

WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER



St John's Church was very pleased to host this annual interdenominational event on Friday, 6th March. We were part of an estimated three million people in over 170 countries all using the same order of service, which this year was written by the Christian women of The Bahamas, and included hymns, one of which was specially written for the occasion. Sea shells, exotic fruit, colourful clothes and the flag of the Bahamas were all in evidence in the church and we even managed to arrange for the sun to shine. The theme of this year's service was taken from St John's Gospel - Jesus said to them "Do you know what I have done to you?" and those present were challenged to find ways to demonstrate the same radical, unconditional love for others that Jesus showed when he washed the feet of his disciples. We were invited to write down our ideas on paper footprints. These ideas included such things as small acts of kindness to a lonely neighbour, or reaching out to people we have never previously got on with. Thank you to everyone who was involved (too numerous to mention by name). The grand sum of £131 was collected for the work of WWDP. Afterwards we enjoyed tea and a delicious cake prepared by Catherine Dean - the recipe is shown below.

Bahama Mama Carrot Cake

Ingredients:

110g/4oz sugar 360ml/1½ cups oil

3 eggs

175g/6oz plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp salt

2 tbsp cinnamon

1 tsp each ground allspice, nutmeg and cardamom

225g/8oz grated carrots

110g/4oz crushed pineapple, drained

2 tsp vanilla essence

110g/4oz dessicated coconut

50g/2oz raisins or dried cranberries

Method:

Beat the sugar, oil and eggs together. Add the dry ingredients, then fold in carrots, pineapple, coconut, raisins or cranberries and vanilla essence. Put into a greased 9" x 9" baking tin and bake at 350°F/180°C/160°C fan oven/gas Mark 4 for about an hour. Can be iced when cold with a cream cheese frosting.

BIRCHANGER WOOD

During April the wood anemones will, or may still be flowering, but the green foliage of the English bluebells is sitting there waiting to show its amazing dark blue bells. Look at them ... the English bluebell is a deep blue, has all the flower-heads almost only on one side of the stem, it has a scent, the petals are 're-curved' and there is a creamy pollen. This distinguishes the native species from the Spanish (garden) bluebell. Check them out! Are the buzzards back in Birchanger Wood this year? Can you hear their high-pitched call? If not now, if they nest and produce young, then you will hear them later this year as the family flies and calls to one another way above the tops of our very tall trees. On the Birchanger side of the Wood where it is easier to exit the Wood into the open fields this is a wonderful sound, and of course sight, with birds wheeling together learning to fly the thermals under instruction from their parents. Last year, I saw two red kites fly over Stansted (High Lane), and again recently (February), in the sky over Furneaux Pelham. They are distinguishable from the buzzard by their forked tail. The kites are scavengers whilst the buzzards are predators. Over in the reaches of Reading, where the red kite is a familiar sight, very little road-kill remains owing to their rapid attention and clearance.

And now, for all our lovely dog walkers - a request to you all: dog walkers are welcome in Birchanger Wood but please clean up after your pet. Dog mess is not only really horrible and smelly, it can cause serious infections. Please carry dog 'poo' bags with you and clear up. We do not have dog bins in Birchanger Wood owing both to the cost, and impracticality of collection but, there are red bins on the public footpath main approach from Heath Row, and close to the play area at Northolt Avenue. Please take your dog poo away with you and put it in one of these bins, or your own rubbish bin. Most dog walkers are only a few minutes from home. There is no such thing as a 'poo fairy' who arrives at nightfall to take them away. Please leave Birchanger Wood clear of doggy 'do-dah'. Thank you.



LOCAL HEALTH CARE THANK YOU

West Essex health and care leaders would like to thank the public for attending their feedback meetings. Residents recently joined NHS West Essex Clinical Commissioning Group's (CCG) events in Harlow, Saffron Walden, Waltham Abbey, Dunmow and Epping to hear how their views have shaped plans for local health and care. In 2013, WECCG held a widespread engagement campaign called My health My future My say which captured public opinion on the future of health and care services in the area. Part II of the campaign aimed to provide an update on NHS plans and provide the opportunity for people to ask questions from local leaders. The event panel was made up of representatives from NHS West Essex CCG, Essex County Council, South Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (SEPT), North Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (NEP) and The Princess Alexandra Hospital NHS. At each event a spirited question and answer session took place, the first such Q&A of West Essex CCG's updated public engagement model.

