EDITORIAL



This well-illustrated talk took us right through the mechanics of a flight from take-off to landing. It was absolutely fascinating. We listened, learned and asked many questions afterwards. 

A warm welcome back to all our pupils, old and new. It is always lovely to see our reception classes settling well into school. Our reception topic for this half term is *Marvellous* Me. Willow and Lilac class are doing lots of self-portraits; Stage 1 are working on *The Enchanted Woodland*. What big surprises are waiting if you go down to the woods today? Foxes and badgers, with voles and mice beneath the leaves on the forest floor. We are classifying and identifying, making maps, working with natural materials in art and building a den. Years 3 and 4 are concentrating on *Tremors*, discovering the dangerous and ferocious world of natural disasters whilst glimpsing their deadly effects. We will attempt to build models of our own exploding volcanoes. The children will study historical narratives and newspaper reports and learn about Pompeii and rocks in science. STRUGGLING TO PAY YOUR BILLS?

Check if you are eligible for Benefits You might be able to claim or increase your current benefits if you are:

- working age and on a low income
- sick or disabled
- State Pension age and on a low income
- a carer
- responsible for children

You can use the online benefit calculator on our website, or our advisers can carry out a benefit check for you.

Help from the Government Every household will automatically receive £400 off their electricity bill in six instalments, under the *Energy Bills Support Scheme*. You do not need to claim and it does not need to be paid back. Payments are £66 in October and November and £67 in December to March. Your electricity supplier will take the amounts off your bills; if you have a prepayment meter, they will confirm whether they will add the instalments to your meter or send you vouchers.

Cost of Living Payment If you get income related benefits, you will receive a £326 *Cost of Living Payment (CLP)*. You only get one such payment, even if you claim multiple benefits. To get this payment you must have either:

- been getting a benefit payment on or between 26th April and 25th May this year; no matter if it gets paid to someone else, like your landlord
- started a successful benefit claim by 25th May or by 26th April if you are applying for Universal Credit.

There is a second *CLP*. If you receive Working or Child Tax Credit, it will be in the winter; for other benefits, it is in autumn. If you are not claiming benefits, and are eligible, you should claim as soon as possible as you might be able to get the second *CLP*.

Help from your local Council. Households in Council Tax bands A-D are eligible for £150 which does not have to be repaid. How you will be paid depends on how you pay your bill. Go to www.uttlesford.gov.uk/energy-bills-rebate or call UDC on 01799 510510 for details. A separate discretionary fund is available for people who do not pay Council Tax, whose homes are in brackets E-H or where households have suffered a recent change that has led to financial hardship. See www.uttlesford.gov.uk/energyrebate-ehf. These schemes are separate from the Exceptional Hardship Fund for help towards Council Tax bills.

There are some changes to the **Warm Home Discount Scheme** which will identify households with high fuel costs and match the addresses to low-income households, who receive certain benefits; the rebate will be paid automatically by March 2023. If you have previously received the grant and are concerned that you may miss out this year, please contact us.

If you were receiving a disability benefit on 25th May 2022, the Government will automatically give you an additional £150 within two weeks of 20th September.

If you are over State Pension age and get Winter Fuel Payments, you will automatically get an extra £300 per household with your usual payment.

If you cannot pay your energy and water bills, afford food or essential items such as clothes or an oven, or you need help with health costs, school costs or essential travel if you are looking for work, there is other support available. Please contact us or visit www.citizensadvice.org.uk. You can also ascertain whether you could get help from local and national charities at www.turn2us.org.uk.

If you are struggling, speak to the organisations you owe money to; they might let you pay smaller amounts or take a break from payments, but do not ignore bills or letters. Our specialist debt team can provide confidential help and support to manage debt. It is completely free, so please get in touch. If you are finding things difficult, remember your mental health is as important as your physical health, so talk to your GP if your money problems are affecting your mental health or go to www.uttlesfordfrontline.org.uk for information and to self-refer to a wide variety of local health and wellbeing support groups.

