The 'Slow Down' signs come on with disturbing regularity and there is still too much half-parking (and consequent obstruction) on pavements. It is good to know that the Parish Council and police are working on these issues but it will be really cheering when we, the residents, can remark on a significant improvement. With public seats, the Editor is not allowed to forget that there is still a 'seat desert' at Burton End. A seat is an excellent subject for a legacy so perhaps the next decade will see one or two more appearing in the deprived areas.

Our magazine has declared an amnesty in its Pothole Contest in deference to the demands caused by the hard winter on the County Council's resources, but as some of these are spectacular if not dangerous we should like to see more hard evidence of repairs during the summer. On page 29 we have a photograph which illustrates the problem in Water Lane, as described in the 'Network' section.

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

"The Unity of Christians never did, nor ever will or can stand in uniformity of thought and opinion, but in Christian love only."

This quotation from Quaker Faith and Practice was written in 1737 and still expresses what Quakers believe. I think I would like to add that we all share Faith and Hope too. During the next month there are two extra and important opportunities to share our faith. On 20th June there is the Songs of Praise in the Memorial Gardens; as well as all the denominations in Stansted taking part, we are hoping to be joined by members of the Church of the Seraphim and Cherubim from Birmingham. Our link with them goes back many years, and the exuberance and sincerity of their worship has always given us an uplift on our visits to them, and we look forward to their contribution on 20th June. The other important event is the annual Bradwell Pilgrimage on 3rd July. This is an ecumenical pilgrimage to the ancient church of St Peter by the sea wall of the estuary. It was founded in 654 by St Cedd who sailed there by coracle from Lindisfarne. Members of churches from all over Essex come to celebrate that this small church has stood like a rock withstanding all the human trials as well as the batterings of the east wind off the North Sea. The Pilgrimage begins with a short service in Bradwell village before the two mile walk to St Peter's. On the large green area by the church the main service takes place. The leading representatives of all the denominations in Essex take part in the service, as well as having a main speaker. There is great delight that this year's speaker will be Archbishop Sentamu of York. I have been several times over the years and it is an amazing experience - an informal and happy atmosphere in which to celebrate the existence and survival of this ancient church, a powerful expression of the Faith, Hope and Love that we all share.




ST MARY'S CHURCH



PRESS RELEASE - Soft Federation

The governing bodies of the Mountfitchet Mathematics and Computing College and Saffron Walden County High School have agreed to form a federation from September 2010. This will be a soft governance federation, which means that each school will maintain its own headteacher, governing body and distinct ethos. 

We had four visitors from a WI in Cheshire (friends of our Secretary, Jenny Wraith) at our April meeting. It is always good to welcome members from other areas and exchange ideas and news. They thoroughly enjoyed their first visit to Essex and admired our beautiful villages and immediate countryside. Our speaker began by telling us that he had altered the title of his talk- whether that meant he'd also changed the content, I'm not quite sure. Billed as 'Essex -Defender of London' we had understood it was to be the part Essex played in the last war. Now called 'Essex at War' he began with the Viking raids at Maldon - he said the Vikings won - well they would wouldn't they with all those helmets? We then fast forwarded to the building of the forts at Tilbury and Gravesend by Henry VIII and thence to the 103 Martello Towers built as defence against Napoleon. Interestingly the bricks used for these were made at Grays. As we all know Essex is vulnerable to invasion with its long coastline, but in the last war it was felt our defence should be airborne. This resulted in 30 airfields being built and more added by the Americans before D-day as we are only too aware. The very first civilian casualties of WW2 were in Essex. Apparently the characters in the TV series 'Sharpe' were modelled on the Essex regiment - bet they didn't have a Sean Bean!

We held a lovely Craft Day when 16 of us gathered to make cards in various mediums. Surrounded by paper, card, glue and glittery things it was just like being back in the safe world of primary school, only better because we were allowed pointed scissors! We did decoupage, encaustic work which involved hot wax on little irons - magical - and iris folding, the art of folding strips of the inside of envelopes and following a printed pattern. We were all very impressed with our efforts and hope to do another one in the autumn.

