourhood Development Plan 2021 - Development.

The community's views on where development should occur in Stansted will be considered in this final chapter. Comments left on our social media channels will be incorporated along with letters and emails sent to us directly on the issue. There will also be an opportunity to ratify the Neighbourhood Plan when residents will be asked to participate in a referendum for its adoption.

### **COLUMBIA THREADNEEDLE UPDATE**



n October Columbia Threadneedle Investments launched a consultation with the community as part of their plans to develop 99 hectares of land north of Stanted Airport. Their application has yet to be submitted to Uttlesford District Council planning authority, but Columbia Threadneedle hope to redevelop land bought from the owners of Stansted Airport transforming it into a business, logistics and technology park.

The park could create 2,000 jobs during its development phase, and business attracted to it could generate employment for 3,000 people. The commercial site developer believes that by working with local training colleges many of the jobs created could go to Uttlesford residents. The expansion of bus routes and cycle lanes, as well as improved local sporting facilities that may result from the proposed scheme are being touted by Columbia Threadneedle as significant community benefits associated with the project.

But there are negative impacts too. The proposed site could result in the loss of two pitches used by Elsenham Youth Football Club. Many of our younger residents play for this club and if alternative pitches are not found this would be an undoubted blow to sports provision in the area.

A Parish Council working group is now examining the project's potential impact. It is made up of representatives from the Stansted Sports Association as well as from Forest Hall School, plus district and parish councillors and individuals working on our Neighbourhood Development Plan.

The group is keen to hear where new sports facilities could be sited for clubs affected by the project, and how they propose to mitigate pollution and congestion on our roads while improving bus service routes.

Columbia Threadneedle began its consultation in October with the launch of a consultation website and a leaflet dropped through residents' doors. In response to feedback that a significant number of households failed to get a leaflet outlining Columbia Threadneedle's plan, we have put the developer in touch with local leaflet delivery firms to ensure the community are kept abreast of the project.

### **FIVE MINUTE RULE**

Public participation is a vital component of Full Council Meetings as it allows councillors to hear directly from the community their concerns and answer any questions people have regarding local affairs. But full agendas combined with the need to observe Covid guidance as best as we can affecting the formats of meetings, keeping things on track and to schedule is ever more important. In light of this we would like to highlight our standing orders relating to public participation:

- You are welcome to make a presentation, answer questions and give evidence at a meeting on an agenda item of relevance to you
- 15 minutes is set aside at meetings for you to do so during the public participation at the start of a Full Council Meeting (unless directed by the Chairman)
- You can speak up to 5 minutes; dependent on the number of people wishing to participate at a meeting, this could be a shorter period of time

### STANSTED WINDMILL

e were delighted to hear from the Stansted Millers in December when they updated our windmill sub-committee on progress at maintaining the Grade II\* listed structure. The windmill, built in 1787, is undergoing a lengthy schedule of maintenance. Last year repairs were made to the striking wheel, 20 shutters were replaced and new ones fitted, along with work done to the striking gear.

The Millers raise a significant amount of funding for the Mill themselves. In addition each year the Parish Council contributes £4000 to the Windmill Capital Fund. It has been proposed to increase this contribution by 2% going forward. We will also be covering the up-front costs of putting on the Stansted Windmill Fete later in the year, with the Miller's repaying the money from proceeds raised by the event.

### DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS



Geoffrey Sell District Councillor Stansted North reports



On behalf of Stansted's District Councillors Melvin Caton, Alan Dean, Ayub Khan and myself I should like to wish you a Happy and Safe 2022.

Last year was another challenging one. It was the year of the jabs, in which Stansted surgery has played an invaluable part in the roll out of the vaccines. It's hard to imagine that at this time last year, barely anyone had received their first dose of a Covid vaccine. I thought it might be helpful to give a review of some issues affecting Stansted.

### Removing HGVs from the centre of Stansted

The entry points of Grove Hill, Church Road, High Lane and Chapel Hill will become no-go zones for HGVs, to be monitored using the latest camera technology, under proposals agreed between highways authority Essex County Council and residents.