MEMORIES

The Link - what a very suitable name for a magazine that not only tells the community what is currently happening in Stansted and surrounding villages, but also brings back many happy memories to those of us born and bred in Stansted. A nephew who



lives in Stansted kindly passes The Link to me as I now reside in Eire. The August report from Stansted Football Club prompted me to put pen to paper, so to speak. Memories came flooding back of the Saturday evenings when my dear dad, Ken Turner, once Secretary of Stansted FC, would return home after every match to call in the results to the media establishments and write up reports for publication.

Mention of Hargrave Park brings back many happy thoughts of the other activities that took place there, such as the annual summer carnivals and. of course. cricket. I remember a particularly fine letter from my aunt, who lived in Cambridge Road. She described enjoying her garden on a beautiful summer afternoon surrounded by the aroma of roses and sweet peas, with the birds chirping and the bees buzzing. In the background she could hear the unmistakable sound of leather on willow as the ball struck the bat, and in my mind's eye made it all the way to the boundary for a six! I was instantly transported back to the village of my youth.

I also recall Peter Philpott who, every Saturday morning, walked from Bentfield End to Hargrave Park to mark out the white lines and ensure the pitch and facilities were in good order for the match.

These people and many others were, and still are, the unsung heroes of local football and other societies and sporting clubs. From reading Tom Williams' write-up, many of the players still seem ambitious. I remember the 1983/84 season when Stansted FC won the final of the FA Vase at Wembley; what excitement that brought to the village.

Of course, the following season a number of the more talented players had moved on to the bigger and more senior clubs who had the money to seduce the players with dreams of success. I believe back in the day many of the players in the professional English leagues were made up of guys from these humble beginnings, who dreamed of being able to join a professional team and played purely for love of the beautiful game!

So, my thanks go to The Link and to Tom Williams for evoking such happy memories. Keep up the good work.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

...with news of a change of provider at the Stansted Youth Club, the search for a site for this year's firework display, the call for volunteers to shape the village's response to climate change, the Summer Windmill Fete, and how to get smoke alarms fitted for free



NEW YOUTH CLUB SERVICE PROVIDER

In Spring, the Parish Council announced that the contract for the provision of youth services would go out to tender this year, and we invited bids from suitable providers.

For the last ten years, the Youth Club has been run by Gemini Youth Support (known as the Stansted Youth Centre for the last 12 months). In both guises it has been headed up by Linda Barnes, a former youth worker of considerable experience for Essex County Council.

Linda announced her retirement during the Youth Club's summer holidays. The Parish Council would like to express their gratitude to Linda, and her band of amazing volunteers, for saving and subsequently running the club and we wish her all the best in her retirement.

We are pleased to announce the winning tender was submitted by Essex Youth Services. EYS will work in partnership with Uttlesford District Council and Stansted Parish Council and plans to deliver new and exciting activities for 13-19 year olds in the village.

This organisation wasted little time in meeting younger residents and held a series of meet-and-greet events at the end of September at the Youth Centre in Lower Street. These offered a chance for EYS youth workers to introduce them-

SEARCH FOR FIREWORKS SITE CONTINUES

ursts of fireworks across the night sky were sorely missed by residents last November. The Parish Council's Events working group has been trying hard for much of this year to find a spot to host the fireworks. In a village with limited open spaces large enough to safely host such a popular event, this has proved no easy task.

A suitable site for a fireworks night needs not just to have enough space to accommodate a large crowd, but room for access by cars and emergency vehicles, and sufficient distance from housing and fire hazards, such as trees.

The last village firework display was in 2019 at Forest Hall School. The pandemic put a pause on the event in 2020 and then, citing concerns around Covid-19 and health and safety, the school's Trust put us off in 2021. Our Events working group is waiting to learn their stance for 2022.

Alternative sites at Bentfield End, the Recreation Ground and

Mountfitchet Green were considered by the working group. Unfortunately these were viewed to be unsuitable. They were either too small, had poor site access, or were too close to houses and trees.