Elsenham hosted the Spring Group Meeting this year and about 90 members including Ugley, Berden, Manuden and ourselves gathered to hear Andy Malcolm tell us of his work with the Fishermen's Mission. This is a Christian-based charity founded 130 years ago and has no Government aid. They help with emergency assistance to injured and shipwrecked fishermen and provide counselling to bereaved families (about 15 men are lost each year) as well as welfare services at their 13 Centres. Andy joined them ten years ago after early retirement from British Telecom, having previously been unaware of their existence. In between describing the hard and often dangerous job they do, Andy told funny stories and sang two beautiful sea-shanties. There are now only 500 active fishermen in East Anglia, but fish and chips are still one of our most popular meals. The first shop was opened in Lancashire in 1863 and it wasn't Harry Ramsden he didn't appear until the twenties! We came away more aware of 'The True Price of Fish and Chips'.

Our June meeting on 10th in St John's Hall at 7.45pm is Members Day when a group of people not on the regular Committee arrange and run the meeting with a surprise speaker. If you like surprises come along! Planning has begun for our 50th Anniversary Dinner in October. We still

have a few founder members and many who have been members for over 40 years. It was good to read in the 'Link' that the daffodil bulbs at Blythwood were bought with money left by Rita Humphreys for the village. Rita was our first Secretary and subsequently our President. She was such an enthusiastic member of our WI and did so much to ensure its early success. She became a WI speaker and travelled around the area giving her very amusing talks. She would be delighted to know that we are still alive and kicking.

UGLEY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

'Bee Keeping in Essex' was the theme of a most interesting and educational talk given by Mr and Mrs Ridler, very enthusiastic promoters of the bee and its benefits to us humans. Mrs Ridler spoke entertainingly about the benefits and Mr Ridler spoke just as entertainingly in the second half of the programme on the threats to bees. It was pointed out that there are 250 species of bees in Britain alone, and that we were the chief beneficiaries of their industry, enjoying the benefits of honey both as a food and as an anti-oxidant. Another important product of the 'hive of industry' of course being wax, and yet another less well known was a substance called propolis which was good for dental problems amongst other things.

Amongst the threats to the bee were the Varroa mites, insects which live on the backs of bees, weakening them so that viruses can take hold and wipe out the colonies; and, of course, human threats in the shape of mobile phone masts -these cause problems with the bees' natural navigational instincts as does crop spraying. However, the good news which Mr Ridler pointed out, was that there was a great increase in bee keeping in Essex. We were advised to encourage the industrious bees into our gardens by planting single flowers - rather than over-selected modern varieties - and to plant them in full sun to encourage the bees to work the flowers. A lively question and answer session brought this very illuminating talk to an end and so ended another interesting afternoon for our members. Why not make a beeline for one of our meetings? You would be very welcome!

HOW TO GIVE A CAT A TABLET

I've had several requests for the 'How to give a Cat a Tablet' instructions again, so here you are!

- Pick cat up, cradle it in left arm. Position right forefinger and thumb on either side of cat's mouth and gently apply pressure to cheeks while holding tablet in right hand. As cat opens mouth, pop tablet in, close cat's mouth and allow to swallow.
- 2. Retrieve pill from floor and cat from behind sofa. Repeat process.
- Retrieve cat from bedroom. Throw soggy tablet away. Get new tablet, cradle cat in left arm, holding rear paws tightly with left hand. Force jaws open and push tablet to back of mouth with right forefinger. Hold mouth shut for a count of 10.
- 4. Retrieve tablet from goldfish bowl and cat from top of wardrobe. Call spouse from garden.
- 5. Kneel on floor with cat wedged firmly between knees, holding front and rear paws. Ignore hissing. Get spouse to hold cat's head firmly with one hand while forcing jaws open with wooden ruler. Drop tablet down ruler and rub cat's throat vigorously.
- 6. Retrieve cat from curtain rail, get another tablet. Make note to buy new ruler and repair curtains.
- Wrap cat in large towel and get spouse to lie on cat so its head is just visible. Put tablet in end of drinking straw, force cat's mouth open with pencil and blow down drinking straw.
- 8. Check label to make sure tablet not harmful to humans, drink glass of water to take taste away. Apply Band-Aid to spouse's forearm and remove blood from carpet with cold water and soap.
- 9. Retrieve cat from neighbour's shed. Get another tablet. Put on heavy-duty pruning gloves. Tie cat's legs to dining table. Force cat's mouth open with small spanner. Push tablet into mouth followed by large piece of steak. Hold head vertically and pour in glass of water to wash tablet down.
- 10. Get spouse to drive you to A&E, sit quietly while doctor stitches fingers and forearm and removes tablet remnants from right eye. Stop by furniture shop on way home to order new table.
- 11. Arrange for vet to make house call!