The Chief Officer at West Essex CCG, Clare Morris expressed her delight that local people had taken the opportunity to see how their ideas had shaped plans. She thanked everyone who had attended for their input and urged people to come to the next open Q&A session later this year. While the feedback events focused on plans for the next five years, it was also an opportunity to share the steps West Essex CCG has taken over the winter period to help manage exceptional demand on health and care services. These include making 5,000 additional face-to-face GP appointments available, simplifying the discharge process and promoting the free NHS 111 service for calling when medical help is needed fast, but it's not an emergency. MAGNA CARTA CELEBRATIONS

Presentation by Nigel Collingwood at Stansted History Society February Meeting

Following an invitation to the Parish Council in November 2012 from Peter Sinclair of Hertfordshire, to join together in celebrating the 800 years' anniversary in June 2015, Nigel did some research. As a result of this a twinning arrangement had begun between his nearby caput of Walkern, and Lanvalley in Normandy, as well as publishing a book about their Baron William de Lanvalei and Magna Carta. After further research Nigel offered to take the lead in response to Peter's letter. The first meeting on 28th May 2013 at the Abbey in Bury St. Edmunds was a really appropriate setting, pre 13th century and where the barons had gathered in 1214 to plan their challenge to King John. The 15 barons' caputs represented were addressed by Sir Robert Worcester, Chair of the Magna Carta 800 Committee, in which they agreed to advance the education of the public in the history of the Magna Carta barons, their towns and villages and jointly celebrate the 800 anniversary.

Nigel developed a desire to feature a lasting piece of artwork that would embody the Magna Carta story, featuring our Baron Richard de Montfichet, to involve the wider community and educate our younger generation and provide a Legacy. In St Mary's Church where the Montfichets must have walked under the Norman arches, Nigel met Audrey Rodgers who introduced him to Leila Riddell, who set up and chaired the Bishops Stortford Embroiderers Guild. Leila enthusiastically took on the project, designing and managing a largely complete three-piece standalone stunning piece of embroidery art work which will be mounted, thanks to Barry Francis, into oak frames. The embroidery will be displayed at dedicated services, lectures and school projects. The first showing will be at a service of dedication in St Johns on 14th June. A brochure describing and illustrating the work is being produced with contributions from Peter Brown and Ralph Phillips. It will also include a full acknowledgement of all volunteers. To finance the embroidery and brochure Nigel approached Stansted Airport through the History Society and utilised their local project grant procedure to raise the money, which was agreed and allowed the project to commence. Another circular route which ventures further afield than last month's walk (with a chance of seeing bluebells in bloom along FP16). Only suitable for lightweight buggies that can be carried on field paths, it's about 3 miles long and takes approximately 1.25 hours.

Note for dog walkers: Red crosses on the map indicate special red bins along the route for the disposal of bagged dogs' poo.

Starting at the junction of Rainsford Road and Pennington Lane marked **A Walk 1** on map, walk the length of Pennington Lane in a northerly direction to the B1383. Cross the B1383 and go along bridleway BR28 Ugley along the northern side of the field; turn right at the eastern side of field along FP16 and head in a southerly direction, through the spinney behind the rifle range and Auction Rooms into Alsa Street.


At point B turn right and walk approx 200 paces, then left at the fingerpost onto FP17 along eastern side of field through spinney then along western side of field to Gall End. Turn right onto FP19 over two stiles and onto High Lane. Turn left and walk approx 150 paces downhill before crossing the road and taking FP13 to Norman's Way and then to the B1383.

Turn right for about 50 paces, cross the B1383 and follow Croasdaile Road into Gilbey Crescent and at the northern end take footpath **C** back into Croasdaile Road, turn left again into Rainsford Road and back to starting point.

Walk can be shortened at point **B** by amending directions to: continue in westerly direction to the B1383, turn left, cross over at Walpole Farm and take FP12 along southern boundary of farm, leading to Pennington Lane.

Enjoy the walk and the bluebells – if they're out!

