I once heard of a group of people who were listening to the story of Jesus for the very first time. #### **Geoffrey Ralph Booker January 1922 - February 2010**

Geoff was well known in Stansted until 1996 when he and Margaret moved to Houghton near St Ives in Cambridgeshire. He was born in Kent and after excelling in French and Geography at University, Margaret and Geoff eventually came to Stansted in the '70s. Geoff was appointed to teach French at the newly built Mountfitchet School. Whilst there he also attained an A grade in A level Italian. He was a true Francophile and in particular developed a love for French wines. Geoff and Margaret spent many happy holidays in France and a day in France with Geoff was a day to be remembered.

Geoff also possessed considerable musical talent. His principal instrument was the bassoon, playing regularly with the Harlow Symphony Orchestra, and for many years he was also a member of the church choir and also Harlow Chorus. As an enthusiastic cyclist he organised the annual sponsored cycle ride for the Friends of Essex Churches.

When they moved to Houghton, Geoff became a member of Hemingford Grey church choir, to which he went by bicycle, of course. His funeral and thanksgiving service was a moving occasion at which his old friend, Canon Barry Rose, assisted. A splendid trumpet rendering from 'Messiah' was given by a member of the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra. He will be remembered with affection by many in Stansted.

This emblem is our Essex badge. Each county has its own



badge which they use to advertise local events as well as the National one. The latter has recently changed from the tree emblem to a more modern logo and I will try and get a reproduction of that for future use. A lot of people dislike the new modern look to the badge; but it was felt by the

National Committee that we needed to be updated and appeal to wider groups of women. Indeed a lot of new WIs have been formed over the last two years. Some daytime ones in the London area have attracted young office women, who are anxious to learn some of the older skills such as knitting, sewing and cooking! The President of Shoreditch Sisterhood WI is really young and heads an Institute where most of the members are in their twenties! They of course can bring many skills to us older members especially on computers, communicating with each other mainly online. They are also keen to get involved with many of the campaigns launched by the WI movement, particularly those in support of womens' refuges and the plight of many women overseas.

Last month we were lucky enough to welcome Paul Embleton as our speaker with his talk on the 'History of Postcards'. Paul has a wonderful collection which he has put onto slides and it was fascinating to trace the development of the first cards produced in 1870, which had no pictures, through to the 1890s when illustrations were added and became more important than the actual message itself. It was quite possible in the early 1900s to send a message in the morning that you would visit someone in the afternoon and it would be delivered in time. I think there were three deliveries a day then. A lot of cards of scenes of the First World War were produced and several samples were shown as well as elaborate cut-out cards and woven silk cards and the humorous cards of the '20s and '30s. Paul also has some wonderful local cards that he has found during his searches, one even addressed to a person who turned out to be a relative! The winning card in the competition, which was of course for an old postcard, was a photograph of a bearded Chelsea Pensioner holding a pipe and stick. Paul said this was very unusual (not the pipe and stick!) to be photographed in the uniform of a Pensioner. It was labelled W.Adams, age 88 and belongs to Marion Pretty, who hopes to find out who he was!

Our WI collects the tea-tokens from the Yorkshire Tea boxes and other products, whereby they pledge to protect the rainforest. For every four tokens we send they donate £1 to the Yorkshire Rainforest Project. If any of you use their tea and like to cut out the tokens, any WI member will bring them to me. We sent them about 300 last year. Yorkshire Tea Company has been doing this for the last 20 years and millions of trees have been protected.

## MOUNTFITCHET GARDEN CLUB

The 'History and Development of Madingley Hall Gardens' was the subject of our March meeting. Mr Richard Gant, Head Gardener for 23 years at Madingley Hall, explained how the estate and gardens had changed over the years and how they hoped to develop it in the future. The Hall was built by Sir John Hynde in 1543 and was occupied by his descendants until the 1860s. In 1860 Queen Victoria rented the Hall for her son Edward (the future King) to live in whilst studying at Cambridge. The family sold the Hall in 1871. There were several owners until in 1948, the Hall and estate were purchased by the University of Cambridge for £50,000. It is currently the home of the Institute of Continuing Education. The University of Cambridge donated 30½ acres of the estate to the United States of America, and in 1956 a cemetery and chapel was dedicated to the American servicemen who died in WWII.