One possible option identified by the working group was land

near to Walpole Meadows. As we go to press we are awaiting further news on the feasibility of the site.

Another alternative noted by the group was the land at Elms Farm, once ownership is

transferred to the Parish Council by the housing developer Crest. The presence of existing trees, and plans to use the land for

rewilding schemes, along with the location of nearby housing are factors weighing against the use of the site however.

Ultimately, should these options not prove possible, then we shall be unable to put on the event this year. Please watch our website and Facebook page for announcements.

WINDMILL SUMMER FETE

Congratulations to the Stansted Millers for once again putting on this year's Windmill Summer Fete. This August bank holiday, over 400 people turned out to the Recreation Ground and Windmill Fields to enjoy face-painting stands, second-hand book stalls, crockery smashing and golf-putting competitions.

The fête is one of the Millers' means to fill their coffers as they continue to pursue a lengthy and costly list of repairs to the village's Grade II* listed windmill. On the to-do list currently is re-pointing of the mill's brickwork (estimated to cost £55k) and in a few years' time a new set of sails, priced at an approximate £70k.

This year the Parish Council underwrote the Summer

Fête should it incur a loss or be cancelled. We also act as one of two trustees for the mill and set aside part of our budget each year to help with its upkeep. This amounted to £4,000 in 2021-22.




JOIN THE CLIMATE FIGHT

Recent rain may have revived some patches of green to your yellowed lawn, but there can be no denying that mother nature has given us a warning shot across the bows this summer with regard to climate change. SMOKE ALARMS FITTED FOR FREE

ouse fires killed 311 people across the UK in 2021. Having a home with smoke alarms that are broken or have dead batteries puts lives at risk. To try and ensure residents' homes have fitted, functional smoke alarms, Essex Fire Service will be installing detectors for free in Stansted this month.

On Thursday 6th and Friday 7th October, the Fire Service will be going door-to-door to homes testing smoke alarms, replacing faulty ones or fitting new ones for free. They will be also be fitting sensory smoke alarms for people with visual or hearing impairments.

Our Police Community Support Officer, Alex Stewart, along with other members from the local police team, will be supporting the Fire Service in this initiative and will be on hand to listen and provide advice on crime-related matters.

Cost of living

The cost of living crisis continues to bear down on the Stansted community regardless of income level. Stansted District Councillors are concerned about the impact, especially for residents on low income as well as those in the middle income bracket. It is one of the reasons why Stansted District Councillors put together a budget motion at the February meeting of Uttlesford District Council (UDC) to provide an additional £100 payment for those families who qualify for the Local Council Tax Support Scheme. I was pleased that our motion was accepted, providing additional help over and above the Government initiatives currently available.

Following our approach, UDC has extended the hardship scheme to those in council tax bands E-H struggling to pay their bills. Search for qualifying criteria for the scheme at: www.uttlesford.gov.uk/energyrebate-ehf. The scheme closes on 31st October. The maximum award is £200. Please do look into this and see if you qualify.

Energy costs

The high cost of energy will impact all of us; more so on those recovering from illness or needing specialist medical equipment on throughout the day and night. We await the Government's response to the October price hike, but if you are struggling to pay your bill it is advisable to contact your energy provider in the first instance. They have a statutory obligation to provide a payment plan that you can afford. The local Citizens' Advice Team have an energy team to provide further advice on reducing your bill, home insulation and other practical help. Please do contact them. See article on page xxxxxx

Uttlesford District Council Housing Department

In 2019, the Residents for Uttlesford (R4U) administration entered into an agreement with an external provider called Uttlesford Norse to deliver maintenance, and gas/electrical checks for its council house stock. This is a 10-year agreement. Recently, the service of this provider has been under scrutiny as they have failed to undertake timely gas safety checks of council-owned properties. This is a serious breach, and given that UDC is the legal landlord, and the chief executive of the District Council has had to refer the authority to the Housing Regulator.

