#### **NATURAL BEEKEEPING**

Well the rain is persisting, and I know summer really only starts after the summer solstice, but this has been ridiculous! I think many plants have flowered really early this year, largely because there has not been any late frost. As a result many of the trees have kept their flowers, which are now fruiting. The elderflowers are out in force. This is great for the trees, but it has not been very good for the bugs, especially the ground burrowing wasps and bumblebees, which I have not seen this year. Butterflies love warm sunny days and again I have not seen many.



As you know, I do natural beekeeping now, but a long time ago I had conventional box hives for a number of years. This year I put out six empty hives and three now have honeybees. So they seem to be doing really well, even with all the rain; I think it is due to the abundance of flowers and very little competition from other pollinators. So even though there have not been many flying days, they have not had to fly very far. I am now holding my breath for a few dry weeks of hot weather, mainly to help all the other pollinators to have a chance to play catch-up. I will keep you posted. What you can keep an eye out for is how the numbers of pollinating flies, wasps, butterflies and bumble bees pick up over the next month.

Such was the combative nature of his argument, that it left us all wanting more. So, watch this space; perhaps the dinosaur pathway will get an airing soon!

David entertained us in February with a talk on *Famous Gardens*; he is a member of Thorley u3a and opens his garden annually in aid of charity. #### HATFIELD FOREST

www.nationaltrust.org.uk/hatfield-forest

Come and visit us this summer and you will experience the beauty of the lake and forest in a way you have not before, whether it is attending one of our open-air theatre events or boating on the lake. The lake was created in the mid-18<sup>th</sup> century, when the Houblon family, who owned the forest, dammed the Shermore Brook. A boat hire facility operated from before the Second World War through to the 1980s.

Following dialogue with *Natural England*, a non-departmental public body, sponsored by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, six boats have been provided for rent. These are named after indigenous trees that can be found within the forest: oak, ash, hornbeam, maple, hawthorn and hazel.

The boats are handmade by Clovelly Boats in Devon and are available to hire in the school summer holidays from the pontoon by the Shell House, noon-4.00pm. A maximum of five people are allowed in a boat and the cost is £10 for 30 minutes.

Alternatively, you could introduce your young ones to fishing. *Get Hooked* is running from **Saturday 13**<sup>th</sup> **July** to **Sunday 8**<sup>th</sup> **September.** Tickets are £5 for children aged 6-16 years and they must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. More information can be found by searching for *Get Hooked* on our website.

Also, in July we have the *The Adventures of Dr Dolittle* performed by the excellent Illyria Theatre company. This is an exciting musical about the adventures of a village doctor who discovers he can talk to the animals; it is fun for all the family in our wonderful forest setting. 



#### IN THE GARDEN

July is usually one of the hottest months of the year but after the weather patterns that have been dominating our climate throughout the spring it is difficult to predict what things will be like during this summer. If we do experience hot dry spells, ridiculous though it may sound after such a wet winter and spring, it still makes sense to save water when we can. Watering should be done in the cooler hours, early morning or in the evening, to avoid evaporation which would occur in the middle of the day. Direct any water to the base of each plant, rather than spraying wide areas, to maximise the benefit of watering.

Make preparations for your garden if you are planning a holiday during this time. Ask a friend or neighbour to look in from time to time, let them pick any ripe fruit or vegetables which will encourage further crops to be produced. Similarly, flowers like sweet peas and dahlias will produce continuous blooms if they are picked regularly. House plants can be given a holiday too. They will benefit from a spell outdoors when it is warmer. Plunge the pots into the soil to minimize water loss.



The summer months are a busy time for gardeners when everything is growing and flowering abundantly. Deadheading will keep blooms coming for longer so never go for a walk round the garden without your secateurs. Late-flowering perennials such as roses will benefit from a general organic fertiliser applied now. In addition, these plants will benefit from a feed after the first flush of flowers; this will encourage them to continue blooming well into autumn. Talking of autumn, why not plant some autumn-flowering bulbs like colchicums, autumn-flowering crocus and nerines to produce flowers through September, October and maybe even into November?




#### **BRAIN TRAINING**

#### It is my nerves! Part 2

Continuing last month's theme of nerves and what they do: they convey information both to and from the brain. Following an injury or surgery, or from overuse or misuse, usually there will be nerve damage; to fully regain strength and prevent further problems, any affected nerves need attending to.

