

UKRAINIAN REFUGEES – CAN YOU HELP?

Volunteers are urgently needed to help Ukrainian refugees arriving at Stansted Airport; to support their onward journey or connection to relatives/host family and other needs that may be identified. This is being co-ordinated by the Council for Voluntary Service Uttlesford (CVSU) with Volunteer Uttlesford. There are up to 200 refugees arriving at the airport every day and there is a Welcome Point in the Arrivals Hall for all Ukrainian arrivals and host families to visit. Ukrainian people with more complex needs are taken to the Reception Centre in Enterprise House. Volunteers will be led and supported by an onsite Volunteer Co-ordinator with full induction and training provided online and are asked to do a four hour shift on a rota basis, with no minimum commitment. Free car parking, mileage, food and drink are provided. For more information please call 01799 510525 or email: volunteer@volunteeruttlesford.org.uk. CVSU are also providing a community responder who visits the hotel where Ukrainians with no onward plans have been placed, to provide additional help, including interpreters.



Over the last five years, Churches Together in Stansted (CTS) have helped one Afghan and three Syrian families settle in Stansted. Now CTS is joining forces with Churches Together in Bishop's Stortford, who are working with the charity *Herts Welcomes Refugees* to set up hospitality support groups to help Ukrainian refugees and their hosts. When the refugees arrive in our country they are traumatised and bewildered. They need a tremendous amount of support, including practical help setting up bank accounts, signing up for health care and education and accessing language lessons. It is not reasonable to expect the hosts to manage all these tasks on their own. If you would like to help, please call Mione on 656634, or email: mionegoldspink@hotmail.com. 

I was just five years old when Queen Elizabeth II came to the throne so have few memories of that occasion. However, I do recall the party held on the large grassy space near my home in Bishop's Stortford to celebrate the Coronation; it rained and I came last in the egg and spoon race!

But who could forget the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in 2012; the parades, processions, Jubilee concert and especially the magnificent Pageant that took place on the river Thames? The spectacle lasted over four hours and despite the cold, rainy weather, thousands of people lined the river bank to wave and cheer the Queen. The Free Church put on an exhibition of photographs and memorabilia showing Stansted Methodist and URC Churches throughout the years, and the windmill hosted displays from the local History Society. The WI held a special cream tea later in the month and there were street parties too. The Parish Council refurbished the fountain island at the top of Chapel Hill to commemorate Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee and a new plaque was added to the railings.



IN MEMORIAM JOHN DUNBAR

17th May 1977 - 9th April 2022



It is with a heavy heart that I write that our son John has died. Some of you may remember him in the village, as he grew up here. He was born at the Leicester Royal Infirmary. From the start the medical staff were baffled and it took until he was nine to obtain a diagnosis of Hypomelanosis of Ito. Needless to say, it was quite a rare syndrome. When he was seven months old, we were to move to Harlow, as his dad had a job there. I did not want to live in Harlow, and we discovered there was a free company coach with its last drop-off in Stansted Mountfitchet. So, it was here we moved in January 1978. At first, I was unaware of the benefits the village would offer us. In Leicestershire we had been given no support for John. After registering at the GP's surgery, we were referred to Great Ormond Street hospital and also for physiotherapy at Rye Street hospital. Mrs James, our physiotherapist, was marvellous and between us we taught him to sit up, crawl and walk.

As he grew older, he was offered a place at the Spinney nursery in Harlow with transport provided. He loved it there. We discovered there was a special school in the village, Peter Kirk School: John enrolled there just before his fifth birthday. We all loved that school and he flourished. Many may remember the school's floats in the Stansted Carnival? I think we won most years. Added to that excitement were the annual jumble sales. My children still talk with great fondness of those events. They had a £1 to spend and what treasures they all bought! When John was seven, we were surprised and delighted to discover that there was a Tortoise Scout troop here in the village. John enrolled and for many, many years he enjoyed the evening meetings and the camping holidays. Those helpers were amazing, so patient, and proffered great support to us all. Finally, when he was seven or eight, John was invited to join the Huw Johnson Club. Over the years John has enjoyed holidays. Thursday evening meet-ups and a great fun social life. So heartfelt thanks to all the volunteers and members.

In conclusion, I want to thank all the agencies in Stansted, who worked so hard to give John a taste of life and excitement. He loved it all. Thank you all!

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

Stained glass has been with us for over a thousand years, traditionally used in windows of places of worship. The Hundred Parishes has some beautiful memorial windows, mostly from the 19th and early-20th centuries, but I would like to briefly describe a few more recent examples.