This means that UDC housing could be put under special measures, which invariably would lead to intervention by the regulator. There is an improvement plan in place with Uttlesford Norse, but the key weakness has been the lack of management of the contract applied by the council. Stansted District Councillors will continue to hold the administration to account and check that they put in place the appropriate arrangements to monitor the provider and ensure tenants get the very best possible service.

Parking

Following concerns from residents, I am pleased that the Parish Council Highways Panel has agreed to look into parking across Stansted, starting with Foresthall Park. It is really positive that residents have agreed to join a small working group to see what solutions can be found. We know that there is no universally agreed approach to parking, whether it is a residents' scheme, or yellow/red lines. I hope the working group can take forward discussions with a tailored approach for the development. Further information can be obtained from the chair of the working group, Cllr Peter Jones (see page 23 for contact details).

Support & advice is available

Finally, I know that it is a worrying time for many, particularly residents who are facing difficulty in paying bills, but there is advice and support available, be it through the excellent work of Stansted's voluntary sector such as Touchpoint, or health partners like the Stansted surgery, as well as from our local business community, all of whom are working hard and will have staff and volunteers who in some way will also be affected by the current economic crisis.

1st September was the first meeting of the season and was introduced by the new Chairman Dave Perry. He took the opportunity to thank Peter Sanders, the previous Chairman, for all the sterling work he had carried out over the past years and presented him with a gift as a token of the society's appreciation. Dave then introduced the speaker, Tony Crosby, who talked about *Chelmsford's Industrial Trail*.

Tony began by outlining the growth of Chelmsford industries and paid particular attention to the rise of the Marconi Company, who perhaps represent the best known of these industries. Guglielmo Marconi was a pioneer in the newly developing electronics industry and originally set up business in London. Due to the electrical interference in the ever expanding commercial and residential development of the capital, he looked for a place close by to site his factories. The first factory was established in about 1898 and the last closed in the 1980s. Marconi's development of radio signals was responsible for the first BBC radio broadcast in 1920.

There were many other industries, ranging from Hoffmann's, major ball bearing manufacturers (1898) to Britvic the soft drink makers, established in Chelmsford for 60 years and finally closed in 2014. So, over the course of some hundred or so years, the old light industries of farming, brewing and milling were expanded to include heavier and more technical industries. Few exist now and their sites are continually being developed for housing and retail parks. Tony's talk concluded with questions from the floor and the chairman thanked Tony for such an interesting and illuminating talk. Our next meeting on **Thursday 6**th **October** at 8.00pm in the Day Centre is entitled *A walk around the 100 parishes*.

What a year it has been! We are beginning to see some plants bouncing back from the extreme drought, with fresh growth on the dahlias and some of the other late flowering perennials in the Italian Garden. We are hoping for good autumn colours, in time for our next Open Day. Our most dramatic autumn tree is the scarlet oak at the top of the Glade, but we also have lovely autumn colours from our acers: by the archive building at the front of the Gardens, the row of acers across the end of the croquet lawn and the range we have down in the Japanese style garden. The crab apples also look good, with their red, yellow or green apples. This will be the first year when we might enjoy the creamy white fruits on the *Sorbus cashmiriana* (Kashmir Rowan) which we planted near the elephant statue.

September Meeting

Members welcomed back George Lockwood, who presented the next talk in the series *Flowering Shrubs for each month*; this time it was for September and October. He gave details of shrubs which flower or have spectacular leaf colour in the autumn. Advice on the best position to site the shrubs, type of soil required, whether annual pruning or just tidying up was required and the overall height/spread was given. George is an organic gardener and looks after five gardens. He discouraged members from using pesticides as these often kill friendly insects; they should use natural means to get a happy balance in the garden. One ladybird larva will consume 50 or more aphids in one day and in its adult form will eat more than 100. The lacewing larva loves eating aphids and consumes 100-600 in its lifetime so is known as the Aphid Lion! He advised that watering in the morning is best and by pouring the water only on the ground around plants ensures that the delicate eggs of lacewings and ladybirds are not washed off the leaves.