Using a series of slides, Mr Gant showed how the garden had changed and developed over the years. The earliest picture was an engraving dated 1705, which showed a formal Dutchstyle garden. However in 1756 Capability Brown was paid £200 to create a more fashionable and modern garden. The current view to the east of the Hall still portrays the undulating grassland and park with scattered trees and vistas. A walled garden was created at the same time and provided fruit and vegetables to the Hall until 1947. During the 20th century a Yew Topiary Garden was added and the University rebuilt and landscaped the courtyard that houses a host of alpines, shrubs and climbers. In the 1980s a new garden was created featuring roses, pergolas, raised alpine beds and a sunken garden. At the present time the gardens are open to the public for the National Garden Scheme (9th May and 20th June) and the Plant Fair (12th September). It is hoped that the planned introduction of a series of talks entitled 'Meet the Gardener' will encourage more visitors to the gardens in the future.

#### **SKYWATCH**

A monthly look at an aspect of the night sky



We talked last month of galaxies, most of them in the design of a revolving spiral of stars with tentacles (actually called arms), with a dense core of stars revolving very fast around the centre which, it is now believed, contains a black hole. Black holes have almost infinite density and, therefore, almost infinite gravity which would slowly but surely engulf the whole galaxy. However, the spinning (centrifugal) force of the galaxy counters sufficiently to keep the galaxy's structure. But there is rather more to the way galaxies exist. There are billions and billions of galaxies, mostly spiral, in every direction, and as they were studied more and more, with ever improving telescopes, astronomers began, first, to realise that galaxies actually exist in groups, and later, groups of groups, called supergroups.

This raised a very interesting question: What kind of force is it that can herd galaxies with the possibility of another force to create the supergroups? There is certainly nothing visible. We now put a very small toe into the sub-atomic universe. Theoretical physics is a wonderful and ever expanding world but even rudimentary study of the subject can cure insomnia. Yet, as we speak of the vastness of a single galaxy. everything comes down to the very, very small. (With luck, the Large Hadron Collider will take us to the even smaller.) The astronomers' answer is called 'String Theory'. Unfortunately, there are two quite separate theories called 'String' but the one we are investigating is the idea that strings of matter, whatever that matter is, are so dense that they have enough gravity to keep the galaxies in place. To do that, our string has to be almost infinitely thin and, wait for it, every inch of it has to have the same mass (weight) as the Earth. This may all sound as though someone is making all this up to dignify something we don't understand: indeed it may prove to be nonsense. The LHC, when up to full power, will find out more about sub-atomic particles by sending them in opposite directions then simply let them smash into each other so we can study the pieces. When those tiny, tiny particles hit each other, it will have the same energy as two family cars crashing head on at 60 mph. So please don't dismiss it; after all, you could come up with your own ideas.

## Yet more delay on second runway: we can't go on like this

It could be another two years before a Public Inquiry into a second Stansted runway is held, the Government has been told. The news came in a letter from BAA to Communities Minister John Denham, copied to SSE. The airport operator told the Secretary of State that it would need 12 to 18 months to update its March 2008 planning application and that it could not realistically begin this until there is an end to the present uncertainty about the future ownership of the airport. That of itself could also take well over a year, meaning a further delay of between two and three years before any Public Inquiry could even start to consider BAA's second runway planning application. The Public Inquiry to consider BAA's March 2008 planning application for a second runway was originally due to start in April last year. BAA is now indicating that it could not start until 2012 or even 2013.