The Parish Church of St Andrew in Much Hadham has a window on the west wall of the tower based on an etching by the renowned sculptor, Henry Moore. The window, depicting the Tree of Life, was created by Patrick Reyntiens and celebrates the joint use of the church by Church of England and Roman Catholic congregations. In Little Easton, the parish church is dedicated to St Mary the Virgin and has two stained-glass windows in the north chapel that honour the American air crews of 386th Bomb Group, known as the Crusaders, who lost their lives in WWII. The windows are the Crusaders Window and the Window of Friendship and Peace.



Another window dedicated to American airmen can be found in St Georges, Anstey. The Millennium Window shown above records the names of all the men of 398th Bomb Group who died in WWII, etched onto butterflies. In Broxted, 13th century St Mary's church has two modern stained-glass windows, the Hostage Windows. They were installed following the release in 1991 of three men: Terry Waite, Brian Keenan and local man John McCarthy. All had been held hostage in Lebanon for five years. One window is called the Window of Captivity and the other the Window of Freedom. They were designed by John Clarke and replaced two Victorian windows. When you are out and about, I hope you will pause to look in our churches at the wonderful range of craftsmanship, some old and some not so old.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE



...with news of Jubilee celebrations, revised cemetery rules, details on how to enter Stansted in Bloom, applications for parking restrictions, & how our plans for the village's green spaces are progressing

JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS



he Trooping of the Colour on June 2 kicks off the Queen's Jubilee Weekend, but celebrations move closer to home later that day when we participate in the lighting of 1,500 Platinum Jubilee Beacons across the British Isles and Commonwealth.

You will need to head to the Recreation Ground at 9.45pm (though we would ask those wishing to watch this event to gather at the Rec from 9.30pm) to see the village's 2-metre tall beacon lit. A resident who celebrates their birthday over the Central Jubilee Weekend will have the honour of lighting the beacon. The U3A choir will sing Jerusalem and the National Anthem to make the event even more memorable.

The celebrations to mark the Queen's 70 year-long reign return again to the Rec on Saturday, June 4 - when the Parish Council's **Jubilee Community Picnic** gets under way from 2pm.

Expect food stalls and catering vans from the award-winning Brohmon (Asian food) and Bear & Eden (ice-cream and sandwiches) as well as tea, coffee and cakes from the Women's Institute, along with a host of other caterers. The Cork House will be on site serving up drinks, and after all costs have been met, any proceeds from the event will go to support a local charity. Residents are also welcome to bring their own food and refreshments to enjoy at the picnic, which will come to a close at 7pm.

Last year's event was one of the competition's most successful to date. This year, there are no less than seven categories to attract as many entrants as possible:

- Main Garden (large)
- Main Garden (small)
- Hanging Baskets, Tubs, Containers
- Fruit & Vegetable Plots (allotments or gardens)
- Communal Areas (care homes & schools)
- Commercial establishments (pubs, clubs, shops, etc)

Judging gets under way on **Sunday**, **June 26** with three sets of judges setting off around the village to assess entrants'



gardens, plots and outdoor spaces. With standards so high in recent times, many of the entries have become recognised village beauty spots in their own right. Organisers hope entrants will be willing to open up their gardens and green spaces for visitors after judging ends. Stansted will also again be competing for glory in the **Anglia in Bloom** competition after success in last year's festival. The focus of Anglia in Bloom is on the managed public spaces of villages and towns. In its first outing, Stansted picked up a silver gilt award for its overall entry. The Parish Council will again be supporting our entry in the hope that we can do even better this year.

RECEPTION HOURS

e are trialling new hours for our reception at the Mountfitchet Exchange. You can now visit us in person on weekdays from 10am to 2pm. As before, you can phone or email on Monday to Friday 9am to 4pm, except on Wednesdays when it's 9am to 2pm (although our staff work beyond these hours!).

As a side note, the District Council continues to plan to use £10k in funds to offer improved access to its services which we hope will include some representation at the Mountfitchet Exchange. The timing of this is dependent on restructuring at the District Council.

WEIGHTY MATTERS

pplications by the Parish Council for parking restrictions are working their way through the system at the North Essex Parking Partnership. Permission for yellow lines along parts of Cambridge Road, Spencer Close, Lower Street and Chapel Hill are being considered by the Parking Partnership following residents' comments

for and against the various schemes. The volume of heavy goods vehicle traffic through Stansted is a hot topic that gets frequent airing at our meetings. We are pleased that Essex County Council is progressing measures to limit HGVs, especially on Grove Hill. Weight restrictions are to be applied to a number of our roads, new signage put up and mobile speed cameras employed to slow



speedsters down and curtail HGV traffic. Sat Nav companies are being asked to remove Stansted from their suggested routes through local roads, reports Essex County Councillor Ray Gooding.

