



Focus on Academics In October we celebrated *Black History Month*, learning about important figures such as Andrew Watson, Bessie Coleman and Dr Marie Maynard Daly. As I indicated in my article in the November Link, I am on a quest to find out about all of the various ways the charity Touchpoint helps our local community, as well as to meet the volunteers who coordinate the food share efforts. My previous article was about the collection of goods for the various food shares that happen during the week. I then attended a food share in Stansted to see how these goods are organised to benefit the public. I was greeted warmly by the volunteers who were busy setting up tables outside Touchpoint HQ whilst a queue of locals began to form. The tables are set out in an orderly way with food groups kept together where possible so that everything is easily visible.

There are seven food shares held every week in Stansted, Elsenham, Saffron Walden and Takeley; these reach approximately 1,500 people weekly which in turn reduces the amount of food waste going to landfill. Anyone can access the food share, there are no medical or financial criteria required. It is a fantastic way to sample rarer foods such as tropical fruits; the produce can change at every food share so you never get the identical produce each week. The lovely thing I found was that the friendly volunteers are happy to provide advice on the best way to use the product.

Following my visit to the food share, I again felt a strong sense of community; the volunteers provided an atmosphere which put people at ease in order to make it an enjoyable experience. I would recommend that everyone visits a food share at the earliest opportunity. The timetable can be found on the website. This quintet, formed in 1993, has performed all across the UK and the rest of Europe. Its members are especially passionate about education, working in universities, schools, day centres and nursing homes, striving to make classical music relevant to a wider audience including those with autism and other special needs. Why have we not booked a wind quintet before, you may ask!



The repertoire for woodwind quintet is extensive, with works by composers such as Percy Grainger, Engelbert Humperdinck, Malcolm Arnold and Gustav Holst as well as less familiar names such as Jacques Ibert, Georg Ligeti, Paul Hindemith, Darius Milhaud and many more. The Galliards have released six CDs of quintet music, both original and in arrangements of Haydn, Mozart and others. At the time of writing, they were still finalising the programme for their visit to Stansted, but an afternoon of happy and colourful music-making is guaranteed and there will be mulled wine! 

Posture, Pain and having a good Slump

There seems to be no link between posture, pain and general health, no matter how bent your upper back is. Nagging your adolescent to stand up straight only leads to a massive grump attack. However, there is a link between losing mobility and pain. The more you keep your spine nice and mobile, the better. So when slumping in front of the telly curled up around your phone, that is fine, but do change your slumped position from time to time: curl round to the right, to the left, stick your legs out and cross the ankles, tuck them in and cross the other knee, slump back, slump forward. Ditto at work; try not to freeze in one position for hours on end.



So what about posture? There was a study where 554 Greek physiotherapists were asked about posture. Is there an ideal sitting and standing posture? *Yes* said 93.9% and they would prescribe exercises to achieve this perfection. However, from seven different sitting postures and five different standing postures, they could not agree which was ideal. So what is good posture? A journalist, Paul Ingraham, has dedicated his work to debunking pain science myths and this is what he concludes: *Posture is not a position but a constantly shifting pattern of reflexes, habits and adaptive responses to anything that challenges your ability to stay upright and functional,* all of which boils down to *use it or lose it.* Do not avoid becoming a bit uncomfortable when reaching for something that is rolled under the sofa. Embrace a postural challenge!

SUSTAINABLE STANSTED

Christmas is a wonderful time of year, but did you know it is also the most wasteful too? We create 30% more waste over the festive season than at any other time of year! Gifts are often wrapped in excess packaging, usually plastic which cannot be recycled. Millions of rolls of wrapping paper are bought each year, most of which cannot be recycled. Huge quantities of uneaten food get thrown away; as a country we buy more food than we can possibly eat and this waste releases methane into the atmosphere when it breaks down. Most food is wrapped in packaging that is added to our household waste.



Traditional items like crackers, advent calendars, Christmas trees and cards are often single use. Most get thrown away as they cannot be recycled due to glitter and plastic. Tips to reduce your waste this year:

- Why not look at gifting experiences, these can create some wonderful memories. Look for second-hand items or shop for local crafts
- Try wrapping gifts in fabric (Furoshiki, search on Google) or use reusable gift bags; buy 100% recycled paper and use paper tape
- Shop for food locally, which can help reduce food packaging and boost our local economy. Buy the amount you need and use leftovers to create new meals
- Make your own reusable crackers at home, placing a small gift inside
- Use a reusable advent calendar, refilling it each year with your own treats
- Try renting a Christmas tree or buying a living one in a pot that you can use again the following year.

IN MEMORIAM

RUTH LOIS RAWLINSON 24th August 1940 - 14th August 2023



Mum grew up in Bexleyheath, Kent and moved to North Limes, Stansted in January 1970 with her husband John and us as six-month-old twins. Mum then stayed in the village for the rest of her life, moving to Mont House in 1988 where we all lived for 20 years. This was then demolished and is now the *Mont Heights* development. She then lived in Blythwood Gardens before her last home in Hargrave Mews.