If the Public Inquiry does not start until 2013, it would be 2015 before a final decision could be announced, meaning that local residents and businesses who received compulsory purchase notifications from BAA in March 2008 would have endured seven years of blight and uncertainty before the final outcome was known. In reality, the blight on local communities in East Hertfordshire and North Essex began in July 2002 when the Government first published its proposals for making Stansted bigger than Heathrow. SSE has repeatedly called on BAA to withdraw its application and thereby allow local communities to return to some form of normality. However, BAA clearly sees some commercial advantage in trying to keep its second runway application on life support, pending an upturn in the market, a more favourable political climate or simply as a possible means of obtaining a higher price for Stansted in the event of a forced sale. BAA's response to the Secretary of State shows an appalling disregard for the local community. We have lived under the threat of a second runway for almost eight years now. The only honourable course open to BAA is to withdraw its applications and to give a clear and unequivocal statement that it will not be making new applications for a project which creates blight without any real prospect of success. With the support of our community, we will continue our campaign to prevent the catastrophic damage that would be caused by expansion at Stansted for as long as it takes whoever the owner.

At the last meeting of the Society, the topic was a little different from the usual one. Normally, we have subjects which have some bearing on the immediate life - past or present - of the locality, but on this occasion, we heard from Brian Williams about one of the characters who appeared on the national stage for nearly 40 years - Sir Oswald Mosley - a figure of great controversy. A poll of unpopular people placed him second to Richard III, but in a reassessment of his life in a biography by Skidelsky in 1975, he was thought to be "the best Prime Minister we never had"!

Born in 1896 as heir to the Baronetcy of Ancoats, he was educated at Winchester School and served bravely in the Great War, in which he was wounded. His marriages to firstly, Lady Cynthia Curzon and, when she died, to Diana Mitford, confirmed his place in Society but he was renowned as a persistent womaniser. He became a Conservative MP in 1918 but in 1924, 'crossed the floor' and joined the Labour benches, eventually becoming Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster in Ramsay Macdonald's Government. In 1930, after his proposals to combat unemployment in the Depression were rejected, he became disillusioned again and firstly set up his New Party and when that did not take off, established the British Union of Fascists after meeting Benito Mussolini in Italy. Brian explained that in the 1920s and '30s, the main fear internationally was of Bolshevism, for which Fascism was seen as an antidote and it was only later that the horrors of anti-Semitism and brutality became associated with Fascism and Nazi-ism following the rise of Hitler.

Unfortunately, Mosley appeared out of step with most of the electorate and the stance he took with his attachment to Hitler, anti-Semitism, Edward VIII's Abdication Crisis and the Battle of Cable Street did nothing to improve the situation. His use of the 'Biff' Boys and other strong-arm tactics also worked against him. Then WWII commenced and in May 1940, he and his wife were interned. After the War, he made several attempts to re-enter politics, forming the Union Movement calling for a single nation state covering the continent of Europe and also proposing that there should be Imperial control of the whole of Africa - again attracting little support. He died in 1980 and was buried in Paris. We were profoundly grateful to Brian for recalling for us so much about a part of our recent history.

Next month we are returning to more local matters, with Roger Barrett telling us more about the Fuller Maitland family. As usual, this will be at the Day Centre, Crafton Green, at 8.00pm on Thursday, 1st April - see you there.

#### **NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS**

## CONSULTATION ON THE PROPOSED MOVE OF ST MARY'S SCHOOL

As part of this process, Essex County Council held a meeting on Tuesday 23rd February for parents and other interested parties. It had been expected that a full presentation covering the reasons for the move to Foresthall Park, the design and advantages of the new school and ideas to mitigate issues for pedestrians and motorists in moving between the centre of the village including St John's (remembering that this is a Church school) and Foresthall Park would be included.

The Parish Council felt that the lack of information provided and the poor quality of the presentation (if indeed it could be designated as such) meant that neither the parents could be expected to judge whether the proposals were in the interests of their children nor could other parties who might be affected significantly by a change of use on the existing site.

The Parish Council has, therefore, asked for the consultation period to be extended (if necessary) and that another meeting is convened at which a comprehensive presentation should be made along with appropriate designs, drawings or models.

## RELOCATION OF THE PARISH COUNCIL OFFICES - CONSIDERING POSSIBILITIES

Assuming that the Primary Care Trust constructs the new health centre (negotiations are, so we are told, still on-going) then the Clinic will move from Crafton Green. The Parish Council will have to decide where to locate its offices given that there is a legal responsibility as well as a moral requirement to be accessible to those with disabilities. In addition the existing office is too small for current needs. The Council is now considering its options, some of which are listed below:

Relocate to the ground floor of Crafton Green House; lease Crafton Green to 3rd party and rent more appropriate accommodation; redevelopment of all or part of the site to provide better and additional community facilities. It is right in this process to review all of the facilities now provided on the Crafton Green site and discussions on their future prospects will take place with Essex County Council and Uttlesford District Council. Any significant redevelopment (if this was to be pursued) will require external funding and no major development could occur without the achievement of such funding. No decision of substance will be taken without consultation with the parish.