The scheme will go out to consultation this year and is a solution to years of negotiations. It makes Stansted one of the first areas in the county to seek a blanket ban. As Chair of the Highways Committee of the Parish Council and Vice Chair of Uttlesford Highways Panel I have been working closely with our county councillor Ray Gooding. We have been greatly assisted by Cllr Lee Scott ECC portfolio holder for Highways. Local residents have shown great patience.

### Welcome to new community organisations

Stansted's response to dealing with the pandemic included the setting up of the new community organisations Let's Talk, Stansted (a community mental health initiative) and Touchpoint, which has taken over the running of the Day Centre. We have supported these organisations through grants from the new homes bonus scheme which each district councillor has. Alan and myself have also worked with residents to fund a defibrillator at Walpole Meadows.

### **Development Pressures**

Last year your councillors and residents celebrated the dismissal by the Planning Inspectorate of the Bloor Homes planning application. This was for the construction of 168 houses west of Pennington Lane. Despite this victory, development pressures will loom large this year. As the planning authority, the District Council has the responsibility for preparing a Local Plan. The District Council has conducted the call for sites and had nearly 300 responses. The Local Plan is for the period 2020-2040.

The Local Plan has had a chequered history. We are now on version 3, the previous one having been withdrawn by the Residents for Uttlesford administration. Stansted councillors voted against withdrawal and for amendment. We were in the minority. A Local Plan is a crucial document as it determines the scale of development and where it should be located. It is Central Government that sets the numbers of houses required. For Uttlesford approximately 11,600 dwellings over the 20 year period are called for. This is far too high a figure. It constitutes a risk of making Uttlesford a less pleasant place to live in. You can view the all sites submitted at Call for Sites April 2021 (arcgis.com).

My colleague Cllr Melvin Caton is a member of the Local Plan Leadership Group. They have the responsibility of bringing an acceptable local plan to fruition. The timetable has been slipping, but these are some of the significant timelines:

- By summer 2022 UDC will presents its preferred options for public consultation
- Mid 2023 the Local Plan will be submitted to Central Government for examination and approval
- Mid 2024 Adoption of the Local Plan by UDC

The shape of the plan, which I am assured by officers will be evidence led, is currently unknown. What is known is that its decisions will not be universally welcomed. As one of the district's principal settlements, Stansted is in a vulnerable position. We will all need to to ensure the essential character of the community we are fortunate to call home is preserved and indeed enhanced. If there is to be development then Stansted must receive significant community benefits.



We have had an excellent restart to our activities with a series of well supported activities. For our next meeting we welcome Brian Nobbs as our guest speaker. He will be giving an insight into the wide range of RSPB reserves to illustrate the wide variety of habitats and how they are managed to maintain their biodiversity. The meeting is on **Tuesday 10**th **February** at 7.30pm in Bishop's Park Community Centre, Bishop's Stortford (near Tesco). All are welcome; entry is £3 for members of our local group, £5 for non-members. Membership until July 2022 is £6.

Later in February we have a visit to one of the flagship RSPB reserves at Rainham Marshes (New Tank Hill Road, Purfleet RM19 1SZ). There is a visitor centre with a shop and café. I get a lot of pleasure from watching the birds that come to feed and nest in my garden and it was actually quite exciting to see a sparrowhawk at such close quarters. I have sometimes seen the evidence of its meals lying around but never actually seen the hawk on the ground before, so in some ways I felt privileged; not sure I would want to witness such a grisly sight again though! (For other puzzler enthusiasts I made the answer to seventeen down *Odeon*; seemed to fit with everything else so I think it was right.)

I try to each year, with mixed results, but it is a good excuse to sit down with a mug of coffee gazing out of the window for an hour without feeling guilty. I will let you know how I got on next month.

### **AMBLE THROUGH THE ARCHIVES**

### February 2012

Hard to believe that ten years ago London was the focus of worldwide attention as it prepared to host the Olympics, and plans were being made to celebrate our Queen's Diamond Jubilee with street parties, fêtes, etc. Major events that occurred in February of that year included an earthquake of 6.9 magnitude that hit central Philippines off the coast of Negros Island causing over 50 deaths and injuring over 100, and a train crash in Buenos Aires which killed 51 people and injured 700. 