HATFIELD FOREST HIGHLIGHTS

Hello everyone. Summer is almost here and the Forest is looking great with a recent yellow haze of buttercups covering the plains. Our Healthy Walk Group is going strong; we meet every Thursday rain or shine at the main gate for a 9.45am start. We have been exploring the Forest every week and have even

ventured out to Wall Wood and Woodside Green.

On 25th June the fantastic Illyria Theatre Company will be performing 'James and the Giant Peach' here at the Forest. For our Shakespeare lovers, Illyria will be returning on July 7th for 'Romeo and Juliet'. For more information ring us on 870678.

During June we carry out our maiden pollarding in areas where we are restoring lost wood pasture. Pollarding is a traditional way of harvesting timber with cutting taking place two to three metres up the tree to avoid the shoots



being nibbled by grazing deer and cows. A tree will usually be pollarded for the first time at about 10 years of age and then pollarded again about 20 years later. Pollards are an important habitat for many wildlife species so ensuring we continue to pollard at Hatfield Forest is an important part of our work. As always, I hope you will come and find me if you have any questions and I look forward to seeing you in the Forest soon.

No 9 Grove Cottage



Grove Cottage provides social and educational activities for people with learning disability: developing their potential, helping them avoid social isolation by developing lifelong friendships and providing respite for their families. It has been providing practical help to local families for more than 40 years. Currently around 100 people use the centre each week and about 50 local families benefit from respite. The centre is in Bishop's Stortford but there are no geographical restrictions on membership. Several Stansted families use Grove Cottage each week. We were delighted that D C Poulton presented us with the eggs from their annual Easter egg collection. The nursery children dressed as Easter bunnies and had their faces painted to meet the staff of D C Poulton in Hatfield Forest for an egg hunt. Afterwards the Easter eggs were shared among the very happy members of Grove Cottage.

Special Needs Nursery

Children can join the nursery as soon as they are diagnosed. A one-to-one staffing ratio provides a stimulating and safe



environment. The children follow the same Early Years Foundation Stages as other children. The staff is experienced in tube feeding, oxygen therapy, nasopharyngeal suction and tracheotomy care.

Youth Club

Young people between 15 and 25 meet on Tuesday evenings.



Speech and Language Therapy

Improving communications is one of the greatest gifts we can offer a child with learning disability.

Saturday Clubs

Two clubs (2-8 years and 9-15 years) provide continuity from the nursery through the school years to maintain friendship groups.

Evening Clubs

Adults meet on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. The two clubs are run by different teams and have different activities.

Carers' Groups

Carers' groups support families with children of different ages.

WHOSE LINE IS IT ANYWAY?

Stop Stansted Expansion (SSE) has endorsed the call by local Parliamentary candidates Sir Alan Haselhurst and Mark Prisk for local rail users to be given at least as much consideration as people travelling to and from Stansted Airport by rail. SSE believes that this simple principle should command allparty support and is therefore writing to all local Parliamentary candidates asking them to declare their support for a fairer deal for local rail users. The issue has come to a head at this time because 120 new 'Electrostar' rail carriages are currently on order for the region and the present intention is to give priority to the Stansted Express by replacing all its existing rolling stock with the new Electrostar carriages and lengthening these trains from eight to 12 carriages. Since it takes 10 trains to operate the present Stansted Express timetable on a 15 minute service frequency, this proposal would see all 120 new carriages allocated to the Stansted Express, leaving none regularly available for local commuter rail services between Cambridge and Liverpool Street, other than during off-peak hours and at weekends.

There is, however, scope for a re-think. The Department for Transport is currently looking for a new train operator to replace National Express from next April and is asking for views on what priorities should be set for the new operator. Sir Alan Haselhurst and Mark Prisk have written to Lord Adonis, the Secretary of State for Transport, arguing for greater priority to be given to local rail users and for a fairer allocation of the 120 new Electrostar carriages. The proposal to lengthen the Stansted Express and give it priority access to all the new carriages comes despite a 25 per cent decline in the number of airport passengers using the Stansted Express service over the past four years. In addition – and against all logic – up until 2005 the Stansted Express service was two trains per hour (in each direction) and mostly these trains were only four carriages long, whereas today the service frequency is four trains per hour (in each direction) and the trains now mostly eight carriages long.