For anyone who may be new to the village and unfamiliar with Stansted Helpline, it is our local community care scheme, run entirely by volunteers for the benefit of those people within the parish who find themselves in need of assistance. The scheme has been running for 30 years, led by a committee of seven, with 10 'Listeners-In' who man the telephone on a rota system, and a base of 40-50 volunteers who carry out the tasks requested. These generally relate to providing transport to doctors' surgery, hospital appointments, shopping, collecting prescriptions for the house-bound etc. We also hold a fairly extensive list of useful contact numbers, so if you are in need of more specialist assistance, we can point you in the right direction.

During 2014, we fulfilled 193 requests, 174 of which related to the provision of transport, which demonstrates a) the continued need for the service and b) the dedication and goodwill of our volunteers, many of whom have been providing their help for many years. The service is free, although reimbursements of petrol expenses are requested when transport is provided. If you find yourself in need, when no other help is available, please ring the Helpline number 07704 553727, which is manned 9.00am-4.00pm Monday-Friday. You can also see details in our advertisement on page 16 of The Link. The year 2014 proved to be a difficult one administratively, with problems arising with our public liability insurance provider (now thankfully resolved) and the legal responsibility placed upon us to ensure that all our drivers are checked under DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) to work with 'vulnerable adults'. I should like to express a huge thank you to all our volunteers who accepted this requirement and complied with all the necessary paperwork with their customary good humour and patience. A Nice Cup of Tea

Our enjoyable March meeting was a presentation by Tim Turner (an auctioneer and valuer from Sworders fine art auctioneers) who gave us a talk on the history of tea and items used in the associated ceremony. He informed us that tea, originally from China, imported for the nobility, was very expensive and was taken in cups without sugar and milk; the taste was both refreshing and bitter. It was Catherine Braganza from Portugal in the mid-18^h century, who married Charles II, and brought us the practice of drinking tea in the afternoon. Pitt the Younger realised that by lowering duty and bringing tea to the working people, he would encourage more people to drink tea, instead of the poor ales and gin that where available at the time, and raise more money for the Government. During this period the Chinese had a thirst for opium as we had a thirst for tea, culminating in 90% of all Chinese males under the age of 40 smoking opium, mainly due to us saturating their market; this created the opium wars in 1839-1842 and 1856-1860. To keep up with the demand for tea, we had started to grow tea in India and sugar in the West Indies, with milk coming from cows, which were kept in the centre of London, and distributed by milkmaids with their pails on a yoke. Tim then gave us a brief understanding of table furniture; how we came to use hardwoods such as mahogany, and the use of veneers; why we used silver, silver plate and Sheffield plate. And of course how we tried to refine our china and produce beautiful porcelain to match the Chinese.

The next meeting is 2nd April at 8.00pm at the Crafton Centre, Chapel Hill when Peter Lawrence will be giving a presentation on Essex Country Houses and their empire building occupiers. All welcome, refreshments provided.



PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

SPRING VILLAGE LITTER PICK

(Community Clear Up Day) Saturday 11th April

Many of you will know Gerard, our litter picker, and appreciate his hard work in keeping the village looking as attractive as possible. However it is impossible for him to cover some areas on the fringe of the village so twice a year the Parish Council ask for volunteers to give up a few hours of their time and join their Parish Councillors to help clear up some of these areas. We provide the equipment but you might want to bring along some heavier duty gardening gloves.

The Government has recently announced that it is backing a first ever Community Clear Up Day – it is being billed as a 'national spring clean' on Saturday 21 March, the first day of spring, with the aim of sprucing up high streets, residential and business areas, villages and parks. We are supporting this initiative but as we have had 11 April in our calendar for some time and regular supporters will already have this date reserved in their diaries we are sticking to our original date.

Volunteers are asked to meet outside the Council Office in Crafton Green at 10.00 am.



HEALTH CENTRE CELEBRATIONS

The Parish Council would like to express its appreciation of all the hard work that the campaigners for the new health Centre have put in. They were able to celebrate overcoming what is hopefully the final hurdle back in February when the village GP Surgery signed the lease on the building. We have waited many years to get to this point, a guaranteed new health centre in the centre of the village, close to existing public transport and an existing public car park with 33 free spaces to be made available in the Lower Street car park for staff and patients. A pedestrian crossing will also be constructed across Lower Street close to the Social Club, another much needed facility together with road improvements.