#### **PARISH BOUNDARY REVIEW**

It is expected that Uttlesford District Council will undertake a review of the parish boundary now that the building of Foresthall Park is moving ahead. At present Foresthall Park is divided between Stansted Mountfitchet and Birchanger.

This appears an unsatisfactory on-going position to have two parish councils on one estate with an arbitrary dividing line. Given its close proximity to Stansted Mountfitchet, it seem logical to move the whole estate into this parish, unless of course it is decided to establish a new parish council for Foresthall Park.

## CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS RESURFACING UNADOPTED ROADS

The Parish Council has a long-standing policy to contribute up to 15% of the resurfacing costs on an unadopted road. This policy was introduced and has been successful in encouraging the quality of these roads to be improved.

The Council has received indications from Residents' Associations for two major roads that they intend to undertake works in 2010. Assuming the works take place then the budget allocated for 2010/11 will be fully used. Thus no further applications will be considered until the following financial year ie 2011/12.

## USING THE PARISH COUNCIL NOTICEBOARDS

The noticeboards are well used and this reflects well on the level of activities in and around the village. However, space may be at a premium. To minimise problems please observe a few

To minimise problems please observe a few simple rules:

- All notices should be A4 in size or smaller.
- Notices advertising events or services within Stansted take priority. Those covering other nearby communities are welcome but may be covered up temporarily if space requires.
- No commercial activities are to be advertised on these boards. Any such notices may be removed.
- Notices which are intended to remain on the boards for a period of time should be kept to a minimum and must be laminated. Tatty notices will be removed.
- The removal of notices is only permitted if the relevant date of the event/service has gone or if it is a commercial advertisement.

Hopefully the notice boards will continue to be a joy in appearance and information!

#### **PARISH COUNCIL VACANCY**

At the Council Meeting on 10 March, Mrs Iris Evans of Park Road was co-opted to fill the vacancy which arose following Gaye Ellington's departure from the village.

## WILLOW TREE AT THE FOUNTAIN, CHAPEL HILL

As we go to print, soil testing is being undertaken at two properties close to the junction in order to establish the type of soil and the condition of the willow tree's roots. With this information, we can then assess whether the felling of the tree is likely to cause any knock-on effects in terms of heave to those buildings – all part of the risk assessment that we must undertake. We will keep you informed, but once the information is to hand, the Council can decide whether to fell the tree in one go, or whether it must be phased over a period of time.



The picture above shows how the junction used to look, with three established horse chestnut trees

and several people have suggested that we restore this look. However, since those times, cables and pipes have been laid underground, there are such things as sight-line requirements, health and safety and red tape!! There are strict rules relating to tree planting and the distance that must be kept from gas pipes etc. It is our intention to replace the willow, but it is likely that the planting will have to be kept to the eastern side of the junction, and perhaps with a smaller specie.

#### **BIRCHANGER WOOD**

In early March we were told that urgent work was required to trees in the wood, particularly along the boundary with the A120, but that the Trust had insufficient funds in its account to complete the work. The work was ordered by Hertfordshire County Council Highways – as the trees posed a danger to traffic on the by-pass. As part owners of the Wood, the Parish Council shares liability for maintenance of the Wood and has agreed to contribute £500 towards these costs.

#### **WINDMILL**

We are still on course for completion of the project at the end of March. Thoughts are now turning to how we might celebrate the re-opening of the Mill when the better weather comes!



#### ALL THINGS BRIGHT AND BEAUTIFUL

As the weather improves, so the bedding plants should start to recover – the bulbs are certainly coming through now and hopefully we will see a host of golden daffodils before too long. Summer planting this year will be a repeat of last year, with marigolds in all the beds, including the newly formed bed at the corner of Blythwood Gardens.