Options for providing local rail users with a fairer share of the benefits of the new Electrostar carriages – which are taxpayer funded and cost £1.3m each – include:

- Increasing the number of Stansted Express services which stop at Stansted Mountfitchet, Bishop's Stortford and Sawbridgeworth
- 2 Ending the dedicated Stansted Express service altogether. This would enable faster and more frequent services to and from all the stations on the main line between Cambridge and Liverpool Street.
- Returning the frequency of the Stansted Express to two trains per hour in each direction. If it were to be lengthened to 12 carriages, two trains per hour would provide more than enough capacity.
- 4 Postponing the lengthening of the Stansted Express to 12 carriages until enough new carriages are available

to replace the old rolling stock on the Cambridge to Liverpool Street line as well as the Stansted Express rolling stock.

Airport Planning Application Refused

SSE is delighted to report that Uttlesford District Council's Development Control Committee voted unanimously to refuse BAA's planning application for permission to rent its surplus warehouse space to all-comers. Having taken account of the evidence submitted by BAA, plus objections by SSE, parish councils and members of the public, the Council could find no material reason for making an exception to its own longstanding policy of only permitting airport-related businesses to operate from within the Airport site. The Committee also disagreed with BAA's argument that there was a serious shortage of suitable warehouse space locally and considered that, with a planning application for a second runway still on the table, no-one could be sure that Stansted Airport's current surplus of airport space would be long term.

Reporting Noisy Aircraft and Aviation Fuel Smells

While many are aware of the system for reporting noisy aircraft using the Stop Stansted Expansion website, still more have been unaware that it is also possible to report strong smells of aviation fuel which occasionally drift across the community. The increasing frequency of reports about these odours means the campaign is keen to gather as much information as possible about who is affected and when so that appropriate action can be taken. To log your concerns use the online form at www.stopstanstedexpansion.com (see link to 'complain about noise/fuel smells') which ensures that SSE receives a copy of your report to BAA and enables the campaign's technical advisers to make its own enquiries too.

NEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL COUNCILS

REPAINTING THE LIGHTING COLUMNS

After a good few years of service, the columns in Lower Street, Station Road and Chapel Hill are looking the worse for wear. Hopefully during May the columns should be repainted which will improve the street scene.

FURTHER IMPROVING THE STREET SCENE

There is so much clutter along our streets that it is time to conduct a review. This has been done and a number of surplus posts and signage boards identified which all require attention. Where appropriate, Essex Highways have been notified. Hopefully there will be a response and action sooner or later!

In addition, community work by young offenders under supervision will be undertaking work to clean up areas in and around the village. If all of this work is completed, the appearance of the village should be much improved.

LOOKING FOR WAYS TO ENHANCE STREET LIGHTING

Following advice from Essex County Council, the Parish Council is looking to set up a trial with white lighting. If it delivers as described then there will be several benefits - more light exposure on the road and footpath, less light pollution and greater economy in energy usage. On the other hand there will be capital costs to convert the existing mishmash of lights. If the decision was taken to proceed, which is unlikely to be for a few months, then a rolling programme will be devised to phase the changeover. The Council recognises the importance which parishioners attach to having effective street lighting and hopefully a major improvement programme can begin within the next year. If there are specific locations where new lights would be beneficial please contact the Clerk or any Councillor.

PLEASE BE PATIENT IF SOME GRASS IS UNCUT

For any parishioner who missed the piece in the May Link, patience is requested where areas of grass are uncut if there are the remains of daffodils. Advice received from professional gardeners is to leave the daffodils uncut until mid-June to reduce risks of growing blind next year. The major areas where this applies are Silver Street, Cambridge Road beyond Croasdaile Road, High Lane and Bentfield Upper Green. Unfortunately this means some untidy grass for a few weeks - apologies.

WOULD YOU LIKE AN ALLOTMENT?

Currently there are only 34 allotments in the parish at Rainsford Road/Pennington Lane, but 15 people are on a waiting list. The recent questionnaire suggested that more people would like to rent an allotment. In order to gauge the level of demand please contact the Parish Council by phone - 813214, email - parishcouncil@stansted.net or in person at Crafton Green. It would also be helpful if you would indicate what you would consider paying as an annual rent. Once this information is available, the Council will contact local landowners to try to find suitable land of adequate size.