She was dedicated to her career, helping others and to us and our families. She worked in London for over 30 years as a Civil Servant for central government and was a regular commuter from Stansted. She said she loved commuting as it was her chance to catch up on her reading, one of her favourite pastimes, as well as the odd game of cards! She was very proud of her work, with highlights being helping inner-city areas to rebuild after the 1980s race riots and working on policies to help small businesses.

Mum loved living in Stansted; she belonged to many clubs and was a familiar face at community events and fundraisers. Her interests included being a governor at Bentfield Primary School, an active member of the Liberal Democrats, a Parish Councillor and a volunteer at the Day Centre. She was also president and later treasurer for the Ugley WI and a keen member of University of the Third Age (u3a).

She had a deep faith and converted to Catholicism in 1986 with a moving service at Westminster Cathedral overseen by Cardinal Basil Hume. Mum was an active member of St Theresa's Church community as well as the wider *Churches Together* movement in the village, going away on retreats to Lourdes and meeting the Pope in Rome. The Church was an amazing support for her after the sudden death of our Dad, John in 1988.

Mum was an amazing woman; she had a wonderful sense of adventure and love of travel including a honeymoon in Morocco, weddings in America, boating through Russia and numerous road trips with us visiting friends and family. She was also very kind and generous to all including to her grandchildren Reggie and May. She spent the last months of her life at Cedars Place nursing home in Halstead where she was very happy and very well looked after. Just before passing away she was, as ever, asking after people, was engaged in activities and had just been appointed to be the Residents Representative at the care home meetings!

Throughout her life, Mum collected a number of extremely good friends in the village and we thank you all for the love you gave Mum, the laughs, the lunches, the fundraising and the travels. As many of you have said to us in the village, we will all greatly miss Mum's gentle and calming influence; she dealt with whatever life threw at her quietly and sensitively and always with that lovely warm smile. She will always be in our hearts and I am sure in all of yours. As she often said to us and which we would like to say to you all, *be nice to each other and the world will be a better place.*



What was our village like in the past? We are fascinated to know what the shops, roads, pubs, houses and schools were like, for instance. Paul Embleton, our November speaker, provided an insight into these intriguing questions. Paul has spent a lifetime collecting postcards, photographs and memorabilia showing the life and times of Stansted and Bishop's Stortford over the last 150 years.



MULTIVIEW POSTCARD OF STANSTED - c1934

Stansted was a relatively small village with an amazing number of pubs, many of which are still functioning today or until recently. These include The Three Colts, The Rose and Crown, The Bell, The Feathers and The Windmill. There were many shops; Greens Stores in Cambridge Road was the most prominent and there were many more shops in Silver Street, Chapel Hill and Lower Street covering a vast array of trades and services. A photograph of the Post Office in Chapel Hill with all the staff outside was another fascinating glimpse into the past. IN THE GARDEN

Our gardens have been cleared of leaves, mulched and planted with bulbs. Winter is here and the garden is dormant for a couple of months. There may still be colour with the odd rose or salvia producing flowers if the weather has been kind; shrubs such as holly, cotoneaster and viburnum may be adding a little to the show. Evergreen shrubs come into their own with their green and yellow colours, and the blue conifer stands out beautifully in the winter garden. Several of these trees can be shaped into topiary balls or cloud-pruned in layers giving interest to the garden. Some shrubs' lower branches can be cut back thereby leaving space for underplanting with snowdrops or primroses. Grasses too can play their part giving colour and structure to the garden in winter.



This is also the time of year for planning. What to plant or sow next year? What did not work; what ideas are there for resurrecting a corner that has been long overlooked, or a border that needs rearranging? If tasks like cleaning and washing greenhouses and cold frames have not yet been tackled, then now is a good time to do so; sheds will also need sorting out and tools cleaned and sharpened. You may not be able to garden but you can still find jobs to do. Do not forget the wildlife at this time of year. Leave plenty of places where those beneficial creatures can safely overwinter, perhaps a pile of leaves and twigs here and there, or build a bug hotel out of a small box filled with cut bamboo canes and rolled-up, corrugated cardboard, using straw and moss to pack in any spaces in between. Whatever the weather that winter has in store for us, there is always something to look forward to in the garden.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

...with news of pharmacy provision in the village, three successful grant awards, a visit to Stansted by teenagers from Rungis and details of how to share your thoughts on the district council's plans for our area until 2041



Pharmacies: An Open & Shut Case

At the start of November, Stansted welcomed the opening of the new dispensing pharmacy. For this we must thank the partners of Stansted Surgery who, having won their appeal against NHS England's refusal to grant them a pharmacy licence back in July, have worked tirelessly to get a working dispensing pharmacy up and running. The result of their

handiwork is Peacock Pharmacy. This new dispensary has taken over occupancy of Stansted Pharmacy, sited next door to the Stansted Surgery on Lower Street. Stansted Pharmacy, despite their convenient location, were without a licence to provide prescriptions



medicines. This left residents in the south of the village and crucially at the bottom of Chapel Hill with no choice but to head up the Boots Pharmacy on Cambridge Road.