### **BRAIN TRAINING**

Pain - utterly fascinating. Is it really a gift? Pain is a peculiar thing; it is actually an action signal sent out by the brain, rather than an input from a sore knee, perhaps. A good, and very funny, book to read which gives examples of pain and our reactions to it, is by Lorimer Moseley, called *Painful Yarns*. With the invention of the MRI scanner and explorations into, for example, people's lumbar spines, we now know that all sorts of terrible things can be happening around a joint, but these cause absolutely no pain whatsoever. The brain is not bothered about that slipped disc. Yet in someone else, that slipped disc causes excruciating pain.



What is going on? If we have pain, something is amiss, and we are not paying attention to it; eventually the brain sends pain to slow us down until we work out the causes. That something could be many things: unhappiness in our life or visual problems – one eye not working well or our glasses not suiting us, an old scar or a previous concussion/ whiplash messing up the balance of the brain. The point of pain is to do something about it. It does not mean stop everything, far from it; but we do need to explore the root causes and address them, which means that pain is actually a gift. Without pain, why change? In truth, big things come from little things. We constantly get signals that all is not well: insomnia, declining balance, strong gag reflex and reduced sense of smell or hearing are common examples. By the time things have progressed to needing to see a doctor, the remedial task is now immense.

In December we held our Quiz evening with teams enjoying mulled wine with mince pies and sausage rolls. January was a members' talk evening with three speakers lined up. Tony Crosby picked up from his 2020 talk about the old Lime Kiln works in Farnham Road. He showed us photos of the works, which opened in 1942/3, in a rundown state. He described the lime extraction process; lime was used locally for building and agriculture. After closing in the 1970s the premises deteriorated, becoming a rubbish dump. The buildings have been sympathetically restored and are now the Animal Rescue Centre.

Kate Birbeck told us about a young soldier, Lt Jack Southard Watney, commemorated on a plaque in St Mary's Church. Kate looked back at the origins of the Anglo Zulu War, then led up to the Anglo Boer War and Lt Watney's involvement; he was in command of a machine gun crew. On 24<sup>th</sup> December 1901 British forces were camped at Groen Kop, or as engraved on the plaque, Tweefontein. They were attacked early on the 25<sup>th</sup> by Boer forces and overwhelmed. He and his crew, whilst trying to rally and charge, were all killed; a fascinating insight into a very sad event.

Finally, Roger Peck described Stansted's contribution to medical research. He explained that a shed in their garden had been a laboratory. After a London conference on tuberculosis (TB) in 1901, Lord Blyth, who was Treasurer to the conference, offered the use of properties in Stansted for research. After Lloyd George supplied more funding in 1911, Stansted clearly benefited. Along with Ros and Roger's house in Silver Street, properties in Chapel Hill and Church Road were also used. Roger then illustrated the link through the years to modern research and the present day.

Our next meeting is on **Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> February** 7.45pm for 8.00pm in the Day Centre, when Alan Padgett will talk on *The History of Church Bells* with a focus on St Michael's, Bishop's Stortford.

## WINTER BIRD WATCHING IN HATFIELD FOREST

Over the past 18 months or so we have been visiting Hatfield Forest regularly. If you followed *Winterwatch* a year ago you will be aware that Chris Packham encourages a 'mindful moment' when you step back from your often busy life and stop to watch and listen to nature all around you.



The forest has become that for us; sitting near the lake with a warming coffee and hot chocolate, we have seen so many different birds, for example the great crested grebes diving under water and reappearing some metres away. There are also cormorants skimming over the water so all you can see is their long neck and head with beak pointing upwards to the sky. The tufted ducks swim about in the centre of the lake while the mallards are eager to be fed and climb out on to the bank quacking noisily. We have seen little egrets on the far side, perched in the trees or fishing at the water's edge and recently a great white egret appeared in the same spot. A grey heron, often just in front of the bird hide, flies off at any disturbance. Now that the trees are bare of leaves, we have seen a buzzard in the woods perching on a low branch as well as bluetits and chaffinches flitting about and a solitary nuthatch and tree creeper almost camouflaged on a tree trunk.



The swans who were absent all summer from this end of the lake have re-appeared with three large cygnets and the jackdaws are a hovering presence waiting for any crumbs from our freshly baked shortbread or flapjack from the café. It is always a rewarding visit and one which we will continue with over this year.