DO WE NEED A NEW HALL?

Views as expressed in the recent questionnaire were mixed. As the Parish Council considers the future of Crafton Green in the context of the need for the Council offices to move once the Clinic is relocated, one of the possibilities would be to redevelop a substantial part or all of the site.

One of the ideas which has been proposed is to build a hall which would have the flexibility to meet many different demands. But this begs the question as to what activities would a new (and expensive) hall aim to accommodate. If you believe that existing facilities are inadequate, please let the Council know as precisely as possible what opportunities a new hall would make possible and whether you know people prepared to organise these activities.

At the same time, the Council will be discussing the futures of the Library and the Day Centre in order to ensure that the needs of a growing parish are met. Crafton Green is the only site in the ownership of the Parish Council and it is thus critical that the big decisions are right. However, any major scheme will only be possible if external funding is forthcoming but such funding will be much easier to obtain if there is a well researched community project which will be of benefit to many.

STANSTED YOUTH CENTRE

The Centre is in good shape. The numbers are good and the young people are excited at the projects that they have got planned for this year.

Recently six girls took part in a 6-week Emotional Wellbeing Course. They enjoyed drama, dance, art and discussion - all based around different feelings and how we cope with them. For their participation they will receive an Essex Youth Certificate.

Our members have begun work on the Mosaic and Mural project that is going to brighten up the outside of the Centre and our storage unit. These murals will depict well know landmarks around Stansted and from Northern Ireland following a visit last year. The mosaics will be of the young people themselves and the hobbies and activities they enjoy taking part in, like BMXing and fishing. The young people are also learning about Gaudi and his famous mosaics and how mosaics first started with the Romans. It is then hoped, if funding can be sourced, to take some of them to Barcelona in June to see Gaudi's work for themselves.



With spring here the garden project will again be bursting into activity with the initial clearing and cleaning and then planting and caring. Plans for the garden this year is construction of a giant chess board made with paving slabs for outdoor chess games and a barbeque area. Our garden crew led by Tom Williams have been eager to get started and the fact that the trees surrounding the garden have been drastically cut back during the

winter means less leaves to clear prior to planting and more light for the plants to enjoy.

Spring also sees our Belfast friends first visit to Stansted. (see photo). Thirty young people from 2 youth centres are coming to spend a week with us to see how our youth centres operate and what life is like in Essex. The youngsters come from the two areas of Belfast that have seen lots of sectarian unrest and are part of the reconciliation process so we hope to make their stay with us as enjoyable as possible.

NEWS FROM UTTLESFORD D.C.

The proposed relocation of an enlarged St Mary's Primary School to Foresthall Park raises the existing question of the unsafe state of Water Lane for pedestrians as this will be an important walking route for parents and children. The County Council has not yet decided what it will do about Water Lane.

The District Council is pushing the developers at Foresthall Park to open the children's play area near Walson Way.

A controversial planning application at the airport was discussed at the start of May and refused. BAA built some commercial premises in 2007 but cannot find any tenants for them because of the downturn in the economy that has hit the aviation business. Uttlesford's policy restricts businesses located at the airport to those that are connected with the operation of the airport. Businesses that have no relevance to the airport are prohibited. Council officers recommended that a concession should be given to help BAA and its subsidiary business's finances by letting in non-airport tenants. There were numerous objections to this concession, not least that it would be unfair to companies with commercial premises outside the airport who also can't let their premises but didn't expect competition from BAA when they built theirs. I spoke in support of the objectors and the committee refused the application unanimously. (Cllr Alan Dean)

St Mary's Primary School

The future of the school and its site in St John's Road is of great interest to me. I spent some of my formative years as a pupil of the school and have happy memories of it. I have also a child who is currently in year 6 at St. Mary's who will

who is currently in year 6 at St. Mary's who will be leaving this year.

Clearly the initial consultation by Essex County Council was flawed. Officers were unprepared for many of the questions asked of them. Subsequently, the portfolio holder Cllr Stephen Castle has met parent, governors and representatives from the Parish Council.

If the school does move to Forest Hall Park I should like to see a blue print for the site. First and foremost the playing field should be preserved as an open space. Clearly the existing school buildings would become redundant. If there is development it should be sympathetic to the existing street scene. What use the site is going to be put to will be a decision for Essex County Council. A planning application would however have to be submitted to the District Council for their approval or otherwise. The site is an important one at the centre of the village, and I feel strongly that there should be some community gain.