The Peacock Pharmacy fills an important gap in community health service provision. But there has been little time for those who campaigned for a second dispensing pharmacist in Stansted to celebrate. The pharmacy on Cambridge Road has been deemed financially unviable by its owners, Boots Pharmacists.

Back to square one?

Well not quite. The village is again down to a single dispensing pharmacist for 8,600 residents, but the Parish Council is working with Stansted Surgery to find ways to expand Peacock's reach in the north of Stansted. One way being explored is to apply for planning permission for a 24hr easy-



to-use collection point for medication on the Crafton Green site.

Another option could see Crafton Green and SMPC buildings used to deliver services such as flu and major vaccination programmes. The aim would be to reduce the need for residents with limited mobility to navigate Chapel Hill. The surgery is already offering a home delivery service for people unable to collect prescriptions in person.

Three more grants awarded

Close to £3,000 in funding has been awarded by SMPC to a trio of organisations delivering services and support to people in Stansted. Last Christmas, TouchPoint raised funds to distribute £25 Amazon vouchers to over 150 struggling families in 2022. To help TouchPoint deliver £15,000 worth of presents to hard up families in Uttlesford, the SMPC has provided a £1,500 grant.

Home Start Essex has been awarded £250 to fund its work providing practical and emotional support to parents struggling to cope with the stresses of modern family life. The final beneficiary was community newcomer She's Ready Stansted. A £1,000 grant will support their work empowering women to be more active through social action.

The organisations joined five other recipients of the £7,000 set aside by SMPC to support community groups in 2023/4. If you would like to find out how to go about applying for a parish council grant for your organisation visit: stanstedmountfitchet-pc.gov.uk/community-grants

Police Action

Investment by the district council in a Tru-cam has helped Essex Police (Uttlesford) clamp down on what consistently ranks for many Stansted residents as one of their biggest beefs speeding motorists.

Police Community Support Officer Alex Stewart has conducted multiple community meet-ups in our area since September. A common complaint heard at these has been pedestrians being made to feel unsafe by fast traffic along High Lane, Cambridge Road and Church Road.

Tru-cam accurately records motorists' speeds and sends pictorial evidence of number plates and car type to the district camera enforcement team.

Rungis Youth Assembly Visit Autumn 2023

Months of planning and hard work paid off for the Stansted-Rungis Twinning Association when a visit by 8 teens from the French town's Youth Assembly (plus their two adult guides) passed off without a hitch.

There have been several visits between our two communities since the official twinning in 2018, but this is the first time a visit has been arranged for this age group, says SMPC Chair Maureen Caton. The trip was a fantastic success.

The party of representatives from the French town's Youth Assembly travelled by Eurostar and stayed in London for their 5-day trip. Other than organising their accommodation, the twinning association also arranged for the teens to experience a day in the life at a British second school (Forest Hall School), while local MP Kemi Badenoch's office kindly organised a tour of the Houses of Parliament.

Chair Caton said: The young people from Rungis really enjoyed their time at Forest Hall and we would like to thank the school Head, Dustin Schuyler, for facilitating the visit.

With the French teens safely returned to their families, the twining association has already started prepping for the next trip between the two communities. Next May, Stansted will once again lay out the welcome mat to our friends in Rungis!

Errant parking is viewed legally as a civil, not a criminal, offence and as such falls outside the jurisdiction of the police. This is not always the case, though, and PCSO Stewart is keen to warn residents that parking vehicles in such a way that could block access to emergency services could see your vehicle towed away, with penalty fees being incurred.



PCSO Stewart said: Normally we need to have a police officer present before we can issue a ticket, but having the Tru-cam means we can issue penalty fines ourselves.

The community policing team also wish to stop people parking on zigzag lines at zebra crossings, such as at Lower Street and Cambridge Road. Parking in such places can put pedestrians at risk of serious injury. Drivers may be unable to spot pedestrians if their view is blocked by parked cars near a crossing. Those caught stopping on zigzags even if it's just to let someone out of a car can expect a £100 fine and points on their licence.

Highways Round-up

Essex County Council are preparing to meet representatives of the communities of Stansted, Elsenham, Henham, Ugley and Takeley ahead of a consultation into the possible rerouting of HGV traffic away from Grove Hill. An alternate route has been suggested that would see HGVs pass instead via Hall Road.