GREEN SHOOTS, GREEN SPACES

ur programme of sprucing up the green spaces of Stansted has been gathering pace. **Mountfitchet Green** has a new zip-wire, a disabled swing is also in the pipeline for the playground, and the multi-purpose games area is to get a fresh coat of paint this summer.

We are also seeking a lease from Uttlesford District Council to make it easier to manage the Green. The area is also to be one of two recipients of a Jubilee tree - the other spot being the **Recreation Ground**. Meanwhile a trim trail is on its way for **Wilkins Crescent**, already a recipient of extra play equipment.

We are working with Tom Moat from the Essex Forest Initiative to identify parts of Stansted that could benefit from extra trees and shrubs. Tom was instrumental in helping us replenish **Newman's Plantation**, where hundreds of shrubs and saplings were planted after the woodland had been struck by Ash die-back.

Progress, albeit slow, is also being made in the handover of land and allotments from developers at Elms Farm and Walpole Meadows. Two weeks of corrective work at Elms Farm is to see the landscape improved, trees replaced, and weeds tackled. At Walpole Meadows, site visits to the allotments are planned by Bloor Homes, District Councillors, and district council officials



to resolve issues preventing the transfer of ownership to the Parish Council.

CALMING WORDS

t was great to hear recently that the reassuring presence of Special Constable Steve Dale and our PCSO Alex Stewart worked to calm troubled waters at the **Youth Centre** on Lower Street. Regular visits by the officers and their colleagues from the Uttlesford Community Policing team to the Youth Club did the trick of stopping troublesome youths from outside Stansted disrupting life at the centre on Lower Street.

The incident not only reminds us of the need to fund local police services - Steve and Alex are both parish-funded we might add - but once again underlines the importance of forging good relations with our younger residents. For this reason, we would encourage anyone under the age of 18 living in Stansted (or attending a local school or college) to consider joining either the Youth Club or our **Youth Council**.

Airport fly parking:

s the country now starts to recover from the pandemic and people start to travel, one of the consequences has been the return of airport fly parking to the area.

Following concerns raised by residents on the Mountfitchet Estate, Cllr Caton and I met with the Community Team at Stansted Airport to take them on a tour of the area to view the problems caused by airport fly parking. I am pleased to announce that following our discussions, Stansted Airport has agreed to install "No Airport Parking" signs across the estate.



In addition to the above, we have also agreed that the "No Airport Parking" signage will be placed on the following roads on Foresthall Park.

- Walson Way
- Reeve Road
- Livings Way
- Palmer Close
- Forest Hall Road

This is a good outcome for both areas as a first measure to try and alleviate the problem of airport parking.

Parking Restrictions

istrict Councillors have been working with the Parish Council and the North East Parking Partnership to discuss appropriate restrictions on the **Mountfitchet Estate** and **Foresthall Park**. This follows concerns related to parking, speeding and safety at junctions.

A consultation will be published in the next few months to inform residents on the process and timescales. It is likely that the Parking Partnership will implement any agreed restrictions in autumn 2023. Further information will be provided through the Parish Council Highways Committee.

Emerging Uttlesford Local Plan

he first draft of the latest attempt to create an Uttlesford Local Plan is due to go out to consultation with residents from June 20 to July 29. It is worth reminding residents that the R4U administration decided to withdraw the previous Local Plan and start the process again.

This decision has cost the District Council some £7m. All four Stansted District Councillors voted against this approach as we wanted the administration to retain and repair the previous plan. Thus, saving money and reducing duplication and avoiding something of a developer free-for-all.

The result of withdrawing the previous plan means that Uttlesford will be required to build 706 houses per annum until 2040 instead of 636 houses per annum, under the withdrawn plan. In total Uttlesford District Council now must find sites for around 16,000 houses.

Stansted District Councillors are not against house building and have always been in favour of the creation of new well integrated communities rather than developer-led additions to the edges of existing communities.

We consider that any development in existing settlements must come with considerable benefits to the community in the form of additional infrastructure, services, and facilities, e.g. for sports and recreation, culture and open spaces that improve the wellbeing and quality of life of our residents. In addition, all new developments must be low carbon. Highways MUST be able to cope.

Like the Parish Council we are opposed to the proposed new settlement at Bollington Hall in Ugley on the grounds of the negative impact on Stansted Mountfitchet, especially traffic on B1383, public services, and coalescence of a new settlement with our village.