Climate Change

At our last council meeting councillors approved a Natural Resources Management Strategy. This is our strategy for addressing the causes and effects of climate change, conserving valuable resources such as energy and water, and dealing with related issues such as fuel poverty.

The main objective of this strategy is to reduce the greenhouse gas emission from council operations and from the district as a whole, and to make preparations for predicted climate change impacts. The principal target is a 25% reduction in the greenhouse emissions under the Council's direct control by 2011/12 compared to 2006/07.

Climate change for this region means hotter, drier summers with more chance of heat-waves and drought, and wetter, milder winters with more chance of storms and flooding. Overall annual rainfall will fall.

Uttlesford falls within the Three Valley's Water area of supply. Interestingly, water use in this supply area is the highest in the country at 161 litres per person per day in 2008-09, compared to the national average of 145 litres per person per day.

The Council has had some environmental successes principally with the new recycling system. In the summer of 2006 the Council introduced a new 'three-bin' scheme allowing residents to recy-

cle kitchen waste. This was followed by an expansion of the range of recyclables that the Council could take. The new system, along with the efforts of residents has proven itself. In 2005-06 before the system was implemented we recycled 26% of our domestic waste. By 2008-09 this had improved to 53.7%, the 10th best recycling rate in the country and 20,371 fewer tonnes of domestic waste was sent to landfill.



SKYWATCH

A monthly look at an aspect of the night sky.



Following the 40th anniversary of Apollo 13, this month we will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the launch of the Hubble Telescope into Earth orbit by the Space Shuttle. It was named after the American astronomer Edwin Hubble,



who, in the 1920s/30s, with the aid of the then largest telescope in the world, discovered that the universe was not just our galaxy, but that we live in one of billions of galaxies. The mission went off perfectly as, once in orbit, did the setting up. Upon completion, the telescope was ready to give us deeper views in to space

than ever before. The first results were eagerly awaited. This machine had the smoothest concave mirror that had ever been ground, in a purpose built building where everything was painted black so as to give no reflections from the network of laser beams that would monitor the correct shaping of the glass. So it was with head-scratching dismay to everyone involved when the first pictures sent back were blurred. Certainly the telescope had been able to capture images we had never been able see before, but they were definitely out of focus. From the beginning, Hubble was to have planned visits from the Space Shuttle for repairs and for upgraded equipment to be installed. But these things do not get hurried. It took three years before the telescope was to be revisited but when the day came, the astronauts had many tasks, including replacing the huge solar arrays that generate Hubble's power. They were also able to install correcting lenses and Hubble could at last see clearly.

Since that mission 17 years ago Hubble has expanded the Universe by billions of light years. Wherever Hubble looks in to an area of sky that has always been black to other telescopes, Hubble finds something. One picture from Hubble is particularly interesting because it shows hundreds of galaxies in a previously black spot of sky. That black spot is the diameter of a 5p piece held 75 feet from the eye. But it is not just that Hubble detected those galaxies so far away but it also means that the Universe is that much bigger in all directions. Hubble is due to be retired in 2014. It deserves a pension. And why were the optics wrong? One bolt in the structure holding the mirror, as it was ground, had its black paint scraped off somehow and it was white underneath and the lasers picked up reflections from it.





Everyone is invited to this as it happens to be 100 years since the mill last worked and the sails frequently turned. We are grateful to English Heritage and the Parish Council for their generous financial input and to IJP Owlsworth Ltd for their painstaking diligence during a particularly harsh winter. To be 60ft up in zero degrees in January was, to put it mildly, uncomfortable. By happy coincidence the works foreman, Giles, was awarded his MSc in Heritage Conservation on the day when the Completion Certificate for the work was issued. Congratulations, Giles, we have been well served. Our gratitude also goes to the numerous volunteers who worked on the mill over many years and to those who have donated and in many cases continue to do SO.

Stansted is fortunate in having such a prominent National Monument clearly visible from the main road. It contains the machinery used during its working days and will continue to be floodlit. The mill has a rich history currently being researched at the County Records Office by Alan Williams and Tudor Owen. Moreover, Tudor has compiled a photographic and video record of the restoration. Altogether we can claim to have reached a high point in its 223 year history.