We are, however, changing the hanging baskets. For many years we have planted them with mini cascade pink geraniums which are effective, but we have received comments that perhaps it is

time for a change! We have listened, and this year you will see mauve petunias with white daisies – any feedback in due course would be appreciated.

Finally on the gardening subject, we will be loo king at gardens, tubs, beds and baskets for this year's Stansted in Bloom competition. Last year, the judges wandered at random around the village looking for award-winning displays, and some people were nominated by friends or neighbours. This less formal approach worked very well and will be repeated this year. In next month's Link you will find a cut-out nomination form which can be used to put forward your own efforts or those of someone else. The competition is not only for gardens, but any floral effort that has been made to brighten up a property or street scene.

#### **SECURITY**

We have recently learned of two burglaries from dwellings on one night in early March, following which some words of caution arrived from our Chief Inspector:

Uttlesford has one of the lowest recorded rates of domestic burglary - if you want the statistics we had 1.3 burglaries per 1000 households in the last quarter. That is amazingly low and we are well placed when measured against the most similar group of districts nationally that we are compared against. Rather than be satisfied with that, we are committed to continuing to reduce the number of dwelling burglaries further because it is a horrible crime that we are keen to have as few victims as possible suffering.

One of the latest pieces of information that we have discovered is that many recent burglaries have been committed by entering through UPVC back doors. These doors have a number of different locking mechanisms – some can be locked by simply lifting the handle; in others lifting the handle drives across a closing bolt but a key is needed to lock the door. It is clear from speaking to recent victims that they had thought they were locking their doors when they were just closing them and actually if the handle was operated from the outside their door would still open. This mechanism is also available on conservatories and can be used with wooden doors so this message is for everyone.

Please make sure you know how your locks operate so when you are locking up you are, in fact, locking up. If you need any assistance with door locks or are confused about this message then please speak to our crime reduction advisor, Peter

Caulfield on 0300 333 4444 and he will be happy to advise you.

#### **NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD D.C.**

The deal with South Cambridgeshire District Council to make savings by sharing staff, accommodation and computing facilities has well and truly fallen through with an unedifying spat of claim and counter-claim in the press between the two councils. The falling-out was precipitated by a back-bench revolt within South Cambs. The Cambourne based council runs a cabinet-style system of decision making whereas Uttlesford runs the more inclusive committee system. It seems that the South Cambs cabinet didn't involve those councillors outside the cabinet until a deal was almost sewn up, and they didn't like it! Uttlesford's Conservative administration also wants to switch to the cabinet system next year. I think we need to tread carefully and learn some lessons from this recent costly debacle.

There have been complaints on behalf of pedestrians about the appallingly long-standing unsafe surface of Water Lane near the railway Black

Bridge. Discussions with Essex Highways have been arranged, though I don't want to raise expectations about an early improvement as everyone has been avoiding responsibility and action to repair the surface for years.

Walson Way is expected to have been opened through to Church Road by Easter. Once that is done, the 510 bus will be routed along Walson Way and will use the smart bus stops that have been installed. Essex County Council has told me that there isn't time for the 7/7A bus route to be extended to Walson Way to provide a link to and from the 510 and that part of Stansted. I have told them that I disagree as I believe it would add only 30 seconds to the journey of the 7/7A. (CIIr Alan Dean)

## Local Development Framework-Further Consultation

All households should have received a questionnaire from the Council about its 'Local Development Framework'. It is entitled Developing Uttlesford. From 15 February until 9 April the Council is asking among other things, for opinions on the location of 4000 new houses in the district over the next decade and beyond.

Some readers will remember that two years ago four options were put forward for consideration, with the District Council stating its preferred option to be Option 4 - a 3,000 home new town between Elsenham and Henham. This new consultation is also seeking views on where the balance of 1,000 houses should go to complete Option 4. The document states that the Council would like to hear your views on whether you agree with the Elsenham proposal or whether you think there is a better option, and why. If you believe like me that a significant new development at Elsenham would have a detrimental effect upon Stansted, it is important to respond to this consultation.