VILLAGE POND WORKING GROUP

The village pond has been looking a lot healthier over the winter due to the hard work of a small group of volunteers on our clean up day in the Autumn. To try and make sure it looks as attractive as possible this summer we are organising another clean up on Sunday 26th April at 10.00 am. We paid the Essex Conservation Volunteers to support and provide equipment for the last pond clean up but we have decided on a DIY approach from now on so we have purchased our own tools and equipment which will be available on the day but we will need volunteers to turn up and provide the labour. PROGRESS ON HIGHWAYS PROBLEMS

Representatives from the Parish Council met with Cllrs. Bass and Johnson who are responsible for Highways matters at Essex County Council and raised the following issues:

- Widening the footpath on Church Road
- Church Road traffic calming
- Pedestrian link from Jordan Close to Walson Way
- Revision of speed limits on Forest Hall Road
- Traffic calming scheme on High Lane
- Pedestrian crossing on Cambridge Road
- Improving the road surface on Stoney Common Road
- Cambridge Road-deliveries, parking and traffic flow
- Additional waiting restrictions on Walson way

As we go to press we are still awaiting a response from ECC but although there are no guarantees ECC will agree to all our requests we are much more confident that we will get answers and at least some of the schemes will move forward. This would be a step in the right direction after a frustrating period where no answers were forthcoming.

The Parking Working Group at Uttlesford District Council meet on 12th March so by the time you read this we are hopeful that the Parish Council's request for waiting restrictions at junctions on the Mountfitchet Estate have been approved which will make it easier for buses to move around the estate and improve safety.

LIMITING FLOOD DAMAGE IN LOWER STREET

The Environment Agency is working with consultants to produce a report which will include costed options for measures to prevent flooding occurring or at least substantially reduce the risks. Unfortunately the report has been delayed and may not now be available until June but once received we will have a better understanding of the likely impact of their proposals .

If the worst comes to the worst the Parish Council have prepared a contingency plan to close Lower Street in the event of flooding to hopefully reduce the impact of the flood water on business and residential properties caused by backwash from vehicles. Essex Highways should take responsibility for closing the roads but if circumstances prevent their arrival the Parish Council plan will be activated. We all hope that the situation where we have to put the plan into action never occurs but after witnessing the damage of the last flood it is important we do everything possible to prevent a reoccurrence.

We are grateful to those who agreed to act as flood wardens but to be really effective we need more of you to offer your services. We will be holding a briefing meeting for volunteers so that if we do need our volunteers to turn out they will know where to go and what to do. Please contact the Parish Office if you are prepared to add your name to the list of volunteer wardens.



MAGNA CARTA 800 CELEBRATION

Parish Council Chairman, Maureen Caton has been visiting village schools to present framed copies of the Magna Carta as part of the events being organised to mark the eight hundredth anniversary of King John putting his seal on the charter. There is also a plaque



with the following inscription "Stansted Mountfitchet derives its name from the Baron, Richard de Montfichet who was one of a committee of twenty five barons of Magna Carta who took the lead in enforcing the charter which was to become a key influence on the constitutions of democratic countries across the globe."

STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

The Parish Council have been asked by UDC to comment on how and when the community are involved in the planning process. Residents can access the consultation on the UDC web site www.uttlesford.gov.uk/sci if you want your voice to be heard. The consultation ends on 13th April.

PARISH CEMETERY

There is a cage at the cemetery to recycle green waste such as flowers. Please do not place oasis or other none compostable items in this cage.

CAMBRIDGE ROAD PARKING ISSUES

Parking issues on Cambridge Road continue to be a major source of frustration. A number of people have suggested that if there was direct access to the Cambridge Road shops from the Crafton Green car park more people would use the car park rather than looking for a space outside the shops. The council will seek to ensure that any future development of the former Sworders site includes pedestrian access to Cambridge Road.