As you will know, our May meeting is the last of the season and also doubles as the Annual General Meeting. This year was no different and our Chairman, Peter Brown, conducted the proceedings with his usual aplomb, which meant that we were able to hear Peter Sanders make this year's presentation without too much delay. Peter had researched the situation between the farmers and farm labourers in the 19th century, a time of great change which affected this locality severely.

Essentially, the price of wheat had dropped from the heights it reached during the Napoleonic Wars, when many farmers had given over much land to the growing of wheat and other crops, at the expense of pasture and the production of livestock. With the fall in income, the farmers had to bring down expenses in order to make a profit and therefore reduced the wages of their labourers. Unfortunately, the labourers were already living at subsistence levels and the reduction from nine shillings a week with beer to eight shillings with beer led to much suffering. This, in turn, led to the Stansted Riot of 1834, which more properly could be understood to be a strike but which was dealt with by the authorities as the more serious alternative with the result that two men were condemned to a year's hard labour. Three years prior to that and for a very similar reason, there had been a similar demonstration in Stansted and other 'riots' took place in several Essex villages.

The effects of the failure of the strike and the introduction of the Poor Law Act of 1834 led to an uneasy peace, which developed into something more sinister. A rash of incendiarism broke out in the area, not so much in Stansted (although it was not thought to be unknown) but certainly in Manuden, our near neighbours. In some cases police had to preserve order to allow firemen to do In addition, the Union assisted undertheir work. employment in many parts of Essex by encouraging and helping many labourers and their families to emigrate some to Yorkshire but many to Canada, Australia and America. Peter is continuing his research, only the bare outlines of which I have been able to give here, and we sincerely hope he will be sharing it with us - in any case, we were grateful to him for telling us of his efforts so far (and to the members of the Committee for bringing to life extracts from papers of the time).

We next meet on Thursday 2nd September, in the Day Centre, Crafton Green, and I understand that David Harrison will be publishing his programme of speakers in a future edition of the 'Link'. In the meantime, I wish you a very pleasant summer!

THE GARDENS OF EASTON LODGE PRESERVATION TRUST

A ten-strong volunteer team from across Essex and Herts has begun tackling an interim restoration project in the Italian Garden within the Gardens of Easton Lodge under the supervision of Writtle College horticulture student Robert Hanchet. Two flowerbeds in the sunken garden designed by Harold Peto for Daisy, Countess of Warwick a century ago have now been cleared in preparation for planting with large, tender perennial plants in mainly reds, mauves and silvers. The idea is to create a transitional planting before a full restoration takes place. Most of the plants are being grown from seed and cuttings. Some of the plants which originally featured in the Italian Garden, described in contemporary Edwardian gardening journals, including canna, dahlia and heliotrope will also be included in the current scheme in keeping with the spirit of historical accuracy. The two new beds will be well developed by late summer.

In the meantime, visitors to the opening of the Gardens on Sunday 20th June are in for a very special treat as the marvellous array of Old English roses elsewhere in the gardens come into bloom, notably the very special and much loved Belle de Crecy rose. The season then continues with Sunday openings on 18th July, 22nd August, 19th September and 10th October. Entry to the Gardens costs just £2.50 (children free). Picnics are welcome and homemade refreshments are on sale during opening hours (12 noon to 6.00pm). Nature Notes


It is a pleasant surprise to see the number of small garden birds that have survived the harsh winter. In my garden robins and coal tits are breeding well and even wrens and goldcrests are in evidence.

It is a curious fact that at a time when the human population is increasing in the south-east and so many green acres are being turned to brown or grey, the numbers of several wild creatures seems to be rising also. Thirty or so years ago it was a rare event to see a badger and fallow deer were much less evident then. Foxes are now urban dwellers while pigeon, carrion crows and muntjac are, to our cost, overabundant. Some, like hares and amphibians, are less common but the overall population is surprisingly buoyant. This should not deceive us into thinking that all is well in the great outdoors, as a glance at the list of endangered species

will demonstrate, so our own modest attempts at conservation should continue.

There is a welcome tendency to popularise native plants in our gardens and to integrate them with cultivated species in the style of the great Gertrude Jekyll. On a garden scale the invasive ones can be controlled and some like lesser celandine and ragged robin have a short period of dominance. Increasingly the smaller species of narcissus and tulips are gaining favour. They avoid the legacy imposed by the large or florists' species of leaving large clusters of strappy foliage in view for weeks after flowering. To echo Schumacher, small is beautiful.