IN MEMORIAM DEREK BAYFORD 7th December 1945 – 11th April 2022



It was a great shock to many people in Stansted to hear of the sudden death of Derek Bayford. He was very much part of village life as a fire officer, gardener, neighbour and friend. Derek was born in Bishop's Stortford and was brought up in a farm cottage at Cradle End, Little Hadham. Hard work, self-sufficiency, self-reliance and 'making do' were all qualities instilled in him from an early age. After leaving school he served an apprenticeship with Franklins at Bishop's Stortford as a motor vehicle mechanic. He then moved to Stansted Motor Company for a time before setting up as an independent motor vehicle engineer. Derek joined Essex County Fire and Rescue Service at Stansted in February 1973 and served until his retirement as Officer-in-Charge in June 2001. Derek led the station through many memorable incidents, including the Korean jumbo jet crash in December 1999. His time with the fire service was a very important part of his life.

When he retired at 55, he launched a new career, this time involving another passion of his, gardening. When Derek came to your garden, you felt that yours was the most important one in the world. "Why don't we move that plant here?" or "shall we put something there?" If Derek thought it was a good idea, it usually was! He loved all things mechanical, and a hobby he and his wife Karen enjoyed together was restoring vintage vehicles. Later they enjoyed canal narrow boating and more recently trips in their camper van. For the past 20 years Derek also worked for a local funeral director. He carried out his duties, as you would expect, in an efficient and dignified way. If he should happen to notice a mourner looking lost or needing help, he would discreetly guide them through any difficulties. This was Derek, always responding to people needing a helping hand and going the extra mile for them. He will be missed by so many people, not only as our hard-working reliable gardener, but as a kind thoughtful man, and a very special friend.

Money worries

Managing finances can create stress and anxiety at the best of times. We are all likely to be feeling the pinch now even more so than usual. Here are a few tips and strategies to help you feel more in control:

- Write a list of things you think you spend your money on over the period of a month or a week. Then, over the next month or week, write down absolutely everything you actually do spend money on. At the end of the month compare your lists. Are there any surprises?
- 2 Allocate into needs and wants look at the items on your spending list and decide whether each item is essential (eg your mortgage/rent, utilities, council tax, petrol, weekly food shop etc) or something that you could manage without (eg gym membership, new make-up, take-away coffee etc).
- 3 Compare your income against your outgoings. Ideally, you have enough money coming in to at least cover your essentials and hopefully most of your wants too; if not you may be building up unwanted debt.
- 4 Are there any areas you could save money? For each item consider whether you can reduce it, or eliminate it entirely. For example, you could plan your weekly meals in advance so you only shop for what you need, swap premium brands for supermarket own brands or go online to check cheapest petrol prices in the area. Don't forget the new Community Foodshare run by Touchpoint every Wednesday-Friday where there is free food on offer to anyone (see page 3).



You may not know how it started over 40 years ago, or how its results are used and what it tells us about our much-loved garden visitors. The subject of the Club's first meeting of the new season was Attracting Birds and Wildlife. Roger Hance, a talented photographer, used a series of slides to explain how to encourage a variety of birds, insects, amphibians and animals into your garden. As birds need an easy escape route from predators, care should be taken when positioning bird tables and feeding stations. By planting berry-bearing shrubs and positioning the bird table nearby, the birds will feel safe and enjoy the berries whilst waiting to use the bird table. A recipe for homemade fat balls was given, along with a warning that dry bread should not be given to birds; always soak it as it can choke fledglings. He recommended adding a pond to your garden as this acts as a magnet to wildlife and will enhance the food chain. Care should be taken to ensure there is a shallow area for birds to bathe and mammals to drink, but also a deeper area for amphibians to live, with water edge plants and stones giving extra hiding places. Nectar-rich flowers will encourage bees, butterflies and moths and a bug hotel will give protection during the winter months.

Our next meeting is **Wednesday** 1st June 7.30pm for 8.00pm at the Day Centre. The subject is *The Human Roots Charity – its Aim.* Keiran Leigh Olivier will talk about past and future projects and explain this year's growing plans with handy tips and tricks. Eye drill - this is to prevent the need for reading glasses or to combat slow deterioration. Equipment needed: a pen with writing on it and a small distant target, on the wall or outside the window.

- 1. Align yourself with the distant target. Ideally the target should be a letter or a number, but not essential
- 2. Pick a letter on the pen to stare at
- 3. Bring the pen as close to the bridge of your nose as you can still read the letter. It can be blurry, but not double
- 4. Now switch gaze from the pen to the distant target as quickly as it takes for each to become clear
- 5. Do this for a few seconds to start with and build the time up.

This is an excellent exercise to do during lengthy spells of staring at a screen. You can feel the muscles working as you

This exercise is relaxing because when the eyes focus on the pen, they cross and the lenses become more spherical; the eye muscles responsible for this lie at the top of the brainstem, the mesencephalon, and this is where the parasympathetic nervous system begins; this is also known as rest and digest system, as opposed to the fight and flight, or sympathetic nervous system. This is why reading a book before going to sleep can help send you off, provided the book is not so exciting that you are grimly hanging on to see what happens next.