In the last two years various technical studies have been carried out and each option for housing growth has been examined and compared. So the consultation also asks a question about whether Option 4 is the best one, or whether residents would prefer a new settlement on land at either i) north-east of Great Chesterford or ii) Boxted Wood, Stebbing, or iii) Easton Park (between Stansted Airport and Great Dunmow), or iv) Chelmer Mead, Nr Great Dunmow.

Other questions in the consultation are about airport growth, business growth and local jobs and traveller and gypsy sites.

There is also the opportunity to respond on-line at www.uttlesford.gov.uk. All the technical studies are also available at links from the same webpage and in paper copy at Stansted library. Your attention is drawn to the Comparative Transport Analysis and the Comparative Sustainability Assessment. Do you agree with the scoring system in the latter analysis that narrowly rates Elsenham as the best location for most new housing? Do you agree with the assumptions used in this assessment? Tell the council what you think.

#### Council Tax 2010/11

The Council has agreed to a 2.9% increase for the forthcoming financial year. For Band D this amounts to £147.42 per annum. Although this is a welcome reduction from last year's increase of nearly 5%, I believe more could have been done. For the current financial year 2009/10 there is a substantial under-spend with £761,000 being committed to the reserves. I supported an amendment which would have meant a 1.2% increase in council tax. This was however defeated.

Apparently scientists are now agreed that the dinosaurs were wiped out by the impact of a meteorite. Nature is very resilient and many life forms survived the ensuing 'winter', including some small mammals from which we humans eventually evolved. We have just experienced the longest cold winter for decades and although this was on a minuscule scale compared to the meteorite winter, many of us have seen at close hand the effect on our local wildlife. The garden bird population has been decimated by ravenous sparrowhawks as described last month, and early spring flowers have stayed in bud or not appeared at all so far. But nature is adaptable to changing conditions. Our solitary blue tit and coal tit both lost their mates but other birds around the garden have fared better and are obviously getting ready for nesting time. The hedgerows are far less green than this time last year, but a walk round our local lanes will reveal bluebell leaves shoot-



ing up and cow parsley starting to flower. The yellow hazel catkins have been hanging on the bushes for some time now. These are the male flowers; you have to look closely to see the female flowers, small crimson stars, which are now appearing on the stems at the bases of the catkins. If you walk along the southern end of

Lime Kiln Lane off Pines Hill you will be rewarded with a fine display of snowdrops which should convince you that spring is on the way.



#### **EASTER EGGS AND DOGS**

At a certain point last week I found myself in a back garden in Bishop's Stortford uttering the words, "the best way to catch a pig is ..." It got me thinking; first of all that being a vet is a funny old job sometimes and secondly that I can be a fountain of incredibly random and useless bits of information. Other examples are that Border Collies have the fastest nip of any dog breed and an angry swan is worse than an angry goose! I could go on but you get the picture. It also struck me that in my job, you get to the stage where you think you have come across most situations and can manage most tasks and then a new one pops up unexpectedly. The trouble is this still happens on almost a daily basis. It seems there are a never-ending combination of animals, diseases, people and circumstances.

Some things do happen fairly regularly, however, and this month of course it's Easter and I expect we shall get one or two dogs that have managed to steal the odd Easter egg and make themselves ill. As I've said in previous articles, chocolate can be poisonous to dogs if eaten in large enough quantities. This is because it contains a substance called theobromine, which can cause vomiting, restlessness, salivation and in severe cases heart problems and epileptic fits. The darker the chocolate, the more theobromine there is, so if your dog has pinched the odd milk chocolate, there's probably nothing to worry about, but if it has eaten a box of dark chocolates, ring the surgery! If the dog has eaten the chocolate within the previous two to three hours we can give it an injection to make it sick, so the theobromine can't be absorbed. If it has been over three hours we may need to put the dog on intravenous fluids. One example of finding the unexpected occurred last week. We had a dog in that had eaten some rat poison. We gave it the injection and like magic it was sick and as well as the rat poison it brought up a strange metal object. When we showed it to the owner, she said it was part of a doorknob that had disappeared at Christmas! So, I hope you all have a good Easter and get all the eggs you wish for and also that you manage to keep your dogs away from them and any stray doorknobs!