Last month I drew attention to the sciatic nerve, which can easily get trapped in the hip musculature. This month I am picking on the shoulders, the *brachial plexus*. As can be seen in the picture, many nerves pass through a small space between the shoulder and the upper arm. Lifestyle and



stress lead to shoulders rolling forwards and sitting too high, and so this small space gets even smaller, squashing the nerves.

Nerves can get compressed in any joint of the body, such as the elbows in golfers or tennis elbow. We do three different things to nerves to improve function:

- We stretch a nerve. This helps activate muscles, important in strengthening weak muscles
- We slide a nerve. This is a frequent action in rehabilitation, sliding the nerve through the tissues where it is stuck
- We shorten a nerve. This is done when a nerve has been thoroughly over stretched and things are very sore.

Whilst none of this information is of immediate use to you, the point is not to overlook the nerves as part of rehabilitation. An aside: shoulders are particularly difficult to rehabilitate because the shoulder joint is shallow, allowing for great freedom of movement, but this also means that they can easily sit badly from lifestyle or poor form in the gym. There is also a huge emotional component to how shoulders sit. When we are stressed or frightened, up they go!

The reserve has three main types of habitat: ponds, meadows and deciduous woodland. Each attracts different species which makes this such an interesting environment. However, it is the transition zones between habitats that often have the greatest variety of species.

The woodland edges where they join the meadow areas or the fields receive more sunlight and allow a greater variety of plants which in turn support more butterflies and other insects. The pond margins rather than the open water provide food and cover for the aquatic species and are where you will see the heron and the moorhens. These, along with the mallards, successfully reared chicks again this year. They are not as cute as ducklings, due largely to their large bald heads.

With regard to the ponds, we need to ask members of the public not to allow their dogs to enter the ponds. The reason is twofold. Firstly, there has been very significant bank erosion to the top pond where dogs enter and exit the water.

Essex Wildlife Trust has now commissioned revetment work to be carried out soon to this area using several thousand pounds of the charity's resources. The second reason relates to the anti-flea and tick treatments that we give our dogs. There is now increasing evidence that these treatments are harming our ponds and streams and negatively affecting the invertebrate species in the water. I am sure some will be disappointed by this but we ask for your co-operation in helping to look after the plants and wildlife in this reserve.

# THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

The 19<sup>th</sup> century was a period of great railway development. Several railways in The Hundred Parishes no longer exist although they played an important role during their hundred-year lifetime.

The Saffron Walden Railway was constructed in 1865. It branched off the London-Cambridge main line and ran from Audley End Station to Saffron Walden. In 1866 it was extended to Bartlow, to link up with the Stour Valley Railway. Following loss of passengers and freight from rail onto road, a report in 1964 by Sir Richard Beeching identified many lines that were deemed uneconomical; many stations and miles of track were decommissioned, including the Saffron Walden line.



In Hertfordshire, a line ran from St. Margarets to Buntingford, including stations at Braughing, Hadham, Standon and West Mill. The Buntingford Line was closed to passengers in 1964 and goods trains a year later. Buntingford Station is now a private residence. Braughing station opened in 1863 and closed in 1964 and is also a private residence, but it retains many of the original features including the platform, signal box and signals; see photo.

Another line ran from Bishop's Stortford via Dunmow to Braintree. Much of this is now the Flitch Way Country Park, a 15-mile route that was opened in 1994 and is largely maintained by a group of volunteers, Friends of the Flitch Way. It is used by walkers, horse riders and cyclists and is part of National Cycle Network Route 16. The demise of the original rail line cannot be blamed on Beeching; it closed in 1952 for financial reasons. Our website includes a fuller exploration of local railways under the *Articles* section, while the *Walks* section includes routes from current railway stations, plus a new series of Quiet Lane walks that do not use footpaths.

We have had a welcome increase in the number of organised group visits from local youth groups, schools and other organisations to the windmill. We are very pleased to host such visits. We are looking forward to welcoming Dr Martin Bridge to the mill. Martin is a distinguished dendrochronologist who works for the Oxford Dendrochronology Laboratory and also does consultancy work for Historic England. Dendrochronology (or tree-ring dating) is defined as the scientific method of dating tree rings to the exact year they were formed in a tree. Martin is interested in dating the upright shaft in the mill and we hope his findings will support the story that according to local tradition, it was once part of a ship's mast.



#### PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

...with pictures of the village D-day Commemoration Service, an update on Grove Hill, Council grass cutting and hedge maintenance, and a goodbye to one of our Councillors





One of the most frequent questions SMPC fields over the summer months is, who cuts the grass and hedges? and when will they next be cut? We thought it would be useful for residents if we published a map detailing our areas of responsibility in this regard, along with some words of explanation.

Keeping the grass short and the hedges trimmed around the village is a shared responsibility. The map opposite shows areas maintained by SMPC. You may find it is up to Uttlesford District Council, Essex Highways, or your property management company to keep on top of things, depending on where you live in Stansted. For example, at Mountfitchet Green the play area grass is cut by SMPC. The rest of the green is cut by Uttlesford District Council. Cuts to the verges around Mountfitchet Green are shared between the two authorities. The green spaces at Walpole Meadows are kept by the property management company assigned by Bloor Homes.

The grassy areas that are looked after by SMPC are cut by our contractors twice-monthly. Hedges, meanwhile, are clipped annually with the work done outside bird-nesting season (March to August). For areas not looked after by the Parish Council, contact the relevant party directly. We have no powers to compel another authority to cut back overgrowth.

#### PROGRESS ON GROVE HILL?

Parish Council Chair Maureen Caton in May wrote to Kemi Badenoch MP asking for help to find a solution to the problems bedevilling Grove Hill. Firing off letters to our constituency MP is something SMPC try to avoid

making a habit of. But our Chair felt that a stand-off between Affinity Water and Essex County Council over who was to blame, and more importantly who should fix, the source of leaking water down Grove Hill had left the parish council with no other option.

Residents and business owners first made SMPC aware of the damage to homes, property, and premises caused by the water flowing down Grove Hill 10 months ago. It has been an item on Parish Council meeting agendas ever since. Efforts to get Affinity Water and ECC to work towards a solution have fallen on deaf ears. Hence the letter.

Emails from Kemi Badenoch to Affinity and Essex County Councillor Ray Gooding appeared to focus minds. As did coverage of the issue on BBC Essex and in the Daily Mail. But now the publicity dust has settled, is the leak nearer to being fixed? Essex Highways have brought forward work to clear the gulleys and drains of Grove Hill from July to June. County officials have also visited the village to inspect the problem first hand. Affinity Water have retested the water. But they maintain the leak isn't from their faulty infrastructure. They also still haven't met ECC officials to discuss the matter. They have, however, offered to drill an exploratory bore hole while the work to clear the gulleys and drains is carried out.



#### ROOM AT THE TABLE

In June, Jamie Hogg announced he was resigning as a Parish Councillor at SMPC. Jamie has been on the Parish Council since November 2020 and participated on many of our working groups and committees. He served as our representative on Stansted Airport Watch and was a member of the working group trying to secure improved sports facilities for the village, particularly the provision of football pitches for our younger residents. We wish him well for the future.

#### Two vacancies to fill

Mr Hogg's departure, however, now offers a chance for someone else to play an important part in community life. Last month SMPC published on our website and social media channels a Notice of Vacancy. This was issued by Uttlesford District Council. It laid out the conditions under which the vacancy left by Jamie's resignation should be filled: firstly by-election; and otherwise by co-option. It is unclear if there's to be an election. This piece is being written ahead of the June 21 deadline, by when an election needs to be called. But if you have read this far and fear you have missed the boat to throw your name into the hat, you haven't — there is another seat on the Full Council to be filled. After last year's local elections, 14 councillors were elected (uncontested) into their posts. This is one shy of the maximum number to represent a community of Stansted's size.

#### **Application packs**

You don't need to be a politics junkie to be a Parish Councillor. Our councillors strive to leave political affiliations outside the chamber door. But if you can spare some evenings each month to take decisions on behalf of our community - head over to our website stanstedmountfitchet-pc.gov. uk. Go to the documents section and download a parish councillor application pack. We'd love to hear from you.

SkateJam 2024 4 August t'll be 10 years since Stansted's first skatejam, and the evergreen Seann Tompson has been hard at work to make this year's event one to remember. The skate park in the Lower Street car park will once

again be the venue for what has become a perennial

highlight of the village social calendar. Expect music, street food vans and plenty of adrenaline action with the first of six competition categories getting underway at 10.30am.