NOTICE BOARDS

There are a number of notice boards in the village which the Parish Council use as a means of communicating with residents. If there is space we are happy for "not for profit" activities to use the boards to promote themselves; however they are not to be used by private sector businesses. All organisations should renew their long term notices on a regular basis to prevent the boards appearing tatty. Any inappropriate notices will be removed.


NEW GOALS FOR THE REC

Plant Breeders – What are they doing to our flowers and vegetables? was the subject of our March guest speaker, Mr Thady Barrett. Using photographs and charts, members were shown how plants and vegetables were being changed to meet people's ever-changing requirements:

To improve yields, etc.



- 4 heaped tablespoons self-raising flour
- 4 level tablespoons caster sugar
- 2 tablespoons cooking oil
- 1 medium beaten egg

Paper cake cases

Bun tin



To Decorate:

Jar Nutella or similar chocolate spread

Packet chocolate mini eggs

Method:

- 1. Put flour, caster sugar, oil and beaten egg into a mixing bowl and stir until the mixture is smooth.
- 2. Place eight cake cases in bun tin and put a heaped teaspoon of the cake mixture into each case.
- 3. Cook in a pre-heated oven at 190°c for about 15 minutes until a light golden colour.
- 4. When cooled top each bun with a teaspoon of chocolate spread and the mini eggs.

Best eaten within two days





I'm hoping my favourites, the bluebells, will be as magnificent as they were last spring. There is much to see in the hedgerows, woods and fields right now while everything's bursting into life. Funding for the Uttlesford Citizen's Advice Bureau's Home Visit Team has been secured for the next financial year thanks to the Seabright Fund, administered by Essex Community Foundation. The Government is gradually replacing Disability Living Allowance (DLA) with the new Personal Independence Payment (PIP). The new benefit will generally require an independent medical assessment and will last for a fixed time. Only those of working age are

affected; claimants over 65 will not need to reapply unless their circumstances change. About 1,200 working age people in Uttlesford who currently receive Disability Living Allowance are expected to be affected by the new scheme.

Lyndie Taylor of the Disability Benefits team has advised people who get a letter from the Department of Work and Pensions about change to the way their benefit is assessed and are worried, to contact CAB to arrange an appointment. One of our team of friendly experienced volunteers can visit and help with your application. We can also help with applications for Attendance Allowance, Employment Support Allowance, DLA applications for children and with getting additional support when it is needed. In 2014, 354 people were helped with benefits advice, resulting in payments of benefits worth a total of £987,378 per year as well as referrals for support on many other matters such as transport, safety, household adaptations, energy bills, befriending schemes, carers, and respite care.

The Uttlesford Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) offers a free, impartial and independent service, with a wide range of support available from general advice to specialist help dealing with serious debt problems, employment disputes, housing and family issues. GARDENING TIPS

Pests are really starting to shift into high gear now, so stop problems such as aphids building up on the young tips of your roses early, warm spring rains bringing a tide of slugs and snails up from hibernation amongst others. If you have winter flowering heathers, now is a good time to lightly clip them back. It'll encourage fresh new growth. Plants grown for colourful young foliage, purple leaved cotinus, berberis, sambucus, photinia, etc. can be pruned hard now to encourage the required fresh young growth. After pruning give them a feed with a general fertiliser such as fish, blood and bone or a general liquid based feed product. Forsythias will be going over and starting to shift into formation of new green growth, so they should be pruned back as soon as the flowers are past their best to encourage new flowers next year at an acceptable height, otherwise they will gradually rise over head height.

- Prune lavender and curry plant into shape, taking care not to cut into the old wood
- Remove frost damaged shoots from tender evergreen shrubs such as Choisya (Mexican Orange Blossom)
- Deadhead daffodils after the flower heads have faded from glory, this concentrates the bulb into preparing for next year; don't tie the foliage in a knot, it reduces photosynthesis within the plant
- Clean out the pond if it has not been done for a few years, lifting as much as possible of the excess mud up and out of the bottom along with decomposing leaves, and other debris, etc. Try to refill with the original pond water or rainwater

Terrific looking plants to watch out for in nurseries in April include cytisus, erysimum (wallflowers), aubretia, ribes sanguineum and pieris amongst others. Try to buy good quality healthy plants.