Costly safety improvements to this route would be needed before this would be considered a viable option by Essex Highways. Alternative routes are unlikely to be welcomed either by nearby communities, who are sensitive to a proposal that could see HGV traffic pushed their way.

Money well spent...

nvestment by the Parish Council in wooden barriers along Ugley Brook came just in time to minimise the risk of flooding in Lower Street when heavy rain from Storm Ciaran pounded the village in November.

Our volunteer flood wardens used £2,000 of funding from the Parish Council to build two barriers to catch debris and manage the brook's flow. Storm Ciaran battered southern England and caused some flooding locally, notably along the B1383 at Birchanger.

But regular checks of the barriers and removal of sticks and branches meant the wardens prevented the Brook becoming blocked and overspilling into Lower Street, as

happened in 2014.



There is pessimism also about the implementation of traffic calming measures for High Lane. At a Highways sub-committee meeting in October, County and District Councillor Ray Gooding says the proposal is currently being reviewed. He reported the problem here rested with High Lane's status as R2.

Roads are ranked according to the prioritisation given to vehicles over other road users and pedestrians. High Lane would need a R3 rating for calming measures. But even if the Lane's was recategorized downwards, this could pose further problems. As an R3 road, maintenance and repairs would be de-prioritised along High Lane.

News that Essex County Cllr Lee Scott has made way for Tom Cunningham as cabinet Member for Highways, Infrastructure and Sustainable Transport, offers hope that a fresh pair of eyes may view the troubles of Grove Hill and High Lane in a new light. The Parish Council has written to welcome Cllr Cunningham into his new role and invited him to visit Stansted to see the problems first hand.

And finally, in light of reported near misses the Parish Council has asked the Local Highways Panel to conduct a study into determining the best location for a Zebra crossing on Forest Hall Park. The highways panel is tasked with delivering road casualty reduction schemes and measures requested by local communities. The absence of a crossing is putting the lives of school children at risk on the development.

Draft Local Plan Consultation

The district council has been in consultation with residents since November 3, seeking your thoughts on the plans and proposals for development in Uttlesford contained in their draft Local Plan.

You have until the middle of this month—December 15 to be precise to have your say on a document that could prove crucial in determining what gets built, and where, across the district from now until 2041.

What has been proposed

Central to the draft plan are allocations for about 6,000 additional homes in the most sustainable locations. Of this number. 455 have been allocated to Stansted. The rest will appear mainly in Great Dunmow, Newport, Saffron Walden, Takeley and Thaxted. Some nonstrategic development is also proposed in larger villages. The plan does not propose any development in smaller villages, other than modest infill, nor in the open countryside.

The Local Plan as currently written seeks to ensure that future development preserves and enhances the experience of existing communities, whilst providing a range of new facilities and infrastructure, and ensuring that 35% of the homes built are affordable homes

Your responses will be used to inform the final version of the plan, which the council will consult on again next year. The final plan will then be submitted to the Secretary of State for independent examination by a Planning Inspector.

Early December 2022

We also need to sort out our plans for re-paving the Italian Garden; this is a longer-term project, so is not likely to be in place for a while yet. UGLEY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

The speaker at our October meeting was Jenny Oxley from Saffron Walden Museum who gave us a fascinating talk on the history of this delightful museum which opened in 1835 and has a staggering collection of 175,000 items! She brought a very interesting selection of them to illustrate her talk, allowing our members to study and, as a rare privilege, handle items ranging from domestic to agricultural use. These included a travelling inkwell used by the military, a sugar cutter, a Victorian can opener, a tool used in the making of sails, and an apple corer made from a sheep's bone. Agricultural items included a tool for cutting and splitting straw and a very tactile leather boot worn by horses when they were put to use as *lawn mowers* before the invention of the more familiar model. The boots prevented the horses' hooves damaging the lawn as they mowed it!

Our December meeting will be our annual festive tea which for catering purposes is restricted to members only, but we welcome visitors to the following meeting on **Wednesday 17**th **January** at 2.00pm in Ugley Village Hall. As we move from autumn into winter, the forest's orange and yellow leaves give way to the barer winter trees. This emptier look is perfect for spotting some of the wildlife in the forest. The ground conditions will deteriorate as the weather changes, so we have closed our grass parks and moved to limited hard standing. This change in season is also causing erosion of the historic woodland rides, so if you come across a diversion, please follow it and discover a new route. The forest is now closed on Mondays and Tuesdays for the winter but is open Wednesday to Sunday 9.00am-2.30pm. The café remains open until 3.00pm serving hot food and warming drinks for this colder weather.



Hatfield Forest venison is now available to purchase from the Estate Office. We manage deer numbers in the forest so that the damage they cause to the woodland is insignificant. Venison has a gorgeous, distinctive flavour with some similarities to beef and lamb. We supply all cuts: haunch, steak, mince, shoulder and diced. 