#### PAYE CODE PROBLEMS

HM Revenue & Customs has recently issued a large number of PAYE Coding Notices for the 2009/10 and 2010/11 tax years. The PAYE code is sent to the taxpayer as a P2 notice. breaking down how the code was calculated. A note of the code, without any analysis, is sent to his or her employer or pension company. If you have received a PAYE Coding Notice recently do check it carefully as any corrections need to be made as soon as possible to avoid incorrect tax deductions. Unfortunately, a number of our clients have noticed errors in this year's PAYE Coding Notices. This has also been reported in the news and has occurred since HMRC started using a new computer system. Some of our employed clients have received codes saying that their salaries should all be taxed at 40%, even though they are not higher rate taxpayers! With some of our retired clients, the age allowance or married couples allowance has disappeared or the state pension amount is understated. Some of the 2010/11 codes have missed off the basic personal allowance, which should be £6,475 unless you are lucky enough to have income in excess of £100,000.

Also, some of our clients have received several PAYE Coding Notices in quick succession and in this situation you only need to check the Notice with the most recent date of issue for each tax year and income source (employer or pension company). If this Notice is incorrect or you have any doubts you can call the telephone number on the Notice and the HMRC staff can often correct the code immediately. Also, if you have an accountant, they can check the code for you. Until resolved, any of these problems could lead to a big drop in net income or a tax bill at a later date, so check the Coding Notices carefully as employers and pension companies are obliged to use them until HMRC issue an amendment.



### THE FOUNTAIN - a potted history,

with acknowledgement to the late Irving Sanders

The 'Elegant Drinking Fountain' was opened on Stansted Fair Day - 1st May 1871. The site was formerly occupied by buildings including the 'Cock' Beer House (Landlord William Amey) and a blacksmith's shop inhabited by the Brett family. This latter appears to have been the remains of a pre-reformation hermitage or chapel, built by the Earl of Oxford and occupied by John Parrot in 1492. These old buildings were bought for £500, raised by public subscription, and demolished. The Fountain was presented by Henry Parry Gilbey of 'The Cottage' (later known as Bentfield Hall and since demolished) and his brother Walter of Hargrave Park. It cost £35 and was manufactured by Macfarlane & Son of Glasgow and erected by J L Glasscock of Bishop's Stortford. The water supply came from Hick's new Steam Flour Mill which had been erected on what later became the site of the water works at the rear of Spencer House. An artesian well which had been sunk there proved so prodigal that surplus water was piped off to neighbouring properties. In time the Stansted Water Company took it over.

The top step of the Fountain was originally paved with tiles and the water issued from a gilded stork under the dome. There were four taps and cups and the whole was surmounted by a gas light and signpost. The addition of the Mountfitchet crest to each face of the dome was made in Coronation Year, 1953. In recent years its surroundings have seen many changes.

8oz (225g) butter or margarine 2oz (55g) icing sugar 1 teasp vanilla essence 6oz (140g) flour 2oz (55g) cornflour ½ teasp salt lemon curd coconut

Cream butter and icing sugar; add vanilla essence. Mix flour, cornflour and salt and fold into butter mixture. Take one dessertspoonful of mixture, form into a ball and flatten slightly. Place on tray 1" apart. Bake in hot oven Gas 6, 400°F, 200°C for 10-15 minutes until the edges are golden. Spread with lemon curd and sprinkle with coconut.

#### **CHOCOLATE RAISIN SQUARES**

4oz (110g) margarine
3 tbsp caster or granulated sugar
1 small egg, beaten
½ teasp (2.5 ml) vanilla and peppermint essence
2 rounded tbsp drinking chocolate
8oz (225g) crushed digestive biscuits
5oz (140g) seedless raisins
4-6oz (110-170g) melted block chocolate

Melt margarine in large pan, add sugar, stir until dissolved. Beat in egg, stir over gentle heat for a few seconds. Remove pan, add flavouring, mix well. Add other ingredients (except melted chocolate). Mix well. Put in 8" x 12" (20 x 30 cm) greased Swiss roll tin, press down. Cover mixture with melted chocolate. Leave to cool and set, then cut into squares.


